YESTERDAY: The Flying Squirrels lost to the RubberDucks, 8-3. The Richmond Flying Squirrels fell to the Akron RubberDucks, 8-3, on Saturday night at The Diamond. The Flying Squirrels fell behind, 6-0, through the first three innings to the RubberDucks. Against Manuel Mercedes in the top of the first, C.J. Kayfus hit an RBI triple and Jorge Burgos added a two-run homer to open a 3-0 lead. Travis Bazzana belted his first Double-A homer, a two-run shot, in the top of the second to extend Akron's lead to 5-0. Cameron Barstad singled in a run in third and Kayfus hit an RBI double in the sixth to open a 7-0 lead. Richmond broke the shutout in the seventh. Diego Velasquez scored on a wild pitch and Zach Morgan hit an RBI single to cut the deficit to 7-2. Justin Wishkoski worked a bases-loaded walk in the bottom of the eighth to pull the Flying Squirrels within four. Burgos extended Akron's lead back to five runs in the top of the ninth with a run-scoring groundout. Akron starter Austin Peterson allowed one hit over four scoreless innings. Ross Carver threw two scoreless frames and struck out three.

TODAY'S GAME: The Flying Squirrels conclude the final Opening Series at The Diamond to kick off their 15th season against the Akron RubberDucks, Double-A affiliate of the Cleveland Guardians. It is the second consecutive year the Flying Squirrels open their home slate against the RubberDucks.

TRYING TO GET ON THE BOARD: The Flying Squirrels are looking to avoid starting 0-3 for the first time since 2016 when they dropped the first three games of a four-game set against the Hartford Yard Goats in their inaugural season with Richmond playing as the road team at The Diamond. They also started 0-3 in 2012 at New Britain before salvaging the final game of that series. Along with those two years, the Flying Squirrels' only other 0-2 start prior to this year was in 2014, when they dropped their first two games of the year before going on to reach the Eastern League Championship Series at the end of the season. The Flying Squirrels have never been swept in a season-opening series.

STARTING OFF: After Friday, Flying Squirrels are 6-9 all time on Opening Day since the franchise's first season in 2010. They are 5-3 when they open the season at home (compared to 1-6 on the road). In their all-time home openers, the Flying Squirrels are 9-6 in their home openers. They faced Akron in their home opener last year and lost, 2-1. This year marks the first time the Flying Squirrels and RubberDucks have met to open a season. Richmond is 3-7 all-time on Opening Day against American League affiliates and 2-2 against Eastern League Western/Southwest Division opponents.

THE FLYING SQUIRRELS went 64-74 last season, missing the postseason for the first time since 2021. For the year, Richmond hitters ranked fifth in the Eastern League in batting average (.238), fourth in hits (592), third in doubles (230), fourth in triples (26), 11th in homers (88) and 11th in stolen bases (123). Flying Squirrels pitchers ranked eighth in the league in ERA (4.22) and fourth in strikeouts (1,281). The 2024 Flying Squirrels used 64 different players, setting a new franchise record.

THE RUBBERDUCKS posted the best record in the Eastern League last year, going 80-58. They were eliminated by eventual-champion Erie in the Southwest Division Series. This year's Akron team includes four players ranked in MLB.com's top-30 Guardians prospects, including Travis Bazzana (No. 1), Cooper Ingle (No. 7), C.J. Kayfus (No. 8) and Austin Peterson (No. 30).

FOR RICHMOND: Left-hander **Jack Choate** makes his season debut and the second start of his career against the RubberDucks. Last year, he spent most of the season with High-A Eugene, going 1-3 with a 2.90 ERA in 19 outings (18 starts). He was promoted to Double-A Richmond in August and made eight starts for the Flying Squirrels, posting a 1-4 record with a 5.82 ERA to close the season. Choate finished 2024 ranked first among qualified, full-season Giants minor-league pitchers in BAA (.231) and WHIP (1.21) while ranking second in ERA (3.79). Choate was selected by the Giants in the ninth round of the 2022 MLB Draft out of Assumption University. He entered 2025 ranked by Baseball America as the No. 28 Giants prospect and No. 27 by MLB.com. *For more on Choate, see page two.*

FOR AKRON: Right-hander Aaron Davenport makes his first start of the season and the fifth start of his career against the Flying Squirrels. Davenport spent all of last season with Akron, going 7-4 with a 2.85 ERA in 27 games (26 starts). He led the Eastern League in ERA and ranked third in WHIP (1.18), tied for third in BAA (.221), fifth in strikeouts (135), fifth in innings pitched (142.1) and tied for sixth in games started (26). In his four previous starts against Richmond in his career, he is 1-0 with a 1.86 ERA (4 ER/19.1 IP). Davenport was selected by the Cleveland Guardians in the sixth round of the 2021 MLB Draft out of the University of Hawaii.

