LAST TIME OUT: The New Hampshire Fisher Cats continued their extra inning struggles with an 8-5 loss to Bowie in 11 innings on Tuesday night. After New Hampshire failed to score in the 10th and 11th, Bowie put the winning runs on second and third with one out and Billy Cook smacked a walk-off three-run homer off Joe Jones. Riley Tirotta opened the scoring in the third and homered for a second straight game with an opposite-field solo shot to right, his seventh Double-A homer. After the Baysox took a 4-1 lead heading into the sixth, Rainer Nunez tied it with a bases clearing double to right-center with two outs. In the seventh, New Hampshire took the lead 5-4 after a throwing error by Bowie shortstop Gilbert Lara on a Tirotta single, allowing Michael Turconi to score. The Baysox tied the game in the eighth on a sac-fly from Anthony Servideo.

MAJOR WILL POWER: After going 1-for-4 last night, OF Will Robertson is on a nine-game hitting streak, his longest with New Hampshire. The 25-year-old ties Leo Jimenez for the second longest hit streak this season. Robertson closed out the series at Reading with a 4-for-4 night at the plate and was a triple shy of the cycle. It's the third four-hit game in Robertson's career and his first at Double-A. Robertson is hitting .309 (51-for-165) in the second half after hitting .181 in the first half.

IT'S TIROTTA HERE: IF Riley Tirotta collected a game-high three hits last night and is 7-for-14 in the month of September with four extra base hits, two home runs and seven RBI, already eclipsing his RBI total from the month of August. The 25-year-old has homered in back-to-back games and has 10 on the season (seven with New Hampshire, three with Vancouver)

RODEN ON A ROLL: OF Alan Roden is 7-for-13 to start the month of September after hitting .326 in the month of August. The Blue Jays No. 7 prospect has 12 multi-hit performances in 37 games played, including in nine of his last 16 games. Roden is hitting .331 since joining the team on July 19.

HOME RUN HITTERS: The Fisher Cats have hit a home run in 11 consecutive games after Riley Tirotta went deep yesterday. The 2011 Fisher Cats hold the record for most consecutive games with a home run at 38 between May 11 and June 6. In the month of August, New Hampshire hit 38 home runs, the third-most in the league.

COMMANDER CJ ON THE BUMP: RHP CJ Van Eyk makes his second Double-A start. The 24-year-old made his Double-A debut last Thursday at Reading, going three innings, allowing two runs on three hits and two walks with a strikeout in a nodecision. It was Van Eyk's first outing above Single-A Dunedin since August 26, 2021 while with High-A Vancouver. Van Eyk is in his first season back after Tommy John surgery kept him out for all of 2022. The former Blue Jays top 10 prospect previously made eight rehab appearances this year between the Florida Complex League and Dunedin.

NEWCOMERS TO NEW HAMPSHIRE: OF Devonte Brown, RHP CJ Van Eyk, IF Abiezel Ramirez, and IF Jeffrey Wehler are the four newest Fisher Cats to be added onto the roster this road trip. Brown signed as an undrafted free agent out of NC State in July 2022. Van Eyk is a former top 10 Blue Jays prospect who did not pitch last year while recovering from Tommy John surgery. A former Rays farmhand, Ramirez played only four games with Vancouver before earning promotion to Double-A. Wehler started the year in independent ball with Staten Island before eventually having his contract purchased by the Blue Jays on June 9.

SIZING UP THE BAYSOX: Bowie is coming off a series loss at Akron, although all six games were decided by three runs or less. The Baysox currently sit two games behind Richmond for the second playoff spot in the Southwest. This is New Hampshire's first time facing Bowie since 2021 when the Fisher Cats took four of six in Maryland.

THIS DAY IN FISHER CATS HISTORY (September 6, 2018)—The Fisher Cats made it two straight over Trenton with a 10-4 win at home. Max Pentecost hit a three-run homer in the bottom of the first inning to give New Hampshire the lead. Harold Ramirez went 3-for-4 with two RBI and Bo Bichette had three hits in the win. Reliever Tayler Saucedo (saw-say-doe) went 3.2 scoreless in relief for the win.

MANCHESTER-BOSTON REGIONAL AIRPORT FLIGHT TO THE MAJORS: Toronto (77-62) won 7-1 in Oakland to move ahead of the Texas Rangers into the third wildcard slot. Chris Bassitt allowed one run in eight innings to improve to 14-7. The Jays broke a scoreless tie with six runs in the seventh. With the bases loaded on walks, Kevin Kiermaier singled (1-0), George Springer singled (3-0), Davis Schneider doubled (4-0), Whit Merrifield hit a sac fly (5-0) and Cavan Biggio walked (6-0). Springer added an RBI single in the eighth...Buffalo (68-63) won for the eighth straight time to move into a tie for second with a 12-4 win over Lehigh Valley. Damiano Palmegiani's first homer at Triple-A came in a four-run sixth. Andrew Bash went five hitless innings to earn the win - he did walk four. Stevie Berman hit a grand slam off Fisher Cat alum T J Zeuch in a five-run second inning for the Bisons...Vancouver (75-51) won 7-3 at Tri-City. Adam Macko went five no-hit innings to earn the win...Dunedin (61-66) fell 5-0 at home to Jupiter.

COMING UP: The Fisher Cats continue the second half of their 12-game road trip with six games against the Bowie Baysox until Sunday. The final home stand of the regular season begins Tuesday, September 12 against the defending Eastern League champions and this season's first-half champions, the Somerset Patriots.
