June 25: Flying Squirrels 6, RubberDucks 5 (10): Maick Collado had three hits and two RBI, but Richmond scored on a passed ball in the ninth to tie the game and scored four times in the bottom of the tenth to walk-off the RubberDucks in game three of the series.

Today's starter: Josh Hartle makes his first second half start on Friday night. The left-hander is coming off a career-high 6.1 innings pitched in a no-decision against Altoona Curve (his former organization) last week in Akron (2 hits, 1 run, 3 walks, 4 strikeouts). Hartle is making his third start of the season against Richmond. He is 0-1 with a 2.61 ERA with five strikeouts over 10.1 innings pitched against the Flying Squirrels. Since giving up a career-high nine runs and three home runs against Harrisburg on May 3, Hartle has gone 1-3 with a 3.00 ERA with 28 strikeouts over 36.0 innings pitched in his last seven starts.

Power month: The Akron RubberDucks offense has crushed 25 home runs and scored 120 runs through the 20 games in June. That marks the most home runs in a month for the RubberDucks offense. The 120 runs are the third most in the Eastern League in June. Akron needs to score 10 runs over the month's final four games for June to be the Ducks highest scoring month of the season. 10 different RubberDucks hitters have homered this month with **Alfonsin Rosario** leading the way with six long balls while **Jaison Chourio** and **Wuifredo Antunez** each have four home runs.

Dependable Devers: Jose Devers has been one of Akron's best hitters over the last two months. After batting .183 in April, the RubberDucks infielder is batting .296 with four doubles, two triples, two home runs and 20 RBI since May 1. He's scored 29 runs in 44 games over the last two months and raised his season average to .263. Devers has been really good against Richmond this season batting .273 with nine RBI.

Long man: Carter Rustad has been a dependable option for the RubberDucks in the bullpen this season. The right-hander has a 2.82 ERA with 41 strikeouts over 22 appearances. More impressive, Rustad has worked 38.1 innings going multiple innings in 17 outings. Those 38.1 innings are the third most by an Eastern League reliever this season.

Walk this way: After leading the Eastern League and ranking fourth in all of Double-A in walks in 2025, the RubberDucks batters are once again showing impressive patience in 2026. Akron's 340 walks rank first in Eastern League and second in Double-A this season. Eight different Akron batters have walked 20+ times this season. **Nick Mitchell** leads the RubberDucks with 39 walks (ninth most in EL).

RubberDucks and Flying Squirrels: Akron is facing Richmond for the third of four series this season and the second of two at CarMax Park. Akron is 4-11 against Richmond and 1-8 on the road this year. Akron is 109-110 all-time against Richmond. Top prospects in the series includes:

Speed Racer: Alex Mooney swiped his team-leading 18th base of the season when he stole third in the second inning on June 25. After leading the club with 25 steals in 115 games played in 2025, Mooney has swiped six bases each month of the 2026 campaign. Mooney and **Nick Mitchell** (11 stolen bases) are the only two RubberDucks with double digit steals this season.

Red hot Rosario: Alfonsin Rosario is on fire this month. The RubberDucks outfielder is batting .324/.1.076 with four doubles, a triple, six home runs and 24 RBI in June. His month got off to a hot start when he hit .357/.431/.905 with three doubles, a triple, six home runs and 20 RBI during the month opening road trip to Chesapeake and Erie. He now leads the RubberDucks team with 12 homers this season. Rosario has reached base in his last 11 games.

Pitching power: The Akron RubberDucks are third in Double-A and first in the Eastern League in ERA with a 4.23 ERA. The Ducks staff have 651 strikeouts over 617.0 innings pitched. Akron pitchers appear in the Eastern League top 10 in ERA, wins, starts, games and innings pitched **Jack Jasiak** is tied for the Eastern League in wins with seven this season. He would be the first Akron reliever to rank among the EL wins leaders in a season since Skylar Arias won the fifth most games in the league (7) in 2021. He is one win away from tying **Bradley Hanner** (8 wins in 2024 and 2023) and **Josh Martin** (8 wins in 2015) for most wins by an Akron reliever since 2010. **Steven Wright's** 9 wins in 2009 are the most by an Akron reliever since at least 2005.

Learning Double-A: Jaison Chourio is starting to find his groove at Double-A. After going hitless in his first two Double-A games and then going on the IL for a week, Chourio is batting .300/.403/.491 with 24 runs scored, 33 hits, four home runs and 16 RBI in his last 29 games. Chourio hit his first professional multi-home run and career-high five RBI game on June 2 and hit a game tying solo home run in the ninth inning on June 11. He has four homers in June, which is one away from setting a new career-high for most homers in a month. Since being promoted to Akron, he ranks six in the Eastern League in OBP (.390).

