## TODAY'S HEADLINES

**LAST TIME OUT:** In a back-and-forth affair, the Saints broke out for 13 runs on 11 hits in a 13-7 victory over Omaha on Tuesday. The Saints took the first lead of the game on a Dalton Shuffield two-run double in the second inning. Caleb Boushley retired the first nine batters he faced before allowing six consecutive hits, including back-to-back homers in the fourth, allowing six runs before retiring the next six batters. The Saints proceeded to score in each of the final five innings, scoring nine runs against the Omaha bullpen to break the game open. The Saints hit a season-high four home runs, including a three-run blast from Michael Helman in the eighth to get the Saints to 13 runs.

**REHAB ROUNDTABLE:** The Minnesota Twins sent outfielder Byron Buxton to St. Paul on a Major League rehab assignment on Wednesday. Buxton will be making his fifth rehab stint with St. Paul since 2021. In 11 games with the Saints, Buxton has hit .324 with three home runs, sporting a 1.081 OPS. Six of his 11 hits with the Saints have gone for extra bases. He joins Josh Winder, who was added to the St. Paul roster on May 8 on Major League rehab. Winder has thrown 4.0 innings, allowing five runs (four earned) on six hits, walking four and striking out two.

**GO DIEGO, GO:** In the Saints' 13-7 victory over Omaha on Tuesday, Diego A. Castillo went 4-for-4 with a walk, reaching base in all five plate appearances. It marks his second four-hit game of the season, with the other coming a month prior on April 14. He is the third player in the International League to record multiple four-hit games this year. He is the 14<sup>th</sup> player in franchise history to reach base in all five-or-more plate appearances.

**IN ST. PAUL, THE STORM CHASES YOU:** The St. Paul offense has historically stepped up against Omaha at CHS Field. Below is how the Saints have fared offensively against each team that has played at least 12 games at CHS Field:

**ROUNDING AND SWIPING BASES:** In the Saints 13-7 victory on Tuesday, the club hit a season-high four home runs and stole three bases. It's just the fifth time in franchise history the Saints have accomplished those feats in the same game, most recently occurring on July 2, 2023. The Saints are 4-1 in games they hit at least four home runs and steal three bases.

**STARTING STRENGTH:** David Festa put forth his second quality start of the season on Friday, also marking the fifth quality start of the season for the Saints. In each quality start the Saints have gotten this year, the starter did not allow an earned run. The Saints' five starts this year of at least 6.0 innings and zero earned runs are the most in Triple-A (Boushley, twice, 4/20 and 4/25, Varland - 5/3, Dobnak - 5/10 and Festa-5/10). All five of the Saints quality starts have come since April 20, no other Triple-A team has gotten more than two in that span.

**WALLNER WARMING UP:** Over the last nine games, Matt Wallner has started to find his stride, hitting .325 (13-for-45) in that stretch. Below is how Wallner fared in his first 11 games with St. Paul, compared to his last 10 games:

**ISOLA SO HOT:** Alex Isola has improved his game at the plate over the last 15 games, hitting .306 (16-for-52) in that span. Isola collected a hit in a season-best five consecutive games in that stretch. Since April 20, Isola has drawn 10 walks, while striking out only seven times in his last 63 plate appearances.

**TWINS UPDATE:** The Minnesota Twins dropped their series opener to the New York Yankees on Tuesday, 5-1. Chris Paddack got tagged for five runs on 12 hits over five innings. Ryan Jeffers accounted for the lone Minnesota run with a solo home run in the first inning, his 10<sup>th</sup> of the season.

**LAST APPEARANCE:** 5/9 @ TOL...made third start with St. Paul, allowing five runs on seven hits, both Triple-A season highs, over 4.2 innings...allowed a two-out double in the first, retiring the other three batters...allowed two runs in the second inning on a triple followed by a sacrifice fly...gave up three runs in the third on a pair of singles...got four of last five outs on strikeouts...received first Triple-A loss in 5-1 Saints defeat.

**APPEARANCE PRIOR:** 5/3 v LOU...made second start with St. Paul, throwing a season-high 7.0 shutout innings, allowing three hits, no walks and struck out eight...retired first seven batters before allowing an infield single that ricocheted off his foot...allowed two singles in the sixth, working around them with a double play...two of three hits were allowed to Levi Jordan...was one out short of his career-high in innings, which also came against Louisville...became one of two pitchers in the International League since 2021 to have multiple starts against the same team of at least 7.0 innings and zero earned runs (Kyle Wright - Gwinnett, vs. Nashville)...was the 11<sup>th</sup> time in franchise history a starter completed 7.0 innings... was the fifth start in franchise history to last at least 7.0 innings and not allow an earned run and the first since he did it against Louisville on August 11, 2023...received first win in 4-0 Saints victory.

**SOMEONE IS FLIPPING OVER A CHECKERS BOARD:** During the 2023 offseason, Louie got engaged to Maddie Hentges, a former lacrosse player at Concordia-St. Paul (2017-20), the same school as Varland. Maddies brother, Sam, was a star forward on the Totino-Grace HS hockey team, played at St. Cloud State, and was a Minnesota Wild draft pick. Maddies Dad, Mark, was a Hobie Baker Award finalist in 1980 at St. Thomas, a 2x All-American (1980 & 81) and played in the Montreal Canadiens organization.

