**TODAY'S GAME:** The Fayetteville Woodpeckers (Single-A, Houston Astros) continue Opening Weekend as they host the Lynchburg Hillcats (Single-A Cleveland Guardians). This is the first time since 2023 that the Woodpeckers opened their season with a home series, a game against the Carolina Mudcats (Single-A, Milwaukee Brewers) which was suspended due to weather, and the second time since the team began play in 2019. Tonight is the second of 15 contests against their new North Division foe and the first of two series the teams will play in the Tar Heel State. Tonight, the Woodpeckers turn to RHP Cole Hertzler for the start while the Hillcats call upon RHP Cam Walty to take the hill.

**ABOUT THE HILLCATS:** The Lynchburg Hillcats, founded in 1894, begin their 132nd season of operation in 2025. Having joined the Carolina League in 1966, they are the oldest team in the league. Jordan Smith returns to manage the club for his third season having led the team to winning records in each of his first two years in Lynchburg. The Hillcats most recently won their eighth Carolina League title in 2017, the most of any current franchise, and sit in a tie for second with the defunct Kinston Indians for second in league history. However, they have not won a championship since the league re-classified to Single-A. Before joining the Guardians organization in 2015, they held previous affiliations with the St. Louis Cardinals (1943-1955), Chicago White Sox (1963-1969), Minnesota Twins (1970-1974), Texas Rangers (1975), New York Mets (1976-87), Boston Red Sox (1988-1994), Pittsburgh Pirates (1995-2009), and Cincinnati Reds (2010).

**(SOMEWHAT) FAMILIAR FOES:** This past offseason, the Carolina League experienced significant changes that saw the league re-shuffle ahead of the start of the 2025 season. In May of 2024, it was announced that the Down East Wood Ducks would re-locate to Spartanburg, S.C. and re-brand as the Hub City Spartanburgers, and shortly thereafter, in July, the Texas Rangers decided to swap them with the Hickory Crawdads, sending them to the High-A South Atlantic League while the Crawdads took their place in the Carolina League. Upon their entry to the league, the Crawdads were placed in the South Division, and the Woodpeckers took Down East's spot in the North Division, grouping them with the Mudcats, Hillcats, Delmarva Shorebirds (Single-A, Baltimore Orioles), Fredericksburg Nationals (Single-A, Washington Nationals), and Salem Red Sox (Single-A, Boston Red Sox).

**ON THE ROAD TO H-TOWN:** At the start of the 2025 season, the Woodpeckers feature three players listed in the top 30 of the Houston Prospect Rankings according to MLB.com. Cole Hertzler is the highest ranked of the trio at No. 27 overall (No. 13 pitcher), Jancel Villarroel is the lone position player in the group at No. 29 overall (No. 2 catcher), and Bryce Mayer rounds out the list at No. 30 overall (No. 15 pitcher).

**THE NEW MAN IN THE DUGOUT:** The Woodpeckers feature a brand new coaching staff from top to bottom in 2025. With former manager Ricky Rivera earning a promotion to Double-A to lead the Corpus Christi Hooks, Carlos Lugo takes over for his first season in full-season baseball. However, Lugo is no stranger to the Houston Astros organization. This season marks his 12th with the club having started as a catching specialist in the Dominican Summer League in 2014. Most recently, he spent four seasons managing in the Florida Complex League, the first of which with Rivera, helping develop some of the Astros' youngest professional players. As he gets his first taste of Single-A, he teams up with three members of his staff from last year in Palm Beach including James Wiseman (Pitching Coach), Kyle Brennan (Hitting Coach), and Alfredo Granier (Development Coach).

**FOR THE 'VILLES:** Last Wednesday, the Woodpeckers hosted the Astros High-A affiliate Asheville Tourists in the fourth annual One Ville exhibition game. While this normally serves as one last tune-up before the regular season, this year, it also doubled as a charity fundraiser to help those who are still dealing with the devastation caused by Hurricane Helene last September. Aided by five runs through the first three innings, a two-run, four-inning start from Mayer, and a two-run Esmil Valencia home run in the fifth, the Woodpeckers prevailed 9-2.

**BIG LEAGUE WOODPECKERS:** Before the season kicked off, one more player added his name to the list of Fayetteville Woodpeckers to reach the Major Leagues. 2022 Woodpeckers RHP Ryan Gusto made the Houston Astros Opening Day roster and officially made is MLB debut in their series opener against the San Francisco Giants on March 31st, tossing two scoreless frames. The former Florida SouthWestern State College standout and 2019 11th round draft pick became the first former Woodpecker to reach the majors in 2025 and 28th overall.

**THIS DAY IN WOODPECKERS HISTORY:** April 5, 2024 - One year ago today, the Woodpeckers kicked off the 2024 regular season with a 10-3 Opening Day victory over the Myrtle Beach Pelicans. RHP Ethan Pecko earned the Opening Day start and Oliver Carrillo slugged the first home run of the season. Fayetteville went on to win the Opening Weekend series 2-1.

## 29 Carlos Lugo



Carlos Lugo was named the fifth manager in Fayetteville Woodpeckers franchise history on February 10th, 2025 and will lead the Woodpeckers throughout their sixth season at Segra Stadium.

Lugo enters his first season at the helm while continuing a long-standing career within the Astros organization. The 35-year-old joined the Astros in 2014 as a catching specialist with the Dominican Summer League Astros and went on to manage the club from 2016-2020. During his time in the DR, Lugo helped coach Astros stars like Yordan Alvarez. In 2021, Lugo managed alongside former Fayetteville skipper Ricky Rivera in the Florida Complex League, and has remained in West Palm Beach, Florida over the last four summers helping develop some of the Astros youngest professional players. Lugo is a native of Santo Domingo, Dominican Republic.

## Manager 22 Alfredo Granier Dev. Coach



Alfredo Granier rounds out the on-field staff in his first year as development coach. Granier joined the Astros in 2022 as an infield and baserunning coach. He was the FCL Astros development coach in 2024 under Lugo and continues his fourth season in the Astros

organization in 2025. Prior to his time with Houston, Granier played college baseball at Birmingham-Southern and spent time after graduation as a youth coach and baseball instructor at Triple H Academy in Atlanta, Georgia.
