RHP TANNER GORDON (0-1, 5.94) vs. RHP CRISTIAN MENA (1-2, 3.48)

TODAY'S GAME: Albuquerque holds a 1-0 series lead after winning game one last night, 6-4 ... Tanner Gordon is expected to take the hill for Albuquerque while Cristian Mena is slated to start for Reno.

B2B: With the win last night, the Isotopes have won back-to-back games in Reno for the first time since June 23-24, 2019, after winning the final contest of 2024, 7-6, in 10 innings.

NO DINGERS FOR YOU: Albuquerque has not allowed a homer in four-straight games, its longest stretch without relenting a dinger since August 15-19, 2018, five games.

DOUBLE TROUBLE: Albuquerque recorded five doubles last night, the most in a contest since August 17, 2024, at Round Rock, also five.

OPENING FRAME: The Isotopes plated four runs on four hits in the opening frame yesterday, the most runs scored by the club in the first frame since bringing home five in Las Vegas on July 30, 2024.

DUKE CITY HR RECORD: Sam Hilliard homered with two outs in the first inning on April 15, his 79th in an Isotopes uniform – which ties Mike Busch (Dukes, 1993-96) the most in Albuquerque professional baseball history.

ISOTOPES RBI RECORD: Hilliard has 223 RBI with Albuquerque, which ranks third among career leaders in team history. Jordan Patterson (2016-18) is second with 229 RBI ... Hilliard has an RBI in three of his last four contests (four).

SAM I AM: Sam Hilliard drew a walk last night to extend his on-base streak to 14, every game he's played in 2025. It's tied for the third-longest active on-base streak in the Pacific Coast League. It was just his fifth hitless game of the year ... Dating back to 2024, has a 22-game on-base streak in Triple-A (June 11-19, 2024).

KEEP IT CLEAN: Albuquerque was charged with three errors yesterday, tied for the most in a game in 2025 (also: April 6 vs. Salt Lake) ... The Isotopes have 14 miscues for the year, tied for the sixth-fewest among Triple-A teams and tied for the second-fewest in the PCL.

RUNS ALLOWED: The Isotopes held their opponent to four runs or fewer for the 10th time this season last night.

TAKE YOUR BASE: Albuquerque issued 10 walks last night, the third-most allowed on the year and third time eclipsing the double-digit mark.

WARMIN' UP: Warming Bernabel registered two doubles last night, the ninth time in his career with two doubles in a contest and second this year (also: April 15 vs. El Paso). It was his sixth multi-hit effort of the year ... Over his last eight games, is 10-for-29 with five doubles, two homers, nine RBI and four walks

MILLER TIME: Owen Miller mashed his second homer of the year yesterday and singled for his fourth multi-hit game of the season and second-straight. Is 4-for-8 over his last two games. ... Has an RBI in five of his last six games (seven total).

YF: Yanquiel Fernandez singled, doubled and drove in a run yesterday. Over his last four contests, is 5-for-14 with three extra-base hits (one double and two homers) and five RBI. It was his fifth multi-knock contest of 2025 and second-straight. ... Has five homers on the year, T-3rd in the PCL.

THE VET: Austin Nola connected on a season-high three hits (two singles and one double) last night for his second multi-hit game of the year. It's his most hits in a contest since also tallying three on August 4, 2022, with San Diego against Colorado.

RITTER: Ryan Ritter doubled last night, his first XBH since April 11 at Sugar Land (HR), seven games ... Is 6-for-37 with 13 strikeouts over his last 11 games, although he has drawn 12 walks during the stretch (.392 OBP, .162 average) ... Has 16 walks on the year, T-3rd in the PCL.

STERLIN: Sterlin Thompson went 0-for-4 yesterday, ending his six-game hit streak (7x21). ... Six of his 13 hits have gone for extra bases (five doubles and one homer).

KEST DADDY: Keston Hiura was 2-for-4 with a pair of RBI hits in Game 2 Sunday, his fourth multi-hit game of the season and second in his last five contests ... T-8th in the PCL in walks.

TRIPLE-A DEBUT: Brendan Hardy made his Triple-A debut yesterday and tossed 1.0 shutout inning, allowing two walks with one punchout.

