SUNDAY: The Flying Squirrels beat the SeaWolves, 11-9, in Erie. **Jairo Pomares** started the scoring with a sac fly in the top of the first inning. Chris Meyers gave Erie a 2-1 lead in the second with a two-run double. Pomares tied the score with an RBI single in the third. **Sabin Ceballos** followed with a go-ahead single and **Adrian Sugastey** drove a two-run double to open a 5-2 lead. Meyers pulled the SeaWolves back within a run in the third with a two-run double. Pomares hit a solo homer in the fifth for a 6-4 lead, but Jake Holton answered with a two-run homer in the bottom of the inning to tie the score, 6-6. Sugastey hit a solo homer in the sixth and Trei Cruz tied the score, 7-7, with a double in the bottom of the inning. In the seventh, **Cal Mitchell** doubled in a run and Ceballos added an RBI single to take a 9-7 lead. Sugastey drove in two with a double in the ninth to push the lead to 11-7. Holton hit a two-run homer in the bottom of the ninth to cut the deficit to 11-9 before **Raymond Burgos** entered to finish the game.

TODAY'S GAME: The Flying Squirrels play the opener of a six-game series against the Binghamton Rumble Ponies, Double-A affiliate of the New York Mets. This is the last series between these two teams this year. Richmond went 1-5 in Binghamton from May 20-25.

PACKING THE HOUSE: Last year, the Flying Squirrels led all 30 Double-A teams in average (6,595) and total (435,295) attendance. Among the 120 MiLB teams, the Flying Squirrels were 10th in average attendance. It was the third straight year the Flying Squirrels led all 30 Double-A clubs in average and total attendance, which had not been done prior to 2022. Last year's total attendance is the highest since 2013 (434,769) and the fourth-highest average in team history. April 4 marked the 15th consecutive Opening Night sellout, marking every home opener in franchise history to date. This year, the Flying Squirrels are averaging 6,935 fans per home game, which ranks third among all 120 MiLB clubs. Their average of 7,290 in the season's first month was the highest April attendance in franchise history.

THE FLYING SQUIRRELS are 5-15 in their last 20 games. They lost four-of-six on the road last week in Erie and in their last home series against the Senators. Of Richmond's 40 losses this season, 21 of them have been by two runs or less (13 by one, eight by two). The Richmond offense has the second-fewest strikeouts (448) in the Eastern League but are 11th in runs scored (188). Richmond's pitching staff has a league-high 4.88 ERA.

THE RUMBLE PONIES are in first place in the Northeast Division, 8.5 games ahead of second-place Hartford with 12 games remaining in the first half. Since May 17, Binghamton is 18-2 in its last 20 games, including a 12-game win streak from May 24-June 5. Binghamton's roster features six players ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Mets prospects list, including SS **Jett Williams** (No. 1), RHP **Jonah Tong** (No. 3), 1B **Ryan Clifford** (No. 9), OF **Nick Morabito** (No. 12), RHP **Jonathan Pintaro** (No. 25) and RHP **Jack Wenninger** (No. 26). MLB.com's top-30 Mets prospects list features six Binghamton players, including Williams (No. 1), Tong (No. 4), Clifford (No. 5), Morabito (No. 17), Pintaro (No. 23), and Wenninger (No. 28).

FOR RICHMOND: Left-hander **John Michael Bertrand** makes his 11th start of the season and the sixth of his career against the SeaWolves. He last pitched on Thursday against the Senators and worked seven innings for the second time this year, allowing five runs (four earned) in a loss. Two of those runs scored in the seventh. He has one other start against Erie this year. On May 16, he threw seven innings and allowed one run on three hits in a win. In his last five starts since May 4, he is 1-1 with a 2.20 ERA (7 ER/28.2 IP). Bertrand started on Opening Day for the Flying Squirrels on April 4 against Akron, becoming the first pitcher to start back-to-back season openers for the Flying Squirrels. Last year, he was named the Flying Squirrels' Pitcher of the Year after going 7-9 with a 4.32 ERA in 28 outings (27 starts). Bertrand also won the team's Community Service Award. He made two starts with Triple-A Sacramento to close the season. For the year, Bertrand led all Eastern League pitchers with 10 scoreless starts, all at least five innings. He also led all MiLB pitchers defensively in assists (31) and ranked second in total chances (38). He finished the season ranked first among all MiLB pitchers in double plays induced (23), five ahead of the next closest pitcher. Bertrand was named Eastern League Pitcher of the Week twice last year, first for throwing seven perfect innings against the Baysox on April 27 and then for working six hitless innings in Bowie on May 23. Entering 2025, he is rated by Baseball America as having the best control in the Giants system for the second straight year. Bertrand began his collegiate career at Furman University in South Carolina before playing his final two seasons at the University of Notre Dame. He was selected by the Giants in the 10th round of the 2022 MLB Draft. **For more on Bertrand, see page two.**

