Tonight's Game

The Clippers will send RHP **Justin Campbell** to the mound tonight, looking to snap the skid before it reaches 3G (last 3G losing streak: 8/25-8/27 at Indianapolis). The Bats will counter with LHP **Kent Emanuel**. Columbus is 18-23 (.439) versus left handers this year. Emanuel has pitched against the Clippers three times in his career, going 2-0 with a 4.72ERA (13.1IP, 15H, 7R, 7ER, 5BB, 14K).

vs. the Bats

Columbus was 7-11 against Louisville last year, going 4-10 in the last 14G to lose the season series for the third straight year (4-0 from 2018-22). The Clippers have won each series so far this year (3-2 from 5/19-5/23, 4-2 from 6/30-7/5). **Kahlil Watson** has hit .348 (16x46) with 2HR and 6RBI in 12G against Louisville in his career (**Milan Tolentino** has hit 4HR with 18RBI in 29G).

Start with a Bang

Over the last 36G, the Clippers have plated 249 runs (most in the IL, 6.9 per), with 158 (63%) tallied in the first four innings of the game. Opponents have only 78 in the first four innings of the last 36G, but are outscoring the Clippers 120-91 thereafter. Tuesday night's loss snapped a 64G win streak when Columbus led after the 7th (first loss since 8/22/25; 78 straight wins when leading after the 8th; 8/7/25).

Bombs Away

Columbus leads all of pro baseball in homers hit since 7/28 (76), entering today with the 3rd most in franchise history (193, one of four teams in the IL with at least 190, zero PCL teams have that many; 10 of 13 teams with at least 160 in Triple-A are in the IL). Columbus has only 89HR on the road, but is averaging at least one a game for the seventh straight season (zero times in previous 14 seasons).

Always On

Cooper Ingle has lost 26 points on his batting average over his last 24G (.224, 19x85) and 68 points from his slugging, with only 4XBH (HR on Saturday snapped streak of 66AB without), but his OBP has dipped only four points in that time, as he has 29BB in 114PA. He ranks 2nd in the IL in walks (81; **Christian Cairo** is 1st with 89BB), having accumulated them in only 428PA (19%, Cairo has 505PA).

Heating Up

Kahlil Watson has hit safely in each of the last 6G (.385/.407/.808), picking up 3HR and 9RBI (.204/.339/.355 with 4HR and 15RBI in first 26G after being optioned on 7/22). Watson has played just over twice as many games with the Clippers this year (88) as last year (43), but has an identical .477SLG. His next steal will be his 100th in the minors (9SB in MLB), but he has 13CS this year (of 37 in career).

Twenty Town

Kody Huff snapped a 12G homerless streak on Tuesday, to reach 20 on the season (.362, 17x47, .574SLG since 8/23). Columbus now has three players with at least 20 and a couple more with 19 (**Kahlil Watson** hit 19th on Sunday, **Cooper Ingle** hit 19th on Saturday), marking the second time in history (2019) the Clippers have five players with at least 19HR (never had five with at least 20HR).

Capitalizing

George Valera has played sparingly since 7/28, appearing in only 15 of 36G, but he has slashed .368/.455/.807 with 6HR and 14RBI when he does take the field (hit .148/.250/.182 with 0HR and 7RBI in 26G prior, 6/10-7/26). The hot streak includes hits in 14 of 15G and, dating to a game prior, he has reached base in 15 straight (.443OBP). In his Clipper career, he has hammered 49HR (t-17th all time).

Power and Speed

Milan Tolentino popped his 20th homer Saturday night (3HR in last 9G) and picked up his 18th steal on Friday, as he attempts to secure the second 20-20 season in franchise history. He scored the first such season last year and, since the start of 2025, he is 2nd in the IL with 41HR (t-25th with 38SB). **Kahlil Watson** is sitting at 19HR (career high, had 11HR through 5/29) and 22SB (three off career best).

Busting Out

Dayan Frias was 1x25 (.040) with an RBI triple from 8/20-8/28, but has gone 9x31 with 4HR and 7RBI in 6G since (also has 4BB). He tied a career high with his 20th steal Saturday night (had 20SB between Akron and Columbus last year). **Tyresse Turner** is hitting 2x12 (.167) in 5G since being promoted, but has drawn 5BB (.444OBP) and collected 4SB (62SB against just 6CS in the last three years).

This Date in Clipper History

9/10/2010

In game three of the IL semis, Scranton/WB's first two batters reached base before the next 26 batters were sent down in order by **Yohan Pino** (7.0IP), **Zach Putnam** (1.0IP) and **Vinnie Pestano** (1.0IP). **Jose Constanza** plated **Luke Carlin** in the 8th for the game's only run and a 2-1 series lead. The Clippers would score 60 runs over the remainder of the postseason (6G), winning the National Championship.