OPPOSING STARTER: Reno's Tommy Henry allowed five runs over 6.0 innings yesterday, the first opposing starter to complete at least 6.0 innings this season.

RENO TIES: Connor Kaiser was Albuquerque's primary shortstop each of the last two seasons, playing in a total of 180 games. **John Curtiss**, currently on Reno's IL, compiled a 3.96 ERA in 43 relief outings for the Isotopes in 2024. **Scott McGough** appeared in 43 contests with Albuquerque in 2018.

NUCLEI NOTES

SKIPPER: Pedro Lopez enters his 21st year as a minor league manager and third guiding the Isotopes. He is the eighth manager in club history ... Spent 2021 as Albuquerque's hitting coach and 2022 as its bench coach ... Notched his 1,000th career managerial victory June 4, 2023 at Salt Lake, 7-1 ... Managed in the Texas Rangers (2001-05, 2007) and New York Mets (2011-19) organizations while claiming the 2014 Eastern League Championship with Double-A Binghamton. Lopez was drafted in the 21st round by the San Diego Padres in the 1988 MLB Draft and spent 13 years in the minor leagues, reaching Triple-A on four occasions.

HOMETOWN KID: Jordan Pacheco begins his fourth season as the Isotopes hitting coach ... An Albuquerque native and 2004 graduate of La Cueva High School, Pacheco then attended the University of New Mexico (2005-07), where he was one of the most prolific offensive players in school history (.384, 59 2B, 25 HR, 145 RBI) ... Drafted by Rockies in the 9th round in 2007 and made his MLB debut with Colorado in 2011.

CHRIS MICHALAK: Begins his third season as Isotopes pitching coach ... Pitched for the Albuquerque Dukes in 2000, followed by stints with the Isotopes in 2004 and 2008 ... Started second-to-last game in Dukes history, giving up two runs in 6.0 innings during Game 4 of a PCL First Round playoff series at Memphis Sept. 9, 2000 ... Appeared in 61 Major League games (24 starts) over five seasons with the Arizona Diamondbacks (1998), Toronto Blue Jays (2001) Texas Rangers (2001-02) and Cincinnati Reds (2006) ... 12th round selection by the Athletics in 1993 ... Has been in the coaching ranks since 2009, including stops as the pitching coach for the Hagerstown Suns (2010-11), Potomac Nationals (2012-13) and Harrisburg Senators (2014-17). He was also the Minor League pitching coordinator for the Miami Marlins from 2018-20 and coached in the Washington Nationals organization from 2021-22.

MICHAEL RYAN: Enters his second year with the Rockies organization as the Isotopes bench coach ... The former outfielder played in 33 games for the Isotopes and hit nine homers during the 2008 campaign. He and Michalak were teammates on that squad for four days in late July ... Entered the coaching ranks in 2012 as a coach for the Double-A Altoona Curve (Pirates). He then managed in the Pirates organization at three levels for seven seasons with stops at Single-A West Virginia (2013-14), High-A Bradenton (2015-16) and Double-A Altoona (2017-19), while winning the Florida State League in 2016 and Eastern League in 2017. Ryan compiled a 221-197 managerial record with Altoona—the most wins for a manager in Curve history ... He also managed in the Cubs organization (High-A South Bend, 2021 and Double-A Tennessee, 2022-June 2023) ... A 5th round draft pick by the Minnesota Twins in 1996, played in 149 MLB games over parts of five seasons with the Twins (2002-05) and Angels (2010) ... Last Angels player to wear 27 prior to Mike Trout's call-up in 2011.

SPLIT-SEASON PLAYOFF FORMAT: For the third-straight year, the Pacific Coast League will use a split-season format to determine playoff participants. With one 10 team division, the first half winner (concluding June 22) will host the second half winner (beginning June 24) in a three-game set. The winner will then face the International League champion for the Triple-A Championship in Las Vegas, NV, on September 27.

BALLS AND STRIKES: The Challenge System, in its third full year in the PCL, will be used exclusively for every game this season. Under this system, the home plate umpire will call balls or strikes while each team has the opportunity to challenge the umpire's call with two challenges per game, retaining one for each successful challenge.
