GAME 1: Quad Cities took a 1-0 lead in the Midwest League Championship Series Sunday, defeating Dayton 4-0 at Modern Woodmen Park ... Bandits' starter Tanner Jones led the way on the mound with a scoreless 4.2-innings and three strikeouts before handing the ball to the bullpen ... while Ramon Ramirez (sac-fly) and Nolan Sailors (safety squeeze) also drove in runs, Blake Mitchell collected the Quad Cities' long RBI-hit, a fourth-inning double that plated Asbel Gonzalez ... Jordan Woods earned the win in relief, tossing 3.0-scoreless innings with four strikeouts.

ONE MORE: The River Bandits are one win away from securing their ninth title in franchise history and their second in six seasons as a Royals affiliate ... Quad Cities' last championship team (2021) included the likes of Maikel Garcia, Michael Massey, Vinnie Pasquantino, and Nick Loftin.

WHAT A RELIEF: Since the start of the playoffs, Quad Cities' bullpen has posted a combined 1.25 ERA (2 ER in 15 IP) and 21 strikeouts.

THEY GET ON BASE: Despite slugging just .319, the River Bandits lead all High-A playoff teams with a .402 on-base percentage including 22 walks, tied for the most among any minor league playoff team this year.

THE CLOSER: LP Langevin has been Quad Cities' go-to ninth-inning man, having closed out all three of the Bandits' postseason wins ... over 3.0 innings, the right-hander has allowed just two baserunners and struck out five of the 11 batters he's faced.

REINFORCEMENTS: Outfielder Henry Ramos and infielder Camden Johnson were both added to Quad Cities' playoff roster ahead of the West Division Championship Series, earning promotions from Columbia (A) ... Ramos played in 99 games with the Fireflies this season, batting .258 (96-for-372) with seven home runs and 20 stolen bases ... Johnson, the Royals' 9th-round selection in this year's draft, helped guide Oklahoma to the 2026 College World Series before playing in 21 games for the Fireflies to close out the regular season.

65 AND UP: Asbel Gonzalez led High-A and finished second in Minor League Baseball with 67 stolen bases this season ... the total ties Roger Minor (1970) for the second-most in a single-season in franchise history ... Bobby Coachman is the record-holder, swiping 69 in 1985 ... prior to Gonzalez, the last River Bandit to swipe 60 or more bases in a season was Royals utility man Tyler Tolbert, who stole exactly 60 in 2022 and never got caught.

BE LIKE B-MITCH: In addition to clubbing 23 home runs this season, Blake Mitchell drew a High-A-best 113 walks ... the total ranked third in Minor League Baseball at the end of the High-A season and is the third-most in a single-season in River Bandits history ... the Royals' No. 5

prospect was the first River Bandit to draw 100 or more walks in a season since Brian Grebeck in 1991.

BIG MAPLE: Despite working exclusively out of the bullpen, LP Langevin racked up 106 strikeouts in 55.1 innings this season (17.24 S/O/9) ... the total tied for eighth-most in the Midwest League and ranked second among all full-time minor league relievers at the end of the High-A season.

HISTORIC HOMERING: Derlin Figueroa led the Midwest League and finished second in High-A with 26 home runs ... the total made "Figgy" Quad Cities' single-season record holder, surpassing Brian Harper's 1978 mark of 24 ... additionally, Figueroa ranks fifth on Quad Cities' all-time home run leaderboard with 28, dating back to his High-A debut with the club last season.

PROSPECTING THE RIVER: The River Bandits' playoff roster features nine of the Royals' top 30 prospects (MLB Pipeline): **Kendry Chourio** (1), **David Shields** (4), **Blake Mitchell** (5), **Zion Rose** (6), **Ramon Ramirez** (7), **Asbel Gonzalez** (14), **Camden Johnson** (23), **Blake Wolters** (29), and **LP Langevin** (30).

A CENTURY AND COUNTING: The 2026 season marks the 103rd year of professional baseball in Davenport, dating back to the 1897 Davenport Brown Stockings of the Northwestern League ... since then, Davenport-based franchises have been part of nine different leagues, affiliated with 12 different Major League clubs, and sported 18 different monikers.

THE ROYAL FAMILY: 2026 marks the River Bandits' sixth season as an affiliate of the Kansas City Royals ... since joining the Royals organization, 20 River Bandits have made their Major League debuts with Kansas City: **Angel Zerpa** (21), **Michael Massey** (21), **Vinnie Pasquantino** (21), **Nate Eaton** (21), **Maikel Garcia** (21), **John McMillon** (23), **Nick Loftin** (21), **Logan Porter** (21), **Anthony Veneziano** (21), **Will Klein** (21), **Walter Pennington** (22), **Tyler Gentry** (21/22), **Tyler Tolbert** (21/22), **Noah Cameron** (22/23), **John Rave** (21), **Jac Caglianone** (24), **Luinder Avila** (23), **Carter Jensen** (23/24), **Eric Cerantola** (22/23), and **Beck Way** (22).

MANAGER JESUS AZUAJE

Azuaje enters his 12th season—fourth managerial—in the Royals’ organization and takes the reins in Davenport for the second-straight season after managing the Columbia Fireflies (Single-A) in 2024 and the ACL Royals (Rookie) in 2023. He spent the previous eight seasons serving as hitting coach in Burlington (2015-2016), Lexington (2017-2020), and Columbia (2021-2022). Prior to joining the Royals, Azuaje spent six seasons as a manager and coach in the Seattle Mariners organization, including a stint in the Midwest League as hitting coach for Clinton (Single-A) in 2009, and as Latin America Field Coordinator for the Los Angeles Dodgers in 2014.

2025: Earned the Paul Splittorff Award, given to the top pitcher in the Royals organization, as well as Carolina League All-Star and Pitcher of the Year honors ... made 1 start for the ACL Royals (R) before being promoted to Columbia (A) in April where made 18 starts and posted a 2.01 ERA (16 ER in 71.2 IP) with 81 strikeouts (28.3 K%) to just 15 walks (5.2 BB%) in his first professional season ... was one of two 18-year-olds to throw at least 70.0 innings in full-season ball, joining Milwaukee's right hander Melvin Hernández, and became the first Royals farmhand to do so since Yefri Del Rosario (79.0 IP in 2018), per FanGraphs ... made 2 postseason starts for the Fireflies, earning the win in both after recording 12 strikeouts and no walks across 10.0 innings.

2024: Graduated from Mount Lebanon High School (Pennsylvania) where he was crowned the Gatorade Pennsylvania Baseball Player of the Year after leading the Blue Devils to a 28-2 record ... went 5-0 with a 0.25 ERA, 52 strikeouts and just 3 walks on the mound, while also batting .418 with a 1.244 OPS, 7 doubles, and 28 RBIs ... was committed to the University of Miami (Florida) prior to signing with the Royals for a \$2.3 million bonus ... volunteered locally at the Miracle League baseball facility operated by Major League veteran, Sean Casey ... also played quarterback on the football team.
