TODAY'S HEADLINES

LAST TIME OUT: The Saints were held off the board until the fifth inning in an 8-2 loss to Rochester on Friday. Louie Varland gave up four runs (two earned) over 5.0 innings, striking out six. After falling behind 4-0, Diego A. Castillo ripped a two-run double to cut the deficit in half, but Rochester scored three more against Josh Winder and one run against Jay Jackson, who made his Saints debut. The Saints also committed a season-high three errors for the fifth time in 2024.

FESTA FEELING IT: As David Festa climbs the mound today, he will look to continue a strong stretch of pitching. 40 of his 60 strikeouts this season have come in his last five starts since April 30. The 40 pinchouts are the second-most in Triple-A in that span, trailing only Norfolk's Chayce McDermott. In his last five starts, Festa has issued only eight walks to his 40 strikeouts, also ranking second in the circuit (min. five starts) with a 5.00 K/BB ratio, again only trailing McDermott's 6.43 ratio.

CHECKING ON THE COMPLEX: Brooks Lee has performed well in his minor league rehab assignment in Fort Myers, hitting .406 (13-for-32) over eight games between the FCL Twins and Fort Myers Mighty Mussels. Lee was placed on the Saints' 7-Day Injured List on March 29 with low back pain.

NEW YORK STATE OF MIND: The two-week roadtrip has benefitted a pair of Saints' batters: Junior Severino and Michael Helman have swung the bats well on this two-week trip.

§ In Severino's eight games since May 21, he has hit .314 (11-for-35), with three home runs and a .971 OPS. His average exit velocity over that stretch is 93.0 mph, up from his season average of 89.2 mph.

§ Michael Helman has turned it on again, hitting .316 (12-for-38) on the roadtrip. He's struck out just six times over his last 40 plate appearances.

NO WALKS FOR YOU: Over the month of May, the Saints issued just 88 walks, the fewest in Triple-A. They lead the circuit with 183 free passes allowed this season. The 88 free passes are currently tied for the fourth-fewest for any Triple-A team in any month this season and the 16th-fewest among all full season minor league clubs in May.

MARTIN MASHING: By collecting a hit in both games of Tuesday's doubleheader, Austin Martin became the 22nd player in franchise history to register a 10-game hit streak. In his 13 games with the Saints, Martin is hitting .310/.500/.452. His 13 walks since being optioned back are the second-most in the league in that span and his .481 OBP since re-joining the Saints lineup is the fifth-best in the IL.

RETURN OF ROYCE: The Minnesota Twins sent Royce Lewis to St. Paul on Major League rehab on Saturday. Lewis is the ninth Major League rehab player to join the Saints this season. Lewis is 3-for-19 with a double, a stolen base and a run scored.

§ In 51 career games with the Saints, Lewis has hit .308 with 11 home runs, owning a .945 OPS. Six of his 11 home runs came in 12 games with the Saints last year. He's also gone 16-for-19 in stolen base attempts in his Triple-A career.

BULLPEN BRINGING IT: Over the last 17 games, the Saints bullpen has been locked in, going 5-1 with a 3.10 ERA, the fifth-best in Triple-A, in that span. The 72.2 innings the bullpen has thrown in that stretch are tied for the eighth-most of any staff in Triple-A. Their 27 walks issued are tied for the second-fewest in the IL, sporting a 1.22 WHIP, the best in the IL in that span.

LIFE ON THE ROAD: The Saints are halfway through their 12-game roadtrip, taking four out of six games in Buffalo and will now play six games in Rochester. Below is how the Saints have fared offensively in the first versus the second week in their previous five two-week roadtrips:

MAKING MY WAY DOWN I-90: This road trip will mark just the third time the Saints will have traveled to play a team from the East Division of the IL. TWINS UPDATE: The Twins started off their roadtrip with a 6-1 victory in Houston on Friday. Palbo López allowed one run over 7.0 innings, striking out six. Trevor Larnach and Carlos Santana each homered in the win.

LAST APPEARANCE: 5/25 @ BUF...made 10th start of the season, throwing 5.0 shutout innings, allowing just one hit and issuing one walk while striking out eight...retired the first 10 batters he faced, including seven in a row by strikeout, setting a new franchise record with seven straight strikeouts, surpassing Joe Ryan (8/20/21 vs Iowa) and Ronny Henriquez (5/28/22 v Indianapolis)...only baserunners allowed came when he gave up a one-out single in the fourth, followed by a walk...was his second time in three starts throwing 5.0+ shutout innings...his fourth start with eight-or-more strikeouts...received first win of the season in 7-0 Saints victory.

APPEARANCE PRIOR: 5/17 v OMA...made ninth start of the season, throwing 4.0 innings in a rain-shortened start...allowed two runs on four hits, one home run, walking two and striking out four...first run allowed scored in the second inning on a wild pitch...surrendered a solo home run to CJ Alexander in the fourth inning...rain arrived in the bottom of the fourth inning, suspending the game with a 2-2 score...did not factor into the decision in a 4-2 Saints victory.

MOWING THEM DOWN: In his start on May 22, 2024 in Buffalo, Festa retired the first 10 batters that he faced. After getting a flyout to center field to start the game, he then struck out the following seven batters, setting a new franchise record. With two outs in the third, Steward Berroa slapped a ball to second base to snap the streak. His seven consecutive punchouts surpassed Joe Ryan (8/20/21 vs Iowa) and Ronny Henriquez (5/28/22 v Indianapolis).

A PERFORMANCE FOR THE AGES: In just his ninth professional pitching appearance, Festa was a major part of a no-hitter. On May 10, 2022 with Fort Myers, he threw 6.0 no-hit innings, striking out a career-high 11 batters in a combined no-hitter for the Mighty Missiles. Jaylen Nowlin followed with 2.0 perfect innings and struck out three. Hunter McMahon tossed 1.0 hitless inning to finish it off, a 3-0 win.

ONE, TWO, THREE, YOU'RE OUT!: On July 24, 2022, Festa allowed three consecutive singles between the third and fourth innings. The final two batters of the third inning reached, as did the first of the fourth. Festa got three outs, but did not retire a batter because promptly picked off each of the three batters, one after the other.

BIGGER, FASTER, STRONGER: Goal in the offseason leading up to 2024 was to add some muscle, so he can be prepared to go an entire season. He said it's sort of tough for him to do certain exercises given his height and narrowness. Last season he was listed at 185 pounds and came into Spring Training in 2024 10 pounds heavier at 195.
