TODAY'S HEADLINES

LAST TIME OUT: The Saints offense broke out in a big way on Saturday, beating Indianapolis 12-4. Despite going 3-17 with runners in scoring position and leaving 10 men on base, the Saints used 9 walks to score double-digit runs for the second time this season. Caleb Boushley turned in the Saints first quality start of the season, striking out eight while allowing only one unearned run in 6.0 innings. Yoynier Fajardo, Alex Isola, Max Kepler and Anthony Prato each had multi-hit efforts in the Saints largest margin of victory this year. After falling 1-0 in the first inning, the Saints plated 12 unanswered runs, highlighted by a five-run sixth that used two bases-loaded walks and a bases-clearing double to drop the crooked number.

BOOM OR BUST: The offense has had its ups and downs in the first 19 games of the season. In the team's three highest scoring games (3/30 - 8R, 4/14 - 13R and 4/20 - 12R), that amounts to 36.7% of the total runs (33 of 90) the Saints have scored this year. In the other 16 games, the team has scored 57 runs. In those three games, the offense has accounted for over a quarter of the season hit total, getting 39 combined hits of the 136 (28.7%) knocks on the season.

WALK THIS WAY: After drawing nine walks in Saturday's 12-4 victory, the Saints moved to 20-2 all-time when drawing at least nine walks. It's the most walks the Saints have drawn this year, beating the previous high of eight from April 9. The Saints are tied for ninth in the IL with their 91 walks drawn this season.

PRATO PACES THE BASES: Once again, Anthony Prato has displayed his ability to reach base, leading the team with 18 walks, the tied for the most in the International League. Prato's .493 on-base percentage is also the highest in the IL. He has reached base in his first 14 games that he has played in this year, a streak that is tied for the fourth-longest streak in the IL. Prato had a .452 OBP in 72 games with the Saints last year and has a career .457 OBP in Triple-A. In his Triple-A career, Prato has reached base in 77 of his 88 games.

ST. PAUL SPEEDSTERS: In their first 21 steal attempts this year, the Saints did not get thrown out, until DaShawn Keirsej Jr. was caught attempting to take third base on Friday. The Saints perfect 21-for-21 start ties the best for any Triple-A team since 2005 (as far as minor league stats go back). Sacramento was successful on their first 21 attempts this year, matching the Saints. The only minor league teams to beat that mark are the 23 consecutive steals to open the year by the 2014 Wilmington Blue Rocks and the 25 stolen bases by the 2007 Elizabethton Twins, holding the minor league record since 2005.

OFFENSIVE STRUGGLES: The Saints offense has continued to struggle in the early goings of 2024, slashing .217/.322/.367, ranking 20th, 19th and 20th in the International League, respectfully. The 90 runs the Saints have scored are the fifth-fewest in the IL. The 17 double plays the team has hit into are tied for the most in the league.

ONE IS THE LONELIEST RUN: The 1-0 defeat for the Saints on Wednesday was just the eighth game in franchise history to be decided by a 1-0 final. The Saints are now 3-5 in 1-0 games. Wednesday's contest was just the second in franchise history to be scoreless after eight innings, joining July 18, 2023 at Omaha. The Saints were also walked off 1-0 in that game.

REHAB ROUNDTABLE: The Minnesota Twins sent outfielder Max Kepler to St. Paul for a rehab assignment on Thursday for a right knee contusion sustained on April 7. This will be Kepler's second career rehab stint with St. Paul, with the other coming in June of 2021. Josh Staumont's rehab assignment ended on Friday and was optioned to St. Paul.

GO, DIEGO, GO: Diego A. Castillo recorded four hits in the Saints victory on Sunday, the 29th four-hit game in franchise history and the 10th of Castillo's career. He followed that with a three-hit game to open the series in Indianapolis. Castillo is snapped his seven-game hit streak on Friday, going 12-for-29 (.414) with a triple, two home runs with one walk and three strikeouts in that span.

RACKING UP K's: The Saints struck out 15 Iowa Cubs on April 13, doing so for the third time in the series. They struck out 15 batters in consecutive games on April 9 and 10, the second time in franchise history the club has recorded 15 strikeouts in back-to-back games, matching May 22-23, 2021 against Indianapolis. It's also the fourth time this season and the 17th time in franchise history that the Saints struck out 15 batters. The Saints are now 10-7 in games which they strike out 15 hitters. Saints' pitchers are tied for third in Triple-A with 200 strikeouts. Their 130 swinging strikeouts are the sixth-most in Triple-A.

