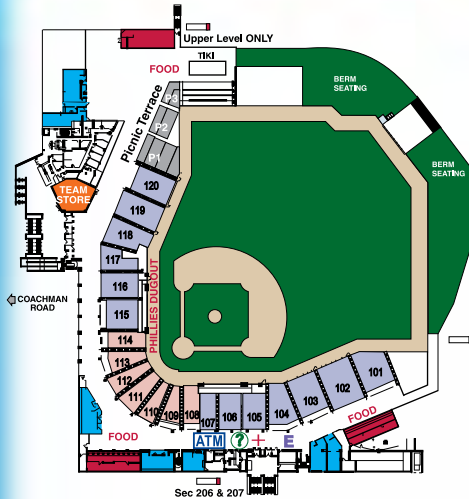

ANNOUNCEMENTS

PA and video board announcements can be arranged for a nominal fee by visiting Guest Services behind Section 106 before the end of the second inning.

ATM

The ATM is located on the first base side of the concourse behind section 105.

BAGS & BACKPACKS

Bags can be no larger than 16"x16"x8" and will be subject to inspection upon entry in accordance with Major League Baseball security regulations. Guests may discard or return the prohibited items to their vehicle.

BATS

Full-size baseball bats are prohibited from entry by guests to the ballpark.

BERM SEATING

Berm seating is limited and ticketed. Blankets are permitted to be brought into the park for berm seating. Chairs, folding chairs, camp chairs, and the like, are not permitted to be brought into the park.

CHILD TICKETS

Children 13 and younger qualify for the child's ticket price. For children 4 and younger, please see the BayCare Box Office or a ballpark gate attendant for a complimentary ticket.

CUSTOMER SERVICE & ADVANCE TICKETS

The Customer Service/Advance Tickets window is located on the first base side of the main concourse behind Section 106. Guests can report problems, check for lost and found items and claim prizes at this location. Tickets for future games may also be purchased here.

FIRST AID

The First Aid office is located on the first base side of the main concourse behind section 106. Guests can either report to this office or contact an usher if in need of medical assistance.

FOOD AND DRINK POLICY

No food, bottles, coolers or cans may be brought into the ballpark. The Threshers reserve the right to search any medical or diaper bags entering the ballpark.

FOUL BALLS

Any foul ball hit into the stands may be kept. Guests are not permitted on the field or to reach into the playing area. Foul balls may be dangerous, so please be alert at all times and aware of the potential hazards.

GATES OPEN

Ballpark gates will open one hour prior to scheduled game time.

HANDICAPPED SEATING

Disabled seating is available all throughout the ballpark. Limited wheelchair seating is available through the ticket office in person or on the telephone. One companion seat is available for purchase with each wheelchair space. An elevator is available for disabled use on the first base side of the stadium (South Parking Lot). Drop-off is available on the West Side of the ballpark (no elevator access here). Please contact an usher for assistance entering and exiting the ballpark.

KIDS ZONE

The left-field concourse features a playground and Kids Zone for our younger guests.

LOST AND FOUND

Located at Customer Service behind Section 106.

SENIOR TICKETS

Seniors 55+ may purchase discounted tickets.

SMOKING

Smoking is prohibited in most areas of the ballpark. Special smoking sections are marked. Smoking is permitted only on the concourse bridge by the right field foul pole and the Tiki Pavilion in left field. For resources to help quit smoking, call 1-877-U-CAN-NOW (1-877-822-6669).

TEAM STORE

The Threshers Team Store, Diamond Outfitters, is located next to the ballpark's west entry, and features hats, apparel and collectibles to satisfy Threshers fans of all ages. Merchandise available 24 hours a day on-line at ThreshersBaseball.com.

TIKI PAVILION

The Frenchy's Tiki Pavilion is located beyond the left field wall. It features a variety of mixed drinks, beer and wine for guests 21 and over. Seats in this section are first-come, first-serve during Threshers season.

WEAPONS

Firearms, weapons, knives, tasers and other dangerous or hazardous devices or substances (collectively "weapons") are prohibited at BayCare Ballpark, unless carried by an on-duty police officer or otherwise expressly approved by The Threshers. Anyone bringing such a weapon to the premises must return it to their vehicle immediately.