HOWELL AT THE MOON: **Carter Howell** was named the 2024 Flying Squirrels Player of the Year in his first Double-A season. He spent all of last year in Richmond. For the season, he led the Eastern League in doubles (30) and triples (7). He also led the Flying Squirrels in batting average (.272), on-base percentage (.347), slugging percentage (.391), OPS (.738), hits (121), walks (47), extra-base hits (40), total bases (174), runs (64) and stolen bases (15). He reached base four times in Friday's season opener.

FAMILIAR FACES: This year's season-opening Flying Squirrels roster includes 22 players who have previously played for the Flying Squirrels. There are six players who will make their team debuts, including **Aeverson Arteaga**, **Sabin Ceballos**, **Manuel Mercedes**, **Rodolfo Nolasco**, **Braxton Roxby** and **Joe Whitman**. Roxby, acquired from the Reds in a trade earlier this year, is the only newcomer with previous Double-A experience.

WHERE DID THESE GUYS COME FROM?: There are players from six different counties on the Flying Squirrels' Opening Day roster, including the United States (20 players), Venezuela (3), the Dominican Republic (2), Cuba (1), Panama (1) and Puerto Rico (1). Among the 20 American-born players, 11 different states are represented, including North Carolina (3), Florida (3), Ohio (3), California (2), Michigan (2), Pennsylvania (2), Kentucky (1), Minnesota (1), North Dakota (1), Rhode Island (1) and Texas (1). There are 11 players who joined the Giants organization out of the MLB Draft, six were signed as non-drafted free agents, six as international free agents, four who were picked up in trades and one who was claimed in the minor-league phase of the Rule 5 Draft. For 23 players, the Giants were their original affiliated organization and five have played with other major-league organizations.

PACKING THE HOUSE: Last year, the Flying Squirrels led all 30 Double-A teams in average (6,595) and total (435,295) attendance. Among the 120 MiLB teams, the Flying Squirrels were 10th in average attendance. It was the third straight year the Flying Squirrels led all 30 Double-A clubs in average and total attendance, which had not been done prior to 2022. Last year's total attendance is the highest since 2013 (434,769) and the fourth-highest average in team history. Friday marked the 15th consecutive Opening Night sellout, marking every home opener in franchise history to date. The Flying Squirrels are 45-30 all time in sellouts at The Diamond.

BOULEVARD TO THE BAY: Last season, 14 former Flying Squirrels players have reached the majors for the first time. That was the most in a season in franchise history. In 2014, 11 alumni made their MLB debuts, including **Joe Panik**, **Adam Duval**, **Andrew Susac**, **Matt Duffy**, **Jackson Williams**, **Edwin Escobar**, **Hunter Strickland**, **Chris Dominguez**, **Gary Brown**, **Brett Bochy** and **Chris Heston**. The Flying Squirrels alumni to debut in the majors last season were **Erik Miller** (2023 Flying Squirrels), **Landen Roupp** (2022-23), **Kai-Wei Teng** (2022-23), **Nick Avila** (2022), **Randy Rodriguez** (2022-23), **Mason Black** (2023), **Gerson Garabito** (2021), **Spencer Bivens** (2023), **Raymond Burgos** (2023), **Hayden Birdsong** (2023-24), **Parker Dunshee** (2023), **Grant McCray** (2024), **Sandro Fabian** (2021) and **Trevor McDonald** (2024). **Christian Koss** (2024) made his debut for the Giants earlier this week as the first new former Flying Squirrel in the majors this year. Dating back to 2022, 23-of-the-last-26 Flying Squirrels alumni who have reached the majors have debuted with the San Francisco Giants, with Garabito (Rangers), Fabian (Rangers) and Dunshee (Braves) being the only exceptions. The 2023 season saw 10 former Flying Squirrels players debut in the big leagues, including a team-record five from that season's Richmond roster.

PROSPECT WATCH: Richmond's roster includes six players are ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Giants prospects, including **Joe Whitman** (No. 10), **Diego Velasquez** (No. 13), **Sabin Ceballos** (No. 16), **Trent Harris** (No. 26), **Aeverson Arteaga** (No. 27) and **Jack Choate** (No. 28). There are also six players ranked in MLB.com's top-30 Giants prospects list, including Whitman (No. 7), Harris (No. 11), Velasquez (No. 15), Arteaga (No. 16), Ceballos (No. 23) and Choate (No. 27).

THIS DATE IN RICHMOND BASEBALL HISTORY

In 1968, the Pittsburgh Pirates beat the New York Yankees, 7-4, in an exhibition game at Parker Field. The Pirates scored four runs in the top of the first inning. Willie Stargell hit a two-run single, followed by RBI hits by Donn Clendenon and Chuck Hiller. In the bottom of the first, Mickey Mantle, who was entering what would be his final season, hit a two-run homer and Joe Pepitone added an RBI single in the frame. Bill Mazeroski padded Pittsburgh's lead in the eighth, bringing in Roberto Clemente to score. Maury Wills had three hits at the top of the order for the Pirates. An estimated 4,600 fans were in attendance. A second exhibition game between the two teams was originally scheduled for the following day but was canceled after President Lyndon B. Johnson's call for a National Day of Mourning for Dr. Martin Luther King, who had been assassinated three days earlier.
