NEWS AND NOTES

FILLING UP THE TANK: Robert Gasser will make his sixth start of the season when he gets the ball to open the series against the I-Cubs. He's made just one other start against Iowa during his career, taking the loss on May 25, 2023, when he allowed seven runs (5 ER) on 10 hits with four strikeouts and a walk over 4.0 IP at First Horizon Park. Tuesday's game will be his 50th career Triple-A appearance with Nashville (45 GS) and he owns a 14-6 all-time record in Triple-A with 275 strikeouts and a .241 BAA.

STALL-ITY START: Right-hander Garrett Stallings recorded the team's third quality start of the season and earned his second win in Sunday's victory against the Bats, allowing three hits and striking out four batters in six shutout innings. Stallings has six career quality starts across 25 starts with Nashville including five last season. It was his first quality start since September 6 of last year. He has 19 career quality starts in his six-year campaign with 11 in Triple-A since making his Triple-A debut with Norfolk during the 2023 season. He has posted 14 career games allowing no runs in 5.0+ innings, including tossing 6.0 no-hit innings in the first game of a doubleheader on May 8, 2022, while he was with Double-A Bowie.

SHUT THEM OUT: The Sounds pitching staff tossed a combined shutout for the second time this season, led by starter Garrett Stallings who tossed his first quality start of the year and was followed by Craig Yoho, Peter Strzelecki and Blake Holub each tossing a scoreless inning to get the combined shutout win. The first combined shutout came against the Knights on April 2 when Nashville secured the 4-0 win in Charlotte. The Sounds have recorded 175 shutouts since 2005, which ranks 11th in Triple-A over the span. The Sounds posted a franchise record 16 shutouts last year.

NARD-DOG: Eddys Leonard recorded a double for the fourth straight game in Sunday's win over the Bats. He is one 11 Triple-A players with a double in at least four straight games this season and tied with Maick Collado (COL) for the longest active doubles streak in Triple-A. Buffalo's William Simoneit is the only Triple-A player with a double in five straight games this season. **The four game streak is tied for the longest of Leonard's professional career after also having four straight games with a double from May 10-13 with High-A Great Lakes during the 2022 season** in which he posted a single-season career-high 32 doubles. The last time a Sounds player had at least four consecutive games with a double was back in 2023 when Abraham Toro

recorded a double in seven straight games from July 18-25. Toro has the longest doubles streak for a Nashville player since 2005, with only four other players having a double in 5+ games for Nashville: Khris Davis (5, 2012), Brice Turang (5, 2022), Drew T. Anderson (6, 2007), and Corey Hart (6, 2005). Leonard owns the team lead with 10 doubles on the season and has hit 154 over his career. **Since the start of the 2021 season, Leonard ranks tied for sixth in hits (612), tied for fifth in doubles (137), and tied for fourth in XBH (246) among all full-season minor leaguers.**

CONSISTENCY IS KEY: Brewers no. 7-rated prospect Jeferson Quero extended his RBI-streak to three consecutive games after finishing Sunday's game with a pair of RBI. It was his 7th multi-RBI game of the season, tied with Eddys Leonard and Brock Wilken for the most multi-RBI games on the team this season. Only Luis Lara (2x) has posted a RBI in four straight games for Nashville this season. Over his last 16 games, Quero has five multi-RBI games, and is hitting .322 (19-for-59) with 16 total RBI and 10 XBH. Quero currently ranks tied for second in the Brewers farm system with his 24 RBI and leads all Nashville players.