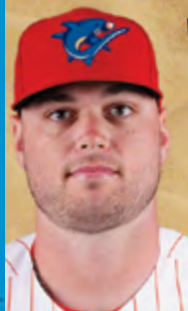

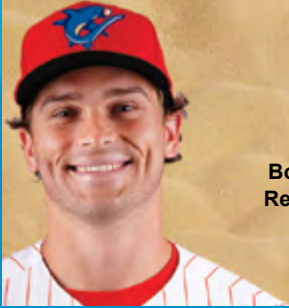

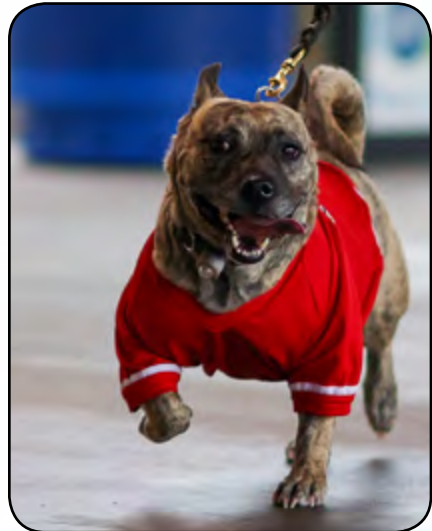

HOW TO SCORE

Scoring Basics...

Different fans have different methods of keeping a scorecard, and many use their own notations. But here's a simple method...

If the hitter grounds out to shortstop, for example, write in "6-3," which shows the shortstop threw him out at first base. If the hitter flies out to left field, write a "7."

If the batter gets a hit, write in the hit according to which base he reached. Each corner of the box represents a base, with the lower-right corner being first.

If he singles, put a "-" in the lower right. If he doubles, write a "=" in the upper right, and so on. For a walk, use "BB" in the lower right. As the runner advances, mark the appropriate symbol in the appropriate corner.

If a runner scores, put a circle at the bottom of the box, and inside the circle put the symbol of the play and/or the player that drove him in. For example, if the No. 5 hitter drives in two runs with a single, mark his single in the bottom right of his box and mark a circle with the number "5" in it in the boxes of the runners who score (Some people like to use uniform numbers here, so you can tell who did what, even after lineup changes).

At the end of each inning, total the hits and runs for that inning only. At the end of the game you'll be able to add the innings total to get the game score.

Player Spotlight: Raylin Heredia

Raylin Heredia's Dedication Has Helped Him Become a Force in Thresherville

Baseball is truly a sport for all ages. Children around the world pick up a bat, ball, and glove when they are barely out of diapers, and many continue to enjoy the game for the rest of their lives. It is that childlike enjoyment that so many pro baseball players play with that helps so many fans enjoy watching the game, then teaching their kids to play that furthers the expansion and fandom of baseball. Though baseball started in America, it has spread widely throughout the world, with some country's baseball culture rivaling that of the United States.

The Dominican Republic is a country that has baseball woven into the fabric of its people's lives and has embraced the sport that brings such joy to its citizens. Some of the greatest baseball players in history have hailed from the Dominican Republic, with many more to come. Threshers' outfielder Raylin Heredia is one of many young Dominican players seeking

to pave his own path from the small island nation to the major leagues.

Heredia was born in Santo Domingo, the capital city of the Dominican Republic. He started playing baseball at five years old, around the same age when most players get their start in Little League. But Raylin's start was different than most. "I had a neighbor who was older than me and he was always playing baseball," said Heredia of his beginnings in the game. "I started to play with him, and watched what he did, and really guided me from playing in the streets to playing in an academy."

Though Raylin is the only one in his family who has played baseball, it was easy for him to get into the game, with pickups popping up all around him from early on in his childhood. According to Heredia, the

first gift most kids get is a plastic baseball bat. Whether it's a stickball-type game being played in the streets or in someone's front yard, there is always a game going on throughout the Dominican Republic.

It wasn't long before pickup games with friends turned into much more for Raylin. By the time he was twelve years old, his talent had grown to the point that he was getting scouted by local baseball academies. The love for the game Heredia developed from playing with his friends throughout his childhood helped him dedicate himself to baseball. He began academy tryouts in his teen years.