TWINS UPDATE: The Twins bounced back with a 4-3 victory over the Detroit Tigers on Saturday. Bailey Ober went 6.0 strong innings, allowing only one run and struck out six. Byron Buxton and Austin Martin finished with multi-hit games. The Twins scored all four of their runs with three sacrifice flies and reaching on an error.

LAST START: 4/16 @ IND...pitched 4.0 innings in third start of the year, allowed season-high five runs on six hits, three walks and three strikeouts...allowed three of five total runs in the third inning...first four batters reached via back-to-back doubles, a single and a walk...issued a walk and a triple in the fourth...allowed extra base hits in the first, third and fourth innings...primarily threw slider (46%)...got seven total whiffs...took second loss in 10-6 Saints defeat.

APPEARANCE PRIOR: 4/10 v IOWA...threw 4.2 innings in start, allowed three runs on five hits, one home run, walking one and striking out seven...racked up six of seven strikeouts in first three innings...recorded first five outs by strikeout...allowed one hit in first inning, worked around runner at third with two outs in third inning...allowed three-run home run to Patrick Wisdom with two outs in the fifth...only allowed two runners to reach scoring position...primarily threw slider (44%), getting seven whiffs...got 14 total whiffs...received first loss in 4-1 Saints' defeat.

SAINTS RANDY: In 2023, Dobnak was a workhorse for the Saints, setting a number of single-season records. He set the franchise record for starts (26), innings pitched (126.1 IP), and strikeouts (115). The 2023 season was Dobnak's third with the Saints and consequently he is the franchise leader in two of those three categories as well: his 33 starts are four more than the #2 pitcher, Simeon Woods Richardson, his 164.1 IP are 12.0 more than Ronny Henriquez, and his 147 strikeouts are just eight shy of Ronny Henriquez.

KNOW ANY GOOD PIRATE JOKES? NEITHER DO ANYYYE: Dobnak grew up a huge Pittsburgh Pirates fan and we would often go to PNC Park. His favorite food to get there was nachos with pulled pork and cheese. He finally pitched at PNC Park on August 5, 2020. The irony was no fans were allowed in, not even his parents. He tossed 6.0 shutout innings allowing three hits and striking out one.

A BATTLE(R) OF WILLS: You can be forgiven if you've never heard of the DII school that Dobnak attended from 2014-17. He spent four years at Alderson Broadus (WV) University, located in Philippi, a town of 3,380. During his time with the Battlers he finished his career as the conference's all-time leader in ERA (2.61) and strikeouts (284). In his sophomore season in 2015, Dobnak threw a no-hitter against Bluefield State.

TWILIGHT SPARKLE MEET BUTTERCUP: Upon graduating from Alderson Broadus, Dobnak went undrafted and was looking for a way to continue his career. He got his break with the Utica Unicorns in the United Shore Professional Baseball League (a four team league where all four teams play in the same ballpark in Utica, MI near Detroit). He signed with them because he caught the eye of manager Jim Essian (a one time Cubs manager in 1981 & also played from 1973-84 in the Majors), whose son played with Dobnak at Alderson Broadus. Dobnak would become the only player to reach the Major League's out of the USPBL.

THERE'S ALWAYS THAT ONE PERSON: In order to make ends meet in the USPBL, Dobnak drove for Uber and Lyft. He began driving for both in October, 2017. His Uber rating was stellar, but not perfect. He had a 4.99/5.0 rating which meant he received all five-star ratings with the exception of one four-star rating. According to Dobnak, "I have one four-star. I'm hoping it was a mistake. I don't remember doing anything bad."

NOT QUITE MIKE ROWE: Just prior to joining the big leagues, Dobnak worked as a consultant for Jordan Tax & Accounting Services in Bethel Park, PA (2017), an accounting clerk at Accountant and Associates in PA (2017), pizza delivery for Italian Village Pizza in South Park, PA (2012-13) and supermarket stocker at Foodland in Pittsburgh (2010-12).

