RJ AUSTIN CONTINUES TO SHOW IMPORTANT LEADERSHIP

Throughout the first half, the Frederick Keys showed not only great talent on the field resulting in victories, but also great comradery off the field that allowed them to bond together as a team.

Arguably, no one showed that comradery better than outfielder RJ Austin, who served as the team's leadoff man in the lineup over the last two weeks of first half play. This role helped lead the Keys to their first playoff berth since 2017 and in the first year back in Birdland.

On the field, Austin finished with a .229 average in first half play while homering twice and knocking in 11 RBIs. Finishing with 14 stolen bases in 15 attempts, RJ Austin helped the Keys become one of the leaders in stolen bases in the South Atlantic League. He is not just offensive skills and speed, but is an important defensive presence at second base and the outfield.



Even when a mid-season injury put Austin on the injured list from April 25 through May 26, he remained with the team and serve as a leader and energizer in the clubhouse. Whether it was creating secret handshakes with each of his teammates, or getting the dugout fired up after any big play, his presence helped Frederick finish with a record a 19-6 record during the month of May in his absence from the lineup.

Since his return from the injured list, he jumped right back in the lineup and quickly provided a spark. In his first four games of the second half, he ranks second on the team in average with a .313 mark, which includes homering twice against the Hub City Spartanburgers in their series at Nymeo Field.

What's next for the Atlanta, Georgia native? He'll continue to serve as not only a leadoff man for manager Collin Woody's lineup, but he'll act as the team's hype man, hoping to guide Frederick to its first league title since 2011 in their first year back in Birdland.



A LOOK AROUND THE FARM SYSTEM

As the calendar moves into the month of July, the first half of the 2026 Minor League Baseball season has come to a close, with the Frederick Keys, High-A affiliate of the Baltimore Orioles, taking home the South Atlantic League North Division First Half title on June 18.

For the Single-A Orioles affiliate Delmarva Shorebirds, they finished the first half with 341 runs scored offensively, which ranked third in the Carolina League North Division. Despite finishing towards the bottom of the first half standings, several top performers stood out offensively including catcher Andrés Nolaya, who led the team in batting average with a .296 average at the dish. Outfielder Stiven Martinez and infielder Jose Perez both hit six homers during the first half, tying for the team high in homers hit in the first 66 games of the 2026 campaign.



On the mound, right-handed pitcher Christian Rodriguez has led the way for the Shorebirds on the mound with a 3.43 ERA in his first 12 starts of 2026. He also led the team with 74 strikeouts and cemented himself as one of the organization's top young pitchers after not pitching last year due to injury.

Double-A Chesapeake's seventh-ranked Orioles prospect and infielder Aron Estrada has guided the Baysox offense for the majority of the first half with 11 homers and 35 RBIs in addition to his .274 average in 60 games played. Fellow top 30 prospect and catcher Ethan Anderson led the team with 13 home runs during the first half, while also leading in on-base percentage with a .486 mark in 58 games.

