SUNDAY: The Flying Squirrels beat the Harrisburg Senators, 5-4, in 10 innings at CarMax Park. The Senators took a 3-0 lead with three solo homers. Ethan Petry went deep in the second, Cayden Wallace homered in the third and Caleb Lomavita added a shot in the fourth. In the bottom of the fourth, **Charlie Szykowny** hit a solo homer to close the score to 3-1. **Bo Davidson** pulled Richmond within a run in the fifth with an RBI single. In the sixth, Wallace hit his second solo homer to extend the Harrisburg lead to 4-2. **Jean Carlos Sio** tied the score, 4-4, with a two-run homer in the sixth. The Flying Squirrels loaded the bases in the bottom of the 10th with an intentional walk and a hit batter before **Maui Ahuna** was hit by a pitch to drive home the walk-off winning run.

POSTSEASON BOUND: Friday's win clinched the Eastern League Southwest Division title for the Flying Squirrels, locking in a postseason berth. The Flying Squirrels will play the second-half division champion in the Division Series. Game 1 will be at the home of the second-half champion on Tues., Sept. 15. Game 2 and, if necessary, Game 3 will be at CarMax Park on Thurs., Sept. 17 and Sat., Sept. 18. If Richmond advances to the EL Championship Series, Game 1 will be at CarMax Park on Sun., Sept. 20. This year marks the fifth postseason appearance in franchise history and the first since 2023.

TODAY'S GAME: The Flying Squirrels play the opener of a six-game series against the Chesapeake Baysox, Double-A affiliate of the Baltimore Orioles. This is the first series between the two teams this season. The Flying Squirrels are looking to improve to 21 games over .500 for the first time since 2014 with a win.

STRONG START: The Flying Squirrels' 10-game win streak from April 4-15 was the longest in franchise history, surpassing an eight-game win streak from May 5-13, 2021, also beginning with the second game of the season. The 41-21 start is the best in team history through 62 games, passing a 36-26 start in 2014 and 2022. Richmond has won six series and split four so far this year.

RELENTLESS: In their 41 wins this year, the Flying Squirrels have come from behind in 20 of them. In 14 of the wins, Richmond has taken the lead in the eighth inning or later. On April 4, they scored two in the ninth for an 11-9 win at Erie. In the April 7 home opener, they never trailed but jumped ahead in the bottom of the eighth for a 3-2 win over the Curve. On April 9, they scored two in the eighth for another 3-2 win against Altoona. On April 11, the Curve scored two in the top of the 10th before the Flying Squirrels walked off with three in the bottom of the 10th. On April 15 in Hartford, the Flying Squirrels scored five runs with two outs in the ninth to win 13-11. On April 24, **Drew Cavanaugh** hit a walk-off, two-run homer in the ninth for a 7-6 win over the Patriots. On April 26, Richmond tied the score with two outs in the ninth before **Parks Harber** hit a walk-off single in the 10th. On April 30, the Flying Squirrels rallied from a two-run deficit in the eighth to take the lead in the ninth and 10th but were answered by Altoona before a 12-run top of the 11th. On Wednesday against Akron, **Jonah Cox** hit a two-run homer to tie the score in the ninth before Cavanaugh won the game, 5-4, with a walk-off double. On Friday, the Flying Squirrels tied their largest come-from-behind win in franchise history, overcoming a 6-0 deficit to win, 9-6, over Akron. On May 20 against Binghamton, **Ty Hanchey** hit a game-tying homer in the bottom of the ninth and Harber won the game with a walk-off single. After trailing, 6-1, early on June 5, the Flying Squirrels rallied and **Diego Velasquez** won the game with double in the 10th. On June 6, Richmond posted five runs in the bottom of the ninth to walk off against Erie, the largest ninth-inning comeback in team history, tying to score with a two-run homer by **Bo Davidson** and winning the game on a double by **Onil Perez**. On June 14, Richmond trailed by three runs twice before **Jean Carlos Sio** tied the score with a two-run homer in the sixth and **Maui Ahuna** was hit by a pitch with the bases loaded in the 10th for a 5-4 win.