"Once the scouts start looking at you, it's non-stop," said Heredia of his experience being scouted in the Dominican Republic. "I started to work out in front of scouts at

13, having at least 3-4 tryouts per day. I didn't have a lot of time to myself." Raylin ultimately decided to attend the prestigious El Niche Academy to continue his baseball career, an academy that has produced great ballplayers such as Juan Soto of the Yankees, and former Florida State Leaguer Elly De La Cruz of the Reds. It was at El Niche where Heredia started to get noticed by more than just local scouts.

Starting around the age of 13, he spent five years training at El Niche, working hard to get noticed by professional scouts. El Niche boasts several former pros on their staff like Rafael Arias, a former Padres farmhand who helped recruit Heredia to El Niche. With a great history of elite pros that hailed from the academy, there was plenty of attention from big league scouts.

Some former academy players who had already turned pro in the United States came back to train, which is how Heredia developed a desire to play with the Phillies. "When I was in the academy, I saw a [then] Phillies pitcher, Adonis Medina, working out in Phillies gear and I thought 'that Phillies red really suits me,' and the rest was history," Heredia said with a smile. Luckily for Raylin, the Phillies had already developed an interest in him, and the team ended up earning exclusive negotiating rights with the outfielder towards the end of his time at the academy.

Though the COVID-19 Pandemic paused some of the international signing, the mutual interest between Heredia and the Phillies never wavered, as the Phillies continued to scout Heredia throughout much of his time at El Niche. He was ready to sign when signing was paused during the pandemic, but it wasn't long

into 2021 that the deal got done, with Raylin signing his first professional contract on January 15, 2021.

“I was so excited because I had finally realized a dream that started from playing on the streets,” said Heredia of his emotions on signing with Philadelphia. “I had always imagined playing on TV like the guys I watched growing up, and all the time I spent training felt even more worth it once I finally signed.” Heredia had been training almost non-stop at El Niche nearly seven days a week to work his way towards the professional ranks. After five years of hard work, his dedication had paid off, and he was realizing his dream of going pro with the Phillies.

Heredia went straight to the Phillies Dominican Summer League Academy in Boca Chica, which was located roughly

45 minutes from where he grew up. He didn’t play much in his first season with the Phillies in 2021, but made a massive impact on the DSL Phillies White squad in his first full year in 2022. He stayed patient and embraced the learning experience in his first season in the Phillies organization, focusing on learning more about what being a pro meant. “Baseball is always going to be the same game. But I had to really focus on being on time and treating this as a job while learning English and learning how to be a pro,” said Raylin.

Heredia’s patience paid off handsomely, becoming a regular starter in 2022 and leading the Phillies White to the DSL Championship. In the final game of the Championship Series, Heredia smacked three hits, scored twice, and drove in a run to clinch a 7-3 victory. Raylin was named the Championship MVP in what would be

his final minor league game in his home country before moving stateside in 2023.

Beginning the 2023 season in the Florida Complex League, Heredia had to adjust to playing in a country where Spanish was not the first language. He was still learning English and adjusting to the new country, but you couldn't tell by his play as he was an instant star in the FCL. He hit .326 in 35 FCL games and was named the Phillies Minor League Hitter of the Month in June.

It wasn't long before he was promoted to the Threshers, joining Clearwater for the final month of the regular season in August. He earned a Florida State League Player of the Week and MLB Pipeline Prospect Team of the Week nod in the final week of the 2023 regular season. Despite being one of the youngest players on the Threshers at 19, he played his way into the starting lineup during the postseason.

It was in the postseason where the differences of playing in Single-A versus the Complex League really dawned on Heredia. Playing in a much bigger stadium at BayCare Ballpark than at either level of rookie ball where he had played prior, with the playoff crowds amped up, it was Heredia's first experience playing in front of big crowds in the states.

"When we won in 2022, it was really fun. There were some fans to watch us, but when we got to the playoffs with the Threshers last year the stadium was full, and it was even more exciting," said Heredia. It was a brand-new ball game for Heredia, as he started five of six postseason games during the

Threshers run for the title and scored three runs during his first postseason experience stateside.