WE'RE BETTER THAN YOU, AND WE KNOW IT: Dobnak got married to Aerial Munson on September 28, 2019, never thinking he'd be in the Major Leagues. He returned home after the Twins finished a series in Detroit and got married on a Saturday. He wasn't exempt from the rookie ritual of having to dress up in a crazy costume. He had to dress up in a Globo Gym outfit and flew commercial home instead of the chartered flight. He showed up to his fiancée's in full attire.

CANDLESTICKS MAKE A NICE GIFT: Before getting married, some of Dobnak's wedding registry gifts wound up in the Twins game notes on September 20 (Amazon Echo, 67-inch leaf rake and Pine-Sol). All of it was the handiwork of intern Ian Kraft. The publicity of their registry becoming public made the soon to be married couple ask fans to donate to St. Jude's Children's Research Hospital, which has always been important to Aerial Dobnak due to her lifelong desire to be involved with children and her experience with the loss of a friend to cancer during her freshman year of college at Alderson Broadus University, instead of buying them gifts. Their initial goal was \$2,000 and within 8 hours that goal was met. Eventually they raised \$4,093. But the story didn't end there. A representative of St. Jude reached out to her on social media afterward, wondering if the couple would be willing to engage in more significant involvement with the hospital once the wedding buzz had died down. They jumped at the opportunity, and the Dobnaks were flown to the hospital in Memphis for a weekend in January to meet patients, connect with fundraising coordinators and evaluate their options for continued future engagement.

- T2nd in International League in starts (26), 6th in strikeouts (115) and T7th in innings pitched (126.1 IP) in 2023
- Pitched in 8 games (3 starts) for Saints in 2022 and allowed three runs over final 11.1 IP
- Placed on the 60-day IL with a right middle finger strain on March 21, 2022 and sent to Fort Myers for a rehab appearance on August 15. Transferred to St. Paul on August 28.
- Missed nearly two months of 2021 season from June 24 until making a rehab appearance with Saints on August 21
- Named Bill Boni Award winner for Twins Most Outstanding Rookie for 2020, an award voted on by the Twin Cities Chapter of the BBWAA
- Ranked first among American League rookies in walks per-9.0 IP (2.51), tied for first in wins (6) and sixth in innings pitched (46.2) in 2020
- Won a career-best five consecutive starts July 31-August 22, 2020 going 5-0, 1.71 ERA (26.1 IP, 5 ER) with five walks and 13 strikeouts during that span. Marked longest win streak by a Twins rookie starter since Tyler Duffey won five-straight decisions from August 15-September 26, 2015. Also marked the first time a Twins rookie starter won at least five-straight starts since Francisco Liriano won six starts in a row from June 11-July 8, 2006
- Earned Jim Rantz Award for Twins minor league Pitcher of the Year after combining to go 12-4, 2.07 ERA (135.0 IP, 31 ER) in 24 games (21 starts) across three levels in 2019. Named starting pitcher on Twins MiLB.com organization All-Star team
- Started Game 2 of the ALDS October 5, 2019 at New York-AL, allowing four runs on six hits in 2.0 innings pitched. Became the fourth rookie in Twins history (6th occurrence) to start a Postseason game, 18th to ever pitch in one. Prior to Dobnak, the last Twins rookie to start in the Postseason was Brian Duensing in 2009 in Game 1 of the ALDS at New York-AL. The two other rookies to start in the Postseason for the Twins: Boof Bonser (Game 2, ALDS vs. OAK in 2006) and Les Straker (3 starts in 1987, 1 in ALCS at DET, 2 in WS atvs. STL)
- Pitched 6.0 innings with just one hit allowed September 25, 2019 at Detroit, becoming the second rookie in Twins/Senators franchise history to throw at least 6.0 innings while allowing no more than one batter to reach safely via hit, walk or hit-by-pitch (previous Twins pitcher was Camilo Pascual on September 14, 1954 at Cleveland)
- Earned first major league win September 20, 2019 vs. Kansas City, allowing one run on three hits in 5.1 innings pitched
- Made major league debut August 9, 2019 vs. Cleveland, pitching 4.0 scoreless innings of relief
- Finished the year third in the Midwest League in ERA (3.14) among qualifying pitchers, tied for third in wins (10) and 10th in innings pitched (129.0 IP) in 2018 with Cedar Rapids
- Only pitched in six games (4 starts) between Rookie-Elizabethton and Low-A Cedar Rapids, going 2-0 with a combined 2.43 ERA (33.1 IP, 9 ER) and 23 strikeouts in first season of pro ball in 2017