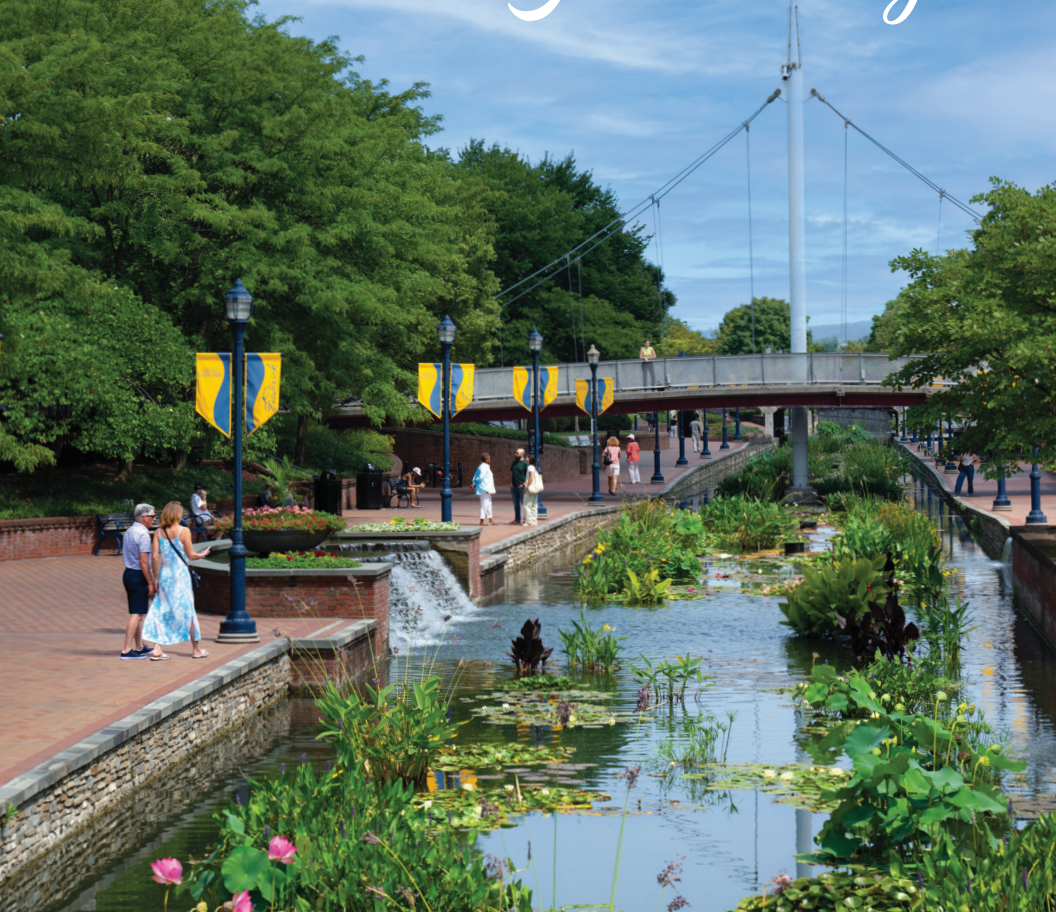
Left-handed pitcher and 12th-ranked Orioles pitching prospect Joseph Dzierwa has made a quick and easy transition to Double-A ball, with a 2.48 ERA across six appearances and five starts, all while recording 41 strikeouts and holding opponents to a .198 average at the plate. He has only given up six walks in his first 32.2 innings on the hill and has continued to emerge as one of the organization's top hurlers after being named the Orioles Minor League Pitcher of the Month in April while with Frederick.

Triple-A Norfolk has stayed consistent in the all competitive International League with infielder Payton Eeles recording a .345 average in his first 28 games of the year, after initially starting with the Keys on a Minor League rehab assignment early in April. First baseman and infielder Christian Encarnacion-Strand led the team in average with a .298 average in his first 47 games as a member of the Orioles organization while also ranking second on the roster with 14 home runs.

Left-hander relief pitcher Andrew Magno posted one of the top ERAs in all of Minor League baseball with a 0.59 ERA in his first 30.1 innings during the first half this season. Former member of the Keys in right-hander Hans Crouse finished with 17 relief appearances and a 3.32 ERA, all while having two saves.

CADEN HUNTER: SEAMLESS ADDITION

The Keys starting pitcher rotation has consistent pieces that have anchored their rotation, including Orioles top 30 prospects right-hander JT Quinn and left-hander Boston Bateman.

However, left-hander Caden Hunter has blossomed in the back end of the rotation for Frederick since his call to High-A on May 26, providing an immediate impact and helping the Keys secure the 2026 first half title in the South Atlantic League North Division.

In his first five starts at the High-A level, the sixth-round 2025 draft pick by Baltimore has recorded a 2.11 ERA in 21.1 innings pitched, recording 31 strikeouts and holding opponents to an average against of .189 on the season. He's also given up just 14 walks in his first stint at the High-A level and recently got his first win on June 24 against the Wilmington Blue Rocks after allowing no runs in five innings.



One of his most memorable outings took place on the second to last day of the first half when he threw in game one of the doubleheader against the Hub City Spartanburgers at Nymeo Field. In that first game on June 17, the

Sacramento, California native pitched four innings and allowed one run on three hits in the seven-inning contest, all while recording eight strikeouts.

Prior to landing with the Keys, Hunter began the season with the Single-A Delmarva Shorebirds and quickly became one of the top pitchers in the Carolina League after finishing with a 1.17 ERA in six starts in the Eastern Shore. In the first 23 innings of his professional career, he racked up 40 strikeouts while holding opponents to a .113 average at the plate before getting the call to High-A.

