Dayton Dragons (15-13, 48-46) at Great Lakes Loons (15-13, 60-33)

RH Chase Petty (0-1, 1.74) vs. LH Jason Wroblewski (4-4, 3.22)

Today's Game: The Dayton Dragons (affiliate of the Cincinnati Reds) meet the Great Lakes Loons (affiliate of the Los Angeles Dodgers) in the fifth game of a six-game series.

Last Game: Friday: Great Lakes 7, Dayton 6. In arguably the most unusual game of the season, Great Lakes worked out of a ninth inning bases-loaded jam to hold off a Dragons comeback effort and snap Dayton's six-game winning streak. Dayton starting pitcher Hunter Parks was ejected after throwing one pitch, hitting Great Lakes lead-off man Taylor Young, also leading to the ejection of Dragons manager Bryan LaHair, and forcing the Dragons to essentially rely on their bullpen for the complete game (Great Lakes later had a player ejected as well). Still, the Dragons led 5-2 in the fourth after a three-run home run by Jack Rogers, but Great Lakes scored five in the bottom of the fourth to take a 7-5 lead. The Dragons scored one in the ninth and had the bases loaded with one out but could not deliver the big hit. Dragons outfielder Jay Allen II left the game in the fifth after an apparent medical issue that lasted several minutes. He eventually was able to walk off the field with assistance from two teammates.

Current Series (July 25-30 at Great Lakes): Dayton is 3-1 in the series.

Dayton team statistics in the series: .220 batting average; 5.8 runs/game; 6 home runs; 5 stolen bases; 4.11 ERA; 2 errors.

Season Series with Great Lakes: Dayton is 7-9, winning five of the last six after losing eight of the first 10 against the Loons.

Last Series (July 18-23 vs. Wisconsin): Dayton went 3-3 in the series.

Dayton team statistics in the series: .266 batting average; 5.0 runs/game; 7 home runs; 11 stolen bases; 5.67 ERA; 5 errors.

Team Notes

- The Dragons had a six-game winning streak snapped last night. During the winning streak, Dragons pitchers allowed just 25 hits, an average of 4.2 per game.
- The Dragons are tied for second place, two games behind Fort Wayne. To reach the playoffs, the Dragons must win the division title in the second half (or finish second in the second half if Great Lakes wins the second half division title).
- The Dragons won back-to-back games Sunday and Tuesday despite trailing with two outs and the bases empty in the ninth inning. The Dragons hit home runs to tie or take the lead in the ninth in Sunday's 6-5 win over Wisconsin and Tuesday's 3-2 win at Great Lakes.
- Ruben Ibarra's three-run home run with two outs in the ninth inning Tuesday, while trailing 2-0, was the first of its kind in many years for the Dragons. While records on ninth inning comebacks only go back to 2008, there is no record of the Dragons ever, while trailing, hitting a ninth inning home run to take the lead on the road, and then holding on to win, prior to Tuesday night.

Player Notes

- **Edwin Arroyo** in his last 13 games is hitting .326 with nine walks and eight stolen bases. Arroyo since May 31 has played in 47 games and is batting .294 with four home runs, 16 stolen bases, and an .840 OPS, raising his average from .182 to .243.
- **Austin Callahan** in the second half (27 games) is batting .317 with 11 doubles, one triple, three home runs, and 19 RBI (.892 OPS) to raise his average from .238 to .263. For the season, he leads the MWL in doubles and extra base hits.
- The Dragons top hitter in the month of July has been Austin Callahan (.299, 2 HR, 12 RBI, .841 OPS). Austin Hendrick leads the team in home runs in July with four but has batted just .176. Jack Rogers leads in RBI with 13 while batting .207 with three home runs. Edwin Arroyo leads in stolen bases with nine while batting .263
- **Braxton Roxby** over his last 21 G (since May 14): 3-1, 1.72 ERA, 4 saves, 31.1 IP, 17 H, 12 BB, 34 SO, .156 opponent's average.
- **Jayvien Sandridge** over his last 6 G: 12.2 IP, 4 H, 2 R, 1 ER, 6 BB, 18 SO.
- **Jose Acuña** has a 2.97 ERA that ranks third in the MWL. He is tied for first in wins (7) and first in opponent's average (.187).
- Starting pitcher **Chase Petty** has an ERA of 1.74 in 41.1 innings (11 starts). He missed the first month of the season.
- The Dragons roster is headlined by **Edwin Arroyo**, a shortstop who is currently ranked as the Reds #2 prospect by *MLB.com*. Arroyo, age 19, is the youngest position player in the MWL among players with at least 100 AB. Dragons starting pitcher **Chase Petty** is currently ranked as the Reds #5 prospect by *MLB.com*. Petty, age 20, is the third youngest pitcher in the MWL with at least 20 innings. Other Dragons players currently ranked among the Reds top-30 prospects by *MLB.com* include outfielder **Jay Allen II** (#8 prospect), outfielder **Austin Hendrick** (#17 prospect), and second baseman **Tyler Callihan** (#26 prospect).

Basics for 2023: This is the third year in which the league is classified at the High-A level of Minor League Baseball. The Midwest League was a Low-A league prior to 2021. The 12-team Midwest League operates with two six-team divisions.

The Midwest League will continue to utilize a Pitch Timer to encourage a quicker pace of play. Pitchers are required to deliver each pitch within a 14-second time limit (or 18 seconds with a runner on base). Defensive positioning rules require at least two infielders on each side of second base, with at least four infielders positioned on the infield dirt. Pitchers are limited in the number of unsuccessful pick-off throws they can make to a base. The third pick-off throw must result in an out, or the runner will be awarded the next base.

