Tonight's Game

The Clippers will send RHP **Rorik Maltrud** to the mound tonight, looking to avoid their first 4G losing streak of the season (last: 8/29-9/2/25). Indianapolis will counter with LHP **Hunter Barco**. Columbus is 5-14 (.263) versus left handers this year. Barco has pitched against the Clippers three times in his career, going 0-0 with a 6.00ERA (9.0IP, 7H, 6R, 6ER, 9BB, 11K).

vs. the Indians

Columbus is 5-5 against Indianapolis this year, posting a -11 run margin (9-9, +13 in 2025; 12-5, +45 in 2024; 10-8, -23 in 2023; 12-8, +53 in 2022). Since the start of the 2022 season, the Clippers are 17-9 (.654) in games against Indianapolis that are decided by at least five. Individually, **Bo Naylor** has 4HR and 17RBI in 20G against Indy and **Cooper Ingle** is 14x41 (.341) with 3HR, 8RBI in 13G.

Desperately Running Out of Time

Last night's loss put the Clippers on the brink of elimination, as they will need to win out to have any chance of winning the first half.

Such a scenario would also require Nashville (vs. Durham) and Memphis (at Norfolk) to lose tonight and tomorrow against the two worst teams in the International League, then Nashville would have to beat Memphis 3-2 next week (a game needs to be cancelled).

There is a Chance

If the above happens, Columbus would also need Rochester to lose at least five more times, potentially setting up a four-way tie in which head to head record would determine the winner (Columbus has not played any of those teams, but would win on the last 20G record). If St. Paul goes 7-1 the rest of the way, they would join the tie and Charlotte needs to go 7-0 with a game cancelled to join the tie.

Dang It

During the 6G road win streak that was snapped Thursday, Columbus led after 47 of 51 innings played (92%, tied after three innings and trailed after one: 1st inning on Tuesday). In the last 3G, all losses, the Clippers were tied after the 1st on Thursday, led 1-0 after the 2nd and have trailed after 21 of 25 innings since (tied through 4th last night; outscored 28-7 in the last 25 innings).

Saturday Redemption

Last night's loss dropped the Clippers to 3-9 on Friday this year (worst in the IL) and they are now 7-27 (.206, worst in the IL) on Friday since starting last season 5-0. However, they have won three straight on Saturday, going 34-12 (.739, best in the IL) since starting the 2024 season 2-14. Columbus has one Saturday loss on the road this year, 5/9 at Iowa (only consecutive Friday-Saturday losses).

Arias Rehab

Gabriel Arias joined the Clippers on rehab on 6/4 (5x15, 3HR and 5RBI in 5G), coming back from a strained left hamstring (on the shelf since 4/7, transferred to 60-day on 5/29). Arias hit .200/.250/.433 with 2HR and 4RBI in 10G with Cleveland prior to injury. He has homered in each of his last 3G, giving him 36 in his Clipper career (1,018PA; 51st to top 1,000 in franchise history).

Getting There

Cooper Ingle finally reached the qualification level for rate statistics in the IL and his current .445OBP ranks 2nd in the IL. Ingle has slumped to a .304OBP over the last 15G (13x60, .217, 8BB, 18K), but since his Triple-A debut on 8/13/25, he has the best OBP in the IL (.422, +21 points on 2nd place) and the 4th most walks (58). As a catcher, Ingle has a 1.214OPS in 29G (.481OPS in 13G elsewhere).

Struggling Slugging

CJ Kayfus enters tonight with a .314SLG since getting optioned on 4/13 (4XBH in 20G, all doubles). Last season, Kayfus had 31XBH in 68G for the Clippers, including 13HR (last on 7/19/25 at Iowa, 99AB since). Aside from a 4RBI outing on 4/26 at Buffalo, Kayfus doesn't have any other multi-RBI games in his last 36G, dating to 7/3/25 (17RBI total; had 36RBI in first 52G with Columbus).

Half Season, Full Huff

Kody Huff is just over halfway to his career high of 101G in 2025 (53G), while also being over halfway to a high of 407PA in 2025 (218PA, 53.6%). With 9HR already, Huff has a new personal best, and his triple last night established a career high (3). His 46RBI are one short of a career best (47RBI in 2025), while he is set to score his 40th run for the second time in his career (high of 45 in 2024).

This Date in Clipper History

6/13/2021

Andres Gimenez got the Clippers on the board with a 1st inning homer at Iowa, on the way to a 6-3 win (**Angel Lopez** broke a 3-3 tie in the 9th with a 3-run double). The bomb from Gimenez was his second of the year and 29th of his career (492nd career game). He would go on to homer in each of his next 5G and popped another in the game following the ending of the streak (7HR, 13RBI in 8G, 6/13-6/22/21).

Huntington (Small) Park

In each of the first 11 seasons after the move downtown (2009-19), Huntington Park ranked among the top two in the IL in homers per game. With the arrival of six new parks to the IL in 2021, Huntington Park finished 4th, 6th and 10th from 2021-23, respectively. The 2024 season saw a return to the top (2.96; 108HR hit by the Clippers, most for the home team in HP's existence), but it dropped back to 7th last year (2.31). Including the postseason, the Clippers have been out-homered over the life of the park (1,438 to 1,386).

