PASQUANTINO PROWESS: The Royals number four overall prospect according to MLB prospect rankings had an incredible game in Omaha's 19-0 win at Louisville on Wednesday. **1B Vinnie Pasquantino** went 5-for-7 with a solo home run in the first inning, a grand slam in the fifth frame, and two doubles on the night. Pasquantino is the only Storm Chaser to record five RBI in a game this season and has done it three times now. He joins **C Freddy Fermin, OF Brewer Hicklen, and INF Nick Pratto** as the only Storm Chasers to have multi-home run games. Omaha is 3-0 in games that feature a player hitting multiple home runs with Fermin and Hicklen each having two on April 20 against Memphis.

OFFENSIVE DOMINANCE: Omaha put together a complete offensive performance in Wednesday's 19-0 win. The Storm Chasers updated seven categories in the Last Time It Happened... section that had not yet been updated this year. As a team, Omaha put up more than 15 runs for the first time since Oct. 1, 2021. They also had more than 25 hits with the last time that happened being back on April 9, 2014, and the last time they had 20 or more hits since June of last year. The Storm Chasers used five total home runs in the win, marking the first time since August 27, 2021, the team eclipsed that mark, and their six doubles was the most since July 28, 2021. The last time an individual player recorded five hits prior to yesterday was on June 10, 2021, and the last time a single player scored four or more runs was on October 1, 2021. Eight of Omaha's nine batters recorded multi-hit games yesterday, after no Storm Chasers hit that mark on Tuesday.

PERFORMANCE PITCHING: RHP Jackson Kowar, LHP Josh Dye, LHP Sam Freeman, RHP Colten Brewer, and RHP Arodys Vizcaíno combined to throw Omaha's third shutout of the season on Wednesday. Kowar has been involved in two of the three while Vizcaíno has had a hand in all three. Omaha holds a 3-4 record in shutouts this year.

FEARLESS FOSTER: LHP Foster Griffin holds Omaha's longest active scoreless streak at 8.2 innings after being optioned back to Triple-A Omaha from MLB Kansas City on Sunday. The 8.2-inning streak is the longest for the Storm Chasers this season, passing RHP Colten Brewer's 8.1-inning streak set in mid-April. Since the streak started on April 26, Griffin has a 0.00 ERA in seven games with two walks and 11 strikeouts with Triple-A Omaha

FOR OMAHA: LHP Kris Bubic looks to make his third start for the Storm Chasers after being optioned to Triple-A Omaha on May 12. The 6' 3" lefty threw 5.0 innings in his last start, allowing three earned runs on five hits with six strikeouts and no walks. Bubic went from Advanced-A in 2019 to the MLB in 2020 because of the canceling of the 2020 Minor League season and spent the entire 2021 season with the Kansas City Royals. Bubic made his MLB debut on July 31, 2020, when he went 4.0 innings and allowed two earned runs with two strikeouts in the loss. Bubic has struggled to begin the 2022 season, coming to Omaha with a 12.83 ERA and an 0-3 record in five starts with 10 strikeouts and 11 walks in 13.1 innings in the Big League. In arguably his best outing this season, Bubic went 5.0 innings on 4/29 against the Yankees, allowing no earned runs in his final four innings of work after giving up back-to-back homers in the first. To start the 2021 season, the Stanford product bounced between the bullpen and the starting rotation, but in July of the same season he became a regular starter, with 13 of his last 15 appearances coming as the first man up. Bubic had his longest outing of the season in his second to last appearance in 2021, tossing 7.0 scoreless innings with six strikeouts at Detroit to secure his sixth win of the season on 9/26/21. The California native was drafted 40th overall by the Kansas City Royals in 2018 after spending three seasons playing for the Stanford Cardinal where he earned pitcher of the year honors during his sophomore campaign.

FOR ST. PAUL: LHP Mike Minor heads to the hill for his fourth start for the Bats this season, holding a record of 0-5 with a 4.50 ERA in 10.0 innings pitched. In his most recent appearance, Minor threw 4.2 innings and allowed four earned runs on nine hits with three strikeouts and no walks. The lefty has yet to go past 4.2 innings this season, still looking for his first win of the season. He has only walked one batter at the Triple-A level with 11 strikeouts. The 2009 seventh overall pick was drafted by the Atlanta Braves. Minor signed a two-year deal with the Kansas City Royals after becoming a free agent in December of 2015. On December 4, 2017, Minor signed with the Texas Rangers before being traded to the Oakland Athletics on August 31, 2020. Minor resigned with the royals in December of 2020 before being traded in March of 2020 to the Cincinnati Reds.

- Optioned to Triple-A Omaha on 5/12 from Kansas City, making first Triple-A start on 5/15 @ IOW, throwing 2.2 innings with 3 earned runs and five strikeouts
- Started 2022 in Kansas City, posting a 0-3 record and 12.83 ERA in six appearances, five starts, with 11 walks and 10 strikeouts.
- Appeared in 29 games during 2021 season, with nine relief appearances for Kansas City while holding a 4.43 ERA in 130.0 innings pitched and a 6-7 record.
- Held 1-6 record in 10 starts in 2020 with 4.32 ERA in 50.0 innings pitched during the COVID-19 shortened 2020 season.
- Skipped Triple-A Omaha to make big league debut with Kansas City on July 31, 2020.
- Threw 9.0 inning complete games in back-to-back starts on 8/9/19 and 8/15/19. Combined for 22 strikeouts and 2 walks between the two games with 2 earned runs allowed over the 18.0 innings.
