PARTY WITH A CAPITAL P: INF Nick Pratto and INF Vinnie Pasquantino both hit long balls yesterday, marking the third time this season that the two top prospects each launched at least one over the fence. The Storm Chasers are undefeated (3-0) when the duo both hit homers, averaging 10.0 runs per game in those games. Pratto (No. 3) and Pasquantino (No. 5) each rank among MLB Pipeline's Top 10 First Baseman prospects. Pasquantino (9 HR) and Pratto (7 HR) are the top two home run hitters with the Storm Chasers this season.

EVERYBODY LOVES THE WEEKEND: The Storm Chasers are 11-6 in games played on Fridays, Saturdays, and Sundays this season and a near-perfect 8-1 inside the friendly confines of Werner Park on the weekends. Omaha is looking to extend its winning streak to four games today to tie a season best. The Storm Chasers have won seven consecutive games at Werner Park heading into tonight's matchup, looking to take the series win just four games into the six-game series while St. Paul is looking to snap their 10-game losing streak.

COMPETITION BREWING IN INTERNATIONAL LEAGUE WEST: Eight of the 10 teams in the newly formed International League West are .500 or better in their last 10 games, with Omaha holding a 5-5 record over that span. There are just two and a half games separating the third-place Iowa Cubs and the eighth-place Gwinnett Stripers. Omaha is currently in seventh place, 7.0 games back of first-place Nashville who holds the best record in the International League at 26-12. Four of the top five teams in the division lost yesterday, allowing the middle six teams to bunch up even more. Omaha is the only team in the International League West that has won each of its three games, with only one other International League team in on a three-game streak.

TWO-THIRDS AT HOME: The Storm Chasers are winning exactly two thirds of their games at home when any of three different situations are present. Omaha has won 10-of-15 games in Werner Park when the opponent starts a right-handed pitcher, 8-of-12 games played at night at home, and 4-of-6 in one-run games at Werner Park.

GOING. GOING. GONE!: The Storm Chasers tied a season best with four home runs yesterday, bringing the season total to 40. LF Nick Pratto hit two to bring his season total to seven, SS Iván Castillo hit his first of the season, and 1B Vinnie Pasquantino pushed his team lead up to nine. Omaha is 13-10 on the year when hitting a home run and 8-2 with at least one at home. The Storm Chasers have had eight games this season with multiple players hitting homers, winning all eight of those games.

FOR OMAHA: LHP Kris Bubic heads to the mound to make his second start of the season for the Storm Chasers, after being optioned to Omaha on May 12. In his lone Triple-A appearance of his career, Bubic went 2.2 innings and allowed three earned runs on four hits and three walks with five strikeouts. Bubic went from Advanced-A in 2019 to the MLB in 2020 because of the canceling of the 2020 Minor League season and spent the entire 2021 season with the Kansas City Royals. Bubic made his MLB debut on July 31, 2020, when he went 4.0 innings and allowed two earned runs with two strikeouts in the loss. Bubic has struggled to begin the 2022 season, coming to Omaha with a 12.83 ERA and an 0-3 record in five starts with 10 strikeouts and 11 walks in 13.1 innings in the Big League. In arguably his best outing this season, Bubic went 5.0 innings on 4/29 against the Yankees, allowing no earned runs in his final four innings of work after giving up back-to-back homers in the first. To start the 2021 season, the Stanford product bounced between the bullpen and the starting rotation, but in July of the same season he became a regular starter, with 13 of his last 15 appearances coming as the first man up. Bubic had his longest outing of the season in his second to last appearance in 2021, tossing 7.0 scoreless innings with six strikeouts at Detroit to secure his sixth win of the season on 9/26/21. The California native was drafted 40th overall by the Kansas City Royals in 2018 after spending three seasons playing for the Stanford Cardinal where he earned pitcher of the year honors during his sophomore campaign.

FOR ST. PAUL: RHP Mario Sanchez is making just his third start this season, seeing most of his appearances come from the bullpen this season with the Saints. As a starter this season, Sanchez holds a 1.13 ERA in two starts with no decisions. Overall, he holds a 2-1 record with a 3.54 ERA in 20.1 innings over six appearances with 16 strikeouts and seven walks. Sanchez signed a minor league contract with the Minnesota Twins in December of last year. The Venezuela native was originally signed as a non-drafted free agent by the Washington Nationals in 2012.
