### Today's Game

The Clippers will send RHP **Austin Peterson** to the mound today, looking to extend the road winning streak to 7G (last: 6/29-7/23/22 at Iowa and Toledo). Indianapolis will counter with RHP **Jose Urquidy**. Columbus is 31-13 (.705) versus right handers this year. Urquidy has never pitched against the Clippers in his career, as today will be his 17th career game in the IL.

### vs. the Indians

Columbus is 5-2 against Indianapolis this year, posting a +9 run margin (9-9, +13 in 2025; 12-5, +45 in 2024; 10-8, -23 in 2023; 12-8, +53 in 2022). Since the start of the 2022 season, the Clippers are 17-7 (.708) in games against Indianapolis that are decided by at least five. Individually, **Bo Naylor** is 18x58 (.310) with 3HR, 15RBI in 17G against Indy and **Cooper Ingle** is 11x32 (.344) with 3HR, 8RBI in 11G.

### Something's Gotta Give

Columbus batters are leading the IL in walks this season (339, +16 on 2nd; 5.5 per game), but Indian pitchers have issued the 3rd fewest in the league (252, +17 from 1st; 3.9 per game). In the previous series between the two, 3/31-4/5 in Columbus, the Clipper lineup collected 36BB in 6G (4-2). Today's lineup has a 12% walk rate, with **Cooper Ingle** (21%) and **Kahlil Watson** (15%) on the bench.

### Inching Closer

Entering today only 2.5 games off the lead, the Clippers are closer to the top spot than they have been since being a pair back on 4/21 (spent last 40G between 3.0 and 6.0). Since getting swept in a DH at St. Paul on 5/15, Columbus is 15-5, tied for the best record in the IL with Rochester (Nashville is next at 15-6). The last time the Clippers were closer than 4th was on 4/7 (tied for 2nd).

### Under the Radar

**Petey Halpin** saw his career best hit streak snapped at 14G Thursday (.300, 18x60, 4/12-4/28) and his on base streak went down at 16G (.359OBP, 4/10-4/28). At the time of his promotion last month, he led the IL with 105 runs scored since his debut (3/28/25). Despite the month away, Halpin enters today at #5 on that list, nine off the lead (now at 108; has scored 14 times in last 15G with Columbus).

### Gaining Steam

**George Valera** owns a 20G on base streak since 5/5 (.425OBP). Over the first 8G of the streak, Valera had a .250OBP (36PA; hit .182, 6x33 with 3BB and 11K), but he has over reached half the time in the last 12G (.549OBP in 51PA; hitting .395, 15x38 with 13BB and 5K). Valera's K-rate is down considerably this season (15.7% from 26.5% in first four seasons with Columbus), with 4K in his last 46PA.

### Week of Adjustment

**Ralph Velazquez** owns a .778SLG over the past week, with 5XBH in 18AB (first Triple-A homer on 6/7 vs. Omaha), after a .282SLG to start his Triple-A career (3XBH, all doubles, in 39AB). Last night saw his first walk drawn since 5/25 at Toledo (42PA between) and his fifth straight game with only 1K (had 3K in back to back games from 5/31-6/2). Velazquez is still just 2x18 with RISP (2RBI).

### Nayled It

The Clippers are 9-2 with **Bo Naylor** in the lineup, averaging 6.6 runs per game (4.2 per in previous 10G). His homer last Tuesday (29HR and 103RBI in 137G of Columbus career) was his only hit in the Omaha series, but he has drawn 10BB in 6G since to boost his OBP to .479 (Columbus catchers are hitting .316/.467/.574, leading the IL in all three categories by a wide margin, 2nd in all is Memphis: .269/.384/.483).

### Start Again

**Nolan Jones** had his 21G on base streak snapped last Wednesday (.370OBP, 5/3-6/2), but saw his OBP drop nine points over the course of the streak. The streak was tied for 10th longest in the IL this season. He has responded with homers in each of 2G since (bomb on 6/4 snapped 89AB streak without, dating to 5/1). In June, Jones has 2HR and 5RBI in 4G (1HR and 6RBI in 22G during May).

### Snapping Out of It

After being named the IL's Batter of the Week for 4/14-4/19 vs. Iowa (10x20, 4HR, 10RBI), **Milan Tolentino** hit .165/.267/.215 with 0HR and 8RBI over his next 22G (4/21-5/23; 39K in 90PA, 43%). Starting with game two vs. Louisville on 5/23, in which he snapped an 83AB homerless streak with a grand slam, he is slashing .257/.278/.457 with 2HR and 8RBI over the course of 36PA (10K, 28%).

# Columbus Clippers Game Information

Wednesday, June 10

## This Date in Clipper History

6/10/1985

The Clippers and Chiefs started what would become the longest game in franchise history, playing a 5:37 marathon that did not get completed until 6/12. In the 20th, after falling behind 7-4, **Bill Lindsey** drove in two with a double, then scored the game tying run before the game was suspended. The Clippers would go on to win 8-7 in 21 innings when the game was resumed, with Lindsey catching all 21 innings.

## Huntington (Small) Park

In each of the first 11 seasons after the move downtown (2009-19), Huntington Park ranked among the top two in the IL in homers per game. With the arrival of six new parks to the IL in 2021, Huntington Park finished 4th, 6th and 10th from 2021-23, respectively. The 2024 season saw a return to the top (2.96; 108HR hit by the Clippers, most for the home team in HP's existence), but it dropped back to 7th last year (2.31). Including the postseason, the Clippers have been out-homered over the life of the park (1,438 to 1,386).

