YESTERDAY: The Flying Squirrels lost to the Yard Goats, 3-1. **Yunior Marte** started for Richmond and pitched the longest outing of his career, throwing seven scoreless innings with six strikeouts. **Diego Velasquez** gave the Flying Squirrels a 1-0 lead in the bottom of the third with an RBI single. In the top of the eighth, Dyan Jorge tied the score with a sacrifice fly and the go-ahead run scored on an error. Roc Riggio added an RBI triple later in the inning.

POSTSEASON BOUND: The June 12 win clinched the Eastern League Southwest Division title for the Flying Squirrels, locking in a postseason berth. The Flying Squirrels will play the second-half division champion in the Division Series. Game 1 will be at the home of the second-half champion on Tues., Sept. 15. Game 2 and, if necessary, Game 3 will be at CarMax Park on Thurs., Sept. 17 and Sat., Sept. 18. If Richmond advances to the EL Championship Series, Game 1 will be at CarMax Park on Sun., Sept. 20. This year marks the fifth postseason appearance in franchise history and the first since 2023.

TODAY'S GAME: The Flying Squirrels continue a nine-game homestand with the fourth of six games against the Hartford Yard Goats, Double-A affiliate of the Colorado Rockies. Richmond won four-of-five in Hartford from April 14-18 and the series finale on April 19 was canceled. This series is the first of three consecutive home sets for Richmond against opponents from the Northeast Division.

RECORD YEAR: The Flying Squirrels' 10-game win streak from April 4-15 was the longest in franchise history, surpassing an eight-game win streak from May 5-13, 2021, also beginning with the second game of the season. The 55-36 record is the best in team history through 91 games, passing a 54-37 record in 2014. Richmond has won seven series, split six and lost three so far this year. After opening the season with a 27-7 record through May 13, the Flying Squirrels are 28-29 in their last 57 games since.

RELENTLESS: In their 55 wins this year, the Flying Squirrels have come from behind in 28 of them. In 18 of the wins, Richmond has taken the lead in the eighth inning or later. The Flying Squirrels have 10 walk-off wins at CarMax Park this season, including at least one in each home series. **Diego Velasquez** has three walk-off hits this year, all in 10th innings. **Drew Cavanaugh**, **Parks Harber** and **Dayson Croes** each have two walk-off winners this year. Richmond has three wins after trailing by five-or-more runs this season.

THE FLYING SQUIRRELS won the Southwest Division first-half title by seven games over second-place Erie and has the Eastern League's best overall record this season. Richmond leads all 30 Double-A teams in batting average (.270) and sacrifice flies (38) this season and rank second in doubles (175) and third in hits (820). The team has combined for 98 homers this year, surpassing 11 of the franchise's previous 15 season totals. The Flying Squirrels are on pace to set offensive single-season franchise records for batting average, runs, total bases, doubles, RBIs, stolen bases, OBP, SLG, OPS, sacrifice flies and hit by pitches. The Richmond pitching staff has thrown eight shutouts this season, which is tied for first in the Eastern League and tied for second in Double-A. At 33-15, the Flying Squirrels have the third-best home record in MiLB this season, trailing only High-A Bowling Green (35-9) and Triple-A Nashville (34-16).

THE YARD GOATS won the Northeast Division's first-half title with a 39-29 record, 2.5 games ahead of second-place Somerset. The Yard Goats will appear in the Eastern League playoffs for the second time in franchise history and the second time in the last three seasons. Hartford's roster features four players ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Rockies prospects, including RHP Jackson Cox (No. 8), LHP Griffin Herring (No. 12), 2B Roc Riggio (No. 15) and C Cole Messina (No. 23). MLB.com's top-30 Rockies prospects list features five Hartford players, including Herring (No. 9), Riggio (No. 10), Cox (No. 19), Messina (No. 21) and LHP Konner Eaton (No. 25).

FOR RICHMOND: Left-hander **Charlie McDaniel** makes his ninth Double-A start and his first against the Yard Goats. In his last start on Saturday night, he allowed two runs over five innings in a no-decision against the SeaWolves. McDaniel went 3-1 with a 3.99 ERA in nine starts with High-A Eugene before being promoted to Double-A on June 2. He was the Northwest League Pitcher of the Month for April after going 1-0 with a 1.10 ERA (2 ER/16.1 IP) in four starts. He pitched his first professional season in 2025 and split the season between Low-A San Jose and High-A Eugene, going 8-6 with a 3.68 ERA in 23 outings (12 starts). McDaniel signed with the Giants as a non-drafted free agent out of Presbyterian College in 2024 after being named First-Team All-Big South in his senior season. *For more on McDaniel, see page two.*

FOR HARTFORD: Left-hander Konner Eaton makes his 15 start of the year and the third of his career against the Flying Squirrels. In his last start on July 12, he pitched two innings and allowed one run. Eaton is a native of Disputanta, Va., and went to Prince George High School before playing three seasons at George Mason in Fairfax. He threw four innings and allowed six runs (five earned) at The Diamond on September 13, 2025. He pitched against Richmond in Hartford on April 16 and allowed two runs over four innings.