Though the Threshers fell in the final game of the 2023 FSL playoffs, Raylin returned to Clearwater in 2024 even more motivated. He was already a player driven by big moments, with a strong desire to win. Despite missing most of April due to injury, Heredia came back in a big way in May, slugging five homers and 23 RBIs in May and June, and playing a pivotal role in the Threshers' second-straight First Half Florida State League Championship.

A seven-game win streak to clinch the first half wasn't enough for Heredia, as his experience with the Threshers last year taught him the real prize is yet to come. In his first full season of pro ball in the US, Heredia has established himself as one of the premier outfielders in Single-A, but he keeps his focus on working hard and winning games.

Player Spotlight: Bryson Ware

Ware is Making Waves All Throughout the Field in his First Full Season

When you can watch players in the minor leagues enjoy the most intense training in their baseball career, it makes the beloved game of baseball even better. Since he came to the Threshers last August, Bryson Ware has played five different positions for Clearwater. Ware has demonstrated high-level fielding ability at every position, and he has done it all like he was born to play ball.

Though Bryson's parents weren't athletes, and he did not have baseball players in his family, he started playing at a young age, 4-5 years old. In the beginning he played in every league he could, starting in city league and rec leagues and quickly moving up to travel ball by age seven. He lived very close to the Double-A Braves stadium in Pearl, Mississippi, and grew up watching the team.

"Baseball is just something that I guess I was a natural at from when I was a kid. I didn't really have a favorite sport growing up, I played just about everything, but as I got to high school I kind of had to narrow it down," said Ware of his beginnings in baseball. "I realized quickly that my future was with baseball, so I stuck with it." Ware played varsity basketball in high school as well, but his primary focus was always on baseball. He played in showcases and was doing everything he could throughout much of his high school career wanting nothing more than to make it to the majors.

Unlike many of his teammates, Ware did not think he had much of a shot to go pro out of high school. According to MaxPreps, he finished his high school career with a .356 batting average, with a whopping .477 average in his final season at Germantown High School in Madison, Mississippi.

Ware started to get looks from scouts after his breakout season, but he chose to start his next steps at Pearl River Community College in nearby Poplarville, MS. Before he even got to campus, his head coach, Michael Avalon, was receiving calls from a multitude of Division I scouts trying to recruit Bryson. Ware played 16 games at Pearl River in 2020, finishing with five home runs, 17 RBIs, and a slugging percentage of .774 before he transferred. He left as a top-10 Junior College prospect, transferring to SEC powerhouse Auburn as he continued his collegiate career.

No matter how talented the athlete, going to a Division I college can be a reality check. Ware had been one of, if not the best, players on his team everywhere he went, but he entered Auburn as a newcomer with a loaded roster full of major league talent. Ware proved himself quickly at the plate, making his bat indispensable to the Tigers lineup early on. However, Auburn was very deep in the infield, with current major leaguer Ryan Bliss (SEA) headlining the upperclassman ahead of Bryson on the depth chart.

Ware played primarily shortstop, second and third base in high school and exclusively at short in Junior College. As a Tiger, he was trained at first base and all three outfield positions where he was rotated and utilized for the first two seasons.

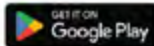
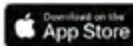
By 2023, Ware was a veteran with the Tigers and was needed in the infield before his final season at Auburn. "It definitely was a challenge being in the outfield for two years and then coming back to the infield, but I took it head on and I loved every second of it," Ware said of being used as a utility player in the field at Auburn. "I just like being in the lineup. I love playing baseball so wherever the coach puts me I'll play."

Ware got a call from the Tigers infield coach before the season began in 2022, confirming his move back to third base in 2023. His return to the infield paid massive dividends on the field and at the dish for Ware and Auburn, as he slashed an impressive .350/.438/.731 with 24 HRs and 63 RBI in his senior season with the Tigers. Having gone through an extensive

scouting process at Pearl River, Ware began reconnecting with scouts following his college career as he prepared for the draft after the 2023 season.

Going pro was always on Bryson's mind as he progressed through college, but it was hard to focus on the next level in the middle of an intense season. The process was less stressful for him this time, having already met some of the MLB scouts now looking much closer at his game. "Kind of halfway through [my senior year], I realized that I might make a real shot at this thing," said Ware of his jump to the pros in 2023. "It was cool being able to reap the benefits of all that hard work that I'd been doing, and just being able to get a little bit of attention for what I've been going through was a really satisfying feeling."