## Challenging Times

The Clippers are 87-83 (.512) in pitch reviews, with batters going 47-56 (.456) and pitchers/catchers going 40-27 (.597). They have run out of challenges in 33G and have not challenged in 3G. Last season, they were correct 43.1% of the time (2nd worst in the IL).

## Extras, Read All About Them

Columbus is 1-3 in extra innings this season, after having gone 5-5 in 2025 and 9-9 in 2024 (most losses since 2013, 12). Since the start of the 2018 season, when baserunners started appearing at second base, the Clippers are 51-36 when playing past regulation (.586, best in the IL; no other team above .570), including 26-17 at home (.605, but 4-7 in last 11G). Of the 87G to require extra play, 69 have been resolved after one frame (including eight DH games) and only one has gone past the 12th (5-4 loss in 13 innings on 9/20/22 at Toledo). From 7/31/19-6/26/21, Columbus played 85 straight within the allotted innings.

## On the Runs

Starting with the embiggened 150G schedule in 2022, the Clippers scored over 800 runs in three consecutive seasons from 2022-2024 (855, 808 and 805 runs, respectively; accounting for the 3rd, 4th and 5th best totals in team history). Following a steep decline last season (670, fewest scored in a full season since 2018), Columbus is looking to easily top 800 again, with an outside chance to establish a new team high (on pace for 854, would rank as 4th most all-time; 898 scored in 1983).

## On the Run

On the basepaths, the Clippers are making a run at the franchise mark in stolen bases, with 88 through the first 63G (on pace for 208SB). The team record was set in 2024 when Columbus swiped an even 200, but the team speed was throttled last year (129SB; still, the 2nd highest total since the Cleveland affiliation started in 2009). However, with 21CS so far, the Clippers are also pacing for the 2nd most times caught stealing of the Cleveland affiliation (50; nabbed 51 times in 2024).

## Juiced is Loose

In the Huntington Park Era (since 2009), Columbus leads the IL with 78 grand slams and 1,938RBI (led IL in RBI in 2010, '11, '12, '17, '18 and '22). Collecting an IL-best 10 grand slams last season, it marked their fifth straight season with at least four (118RBI last year; had only 97RBI in 2024, worst in a 140+G season since 2016).

## Hits the Spot

When turning in as many or fewer hits than their opponents last season, the Clippers went 18-64 (.220), coming in 13th out of 20 in the IL. The 2024 season saw them post an IL-worst .185 (12-53) winning percentage in such games. When allowing at least 10 hits last year, Columbus was 7-41 (.146, 20th in the IL; started the season 1-20).

## In Big Trouble

The Clipper pitching staff is trending toward the worst ERA in club history, sitting at 5.40 through the first 63G. Since the reorganization of the minor leagues in 2021, Columbus has twice finished the season with a 5+ ERA (current record is 5.32, set in 2023), after having done so just once in the first 43 seasons (5.08 in 1983). However, the staff is pacing to give up only 162HR (20HR under the average of 182 per season since the Year of the Homer in 2019).

## Department of Defense

The Columbus defense is sitting at 9th in the IL this year (.980), following a 2025 that saw a franchise record (.985, led the IL). On 4/10 at Worcester, the defense collapsed for the first 5E game since 8/27/24 (topped out at 3E in a game twice last year and had fewer than 5E in 21 of 26 series). The Clippers have played flawlessly in 35G this season (23-12, .657), after doing so in nearly 60% of games last year (44-42, .512), including 16 straight from 6/20-7/8/25 (longest streak in the IL over the last 20 years).

## Key to Victory

From 2022-23, Columbus owned the best record in the IL when holding opponents to three runs or fewer, going 95-8 (.922, no other team was above .880). The Clippers were 43-10 in such games in 2024 (.811, 13th in the IL), accumulating four losses by 4/14, and were just 47-10 (.825, 9th) last year, collecting four losses over 14G from 4/23-5/9 (had four losses total in both 2022 and 2023).

## Good Baseball

**Kody Huff** bunted a run in, while moving another to scoring position in a 5/24 win vs. Louisville. Since the start of the 2018 season, Columbus is 87-23 (.791) in games in which a run is scored after a good bunt attempt, including a 4-2 mark this season (.667, blew 7-run lead in one of the losses; went 23-2 in 2018).

## To the End

The Clippers had the 6th most last at bat losses last season (17), after pacing the circuit with 23 in 2024 (tied with Toledo). They also suffered the 4th most walk-off losses (8), watching three in a row slip away at Rochester from 5/29-5/31. The 2024 season saw 41G decided in the last at bat (tied for 2nd most in the IL, one off lead), with Columbus going 18-23 in those contests (-17th, .439).

## Manager Profile

**Andy Tracy** made his Clippers debut in 2021, following **Tony Mansolino's** championship rookie year in 2019 (sixth Clipper skipper to win Governors' Cup in first season; **Gene Michael**-'79, **Joe Altobelli**-'80, **Frank Verdi**-'81, **Bucky Dent**-'87 and **Mike Sarbaugh**-'10). This season marks Tracy's sixth year as a manager (first was with Williamsport in the Philadelphia system), as he holds a career record of 422-433 (.494), 392-387 with Columbus (.503).