First Half Wrap

Despite being eliminated from playoff contention on the penultimate Sunday of the first half, the Clippers were 41-33 and finished with their first winning record in the front half since the season was split in 2023 (averaged 32 wins from 2023-25, topping out at 34-38, .472, last season). From 4/22-6/17, they spent every day between 3.0 and 6.0 games off the lead, while occupying anywhere between 4th and 13th in the standings. A late push (15-6 from 5/16-6/9) got them to within 2.5 before derailing with a 3G losing streak at Indy to seal their fate. On the back half, Columbus has posted just one winning record, clinching a playoff berth in 2024 with a mark of 48-26 (.649).

Huntington (Small) Park

In each of the first 11 seasons after the move downtown (2009-19), Huntington Park ranked among the top two in the IL in homers per game. With the arrival of six new parks to the IL in 2021, Huntington Park finished 4th, 6th and 10th from 2021-23, respectively. The 2024 season saw a return to the top (2.96; 108HR hit by the Clippers, most for the home team in HP's existence), but it dropped back to 7th last year (2.31). Including the postseason, the Clippers have been out-homered over the life of the park (1,496 to 1,450).

Challenging Times

The Clippers are 189-149 (.559) in pitch reviews, with batters going 95-88 (.519) and pitchers/catchers going 94-61 (.606). They have run out of challenges in 48G and have not challenged in 8G. Last season, they were correct 43.1% of the time (2nd worst in the IL).

Extras, Read All About Them

Columbus is 5-4 in extra innings this year, after having gone .500 in each of the last two seasons. Since the start of the 2018 season, when baserunners started appearing at second base, the Clippers are 55-37 when playing past regulation (.598, best in the IL; no other team above .570), including 27-17 at home (.614; 5-7 in last 12G). Of the 92G to require extra play, 73 have been resolved after one frame (including nine DH games) and only one has gone past the 12th (5-4 loss in 13 on 9/20/22 at Toledo).

On the Runs

Starting with the embiggened 150G schedule in 2022, the Clippers scored over 800 runs in three consecutive seasons from 2022-2024 (855, 808 and 805 runs, respectively; accounting for the 3rd, 4th and 5th best totals in team history). Following a steep decline last season (670, fewest scored in a full season since 2018), Columbus is looking to top 800 again (on pace for 842, would rank as 4th most all-time; record is 898 scored in 1983).

On the Run

On the basepaths, the Clippers are making a run at the franchise mark in stolen bases, with 166 through 137G (on pace for 178SB). The team record was set in 2024 when Columbus swiped an even 200, but the team speed was throttled last year (129SB; still, the 2nd highest total since the Cleveland affiliation started in 2009). However, with 50CS so far, the Clippers are also pacing for the most times caught stealing of the Cleveland affiliation (54; nabbed 51 times in 2024).

Crazy Eighthths

From the 8th inning on, the Clippers have scored an IL-best 190 runs while crafting a .888OPS (over 60 points better than all other teams). On the flipside, Columbus has given up 129 runs from the 8th on, resulting in a +61 run differential (Clippers are getting outscored 309-201 from innings 5-7).

Juiced is Loose

In the Huntington Park Era (since 2009), Columbus leads the IL with 81 grand slams and 2,003RBI (led IL in RBI in 2010, '11, '12, '17, '18 and '22). Collecting an IL-best 10 grand slams last season, it marked their fifth straight season with at least four (118RBI last year; had only 97RBI in 2024, worst in a 140+G season since 2016).

In Big Trouble

The Clipper pitching staff is trending toward the worst ERA in club history, sitting at 5.37 through 137G. Since the reorganization of the minor leagues in 2021, Columbus has twice finished the season with a 5+ ERA (current record is 5.32, set in 2023), after having done so just once in the first 43 seasons (5.08 in 1983). Additionally, the staff is pacing to give up 200HR (would be 2nd most in franchise history; 214HR allowed in 2023).

Department of Defense

The Columbus defense is sitting at 7th in the IL this year (.980), following a 2025 that saw a franchise record (.985, led the IL). On 4/10 at Worcester, the defense collapsed for the first 5E game since 8/27/24 (topped out at 3E in a game twice last year and had fewer than 5E in 21 of 26 series). The Clippers have played flawlessly in 75G this season (43-32, .573), after doing so in nearly 60% of games last year (44-42, .512), including 16 straight from 6/20-7/8/25 (longest streak in the IL over the last 20 years).

Good Baseball

CJ Kayfus bunted a runner into scoring position with a single on 7/5 vs. Louisville, with that runner kicking off a 5-run inning that led the Clippers to victory. Since the start of the 2018 season, Columbus is 90-23 (.796) in games in which a run is scored after a good bunt attempt, including a 7-2 mark this season (.778, blew 7-run lead in one of the losses; went 23-2 in 2018).

To the End

The Clippers have the 8th most last at bat wins this year (15, three off the lead) while playing in the 13th most games decided in the last at bat (28, Norfolk has 39). Since the start of the 2024 season, Columbus has played in 102G decided in the last at bat (2nd most in the IL), going 49-53 (.480, 16th best winning percentage; 3rd most wins, 2nd most losses).