Ware seemed to have increased recruiting attention as he progressed through Junior College and Division I ball. By MLB draft day in 2023, it was less a matter of if he

would be drafted, and more a matter of when. According to his agent, Bryson was projected to be a middle-round pick on day two, so he got comfortable with his family and awaited the call.

He describes the draft process as routine, and that it all went by in a blur. Multiple MLB teams had targeted him and there was no telling where he would go. He fell to the Phillies in the eighth round, completing a big step in his lifelong goal of being a professional baseball player. "I was very fired up," Ware said about being drafted. "It was awesome, it was surreal. I had dreamed of that since I was a kid watching the draft growing up, seeing all these guys get these calls thinking 'I hope that is me one day!'" Getting to go through that was a really cool process."

With the dream realized, Ware went to Philadelphia with a group of fellow draftees and began the quick turnaround to camp in Florida. He spent a week in Philadelphia, and

then quickly reported to Clearwater to begin his professional playing career.

The pace quickened for Ware, almost immediately earning a promotion to the FCL Phillies in late July. After four games in the Florida Complex League, Ware became one of the first Phillies drafted in 2023 to make an affiliate, earning a promotion to the Threshers on August 6th. “I was super excited to make an affiliate in my first year and contribute when I could to that playoff run that we had. It was a lot of fun in the clubhouse and on the field, I enjoyed every second of it.”

Ware slugged four home runs in 20 games with the Threshers last season, and even made the playoff roster during the Threshers run in 2023. Though the Threshers fell short in the final, it was clear that the Phillies had a solid new addition to their organization, as Bryson demonstrated a great hitting ability and a rock-solid glove at third base.

Ware opened the season with the Threshers in 2024 as one of the veterans on a young opening day roster. He began the season playing mostly at third base, but with a loaded infield, he was once again asked to take some shifts in the outfield. “It gives me the opportunity to be a leader with outfielders and infielders, being a guy that does both.” Ware’s leadership helped the Threshers clinch a first half championship for the second-straight season, with Bryson still yet to record an error amongst many highlight-reel catches in left and centerfield through June.

Ware got back to shortstop for the first time since junior college in May for the Threshers and has played in five of nine potential field positions in his first full season as a pro. We may never know where Ware will play in the field, but he continues to show the willingness to play anywhere for the team, and to do anything to realize his dreams of making it to the major leagues.

Player Spotlight: Casey Steward

Casey Steward's Rise from Division II to the Pros

No path to the pros is the same. There are plenty of players who make it to the big leagues that were highly touted recruits, others who are signed to international deals and even more who take a completely different route to the ranks of professional baseball. Every so often there are players who were no-name recruits that end up jumping from a small school or program to the highest level possible of their sport. From his early years as a lightly recruited Division II standout Casey Steward hopes to be the next exceptional story to jump from a small school and small town to the pros, and all the way up to the show.

Steward comes from a baseball family in Kansas, with his brothers and himself comprising the third generation of Stewards to play baseball. He grew up hearing stories of his grandfather, a flamethrowing pitcher who played in independent leagues, as his father passed the game along to him and his two brothers. Casey's father was an infielder, and his older brother played catcher. Though Steward made the pros as a pitcher, he started in the field, catching like his older brother when he was around five years old. Casey's strong arm also allowed him to play third base, and his height had some of his coaches use him at first.

After high school, Steward had just three college offers, two from junior colleges and one from a four-year college, Washburn University. Washburn was close to home and

offered Casey the chance to stay with the same players and staff all four years. Not wanting to move after two years of JUCO, Casey chose Washburn to further his baseball career.

“I always wanted to go pro, but it never realistically hit me until the year I got drafted,” Steward said of his next-level aspirations. Though lightly recruited, Steward quickly shined at Washburn, transitioning from a position player to a pitcher soon after he enrolled. He began with two pitches in his arsenal, a hard fastball and a curveball. He knew he needed some more pitches if he were to make an impact out of the bullpen or within the rotation.

