

DOUG DAVIS

BORN: SEPTEMBER 24, 1962 RESIDES: BLOOMSBURG, PA YEARS WITH NYY: 4

DID YOU KNOW?: DAVIS' FIRST MANAGER IN THE MINOR LEAGUES WAS HAZLETON, PA NATIVE JOE MADDON, WHO EVENTUALLY LED THE CHICAGO CUBS TO THE 2016 WORLD

It was announced January 27, 2020, that Bloomsburg, Pennsylvania native and Central Columbia High School graduate Doug Davis will manage the RailRiders for the 2021 season. He is the 13th manager in SWB franchise history, and just the fifth in Yankees-era history (2007-Present). He joins Dave Miley (2007-15), Al Pedrique (16-17), Bobby Mitchell (2018) and Jay Bell (2019) as SWB skippers to serve under the Yankees affiliation.

Davis enjoyed an 11-year professional career, which included spending parts of two years in Major League Baseball. He spent three seasons coaching with the RailRiders under three different managers, serving as the Defensive Coach in 2017 under Pedrique, the Bullpen Coach in 2018 under Mitchell and the Bench Coach in 2019 under Bell.

Davis, 58, has been in coaching since 1995, serving as a minor league manager for eight seasons. As a manager, he owns a career 515-484 record including championships with Pittsfield in the NY-Penn League in 1997 and Capital City (Columbia, SC) in the South Atlantic League in 1998. From 2007-2016 he was on staff in the Toronto Blue Jays system and before that he spent two seasons in the big leagues as the Florida Marlins bench coach from 2003-04, winning the World Series against the Yankees in 2003 with former SWB Pitching Coach Tommy Phelps on the roster.

In between coaching stints, Davis served as the Minor League Field Coordinator for the Montreal Expos (2001), Florida Marlins (2002, 2005), and Toronto Blue Jays (2009-2016).



Selected in the ninth round of the 1984 MLB Draft out of

NC State, the former catcher played professionally for 11 seasons between 1984 and 1994 in the minor league systems of California, Kansas City and Texas. He made it to the big leagues on two separate occasions, scoring one run in six games with the Angels in 1988 and he collected a hit in his only MLB at-bat with the Rangers in 1992.

RAUL DOMINIGUEZ- COACH

Dominguez begins his first season with Scranton/Wilkes-Barre and his 14th in the Yankees organization in 2020. He spent the last two seasons as the defensive coach for Double-A Trenton, and served in the same role for A-Advanced Tampa in 2017. Dominguez was signed by the Yankees as a non-drafted free agent in 2001.





CAONABO COSME- COACH

Cosme enters his 10th season in the Yankees organization and his first with the RailRiders. He was scheduled to serve as a defensive coach for the Yankees' former Double-A Trenton affiliate before the 2020 season was cancelled due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

GIVING BACK: CHIRINOS USING BIG LEAGUE CAREER TO HELP OTHERS

RailRiders catcher Robinson Chirinos grateful for the opportunity to give back and is using his baseball career as his chance to do so.

RailRiders catcher Robinson Chirinos has experienced a lot in his 21 years of being a professional baseball player, but a season without fans is something he hopes to never see again. Chirinos played in 26 games with the Texas Rangers and New York Mets, but things didn't really feel right.

"Last year it felt more like a practice game to me," Chirinos said about playing in front of empty stadiums. "Last year we didn't have the interaction with the fans and it was really hard. So thank god we have some fans in the ballpark [this year]. I know they're really happy to be back and we're super happy to have them back in the ballpark."

More than his big league career which has spanned nine seasons and taken him to the World Series, Chirinos takes pride in his connection to the fans and the community. While warming up, he usually takes a few extra baseballs to toss to kids in the crowd and will stop to sign autographs. Making those memories for fans is what makes being a professional baseball player special for him.



The 36-year-old catcher has come a long way since he was signed by the Chicago Cubs in July 2000, less than a month after his 16th birthday. He began to play in the US next year, and for the next 10 seasons, he toiled in the Cubs minor league system. Chirinos caught hundreds of games for teams in Boise, Idaho, Lansing, Michigan, and Knoxville, Tennessee – all far cries from his hometown of Punto Fijo, Venezuela.



