LAST TIME OUT

The Ems snapped their three-game skid in impressive fashion on Tuesday night, cruising to a comfy 9-3 win over the first place Everett AquaSox in the first game of a six-game set at PK Park. With the win, the Emeralds moved just 0.5 game behind the Frogs in the standings. Brett Auerbach, a recent addition from Low-A San Jose, made one heckuva home debut on Tuesday night, tallying 6 RBIs while going 3-for-5, including a three-run homer. Starting pitcher Seth Corry pitched 5.0 innings for just the third time this season, allowing just two hits, two earned runs and three walks while striking out seven batters to earn his third win of the season. Ismael Munguia finished with a game-high four hits, and both Franklin Labour and Armani Smith also added RBI base knocks. Tyler Schimpf and Chris Wright pitched the eighth and ninth innings, respectively, with each reliever recording all three outs via strikeouts. The Emeralds pitching staff held the potent AquaSox lineup to just four hits.

TONIGHT'S STORYLINES

Everett sends out another one of Seattle's Top 30 prospects (per MLB.com) in the form of RHP Matt Brash, the 28th ranked prospect in the Mariners system. Eugene will counter with changeup specialist RHP Aaron Phillips who has earned a decision in all seven of his starts this season (3-4, 4.91 ERA). Phillips is fresh off his longest outing of the season that saw him fire 7.0 innings of one-run ball on July 1 in Hillsboro, while Brash also enters off his longest outing of the year, a 6.0 inning scoreless performance on June 30 against Vancouver. Ismael Munguia carries a six-game hit streak into tonight and is batting .407 with a .556 OBP during that span.

Wilson and Rincones are the sixth and seventh players to be promoted to Double-A Richmond this season, joining RHP Jose Marte, RHP Caleb Kilian, INF Simon Whiteman, RHP RJ Dabovich, and C Brandon Martorano.

After 49 games as an Emerald, Wilson departs the Northwest currently ranked tied for second in the High-A West in home runs (10), tied for third in extra-base hits (26), fourth in total bases (97), fifth in slugging (.497), tied for sixth in runs scored (37), seventh in doubles (14), tied for eighth in hits (49), and ninth in OPS (.837).

Meanwhile, Rincones leaves Eugene after 25 games as an Emerald having slashed .300/.385/.533 with 5 homers, 6 doubles, 15 RBIs and a .918 OPS. Rincones played just 25 games as an Emerald was not due to injury, but rather due to time spent with the Venezuelan National Team. Rincones, one of three Emeralds to play for their respective national teams this season (OF Ismael Munguia - Nicaragua | RHP Jasier Herrera - Columbia), spent two separate stints with the Venezuelan National Team this summer, first at the WSBC Olympic Qualifying Tournament held in Florida and later at the WSBC Final Qualifier held in Mexico. The barrel-chested outfielder made his mark in both stints with the Venezuelan National Team, including a walk-off homer against Columbia in Florida and later a three-run homer against the Dominican Republic in the championship game of the Final Qualifying for the Tokyo Olympics.

Walk This Way

Emeralds 1B Logan Wyatt became the first man in the High-A West to reach 40 BBs last Friday night. Wyatt enters Tuesday ranked T-11th in all of Minor League Baseball in walks, still sitting on 40 BBs..

The Wright Stuff

No Marte? No Dabo? No problem. Wright has slid into the closer role seemlessly after prior Emeralds closers Jose Marte and RJ Dabovich each received promotions to Double-A Richmond. In 21.1 innings pitched this season between Low-A San Jose and High-A Eugene, Wright has struck out an astounding 46 batters while going 9-for-9 in save opportunities. Wright struck out the side against Everett on Tuesday night against Everett.

Strikeout Savants

Through 54 games, the Eugene pitching staff leads the High-A West in strikeouts (595). Their 595 collective strikeouts are 17 more than the next closest High-A West team (Everett - 578). But it doesn't stop there... the Emeralds ranked 3rd in all of High-A, too, trailing only the Hickory Crawdads (TEX) who have 598 and the Hudson Valley Renegades (NYY) who have 615. Across all of Minor League Baseball, Eugene's 595 K's rank 9th. Coincidentally, the San Jose Giants (San Francisco - Low A) lead all of Minor League Baseball with 714 K's. Entering Wednesday night, San Jose's 714 K's are 72 more than the next closest team (Modesto Nuts | SEA | Low-A West).

