After dropping a wild 15-14 opener, the Lugnuts have won the last four games of the series, putting them in position to win five of six games in a series for the second consecutive week.

Last Night: Lugnuts 9, TinCaps 7. Fort Wayne scored one run in the 1st, three in the 2nd and three in the 3rd... only to see the Lugnuts answer with four runs apiece in the 4th and 5th innings and one more in the 6th for a stunning comeback victory. Center fielder Rodney Green, Jr. swatted his league-leading sixth home run of the season in the win, while five Lugnuts relievers combined for six shutout innings, striking out seven while allowing only three singles and no walks.

Hello, First Place: With yesterday's win and West Michigan's 10-inning loss in Dayton, the Nuts moved into a first place tie atop the Midwest League's East Division with the Whitecaps.

Atop the League: The Lugnuts' offense leads the Midwest League in batting average (.285), base hits (190), fewest strikeouts (130) and on-base percentage (.394). The Nuts also rank second in runs scored (109) and slugging percentage (401).

Streaking: Clark Elliott (1-for-2, HBP, two walks yesterday) enters today on a 15-game on-base streak; Cole Conn (idle yesterday) has hit safely in 10 straight games; Tommy White (1-for-5) has hit safely in 11 straight games and reached base in his last 13 games; and T.J. Schofield-Sam (2-for-4, walk) has reached base in his last 13 consecutive games.

Lugnut League Leaders, Hitters:

- Clark Elliott tops the Midwest League with a .516 on-base percentage, having reached base in 32 of his 62 plate appearances this year: 13 base hits, 17 walks and 2 HBPs in 15 games.

- Rodney Green, Jr. leads the Midwest League with six home runs and ranks 3rd in total bases (39), tied for 3rd in runs scored (16), and tied for 3rd in extra-base hits (10).

- Tommy White has the most base hits in the Midwest League (24) and is 2nd in doubles (8) and tied for 6th in runs (14).

- T.J. Schofield-Sam is 2nd in the Midwest League with a .368 batting average and is 4th in OPS (.948) and tied for 6th (with teammate Nate Nankil) in base hits (21).

- Jared Dickey ranks 5th in batting average (.328) and 5th in on-base percentage (.459).

Lugnut League Leaders, Pitchers:

- Grant Judkins has the Midwest League's only complete game.
- Gage Jump tops all Midwest League hurlers with 30 strikeouts.

- Mark Adamiak and Henry Gomez are tied for 1st in the Midwest League with three saves.

Prospecting: The Nuts boast the A's second, third, fourth and fifth selections in the 2024 draft: slugging third baseman Tommy White (40th overall), southpaw starter Gage Jump (73rd), shortstop Joshua Kuroda-Grauer (75th) and outfielder Rodney Green, Jr. (104th). White is rated the A's No. 7 prospect, Kuroda-Grauer is No. 10, Jump is No. 13 and Green is No. 19. The Lugnuts also have 19-year-old Steven Echavarria, rated No. 12, and outfielder Nate Nankil, who is No. 29.

DK at the Helm: The 19th manager in Lugnuts history is Darryl Kennedy, entering his second year in the A's organization. Kennedy distinguished himself as a catcher at Manatee Community College before starring at the University of North Florida and was named an NCAA All-American in 1991 en route to North Florida's Hall of Fame, inducted in 2017. Kennedy played in the Minor Leagues for seven seasons, including parts of four seasons in Triple-A. Following his 1997 retirement, he immediately began managing, leading the Gulf Coast League Rangers to the 1998 GCL Championship. Kennedy won a second title with the GCL Rangers in 2000, moving on to stops in the Florida State League, Northwest League and Texas League through 2006. Upon joining the Royals' organization, Kennedy managed in the Appalachian League, Carolina League, Pioneer League, Arizona League and Texas League through 2020

2010: 1st-rounder Chad Jenkins fired eight shutout innings, allowing six hits and one walk while striking out nine, and Evan Crawford wrapped up a seven-hit Lugnuts 6-0 victory at West Michigan.

2016: The Lugnuts extended their scoreless streak to 24 innings, as Angel Perdomo (5 IP, 7 K) combined with two relievers on a four-hit 6-0 shutout at Beloit.

2018: Cullen Large went 5-for-5 and scored the game-winning run on a Norberto Obeso RBI single in the bottom of the ninth, helping the Lugnuts complete a four-game home sweep of the Dayton Dragons with a thrilling 8-7 win. (Obeso, added to the roster earlier in the day from Extended Spring Training, wore eyeblack that read "I'm back.").

In a Nutshell: Enters second season in the Midwest League... started Lugnuts' third game of the year, April 6 at Fort Wayne, and fanned eight TinCaps in four hitless innings... last time out, tossed the first complete game of the season in the Midwest League, and one of only three CGs in MiLB to this day, firing six innings in the series finale, April 19 at Wisconsin: 75 pitches, 47 strikes, seven hits, two runs, one walk, one strikeout, in a 2-0 loss – the Lugnuts' only loss of the series.

History: Facing the Cedar Rapids Kernels on June 13, 2024, relieved Jake Garland to open the 6th inning and tossed 2 2/3 hitless innings, walking one and striking out three, as part of the Lugnuts' 8-0 combined no-hitter of the Kernels... it was the 4th no-hitter in franchise history as well as the first home no-hitter since 2003.

Onward to Des Moines: Entered the 2017 Big Ten season ranked by Baseball America as the No. 8 freshman... two-way player, hitting .270 in 31 starts as a DH (and three starts as a pitcher hitting for himself)... 2018 Academic All-Big Ten... No. 3 starter in 2019; 2019 Collegiate Baseball Player National Pitcher of the Week (Feb. 18), tossing six no-hit innings with 11 strikeouts; ranked 7th in the Big Ten in ERA (2.72)... No. 2 starter in 2020 before season was halted early due to the pandemic: 2-0, 3.00, 4 GS, 21 IP, 24 K, 5 BB... signed with the Athletics following the shortened five-round draft.

International Stage: With lowa, took part in the 2017 World University Games in Taipei City, winning a silver medal (fell to Japan in the gold medal contest)... part of the first American team to ever advance to the gold medal game as well as the first American team to ever medal, period... team finished 5-2, losing only to Japan... started five games, four at first base, one at pitcher.