In all that time Chirinos only played 15 games in Triple-A, but after the 2010 season he got his big break and was traded to the Tampa Bay Rays organization. Finally, 11 years after signing his first professional contract, he made his MLB debut on July 18 against the New York Yankees. He doubled against A.J. Burnett in his first big league at-bat and played in 20 games total that season with the Rays, hitting .218.

It wasn't until the 2014 season with the Texas Rangers that Chirinos established himself as a full-time major leaguer. He spent six years with the Rangers before signing as a free agent with the Houston Astros for the 2019 season. After the stint with Houston, Chirinos returned to Texas prior to the 2020 campaign.

In that time Chirinos has established himself as a solid player both offensively and defensively. Since the start of the 2011 season, Chirinos' .755 OPS is 12th among all big league catchers and puts him in the same tier as seven-time all-star Brian McCann and nine-time all-star Yadier Molina. Chirinos has gotten even better as time has gone on and his role has grown, posting a .798 OPS in 315 games from the start of 2017 through 2019.

For Chirinos, baseball has always been about more than just the games and the stats. It is about using his platform as a professional athlete to make a difference in the lives of others. That's why in addition to making his big league debut in 2011 Chirinos also founded The Robinson Chirinos Foundation.

"It was a dream my dad had when I signed," Chirinos said. "He told me that one day when I make it to the big leagues, he wanted me to start a foundation to give back to the community, especially my hometown Punto Fijo, where I grew up."

It started out small. Chirinos began donating baseball equipment to kids in need in Venezuela. He wanted the next generation to play and have the opportunities that he has had, but the foundation has morphed into something more.

In 2014, the Texas Rangers began to assist Chirinos in his charitable efforts and helped him host fundraisers. Rangers teammates like Elvis Andrus, Martin Perez, Yovani Gallardo and Jayce Tingler all showed up to Foundation events to help others.

Chirinos now uses the foundation to provide, food, clothing, medicine and school supplies to those in need both in Venezuela and the United States. Until the pandemic made it impossible, he hosted dinners every year in Texas which were well attended by his teammates and Rangers officials to raise money.

Robinson has received multiple awards for his charity work from the Rangers and the Dallas-Fort Worth Chapter of the Baseball Writers Association of America, but he doesn't do it for the recognition. His motivation is purely to use the blessings he has received to lift up others.

"God has been so good to me and I'm just trying to help people in need and use what I have to use what I have around myself to help people. That's what my goal has been in everything. I've been trying to make people aware of what's going on in their community and help people really going through a struggle in life."





GREEN'S DAY COMING: PITCHER EXCELLING IN RISE TO TRIPLE-A

Nick Green was acquired from the Texas Rangers in 2016 and has reached Triple-A for the first time in his career.

When he is at his best, RailRiders pitcher Nick Green is a throwback pitcher. His fastball doesn't reach the upper 90s and he has never really tallied up strikeouts at a prodigious rate. To get batters out he relies on deception, movement and one of the top groundball rates in the game of baseball.

Perhaps it shouldn't be a surprise that Green has always been a good groundball pitcher. He grew up in Fountain, Colorado, about an hour and a half south of Denver. With baseballs famously flying in the thin mountain air, inducing hitters to pound it into the ground is more than sound strategy – it's a survival technique.

"Since I grew up there ... it's just normal for me, you know?" said Green. "Everybody's like all the ball flies there and the ball you

know, goes crazy there and I'm like, no, it's normal there you know, but it does fly there. It absolutely goes."

Nestled in the Rocky Mountains 5,545 feet above sea level, Fountain is locally famous for being the site of a massive train wreck in the late 19th century and for being the hometown of former Yankees third baseman Chase Headley. Green and Headley are the only two professional baseball players to come out of Fountain-Fort Carson High School.

Green's path to pinstripes has taken some twists and turns. He was originally drafted out of high school by the Yankees in the 36th round of the 2013 MLB Draft, but decided not to sign. Instead he attended Indian Hills Community College in Iowa – a powerful junior college program. After going 3-1 with a 2.97 ERA with IHCC in 2014, the Texas Rangers drafted the right-hander in the 7th round of the 2014 draft. This time he signed, and at just 19 years old began his professional career.