So Offensive

The Everett offense has been flat-out absurd all season long. Entering Wednesday night, the Frogs rank 5th in all of Minor League Baseball in runs scored (363), 1st in doubles (135), 3rd in on-base percentage (.375), and 9th in OPS (.823).

Living On The Edg

After falling in extra innings to the Tri-City Dust Devils, 7-6, on May 20, the Emeralds have won ten straight games decided by one run and are now 10-1 in one-run games this season.

Olympic Ems

Diego Rincones and the Venezuelan National Team's bid to make the Olympics came up just short on Saturday, with Venezuela falling to the Dominican Republic, 8-5, in the WBSC Baseball Final Qualifier held in Mexico. Rincones made his mark in the Final Qualifier, belting a three-run homer in the 2nd inning to put Venezuela up 3-0 at the time but a six-run 4th inning, helped the Dominican Republic roar back and hold on late for the win. During the Final Qualifier, Rincones went 3-for-14 (.214) with 5 RBI, a double, and a HR

BIO: While at St. Bonaventure, excelled as the team's ace, earning 2017 Atlantic 10 Pitcher of the Year honors, 2017 ACBA/Rawlings Third Team All-American, and a 2017 John Olerud National Two-Way Player of the Year Finalist after going 9-2 with a 3.04 ERA and 90 K's in 100.2 innings wild batting .251 with 26 RBI and 18 stolen bases in 22 attempts. Highest draft pick in Bonnies history. Father played college football at Ithaca. Attended Cheveland Hill High School where he set the school record for career strikeouts, single eason strikeouts and single game strikeouts. Per

Baseball America's 2017 Draft Profile: "Phillips was a solid two-way player for St. Bonaventure, but his future is on the mound. He'll need to improve his command and control, and that could come naturally as he focuses exclusively on pitching. Phillips shows an upper 80s fastball and bumps 92 mph. His offspeed stuff is below-average at present and will need refinement." First pro season (2017), Phillips pitched exclusively out of the bullpen (14 APPs for Salem-Keizer) but since has been almost exclusively a starter (45 APPS, 40 starts in 2018-19). Signed with the Giants for \$80,000 after being drafted.

Notes: #28 prospect in Seattle Mariners system, per MLB.com. Originally selected by San Diego in the 4th round of the 2019 MLB First Year Player Draft. Became the 2nd-highest draft pick in Niagara University baseball history (Doug Farrell, Pittsburgh, 2nd round in 1971 and 3rd round in 1972). During junior year (2019) at Niagara, recorded 121 strikeouts, setting the Niagara and Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference single-season records while ranking 10th in the NCAA for the season. His 2.43 ERA was the best in the MAAC in 2019 and 2nd-best in Niagara program history. Completed his career at Niagara with a 2.97 ERA, 2nd-best in program history. 2019: Made

his pro debut in the Padres organization; appeared in 5 games (1 start) between the AZL Padres and Single A Fort Wayne, posting a 1.69 ERA (1 ER, 5.1 IP) with 8 strikeouts and 0 walks. 2020: Added to the Mariners 60- man roster after being acquired by Seattle from San Diego as player to be named later on Sept. 17 Per MLB.com, "The Canada native caught scouts' attention ahead of the 2019 Draft with huge strikeout numbers at Niagara University, a whopping 121 in just 14 starts to go with a career 2.97 ERA over three college. seasons. In his final year, he earned MAAC Pitcher of the Year honors. The Padres wound up selecting him in the fourth round and he signed for \$512,000. He pitched in just five games of relief during his first pro season, then was impacted by the cancellation of the Minors season in 2020. The Mariners acquired him for reliever Taylor Williams as a player to be named later at last year's Trade Deadline, but a shoulder impingement kept him from pitching at the club's fall developmental camp in Arizona. For a 6-foot-1 righty, Brash has impressive extension down the mound with his fastball, which has been one of the key attributes the Mariners have looked for while assembling Minor League pitching talent in recent years. He sat in the low 90s at Niagara, topping out at 95 mph and there's room for more velocity there as he grows into his body. His changeup is his second-best gitch and one that showed enqueby elecity variation from his heater. He also throws a slider and curveball. Brash reached full-season ball during his brief debut in "19, but because he's been out of game action for so long and after the shoulder issue last year, he'll need to be built back up slowly in 2021. He has the chance to start, especially if his breaking stuff improves, though he'll have to show he can stay healthy."