THE FLYING SQUIRRELS lead the Southwest Division by 8.5 games over Erie with six games remaining in the Eastern League's first half. Friday's win clinched the first-half division title. They have the second-best record in Double-A. Richmond leads all 30 Double-A teams in batting average (.279), hits (582), doubles (132) and triples (20) and rank second in total bases (952) and OPS (.816).

THE BAYSOX are in sixth place in the Southwest Division, 16 games behind Richmond and 2.5 games behind fifth-place Altoona. They dropped four-of-six in Altoona last week and are 1-4 in their last five games. The Chesapeake roster features eight players ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Orioles prospects list, including LHP Luis De Leon (No. 4), LHP Joseph Dzierwa (No. 5), RHP Juaron Watts-Brown (No. 14), C Ethan Anderson (No. 15), 2B/OF Aron Estrada (No. 16), LHP Sebastain Gongora (No. 17), LHP Micah Ashman (No. 20) and OF Thomas Sosa (No. 27). MLB.com's top-30 Orioles prospects list features seven Baysox players, including De Leon (No. 3), Estrada (No. 7), Dzierwa (No. 12), Watts-Brown (No. 14), Sosa (No. 18), Anderson (No. 23) and SS/2B Griff O'Ferrall (No. 26).

FOR RICHMOND: Left-hander **Greg Farone** makes his 13th Double-A start and his first against the Baysox. In his last start on Wednesday, he tied his longest outing of the year, allowing two runs over five innings to pick up his first Double-A win. In his last four starts since May 22, Farone is 1-1 with a 2.95 ERA (6 ER/18.1 IP). Farone was Richmond's Opening Day starter on April 4 at Erie in his Double-A debut and allowed one run over 4.2 innings. He had eight strikeouts, tying the franchise record for the most strikeouts on Opening Day. He pitched his first professional season in 2025 and split the year between Low-A San Jose and High-A Eugene. He made 12 starts for San Jose, going 2-1 with a 3.73 ERA. At the time of his promotion in June, he ranked third in the California League in strikeouts (73). Farone closed the year with 11 starts at High-A, going 4-2 with a 4.25 ERA. Farone began his college career at Herkimer College in New York, where he led the team to the program's first NJCAA national title in 2022, going 7-0 with a 1.65 ERA and was named the NJCAA Division III Player of the Year and MVP of the World Series. He transferred to the University of Louisville for the 2023 season and pitched at the University of Alabama in 2024 before being selected by the Giants in the seventh round of that year's MLB Draft. **For more on Farone, see page two.**

FOR CHESAPEAKE: Left-hander Sebastian Gongora makes his 13th start of the season and the first of his career against Richmond. He last pitched last Wednesday at Altoona and was charged with a loss after allowing four runs over four innings. In the Eastern League this year, Gongora is ranked seventh in innings pitched (58.0), eighth in ERA (3.72), eighth in WHIP (1.29) and ninth in strikeouts (63). He is in his first Double-A season. Gongora was selected by the Orioles in the 11th round of the 2024 MLB Draft out of the University of Louisville, where pitched one season after spending the previous two seasons at Wright State and was the 2023 Horizon League Pitcher of the Year.

IT'S BO TIME! **Bo Davidson** has reached base in 14 consecutive games dating back to May 30. In that stretch, he is batting .346 (18-for-52) with six homers, two doubles and 13 RBIs, adding seven walks. From June 4-7, he homered in four consecutive games, a new Flying Squirrels franchise record. From June 2-June 7, he picked up at least one RBI in six consecutive games, one shy of the franchise record. Davidson hit a two-run homer in the ninth on June 6, part of a team-record five-run comeback in the final inning. Davidson leads the team and the Giants minor leagues with 12 homers on the season.

PARKS & WRECK: **Parks Harber** has homered seven times and picked up 28 RBIs in his last 33 games since May 7. He had seven RBIs over two games on May 13 and 14 at Erie, including two homers. He hit a solo home run on May 20 against Binghamton before driving a game-winning single in the bottom of the ninth, his second walk-off hit for the Flying Squirrels this year. Harber had 23 RBIs in the month of May, which was fourth-most in the Eastern League.

