## RHP CADEN DANA (2-2, 2.29) vs. RHP TANNER GORDON (1-1, 5.56)

**TODAY'S GAME**: Salt Lake holds a 3-2 series lead after a 6-4 win last night ... The Isotopes need a triumph to avoid their first series loss at home on the year ... Tanner Gordon is expected to take the hill for the Isotopes while Caden Dana is slated to start for Salt Lake, a rematch of game one of the series.

31: Sam Hilliard has a 31-game Triple-A on base streak dating back to June 11, 2024, the eighth time in team history a player has reached base in at least 31 consecutive games

ISOTOPES RBI RECORD: Sam Hilliard drove in two runs last night and has 230 RBI with Albuquerque, passing Jordan Patterson (229, 2016-18) for second all-time in Isotopes history ... Jason Wood (2003-06, 08) holds the record with 328 RBI.

NOW THAT'S QUALITY: Carson Palmquist twirled the second quality start of the season last night (6 IP, 3 ER, 9 K), joining Tanner Gordon's performance against the Aces April 23. Additionally, Palmquist's nine strikeouts were the most for an Isotopes pitcher since Noah Davis on June 30, 2024 vs. Salt Lake (nine).

**PUNCHOUTS**: Albuquerque's pitching staff struck out 14 batters last night, tied for the most in a contest this year (also: April 3 vs. Salt Lake, April 11 at Sugar Land).

**BEHIND THE DISH**: Albuquerque catchers (**Braxton Fulford**, **Austin Nola** and **Ronaiker Palma**) have combined to slash .391/.440/.635 with 45 hits, 10 doubles, six homers and 16 RBI on the year, leading the PCL in hits, doubles, average, OBP and slugging percentage.

**OPPOSING STARTER**: Last night, Chase Silseth became the fifth opposing starter in the last 11 games to complete 6.0 innings against Albuquerque, and third time this week.

**RUNS SCORED**: The Isotopes have plated 21 tallies across the last seven contests.

VS. SALT LAKE: In five of the 11 meetings between Albuquerque and Salt Lake this season, the game-deciding hit has taken place in the seventh inning or later.

**CLOSE CALL**: Saturday marked the 12th time in 2025 an Isotopes game was decided by two runs or fewer, the club is 5-7 in such contests.

HITS: The Isotopes have tallied double-digit hits in just five of their last six games after recording double-digit knocks in their precious five

**SAM I AM**: Sam Hilliard swatted a single and two-run double yesterday to extend his 2025 on-base streak to 23 games, every game he's played this year. It's the longest on-base streak in the PCL this season and tied for the second-longest in Triple-A.

HIT STREAK: Hilliard also has a hit in six-game hit streak, a season-high (9x24).

**BRAX**: Braxton Fulford singled yesterday to extend his hitting streak to 11 contests, the longest active hit streak in the PCL and third-longes active streak in Triple-A. During the streak he is slashing .425/.489/.875 with three doubles, five homers and 11 RBI.

**HE GETS ON BASE**: Fulford also has reached base in 14-straight games, the fiffth-longest streak in the PCL.

JC: Julio Carreras recorded two singles yesterday to extend his hitting streak to 10 games, second-longest active hit streak in the PCL and fourth-longest active streak in Triple-A. Is slashing .486/.512/.622 with three doubles, one triple and six RBI during the stretch ... It's his longest since Sept. 10, 2022-April 13, 2023, spanning two seasons with Hartford (10 contests).

THE VET: Austin Nola recorded two hits Friday, including a double. Has a hit in six-straight games. Slashing .583/.600/.750 with four doubles, 14 hits and three RBI during stretch ... Has six multi-hit games on the year and five in his last six contests.

**KESTDADDY**: Keston Hiura roped an RBI triple yesterday, extending his modest hit streak to three games, tying a season-high (also: April 2-5 vs. Salt Lake). Hiura has 17 knocks in 2025 and 10 have come against the Bees, his former team.

RITTER: Ryan Ritter homered in the seventh inning last night, his fifth on the year, just his fourth hit across his last 33 at-bats ... Has three extra-base hits in his last 18 games, dating back to April 13 at Sugar Land.