He pitched well enough in the Arizona League to earn a promotion to Spokane in 2015, and was pitching there again in 2016 when his baseball world was turned upside

down. The Rangers were in first place and looking to solidify their lineup for a playoff push on August 1. The Yankees, on their way to a fourth-place finish were looking to trade outfielder Carlos Beltran.

Yankees GM Brian Cashman worked out a deal with Texas to trade the veteran Beltran for three minor league pitchers – Dillon Tate, Erik Swanson and Green. Getting traded for the first time can be a shocking and sad experience for players, but now with some hindsight Green has a positive take.

"I think anytime some team shows interest in you, it's just a really good feeling in general, just because that it happens to very little people," he said. "You always you always have like those guys on the team that you really care about. And obviously, the [Rangers] took care of me while I was young. So you have those

moments, but over time, you just kind of move forward with it and you understand."

After a lost year in 2020 with the COVID-19 pandemic, Green is happy to be back on the field competing. Like most players who were not part of the Alternate Training Site at PNC Field last year, Green stayed in shape by playing catch and pitching with his mom and dad in Colorado. While nothing is a substitute for real game action, Green has found the transition back to baseball relatively easy, even with the transition to Triple-A for the first time.

"I think there's not too much of an adjustment. It goes back to getting back into routines and stuff just because you know, every level you move up, it's kind of the same thing," he said. "You get used to the team, you get used to the players and over time, you just kind of get used to the atmosphere. So I think it just goes back to like getting through the routines and all that stuff. It was awesome. I mean, I'm super pumped up to start [here]. It's definitely been a lot of fun. The team is awesome, great group of guys."

Green knows that to take the next step he needs to work on limiting walks, something that has become an issue as he has risen through the Yankees minor league system. If he can do that while maintaining his groundball prowess, he could be earning himself a ticket to the Bronx soon.

"I tell you what, I put myself in so many situations that I don't need to be in," said Green. "I want to say it's an easy fix, but you know, it's one of those things. It's not easy, but it is easy. So obviously, that's the biggest thing for me. I think in general I want to maintain the game that I'm playing right now. Just kind of clean it up a little bit over time and grow from each game."

NEED TO KNOW: ADDITIONAL UPDATES TO PNC FIELD PROTOCOLS

RailRiders updating several guidelines and policies as PNC Field returns to 100% capacity on June 1, 2021.



PNC Field will soon return to full capacity for the first time this season.

Due to additional changes in CDC and state guidelines last week, the Scranton/Wilkes-Barre RailRiders have updated several policies for fans attending games at PNC Field this season. Masking policies will change during the team's next homestand and capacity restrictions will change next month.

PNC Field returns to 100% capacity on June 1 and single-game tickets for the remainder of the 2021 home schedule will go on sale tomorrow, May 21, at 10 A.M. online at swbrailriders.com.

Updated Policies and Guidelines are as follows:

Mask Policy (Beginning May 25)

- Vaccinated fans do not need to wear a mask unless they choose to do so.
- Unvaccinated fans must continue to mask at all times.

Entrance/ Seating/ Capacity Restrictions (Beginning June 1)

- Due to Major League Baseball requirements, social distancing will remain in place during entrance and exit at PNC Field as well as in concession lines throughout the ballpark.
- A special "pod seating" section will remain in place for fans wishing to maintain safe social distancing. Masking will be required in this section.
- The Season Ticket Holder early entrance policy will be reinstated (15 minutes before gates open via the SWB Station Team Store).
- The designated smoking areas will be reinstated.
- The Geisinger Kids Zone will be open.
- The SWB Station Team Store capacity restrictions will be lifted.
- Ballpark re-entry will now be permitted.

The RailRiders will keep several existing policies in place. They are as follows:

- RailRiders and Legends staff will continue to wear masks at PNC Field.
- Digital Ticketing will remain in place for the entire 2021 season.
- PNC Field will remain cashless for the entire 2021 season
- Players will not be able to sign autographs until further notice.
- The Clear Bag Policy remains in effect for the entire 2021 season.
- Enhanced cleaning and sanitization efforts will stay in place for the entire 2021 season.

In addition, due to MLB guidelines, the RailRiders will continue to utilize pod seating for player families to assist with social distancing and safety.

Protocols and procedures remain subject to change this season per Major League Baseball, state and CDC guidance.