SIO LATER: **Jean Carlos Sio** has eight RBIs in his last four starts since June 10. He began the stretch with his first Double-A homer on June 10 at CarMax Park against Harrisburg, a solo shot. The follow game on June 11, he went 2-for-5 with a solo homer and a two-run triple. In Friday night's division-clinching win, he drove a two-run single in the first inning. He worked a walk as a pinch-hitter in the ninth inning on Saturday. On Sunday, he hit a game-tying, two-run homer in a comeback win.

TOP SKIPPER: Flying Squirrels manager **Dennis Pelfrey** has led the team to 301 wins in his career, which is a franchise record all-time wins record for a manager. He passed the record with Richmond's 6-1 win at Binghamton on May 23, 2025. From 2011-2013, **Dave Machemer** won 216 games as Richmond's manager, leading the team to the Eastern League postseason for in 2011. Pelfrey, who has been with Richmond since the 2022 season, led the team to back-to-back postseason appearances for the first time in franchise history in 2022 and 2023. He also managed the 2021 Eugene Emeralds to the High-A West championship. Of Richmond managers since 1954, Pelfrey is second in wins behind Eddie Haas (1968, 1981-84), who had 351 wins.

PACKING THE HOUSE: In 2025, the Flying Squirrels led all 30 Double-A teams in total (446,679) and average (6,768) attendance for the fourth consecutive season. The average attendance was the highest in the franchise's history. April 7's inaugural game at CarMax Park had been sold out for more than a month, marking the 16th consecutive home-opener to sell out for the Flying Squirrels. This season, the Flying Squirrels rank third among the 120 MiLB teams in average attendance (6,991).

IN THE LEAGUE LEADERS: In the Eastern League, **Jonah Cox** is first in batting average (.400), first in OBP (.453), first in SLG (.644), first in OPS (1.097), first in triples (5), fourth in hits (64) and third in stolen bases (27). **Parks Harber** is tied for sixth in doubles (15) and 10th in batting average (.294). **Scott Bandura** is second in OBP (.430) and third in batting average (.324). **Charlie Szykowny** is tied for fourth in triples (3), tied for fourth in doubles (16), tied for fifth in extra-base hits (28), tied for fifth in hits (62) and tied for sixth in total bases (111). **Bo Davidson** is tied for ninth in homers (12). **Joe Whitman** is first in WHIP (0.97), third in BAA (.198), fourth in ERA (3.22), tied for fourth in wins (5) and sixth in strikeouts (65). **Tyler Vogel** is first in saves (8). **Mitch White** is tied for fifth in saves (5). **Cesar Perdomo** is first in BAA (.193), second in strikeouts (73), second in WHIP (1.01), seventh in ERA (3.59) and eighth in innings pitched (57.2). **Trystan Vrieling** is first in shutouts (1) and tied for first in complete games (1).

PROSPECT WATCH: Richmond's roster features four players are ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Giants prospects, including **Bo Davidson** (No. 3), **Parks Harber** (No. 16), **Diego Velasquez** (No. 24) and RHP **Yunior Marte** (No. 29). **Adrian Sugastey** is rated by Baseball America as the top defensive catcher in the Giants organization. MLB.com's top-30 Giants prospects list features three Richmond players, including Davidson (No. 6), Harber (No. 13) and INF **Maui Ahuna** (No. 18) and Marte (No. 25).

THIS DATE IN RICHMOND BASEBALL HISTORY

1958: The Richmond Virginians beat the Buffalo Bisons, 4-3, in 10 innings. With two on in the bottom of the 10th, Jonny Jaciuk singled to center to score Len Johnston and win the game, 4-3. **1964:** The Richmond Virginians beat the Toronto Maple Leafs, 2-1, at Parker Field in front of a crowd of 13,534, then the largest crowd for a regular season game in Parker Field's history. Mel Stottlemyre threw a complete game and allowed one unearned run, lowering his season ERA to 2.00. Stottlemyre also drove in the go-ahead run in the sixth to break a 1-1 tie with a groundout to third and Jack Reed beat the throw to the plate. **1993:** The Richmond Braves beat the Charlotte Knights, 3-2, at The Diamond. Ryan Klesko hit a solo homer in the fourth and Melvin Nieves followed with a two-run homer for a 3-0 Richmond lead. In the eighth, Bill Wertz threw behind Klesko. On the next pitch, Klesko threw his bat toward the pitcher, leading to a bench-clearing brawl.