He was also named as the Carolina League Pitcher of the Week on May 17 after he threw a combined 8.2 innings of one-run ball in two starts against the Fayetteville Woodpeckers. His first start of the series back on May 12 featured him recording a career-high 10 strikeouts in 4.2 innings, all while not allowing any base hits and issuing only one walk.

As the Keys progress into second half play, pitching coach Jordie Henry and manager Collin Woody will be looking for Hunter to develop at even higher levels during his first full season in Birdland.

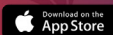

ORIOLES MONTHLY HONORS LAND IN FREDERICK AGAIN!

The Frederick Keys added two more in-season accolades this past month as Keys left-handed pitcher Boston Bateman and infielder Wehiwa Aloy were named as the Baltimore Orioles Minor League Players of the Month for the month of May.

Bateman, a 6-foot-8 lefty, gave up just two earned runs throughout the month of May. Over his four starts, the 2024 second round draft pick by San Diego pitched 20.1 innings while striking out 22 and allowing just 14 hits. He went 2-0 while posting an ERA of just 0.89.

He entered May with a 6.35 ERA but was able to drop it to 3.38 by the end of his final start on May 27. In his longest outing of the month on May 20, he threw 5.2 innings allowing just two hits and no runs against the Greenville Drive (Red Sox) while striking out six.

The Orioles No. 9 ranked prospect fourth start of the month came on the road against the Jersey Shore BlueClaws (Phillies), where he threw five innings and struck out seven at ShoreTown Ballpark.

As for Aloy, his .329 batting average led the way for the Keys during the month of May. Paired with six home runs and 19 RBI, Aloy was one of the most dangerous bats in the Frederick lineup as they continued to make their first half push.

The 2025 Golden Spikes Winner also helped turn seven double plays while making just three errors at shortstop and third base. He recorded 20 outs while assisting on 46 others. Aloy logged a month-high five assists twice, the first time on the road against the Brooklyn Cyclones (Mets) and the second at home against Jersey Shore.

The Orioles No. 5 ranked prospect also logged a three-homer game on May 10 against Jersey Shore, becoming the first Keys player to hit three homers in a single game since former Keys first baseman Ryan

KEYS SECURE FIRST HALF TITLE

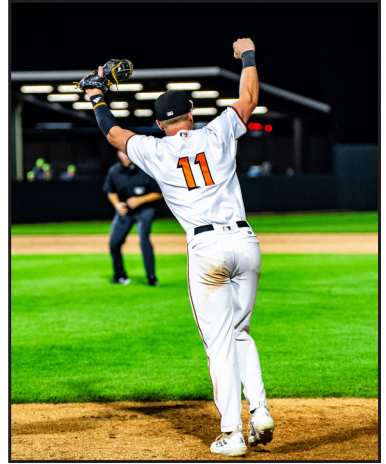

Nobody knew what would be made of the Frederick Keys franchise after being renamed the High-A Affiliate of the Baltimore Orioles ahead of the 2026 season. While in the same place and in a familiar atmosphere, the elevation of the team from the MLB Draft League to High-A came with expectations, ones the team would not wait long to meet.

The Keys secured the first half South Atlantic League North Division title on June 18 with a 6-5 victory over the Hub City Spartanburgers (Rangers), capping off their third win in two days with extra celebration. The team had entered the week one game behind the Greensboro Grasshoppers (Pirates) after leading the South Atlantic League North division for much of the month of May. With their backs against the wall and a substantial week ahead, the Keys found a way to win the three of the first four against Hub City and secure the title.

The first half victory earned the Keys their first postseason berth since 2017, as the team punched their ticket with the go-ahead run in scoring position in the top of the ninth. After three runs had already come across home plate in the ninth, Joe Glassey produced a ground ball to the left side where Colin Yeaman fielded it and threw the ball across to Victor Figueroa at first base to end the late rally.



Led by several highly touted prospects, the Keys' first half of the season was nothing short of dominant. Winning seven series, including a road sweep over the Hudson Valley Renegades (Yankees), and a division-leading +84 run differential, the Keys simply found ways to win games no matter the circumstances.

Victor Figueroa, first baseman and designated hitter for the Keys, mashed 19 home runs in the first half of play. He led the team in home runs, runs batted in, and slugging percentage among full time Keys players. His big bat and power presence in the heart of the order were mainstays that continually provided for the team.