The first breaking pitch Steward developed after his curve was a slider, which took him over a year to develop. He had to play with grips and arm slots to expand his arsenal throughout his tenure at Washburn. He started out throwing

over the top but dropped his arm slot down to improve his command. After ten relief appearances in his first year at Washburn, he added a changeup to his arsenal so he could be included in the starting rotation.

In Steward’s final two seasons at Washburn, he started in all but one of his remaining 31 appearances as an Ichabod, finishing his college career as one of the best pitchers in school history. In his last two seasons at Washburn, Steward racked up almost 200 strikeouts in 152.2 innings over his last two years, including a school-record-tying 110 strikeouts in his final season in 2023.

Steward finished with a successful career at Washburn, making the All-MIAA Second Team in his sophomore and junior seasons as well as the academic honor roll every year he was an Ichabod. Though he referred to himself as a no-name recruit, Division II schools in his conference were starting to notice his talent. He knew that he could be playing at a higher level, so after his record-tying season in 2023, Steward entered the transfer portal with designs of transferring to a Division I school so he could get drafted to the Major Leagues.

“I never really got comfortable being in D-II,” Steward said, reflecting on his collegiate success. “Not a lot of Division II guys get the opportunities that I have, so it just made me want to work a little bit harder and drive me a bit more.” Within the first 48 hours of entering the transfer

portal, he had so many offers that he could eliminate the Division II schools, and filter out some messages from smaller Division I programs. With the newfound attention, Steward still had higher aspirations than just moving up a level.

By the time he got to draft day in 2023, Steward already knew he would be playing higher level baseball in 2024. Not only were Division I schools scouting him, but multiple MLB teams had discovered his talent as well and began scouting the right-hander. Many teams were interested, but by the time of the draft in mid-July, Steward had essentially narrowed down his options to the Royals, Mets and Phillies. They were the three teams that he had the most contact with during the draft process.

Once the pre-draft process was over, Steward returned home to Kansas to spend the draft with his family. The first two days came and went, and Steward still had not been picked. "I was with my family [during the draft] because we kind of expected something to happen, and it was probably the longest day of my life," Steward said of his experience on the final day of the draft. He had Division I schools chomping at the bit to recruit him, but with a potential draft pick within his reach, Casey had his sights set on realizing his childhood dream and turning pro.

Round by round, picks were made, and Steward was still not one of them. He was in constant contact with his agent and was sheltered with his family waiting for his name to be called. There was some

movement after round 15, then again in round 18 when his agent said he might get picked. But after the 18th round of the draft, Steward remained unchosen. “Round 19 comes, and I see my name pop up and it didn’t feel real. Then five minutes later I got a call, and everyone started cheering. It was a long day, but it was surreal.” He finally got the call from the Phillies, realizing his professional dreams, and he was off to Clearwater within the week.

Luckily for Steward, he already knew one player in the Phillies minor league organization. Fellow right-handed pitcher Josh Bortka was in his conference in college before he was drafted by the Phillies in the 16th round out of Central Missouri the year prior. Knowing even one other person helped him adjust to his new surroundings.

“It always helps to have someone who has been through the same path as you,” said Steward of his relationship with Josh Bortka. “Seeing a familiar face is always helpful when you’re around guys you’ve never seen before.” It certainly helped Steward, who was one of the select few pitchers drafted in 2023 to immediately join the FCL Phillies and earn a late-August call-up to the Threshers. Not only had the Division II product defied the odds by making it to the pros out of a school below Division I, but he had made an affiliate after his first few games as a pro in the Florida Complex League.

Steward pitched four innings in the regular season with the Threshers last year and was assigned to the team again in 2024 to start the season. Beginning the season feeling like one of the vets on the team, he quickly transitioned from the bullpen to a key member of the Threshers starting rotation. “It definitely helps when you can help other people out and they kind of look to you, knowing that you’ve been here before, so that you can show them the ropes a little bit,” said Steward.

Though 2023 was his first-year pitching in a stadium the size of BayCare Ballpark, he was still being asked by many of the rookie pitchers about the particulars of pitching in the Florida State League. But now, Steward is in somewhat uncharted territory again knowing that he could be called up and moved through the Phillies system at any moment. It is certainly something he has been working towards, and the odds are against minor leaguers, but Casey Steward is familiar with long odds, and he is determined to beat another set of odds on his road to the major leagues.
