BINGHAMTON LEADS START TO FINISH IN 5-3 WIN: Binghamton handed the Fisher Cats their third straight loss with a 5-3 victory on Wednesday night. The Rumble Ponies plated two runs in the first inning, and would wind up handing Elvis Luciano his first loss of the season. Graham Spraker, Sean Rackoski, and Kyle Johnston combined for three innings of one-run relief pitching, but the Fisher Cats squandered opportunities with runners in scoring position and were held to under five runs for the the fifth straight game, allowing Bowie to retake the league lead in runs scored at the same time.

TIME TO PONY UP: The Rumble Ponies are 7-1 against the Fisher Cats this season, a winning percentage of .875. Against non-Fisher Cats opponents, Binghamton is 13-33, a winning percentage of .282. With two consecutive games under two hours and 50 minutes, the opening two games of this series are the shortest back-to-back nine inning games of the season.

MIRABITO STADIUM DYNAMICS: Mirabito Stadium is the most pitcher-friendly park that the Fisher Cats will have played at this season. Mirabito Stadium has seen the third fewest home runs of any stadium in the Double-A Northeast over the last five seasons, and the lowest home run total to date this year. This is the Fisher Cats' only trip to Binghamton this season. Despite these metrics, the Fisher Cats hit two home runs in the series opener.

BOB LIPMAN'S THIS DATE IN FISHER CATS HISTORY: July 8, 2018—The Eastern League Champs snapped the longest losing streak of the season (four games) with a 14-2 win over Reading at Delta Dental Stadium. The Fisher Cats scored nine times in the bottom of the eighth inning, which included a grand slam by Jonathan Davis. Harole Ramirez and Eduard Pinto each had three hits.

MANCHESTER BOSTON REGIONAL AIRPORT FLIGHT TO THE MAJORS: The Blue Jays recorded 15 hits en route to a 10-2 drubbing of the Orioles. Bo Bichette and Vlad Guerrero Jr. combined for six hits and five runs batted in. Buffalo lost to Rochester 4-3, as Zach Logue took his first loss at the Triple-A level, going just three innings. Former top prospect Blake Swihart homered for Rochester. Spokane scored three unanswered runs to defeat Vancouver 3-2. Tampa and Dunedin were preemptively cancelled due to Tropical Storm Elsa. The FCL Blue Jays play two today, including the completion of a suspended game against the FCL Tigers.

COMING UP: The first 12-game road stretch of the season (and in the history of the Fisher Cats) begins this week for the Fisher Cats. The Fisher Cats will spend this week at Mirabito Stadium to take on the Binghamton Rumble Ponies (New York Mets) before a week at Hartford July 13-18. The only remaining home series this month begins July 20 against Reading (Phillies).

STARTERS: For the Fisher Cats, Maximo Castillo gets the mound in tonight's game. Castillo is tied for the lead in all of Double-A with six wins on the season, and he has won each of his last four starts. Last time out, Castillo limited Portland to just two hits in five innings of work, fanning six. Opponents have been able to put runners on base against Castillo, with his WHIP sitting at 1.40 (slightly above league average), and he has an ERA of 8.05 away from home this season.

For the Rumble Ponies, Josh Walker will make his second start against the Fisher Cats this season. He picked up the win in the first meeting between these teams, but only lasted 3.2 innings in his last start. He has a stellar WHIP of 0.99 on the season in Double-A since his promotion from Brooklyn in late May. He is also averaging more than one strikeout per inning and has not given up a home run since facing the Fisher Cats in early June.