Dragons Manager/Coaches:

Bryan LaHair is in his second season as Dragons manager and his sixth year in the Reds organization. Under LaHair's leadership last season, the Dragons posted a first half record of 39-27 to finish second in the Midwest League's East Division, one game out of first place. The 2022 Dragons broke the club record for home runs in a season, leading the league with 152. The Dragons also narrowly missed leading the league in stolen bases, finishing with five fewer than the league leader despite playing four fewer games. LaHair served as manager with the Reds affiliate in the Arizona Complex League in 2021 and was the manager at Billings in 2019. LaHair opened his coaching career as the Billings hitting coach in 2018. As a player, LaHair played professionally for 14 seasons from 2003-14 and 2016-17, appearing in more than 1,000 games. He was primarily a first baseman but also saw considerable time as a corner outfielder. He played in 195 major league games with the Seattle Mariners and Chicago Cubs. In 2012, he appeared in the MLB All-Star Game. LaHair played for TEAM USA's national team three times (2005 World Cup, 2006 regional Olympic qualifier, 2007 Olympic qualifier). LaHair led all of Minor League Baseball in home runs in 2011 with 38 with the Iowa Cubs and was selected as the Pacific Coast League Most Valuable Player. LaHair, 40, is a native of Worcester, Massachusetts and was chosen as the 2000 Massachusetts High School Player of the Year. He was selected by the Mariners in the 39th round of the 2002 draft out of St. Petersburg College in Florida.

Todd Naskedov (NASK-uh-duv) joins the Dragons as pitching coach in 2023, his second season in the Reds organization. The 2023 season is Naskedov's sixth year in professional baseball after more than 20 years as a coach at the high school or college levels. He was the pitching coach at Single-A Daytona in the Reds organization in 2022. Naskedov spent four years as a coach in the Houston Astros organization before joining the Reds. He was the pitching coach at Single-A Fayetteville in 2021 after three years as the Astros pitching rehab coordinator at their complex in West Palm Beach, Florida. Naskedov coached college or high school baseball in Arizona, Oregon, Texas, and Washington, has coached with USA Baseball's national team, and has coached abroad in the United Kingdom and the Netherlands as a Major League Baseball international envoy. Naskedov, 46, is originally from Kelso, Washington.

Eric Richardson joins the Dragons as hitting coach in 2023, his second season in the Reds organization and 10th year as a professional coach. He was the hitting coach at Double-A Chattanooga in 2022. Richardson began his coaching career in the Phillies organization with stints as hitting coach with Single-A Lakewood in 2004; the GCL Phillies in 2005; and Short-Season Batavia in 2006. He served as the hitting coach in the White Sox organization with Great Falls for three seasons from 2017-2019. Richardson played for seven seasons in the White Sox organization from 1991-97, spending two years in the Midwest League with South Bend. In 1994, Richardson played in the outfield with NBA legend Michael Jordan during spring training in Jordan's lone season as a professional baseball player. Richardson was a base stealing threat, leading the South Atlantic League in stolen bases in 1993. Richardson, 50, was drafted by the White Sox in the fifth round in 1991 out of Brenham High School in Texas.

Osmin Melendez joins the Dragons as a coach in 2023, his first year in the Reds organization and 21st year in coaching in professional baseball. Melendez served as a coach in the Chicago Cubs system for seven seasons from 2013-19 after coaching in the Pirates organization for 13 years. He spent the 2015 season in the Midwest League as the infield coach with South Bend. Melendez began coaching as the coordinator of the Pirates academy in Venezuela from 1999-2011. He was the manager of the Pirates affiliate in the Venezuelan Summer League for six seasons, 2006-2011. His teams posted a record of 272-142 (.657), earning the VSL's best regular season record all six years and winning the league championship in 2008 and 2010. He served as manager of the Cubs affiliate in the Venezuelan Summer League in 2013. He was the hitting coach for the AZL Cubs in 2014 and 2017. He was the hitting/infield coach at Double-A Tennessee in 2016; the hitting coach at Short-Season Eugene in 2018; and the hitting/infield coach with Single-A Myrtle Beach in 2019. Melendez is a former infielder who played for two seasons with the GCL Orioles in the Baltimore Orioles organization, 1993-94. Melendez, 47, was born in Barquisimeto, Venezuela and currently resides in Orlando, Florida.

2023 Memorable Moments

On April 26 vs. Lake County, the Dragons reached their highest run total in nearly eight years and their highest total at home in nearly 11 years, with a 17-8 victory. They last scored 17 runs in a game on June 5, 2015 at Clinton, and last scored 17 runs at home on July 4, 2012 against South Bend. The club record for most runs in a game is 21, in 2001. On April 26, Mat Nelson hit two home runs including the back end of back-to-back home runs in the third inning after Austin Callahan had hit a two-run homer. Jack Rogers hit a grand slam, the second of the year for the Dragons. Dayton was 8 for 12 with men in scoring position. Tyler Callihan added a double and triple.

In back-to-back games, the Dragons trailed with two outs and the bases empty in the ninth inning but rallied to win. On June 23 vs. Wisconsin, the Dragons trailed 5-4 with two outs and the bases empty in the bottom of the ninth inning when Hayden Jones belted a game-tying home run. Two batters later, after a pair of walks, Edwin Arroyo lined a single to center field to drive in Trey Faltine from second with the winning run. In the next game, on June 25 at Great Lakes, the Dragons trailed 2-0 with two outs and the bases empty in the top of the ninth inning when Arroyo doubled, Austin Callahan walked, and Ruben Ibarra blasted a 451' three-run home run to left field to give the Dragons a 3-2 lead. Braxton Roxby pitched a perfect bottom of the ninth to close out the win.