No. 2 Orioles prospect Ike Irish also had a sizeable impact in the first half. The 2025 first round draft pick by the Orioles hit a team-leading 12 doubles in the first half while driving in 41 runs and stealing 13 bases. The former Auburn Tiger also provided versatile defense, lacing up the cleats throughout left field, center field and right field, while also providing a reliable glove at first base for several games.

Among Figueroa and Irish in the heart of the order, Wehiwa Aloy, the 2025 Golden Spikes winner and first round selection by the Orioles, proved to be a tough out and commander of the infield throughout his first half. While hitting .277 with 11 home runs and 49 RBI, Aloy led the infield from both third base and shortstop, demonstrating his defensive know-how and athleticism. Aloy was also the first part of the game-ending triple play turned by Frederick on June 6 in a victory over Hudson Valley. He hit .329 in the month of May, earning himself Orioles minor league player of the month honors while slugging .624, driving in 19 and hitting six home runs among 28 total hits.

While the offense was a key part of the winning recipe in the first half, the pitching staff held its' own, pitching to the tune of a 3.96 ERA while striking out 666 batters. Opening Day starter Joseph Dzierwa quickly earned himself a promotion to Double-A Chesapeake after throwing 40.2 innings for Frederick, striking out 50 while allowing just 10 earned runs on 23 hits.

Since the departure of Dzierwa, JT Quinn has emerged as the ace in the Key City. In his 57.1 innings, the former Georgia Bulldog has struck out a team-leading 65 batters while holding a 3.30 ERA. The righty, with a 3-0 record, earned his third win of the first half in the final game of the half. After making his most recent start the previous Saturday, Quinn took the mound for Frederick on Thursday, throwing five innings of two-run ball while striking out six, tied for his most in a game since April 17.



The Frederick starting rotation was the best in the entire South Atlantic League. Starters like left-hander Boston Bateman and right-hander Yeiber Cartaya consistently outmatched their opponents. Bateman, pitched for the Keys both out of the bullpen and in the starting role. Over 12 appearances in the first half, he logged 59 strikeouts while allowing just two home runs over his 48 innings of work. Cartaya also worked out of the bullpen and starting role. In his 48.1 innings of work, he logged 58 strikeouts and an ERA of 2.23 while also posting an opponent batting average against of just .186.

While several stars highlighted the way for the Keys, the team's depth and chemistry led to their first half dominance. A 41-23 record does not happen with just a few names. The team also went 21-11 at home and 20-12 on the road, showing maturity and composure in both a comfortable environment and an unfamiliar one.

With the first half behind them, the Keys will look to continue their dominance in the second half. With the confidence in already having secured a postseason berth, there is nothing for the team to lose as it awaits the second half winner ahead of the postseason in early September.

AROUND THE SOUTH ATLANTIC LEAGUE

The Frederick Keys have begun the second half the 2026 season in the South Atlantic League. Frederick, winners of the North Division in the first half, will continue play against both familiar and new opponents.

The Bowling Green Hot Rods (Rays) won the first half title in the South Atlantic League South division with a record of 47-18, ending the half 9.5 games ahead of the second-place Winston-Salem Dash (White Sox). The Keys and Hot Rods did not meet in the first half but will face off in Frederick August 11-16.

The Keys will also play the Rome Emperors (Braves) and Asheville Tourists (Astros) for the first time this season. Rome ended the first half in third place with a record of 33-31 while Asheville ended 17-48 and 30 games back. The Emperors and Keys will face off for a six-game series July 21-26 in Rome, Georgia while Asheville plays Frederick a visit August 25-30.

The Greenville Drive (Red Sox) currently hold the lead in the south division in the second half, winning four of their first five games since June 18. The Drive and Keys met just four times in the first half, with the Keys winning three contests as two others were cancelled due to rain. The Keys will make their first-ever visit to Greenville, South Carolina for a three-game series against the Drive from July 17-19 following the 2026 All-Star break.

In the SAL North, the Greensboro Grasshoppers (Pirates) fell just shy of the first half title. Ending just one game behind Frederick, the Grasshoppers went 41-25 with a +40-run differential. Greensboro and Frederick will not meet again during the 2026 regular season.

Frederick's first full series in the second half was in Wilmington, Delaware, where the Keys took down the Blue Rocks (Nationals) in shutout fashion in the first two games. The Keys and Blue Rocks met once in the first half as Frederick took the series four games to two. Wilmington ended the first half in third place, 10.5 games behind Frederick.