**NOTHING TO RANT(Z) ABOUT X 2:** Make it back-to-back years in which Varland was honored with the Jim Rantz Minnesota Twins Minor League Pitcher of the Year Award. In 2021 he received it after going 10-4 with a 2.10 ERA in 20 games (18 starts) between Low-A Fort Myers and High-A Cedar Rapids. In 103.0 innings pitched he fanned 142 while opponents hit .214 against him. In 2022, between Double-A Wichita and Triple-A St. Paul, he went 8-5, 3.06 (126.1 IP, 43 ER) with 42 walks and 146 strikeouts as opponents hit .242 against him across 24 games (23) starts. He also went 1-2, 3.81 ERA (26.0 IP, 11 ER) with six walks, 21 strikeouts, and a .261 opponents batting average in five starts.

**WHO SAYS YOU CAN'T GO HOME:** With the transfer from Double-A to Triple-A, on August 8, 2022, Varland returned home. He became the first player from St. Paul to play for the Saints since the team became a Triple-A franchise. Some of the players from the Independent days that were from St. Paul that played for the Saints include Jack Morris, Ryan Schlosser, Tim Thomas (1995), Chris Schwab, Steve Butler, Adam Larson, Brian Whinnery, Zach Peterson, Reid Mahon, Matt Schuld, Joe Bonfe, Jack Gohil, and Jake Esch.

**HULKAMANIA:** While in high school at North St. Paul High School, Varland was on the wrestling team. He was a two-time MSHSL State Tournament wrestler, two-time MVP, Most Improved, Rookie of the Year, two-time section runner up and four-time captain of the wrestling team.

**GET ON THE BUS, GUS:** Louie's brother, Gus, is 13 months older than him. They played together at North St. Paul High School and Concordia, St. Paul. Gus was selected in the 14th round by the Oakland Athletics in 2018 out of Concordia, St. Paul. Gus was then traded to the Dodgers along with 3B Sheldon Neuse in exchange for LHP Adam Kolarek and RF Cody Thomas on February 12, 2021. He was claimed in the Minor League phase of the Rule 5 draft by the Milwaukee Brewers from the L.A. Dodgers on December 7, 2022

**NOT MY BROTHERS KEEPER:** - Louie faced off against his brother Gus in 2022 as the Wind Surge took on the Tulsa Drillers on May 6, 2022 in Wichita. It's the first time brothers started against each other in the Minors since at least the 2000s. Louie went 5.0 IP allowed two runs on four hits while walking two and striking out six. His brother went 3.0 IP allowing six runs on eight hits while walking two and striking out two in a 7-2 Wichita victory in game one of a doubleheader.

**BROTHERLY LOVE:** On June 15, 2022 the Wind Surge and Drillers met again in a doubleheader in Wichita. This time, the brothers pitched opposite ends of the doubleheader and each got a victory. Louie won Game 1 allowing two runs across 6.0 innings while walking one and striking out four in a 7-4 Wind Surge win. In the second game, Gus pitched 2.0 shutout innings of relief allowing one hit and striking out four in a 4-3 Drillers victory.

**RUNS IN THE FAMILY:** While Louie has more than made a name for himself, he might not even be the most athletic person in his family. His Aunt's Denise and Sue were legendary softball pitchers at North St. Paul High School.

- Finished 7th in the American League in K/9 IP in 2023 at 9.40 (min 65.0 IP) in 2023
- Post-Season International League All-Star with the Saints going 7-1 with a 3.97 ERA (81.2 IP/36 ER) while walking 26 and striking out 88 with a .265 OBA in 16 games (15 starts) in 2023
- Allowed three-or-fewer earned runs in 18-straight minor league starts in 2022 from May 18, 2022-end of season going 4-4, 2.85 ERA (94.2 IP, 30 ER) with 31 walks and 111 strikeouts in that span. His teams were 12-6 in that span

- Placed on the Twins' 10-Day Injured List on May 3, retroactive to May 2, with right knee inflammation.
- Was hitting .250/.300/.391 in 28 games with the Twins in 2024 before hitting the IL.
- Named 2022 AL All-Star, originally as reserve but was starting centerfielder, replacing Mike Trout; hit go-ahead solo homer in fourth inning
- Signed seven-year contract extension to stay in Minnesota through 2028 on December 1, 2021, just hours prior to the MLB work stoppage
- Finished the 2022 season with an MLB-record 54 consecutive home runs since last grounding into a double play on August 18, 2020 vs. Milwaukee when he hit into two. He snapped that streak of 172 games without a GIDP on April 2, 2023
- Awarded AL player of the month in April 2021 after starting the 2021 season hitting .370 with the Twins, hitting nine home runs and 17 RBIs before landing on the 10-Day
- Injured List on May 7th with a right hip strain.
- Named 2020 Rawlings Gold Glove centerfield finalist, finishing behind Luis Robert.
- Finished in 16th in 2020 AL MVP voting with two points.
- Was third in the majors in sprint speed, avg 30.0 ft/sec.
- Won the Jim Kaat award for Twins defensive player of the year in 2016, 2017, 2019 and 2020.
- Successful in 33 consecutive steal attempts from May 23rd, 2017 to April 22nd, 2019, a Twins franchise record.
- Won a Rawlings AL Gold Glove in 2017, as well as being named the Wilson 2017 MLB Defensive Player of the Year.
- Was 4th in the AL in stolen bases in 2017 with 29, also set MLB career-highs that season with 16 home runs and 51 RBIs.
- In 2012, ranked top high school prospect in the country at the time of the MLB First-Year Player Draft by Baseball America