**VEEN**: Zac Veen has a 14-game on-base streak (every game played in 2025, tied for the fifth longest active streak in the PCL.

**YF**: Yanquiel Fernández has gone hitless in at least three consecutive games for the third time this season (also: March 28-April 1, April 11-15).

PCL LEADERBOARD: Warming Bernabel is T-8th in XBH (14) and doubles (10) ... Ryan Ritter is T-2nd in walks (24) ... Yanquiel Fernandez is T-2nd in homers (7) ... Sam Hilliard is 1st in triples (3).

### NUCLEI NOTES

SKIPPER: Pedro Lopez enters his 21st year as a minor league manager and third guiding the Isotopes. He is the eighth manager in club history ... Spent 2021 as Albuquerque's hitting coach and 2022 as its bench coach ... Notched his 1,000th career managerial victory June 4, 2023 at Salt Lake, 7-1 ... Managed in the Texas Rangers (2001-05, 2007) and New York Mets (2011-19) organizations while claiming the 2014 Eastern League Championship with Double-A Binghamton. Lopez was drafted in the 21st round by the San Diego Padres in the 1988 MLB Draft and spent 13 years in the minor leagues, reaching Triple-A on four occasions.

**HOMETOWN KID**: Jordan Pacheco begins his fourth season as the Isotopes hitting coach ... An Albuquerque native and 2004 graduate of La Cueva High School, Pacheco then attended the University of New Mexico (2005-07), where he was one of the most prolific offensive players in school history (.384, 59 2B, 25 HR, 145 RBI) ... Drafted by Rockies in the 9th round in 2007 and made his MLB debut with Colorado in 2011.

CHRIS MICHALAK: Begins his third season as Isotopes pitching coach ... Pitched for the Albuquerque Dukes in 2000, followed by stints with the Isotopes in 2004 and 2008 ... Started second-to-last game in Dukes history, giving up two runs in 6.0 innings during Game 4 of a PCL First Round playoff series at Memphis Sept. 9, 2000 ... Appeared in 61 Major League games (24 starts) over five seasons with the Arizona Diamondbacks (1998), Toronto Blue Jays (2001) Texas Rangers (2001-02) and Cincinnati Reds (2006) ... 12th round selection by the Athletics in 1993 ... Has been in the coaching ranks since 2009, including stops as the pitching coach for the Hagerstown Suns (2010-11), Potomac Nationals (2012-13) and Harrisburg Senators (2014-17). He was also the Minor League pitching coordinator for the Miami Marlins form 2018-20 and coached in the Washington Nationals organization from 2021-22.

MICHAEL RYAN: Enters his second year with the Rockies organization as the Isotopes bench coach ... The former outfielder played in 33 games for the Isotopes and hit nine homers during the 2008 campaign. He and Michalak were teammates on that squad for four days in late July ... Entered the coaching ranks in 2012 as a coach for the Double-A Altoona Curve (Pirates). He then managed in the Pirates organization at three levels for seven seasons with stops at Single-A West Virginia (2013-14), High-A Bradenton (2015-16) and Double-A Altoona (2017-19), while winning the Florida State League in 2016 and Eastern League in 2017. Ryan compiled a 221-197 managerial record with Altoona—the most wins for a manager in Curve history ... He also managed in the Cubs organization (High-A South Bend, 2021 and Double-A Tennessee, 2022-June 2023) ... A 5th round draft pick by the Minnesota Twins in 1996, played in 149 MLB games over parts of five seasons with the Twins (2002-05) and Angels (2010) ... Last Angels player to wear 27 prior to Mike Trout's call-up in 2011.

**SPLIT-SEASON PLAYOFF FORMAT**: For the third-straight year, the Pacific Coast League will use a split-season format to determine playoff participants. With one 10 team division, the first half winner (concluding June 22) will host the second half winner (beginning June 24) in a three-game set. The winner will then face the International League champion for the Triple-A Championship in Las Vegas, NV, on September 27.

**BALLS AND STRIKES**: The Challenge System, in it's third full year in the PCL, will be used exclusively for every game this season. Under this system, the home plate umpire will call balls or strikes while each team has the opportunity to challenge the umpire's call with two challenges per game, retaining one for each successful challenge.