THE NEW GUYS: The Flying Squirrels added three players from High-A Eugene on Friday for their Double-A debuts: **Gavin Kilen**, **Dakota Jordan** and **Trevor Cohen**. Kilen, who was the 13th-overall pick in last summer's MLB Draft, was leading the Northwest League in doubles (27) and also ranked tied for second in extra-base hits (37), fourth in total bases (144), tied for fourth in hits (88), eighth in batting average (.282) and tied for eighth in runs scored (49). Jordan led the Northwest League in RBIs (66), extra-base hits (41) and total bases (171) and ranked tied for first in homers (18), second in SLG (.533), second in hits (93), third in doubles (22), fifth in batting average (.290), fifth in OPS (.879) and seventh in runs (50). Cohen led the league in hits (97) and runs (72) and ranked second in doubles (26), third in stolen bases (26), fourth in batting average (.297), tied for fourth in walks (48), sixth in total bases (136), seventh in extra-base hits (31) and eighth in OBP (.387). **Jancel Villarroel** joined the Flying Squirrels from Eugene this week and had an RBI single in his Double-A debut on Tuesday.

GO, DIEGO, GO! In his last 16 games since June 28, **Diego Velasquez** is batting .482 (26-for-54) with a homer, four doubles, 10 walks, eight RBIs and four stolen bases. Since joining the Flying Squirrels in July 2024, Velasquez has played 247 games. In Richmond's franchise history, Velasquez ranks second in sacrifices (19), third in walks (121), third in OBP (.377, min. 400 PA), tied for fourth in stolen bases (40) and sixth in hits (244). This month, he leads MiLB in OBP (.552) and ranks second in batting average (.469).

JACK ATTACK: In his last 29 games since June 5, **Jack Payton** is batting .350 (36-for-103) with a homer, five doubles, a triple, 10 RBIs, 10 walks and 13 runs scored. He has 10 multi-hit performances in his last 27 games dating back to June 9, including seven two-hit games and three three-hit games.

TOP SKIPPER: Flying Squirrels manager **Dennis Pelfrey** has led the team to 315 wins in his career, which is a franchise record all-time wins record for a manager. He passed the record with Richmond's 6-1 win at Binghamton on May 23, 2025. From 2011-2013, **Dave Machemer** won 216 games as Richmond's manager, leading the team to the Eastern League postseason for in 2011. Pelfrey, who has been with Richmond since the 2022 season, led the team to back-to-back postseason appearances for the first time in franchise history in 2022 and 2023. He also managed the 2021 Eugene Emeralds to the High-A West championship. Of Richmond managers since 1954, Pelfrey is second in wins behind Eddie Haas (1968, 1981-84), who had 351 wins.

IN THE LEAGUE LEADERS: In the Eastern League, **Diego Velasquez** is fourth in batting average (.307) and fifth in OBP (.398). **Bo Davidson** is tied for third in homers (19), sixth in RBIs (54) and eighth in SLG (.521). **Parks Harber** is tied for seventh in doubles (20), ninth in batting average (.284) and ninth in OPS (.879). **Jonah Cox** is first in triples (5) and sixth in stolen bases (27). **Tyler Vogel** is first in saves (13). **Trystan Vrieling** is first in shutouts (1), tied for first in complete games (1), sixth in ERA (4.13) and fourth in BAA (.233). **Cesar Perdomo** is eighth in strikeouts (89).

PROSPECT WATCH: Richmond's roster features five players are ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Giants prospects, including **Dakota Jordan** (No. 7), **Gavin Kilen** (No. 8), **Trevor Cohen** (No. 9), **Yunior Marte** (No. 19) and **Diego Velasquez** (No. 29). **Adrián Sugastey** is rated by Baseball America as the top defensive catcher in the Giants organization. MLB.com's top-30 Giants prospects list features five Richmond players, including Kilen (No. 4), Jordan (No. 5), Cohen (No. 8), **Maui Ahuna** (No. 18) and Marte (No. 25).

THIS DATE IN RICHMOND BASEBALL HISTORY

1931: The Richmond Byrds (Colts) of the Class-A Eastern League beat the Springfield Ponies, 5-0, at Tate Field. Jimmy Pattison threw a nine-inning no-hitter. The 21-year-old retired the first 15 batters in order. Pattison had briefly pitched for the Brooklyn Robins in the majors in 1929. **1967:** The Atlanta Braves beat the Richmond Braves, 7-6, in an exhibition game at Parker Field. Tom House was called up from Kinston to start for Richmond and allowed five runs over 6.1 innings. He hit two RBI singles at the plate. Bobby Cox had a hit and scored two runs. Tito Francona went 4-for-5 for Atlanta. **2022:** The Flying Squirrels beat the Bowie Baysox, 7-6, at The Diamond. The Baysox scored six runs in the first two innings to take a 6-0 lead. Ricardo Genovés hit a three-run homer to close the score to 6-3 in the third. In the sixth, Brett Auerbach hit a solo homer and Jacob Heyward drove a two-run shot to tie the game, 6-6. Diego Rincones hit a go-ahead single in the seventh. The six-run deficit tied the team record for the largest come-from-behind win in team history.