#26 Manager Greg DiCenzo enters his sixth season with the Guardians organization. The 2025 season will be DiCenzo's third as RubberDucks manager, and fifth as a manager in Cleveland's organization. He's led the RubberDucks to a 157-118 record in two seasons as Akron's manager including an Eastern League playoff appearance in 2024.

Prior to becoming Triple-A Columbus' bench coach in 2023, DiCenzo spent the 2021 and 2022 seasons as the manager in High-A Lake County. He guided the Captains to a 141-108 record in his two seasons including a Midwest League finals appearance in 2022.

A native of Duxbury, MA, DiCenzo was the head baseball coach at Holy Cross for 12 seasons prior to joining the Cleveland organization. The Crusaders went 137-109 in Patriot League play during his tenure, including a 2017 Patriot League Championship, and posted 20-win seasons in 10 of those 12 years.

#48 Hitting Coach Jordan Becker enters his seventh season with the Guardians organization and third with the RubberDucks. In 2023, Becker served as the hitting coach for Lake County.

Becker joined the Cleveland organization in 2019 after a collegiate coaching career that saw stops at Riverside Community College and New Mexico State University.

#43 Hitting Coach Cole Nieto enters his fifth season in the Guardians organization and first season in Akron. Nieto joins the RubberDucks after serving as the hitting coach for the Lynchburg Hillcats in 2024 and their Carolina League championship season in 2025.

A graduate of St. Ignatius High School in Cleveland, Nieto played four years at Baldwin Wallace University in Berea. While at Baldwin Wallace, he hit .341 with 17 home runs and 109 RBI in 137 career games.

#55 Pitching Coach Angus Adams enters his first season in the Guardians organization and first season in Akron. Prior to joining the RubberDucks, Adams served as a performance coach for Tread Athletics and was a pitching coach at Elmira College.

#54 Pitching Coach Michael Poole enters his fourth season in the Guardians organization and third season with the RubberDucks. He will be a pitching coach in 2025 after spending 2024 as Akron's assistant pitching coach. Prior to joining the RubberDucks, Poole was the pitching development coach on the Arizona Complex Academy staff.

A native of [Akron](#), Poole played at Cuyahoga Community College and Lake Erie College before starting his coaching career at Inspiration Academy (FL) in 2019. Poole was an assistant coach at LSU-Eunice for the Bengals D2 JUCO World Series Championship season in 2021.

#33 Bench Coach Yan Rivera enters his fifth season in the Guardians organization and first season in Akron. Prior to coming to Akron, Rivera spent 2025 as the bench coach for Lake County and 2024 as the manager for the ACL Guardians.

Rivera is the son of former Cleveland minor league manager and Toronto Blue Jays coach Luis Rivera.

#47 Development Coach Gustavo Nava enters his second season with the Guardians organization and first season with the RubberDucks. Prior to coming to Akron, Nava served as the Development coach for Lynchburg in their 2025 Carolina League championship season.

Athletic Trainer Derrik Diaz enters his ninth season in the Guardians organization and third season with the RubberDucks. Diaz was the Eastern League Athletic Trainer of the Year in 2024. Prior to coming to Akron, Diaz served as the head athletic trainer for the Dominican Republic Complex in 2023.

Assistant Athletic Trainer Laura Gutiérrez-Sogel enters her third season in the Guardians organization and first season in Akron. Prior to coming to the RubberDucks, Gutiérrez-Sogel spent the 2025 season as the Assistant Athletic Trainer in Lake County.

Strength and Conditioning Coach Jack Baldwin enters his third season with the Guardians organization and first season in Akron. Prior to joining the RubberDucks, Baldwin served as the Strength and Conditioning coach for Lynchburg in 2025.

Mental Performance Coach Andie McGregor enters her third season with the Guardians. She previously worked as a Mental Performance Coach at IMG Academy, supporting middle school, high school and post-grad student athletes in the baseball program. Also served as a Mental Performance intern with the New York Mets, working with the FCL Mets during the 2021 season. Has a Master of Science in Educational Psychology – Sport Psychology at Florida State University and a Bachelor of Science in Exercise Science at Georgia College & State University.

Baseball Technology Fellow Ryan Chambliss enters his first season in Akron. He spent the 2025 season with the Guardians ACL affiliate.

We Are the RubberDucks

On October 29, 2013, then team owner **Ken Babby** and general manager **Jim Pfander** stood before a capacity audience at the Akron Civic Theater and announced that the team would be known henceforth as the **Akron RubberDucks**. In addition to being symbolic of the fun, family-friendly brand of entertainment offered by minor league baseball, the name also honors Akron's long history as the "**Rubber Capital of the World**." Brandiose Marketing of San Diego, California designed the team logo, colors, and various marks and insignias. Please note that for print coverage, *RubberDucks* is spelled as one word with a capital "D." In broadcast coverage, referring to the team as "*the 'Ducks*" is an acceptable variation of the team's nickname.