Challenging Times

The Clippers are 93-85 (.522) in pitch reviews, with batters going 50-58 (.463) and pitchers/catchers going 43-27 (.614). They have run out of challenges in 33G and have not challenged in 3G. Last season, they were correct 43.1% of the time (2nd worst in the IL).

Extras, Read All About Them

Columbus is 1-3 in extra innings this season, after having gone 5-5 in 2025 and 9-9 in 2024 (most losses since 2013, 12). Since the start of the 2018 season, when baserunners started appearing at second base, the Clippers are 51-36 when playing past regulation (.586, best in the IL; no other team above .570), including 26-17 at home (.605, but 4-7 in last 11G). Of the 87G to require extra play, 69 have been resolved after one frame (including eight DH games) and only one has gone past the 12th (5-4 loss in 13 innings on 9/20/22 at Toledo). From 7/31/19-6/26/21, Columbus played 85 straight within the allotted innings.

On the Runs

Starting with the embiggened 150G schedule in 2022, the Clippers scored over 800 runs in three consecutive seasons from 2022-2024 (855, 808 and 805 runs, respectively; accounting for the 3rd, 4th and 5th best totals in team history). Following a steep decline last season (670, fewest scored in a full season since 2018), Columbus is looking to easily top 800 again, with an outside chance to establish a new team high (on pace for 833, would rank as 4th most all-time; 898 scored in 1983).

On the Run

On the basepaths, the Clippers are making a run at the franchise mark in stolen bases, with 90 through the first 66G (on pace for 203SB). The team record was set in 2024 when Columbus swiped an even 200, but the team speed was throttled last year (129SB; still, the 2nd highest total since the Cleveland affiliation started in 2009). However, with 21CS so far, the Clippers are also pacing for the 3rd most times caught stealing of the Cleveland affiliation (47; nabbed 51 times in 2024).

Juiced is Loose

In the Huntington Park Era (since 2009), Columbus leads the IL with 78 grand slams and 1,938RBI (led IL in RBI in 2010, '11, '12, '17, '18 and '22). Collecting an IL-best 10 grand slams last season, it marked their fifth straight season with at least four (118RBI last year; had only 97RBI in 2024, worst in a 140+G season since 2016).

Hits the Spot

When turning in as many or fewer hits than their opponents last season, the Clippers went 18-64 (.220), coming in 13th out of 20 in the IL. The 2024 season saw them post an IL-worst .185 (12-53) winning percentage in such games. When allowing at least 10 hits last year, Columbus was 7-41 (.146, 20th in the IL; started the season 1-20).

In Big Trouble

The Clipper pitching staff is trending toward the worst ERA in club history, sitting at 5.51 through the first 66G. Since the reorganization of the minor leagues in 2021, Columbus has twice finished the season with a 5+ ERA (current record is 5.32, set in 2023), after having done so just once in the first 43 seasons (5.08 in 1983). However, the staff is pacing to give up only 172HR (10HR under the average of 182 per season since the Year of the Homer in 2019).

Department of Defense

The Columbus defense is sitting at 10th in the IL this year (.979), following a 2025 that saw a franchise record (.985, led the IL). On 4/10 at Worcester, the defense collapsed for the first 5E game since 8/27/24 (topped out at 3E in a game twice last year and had fewer than 5E in 21 of 26 series). The Clippers have played flawlessly in 35G this season (23-12, .657), after doing so in nearly 60% of games last year (44-42, .512), including 16 straight from 6/20-7/8/25 (longest streak in the IL over the last 20 years).

Key to Victory

From 2022-23, Columbus owned the best record in the IL when holding opponents to three runs or fewer, going 95-8 (.922, no other team was above .880). The Clippers were 43-10 in such games in 2024 (.811, 13th in the IL), accumulating four losses by 4/14, and were just 47-10 (.825, 9th) last year, collecting four losses over 14G from 4/23-5/9 (had four losses total in both 2022 and 2023).

Good Baseball

Kody Huff bunted a run in, while moving another to scoring position in a 5/24 win vs. Louisville. Since the start of the 2018 season, Columbus is 87-23 (.791) in games in which a run is scored after a good bunt attempt, including a 4-2 mark this season (.667, blew 7-run lead in one of the losses; went 23-2 in 2018).

To the End

The Clippers had the 6th most last at bat losses last season (17), after pacing the circuit with 23 in 2024 (tied with Toledo). They also suffered the 4th most walk-off losses (8), watching three in a row slip away at Rochester from 5/29-5/31. The 2024 season saw 41G decided in the last at bat (tied for 2nd most in the IL, one off lead), with Columbus going 18-23 in those contests (-17th, .439).

Manager Profile

Andy Tracy made his Clippers debut in 2021, following **Tony Mansolino's** championship rookie year in 2019 (sixth Clipper skipper to win Governors' Cup in first season; **Gene Michael**-'79, **Joe Altobelli**-'80, **Frank Verdi**-'81, **Bucky Dent**-'87 and **Mike Sarbaugh**-'10). This season marks Tracy's sixth year as a manager (first was with Williamsport in the Philadelphia system), as he holds a career record of 422-436 (.492), 392-390 with Columbus (.501).