Manager Profile

Andy Tracy made his Clippers debut in 2021, following **Tony Mansolino's** championship rookie year in 2019 (sixth Clipper skipper to win Governors' Cup in first season; **Gene Michael**-'79, **Joe Altobelli**-'80, **Frank Verdi**-'81, **Bucky Dent**-'87 and **Mike Sarbaugh**-'10). This season marks Tracy's seventh year as a manager (first was with Williamsport in the Philadelphia system), as he holds a career record of 460-469 (.495), 430-423 with Columbus (.504).

Worth the Wait:

Campbell made his professional debut on 4/2 vs. West Michigan, 1,355 days after being taken in the supplemental 1st round of the 2022 draft. His career was delayed by surgeries on his right elbow in both May of 2023 and April of 2024 (also had surgery on right wrist in October of 2024). He proceeded to allow 1ER in his first 6GS (13.1IP, 38.2 pitches per start), while walking just a pair of 48BF (4%; also had 18K, 38%). Campbell was promoted to Triple-A on 7/1, but injured his oblique during warmups and left the game before it started (eventually placed on the DL).

Wilding Out:

In his final start with Lake County, Campbell issued 3BB (11BF) and then surrendered 22BB across 9GS with Akron (152BF, 15%), including a pair of outings with 5BB each. His strikeout rate dipped to 29% in that stretch (48K), but he snagged a career high with 8K on 6/6 at Chesapeake (0BB).

No Homers Club (You're Allowed to Have One):

Among all full season minor league pitchers with at least 230BF this season, Campbell is one of 13 that has allowed a single longball (one pitcher has 0HR). That shot came on 6/13 at Erie, snapping a streak of 158BF without a homer to start his career (87BF since).

Buckling Down:

Opposing hitters have had 93 chances with runners on base against Campbell this season, batting .120 (10x83) with only 3XBH (all doubles, .157SLG) and 10BB (.215OBP). Campbell has whiffed 38% of those hitters (35K), while inducing 4GIDP. With the bases empty, opponents have fared a little better, slashing .218/.320/.293 with a HR in 133AB (42K in 153BF, 27%).

June Swoon:

In his first 10G of the year (March-May), Maltud gave up 15ER in 50.2IP (2.66ERA), holding the opposition to a .195 average (38x186, 4HR). He gave up multiple runs in each of 5G in June (17.1IP, 15ER) and struggled in July also (22.0IP, 12ER), as he posted a 6.18ERA (39.1IP, 27ER) over the two months. Opposing hitters batted .294 (48x163) with 10HR in 10G from June-July (9HR to last 107BF). Since the calendar has flipped to August, Maltud has regained his early season form, turning in a 2.93ERA (30.2IP, 10ER) through six outings.

Undecided:

Through the month of June, Maltud was the only pitcher in the IL with at least 10GS that had not taken a loss and his lone win (4/11 at Worcester) made him the only starter with a single decision. He is 6-1 in 11G since the start of July, winning back to back starts to begin the month and suffering his only loss of the year in his 17th start (7/22 at St. Paul). Despite a 3.77ERA as a starter and run support of 5.9 per game, Maltud has left with the lead only 12 times because the offense is averaging 2.8 runs while he is the pitcher of record, including 12G with two runs or fewer (5G with zero runs).

Efficiency is Key:

Through 126 innings started in 26G, Maltud has retired the side with fewer than 10 pitches on 17 occasions, including 4-pitch innings on 4/3 vs. Indianapolis and 8/28 at Indy, while turning in 24 innings of more than 20. He has hit 30+ four times, thanks to an 11-pitch battle vs. Iowa's **Pedro Ramirez** on 4/17 (walk, 34 in the inning) and a 14-pitch skirmish with Buffalo's **Yohendrick Pinango** on 4/23 (groundout, 30 total). He ranks 4th in the IL with 15.6 pitches per inning.

Among the Leader Beans:

Entering today's game, Maltud is 3rd in the IL with a 3.88ERA (12 qualifiers, dropped out of the top five after allowing 7ER in 3.2IP at St. Paul on 7/22). From his quality start win on 4/11 at Worcester through his quality start on 5/25 at Toledo, he crafted the 2nd best ERA in the IL, at 2.14ERA (42.0IP, 10ER). Additionally, Maltud's 0.95WHIP in that time ranked 2nd best (1.24WHIP on the season places 4th).

Stepping Up:

With runners in scoring position this season, Maltud has held the opposition to a line of .165/.270/.216, surrendering just 1HR in 97AB. With a runner at first base, he has struggled to a line of .287/.354/.506 while allowing 4HR (87AB) and with the bases empty, the bad guys have hit .238/.299/.394 with 11HR in 277AB.

In Relief:

Maltud has pitched four times in relief this season (previous 5G out of the bullpen came among first 7G as a pro), piggybacking **Trenton Denholm** on 4/30 vs. Toledo (3.0IP, 40 pitches), **Daniel Espino** on 6/2 vs. Omaha (4.0IP, 81 pitches), **Austin Peterson** on 8/9 at Syracuse (3.1IP, 47 pitches) and **Justin Campbell** on 8/28 (5.1IP, 80 pitches). He has registered a 4.60ERA out of the bullpen (15.2IP, 18H, 8R, 8ER, 4BB, 21K).