Wilmington, led by Nationals top prospect Eli Willits, made an early move for the first-place spot but has since dropped to second-place. Willits, a 6-foot-1 shortstop, hit .262 in 11 games with the Blue Rocks. The 18-year-old hit has hit five home runs and three doubles while driving in 11.

After the series at Wilmington, the Keys will play their next 12 games at home, welcoming the Brooklyn Cyclones (Mets) and Jersey Shore BlueClaws (Phillies). Frederick played each SAL North division rival in the first half, going 8-4 against Jersey Shore and 7-5 against Brooklyn. While the BlueClaws have already visited Nymeo Field, the Cyclones will visit Frederick for the first time starting June 30. Brooklyn, the 2025 SAL Champions, will see the Keys one more time from Sept. 1-6 in Coney Island.

The Keys are not slated to play the Hudson Valley Renegades (Yankees) again in 2026 after taking 12-of-18 against the Renegades this season. If Hudson Valley wins the second half, the two will meet for at least the 19th and 20th times in the South Atlantic League North division playoffs.

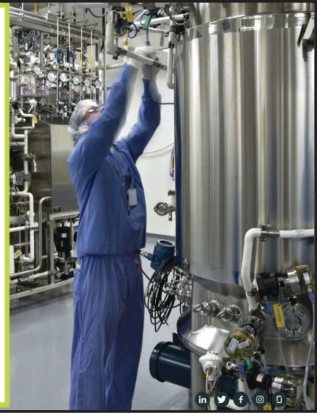

FREDERICK KEYS FAN BEHAVIOR POLICY

The Frederick Keys are committed to creating a family-friendly and welcoming environment at the ballpark for all guests. As part of that commitment, we have adopted this written policy addressing fan behavior. The policy includes a Fan Code of Conduct, which is fan-facing and describes how fans are expected to behave.

All Frederick Keys staff, including game-day staff, must receive a copy of this policy before working any games. In addition, all staff must receive annual training on this policy, the substance of the Fan Code of Conduct, and how to respond to prohibited fan behavior. All training will be documented.

A copy of the Fan Code of Conduct can be found at any entrance gate to the ballpark, at any guest services booth, on www.FrederickKeys.com, and in the official game program.

Fans will be notified before and during the game through public service announcements ("PSAs") on the main video board that summarize the Fan Code of Conduct, the penalties for violation, and how to report prohibited behavior.

Reporting An Incident

Any game-day staff member who witnesses or receives a report of prohibited fan behavior by a fan must report the incident to a Club security supervisor. This can be done by contacting your immediate supervisor, notifying a nearby security staff member, or by contacting (301) 662-0013.

Use of derogatory language by a fan toward a player, umpire, Club staff, or their family members must be documented by the Club and reported to the Club's General Manager and to the Commissioner's Office via email to PDLsecurity@mlb.com. Clubs must seek to collect the name and identifying information of the fan and must include in their report a description of how the Club addressed the incident and any planned discipline.

Fan Code of Conduct

In order to provide a welcoming experience for all, the Frederick Keys have implemented a Fan Code of Conduct. Out of respect for fellow guests, players, coaches, and ballpark staff, all guests are prohibited from:

- Trespassing on the playing field at any time;
- Interfering with baseballs that are in play;
- Throwing or tossing objects;
- Using foul, obscene or derogatory language (see below) or gestures;
- Misusing or overconsuming alcohol, including, underage consumption;
- Behaving in a manner that is disruptive, unruly, or abusive;
- Accessing areas of the ballpark without a proper ticket, pass, or credential;
- Misusing tickets, passes, or credentials in any way; or
- Bringing prohibited items into the ballpark.

Derogatory language is defined as offensive language concerning a person's race, ethnicity, gender, religion, disability, age, sexual orientation, or national origin, and anyone using such language is subject to automatic ejection from the ballpark.

Violations of the Fan Code of Conduct will not be tolerated and may lead to ejection from the ballpark, a ban on attending future games, or other consequences. Guests who are found to have used derogatory language will be ejected from the ballpark.

Guests are encouraged to report violations of the Fan Code of Conduct to the nearest ballpark staff member. This can be done in person, at the nearest Guest Services location, directly with Ballpark Security or by calling (301) 662-0013.