FOR BINGHAMTON: Right-hander Jonah Tong makes his 11th start of the season and his second of the season against the Flying Squirrels. In his last start on Wednesday against the Patriots, he threw five hitless innings and struck out 11 batters. Tong faced the Flying Squirrels on May 23 and allowed two runs over four innings with six strikeouts in a loss, the most earned runs he has allowed in a start since April 16. Since joining the Rumble Ponies, he has been named Eastern League Pitcher of the Week three times. He was also named EL Pitcher of the Month for May. Tong threw 6.2 innings in a combined perfect game on May 10 against Reading, striking out 13 batters. For the season, Tong leads the Eastern League in strikeouts (83) and BAA (.137) and ranked second in ERA (2.02) and third in WHIP (1.02). Tong was selected by the Mets in the seventh round of the 2022 MLB Draft out of high school.

DON'T RUN ON RICHMOND: The Flying Squirrels' catching unit of **Adrián Sugastey** and **Zach Morgan** have combined to catch 30 stolen base attempts this season, which is second among the 30 Double-A teams and leads the Eastern League. Sugastey is tied for first among Double-A catchers with 18 runners caught stealing, which is leads the EL. Morgan is fourth in the Eastern League with 12, which is tied for fifth in Double-A.

BERI'S BACK: Outfielder/first baseman **Victor Bericoto** returned to the Richmond roster last Tuesday. He was placed on the injured list with Triple-A Sacramento on May 9 and played six games with the ACL Giants on a rehab assignment before returning to the Flying Squirrels. Bericoto opened the season with Richmond and hits .319 with three homers, four doubles and eight RBIs in 13 games before being promoted to the River Cats on April 20. In his Richmond career dating back to 2023, Bericoto has homered 25 times, which is tied with **Frankie Tostado** for the eighth-most in franchise history, two behind a four-way tie for fourth place.

HELLO, GAVELLO: Catcher/infielder/outfielder **Thomas Gavello** joined the Flying Squirrels from High-A Eugene on May 9. In his Double-A debut on May 10 at Harrisburg, he hit a double on the first pitch he saw in the game. He followed with two hits, including another double, in his second game the following day. On May 29, he hit his first Double-A homer, a two-run shot to right. Last Wednesday night in his first plate appearance, he hit a go-ahead, two-run homer with two outs in the ninth inning. Since joining Richmond, Gavello has picked at least one hit in 13-of-19 Double-A games he has played, including six doubles, and is batting .346. He has played one game at shortstop, one a second base, one at third base and 15 games in left field, the first games of his professional career in the outfield.

TAKING THE JAIRO: **Jairo Pomares** has picked up at least one hit in seven-of-his-last-nine games dating back to May 29, batting .382 (13-for-34) with two homers, two doubles, six RBIs and three walks, raising his season batting average from .185 to .219. That stretch includes five multi-hit games. He hit a solo homer last Wednesday, his first since May 2, snapping a 25-game homerless streak. He went deep again on Sunday, one of three hits in the game, and drove in three.

IN THE LEAGUE LEADERS: In the Eastern League, **Diego Velasquez** is seventh in hits (53). **Seth Lonsway** is sixth in innings pitched (55.1), eighth in ERA (3.42) and tied for eighth in strikeouts (54). **Jack Choate** is fifth in strikeouts (59). **Joe Whitman** is seventh in strikeouts (56). **John Michael Bertrand** is fifth in innings pitched (55.2).

TOP SKIPPER: Flying Squirrels manager **Dennis Pelfrey** has led the team to 221 wins in his career, which is a new franchise record all-time wins record for a manager. He passed the record with Richmond's 6-1 win at Binghamton on May 23. From 2011-2013, **Dave Machemer** won 216 games as Richmond's manager, leading the team to the Eastern League postseason for in 2011. Pelfrey, who has been with Richmond since the 2022 season, led the team to back-to-back postseason appearances for the first time in franchise history in 2022 and 2023. He also managed the 2021 Eugene Emeralds to the High-A West championship.

PROSPECT WATCH: Richmond's roster features five players are ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Giants prospects, including **Joe Whitman** (No. 5), **Diego Velasquez** (No. 10), **Sabin Ceballos** (No. 21) and **Jack Choate** (No. 26). **John Michael Bertrand** is rated as having the best control in the Giants system. **Adrian Sugastey** is ranked as the top defensive catcher. **Aeverson Arteaga** is rated as the best defensive infielder and best infield arm. MLB.com's top-30 Giants prospects list features five Richmond players, including Whitman (No. 7), Velasquez (No. 15), Arteaga (No. 16), Ceballos (No. 23) and Choate (No. 27).

SHUFFLING THE RANKINGS: Baseball America announced updated top-30 prospects lists for all 30 clubs on Friday afternoon. On the San Francisco Giants' list, **Joe Whitman** jumped from No. 10 to No. 5, **Diego Velasquez** climbed from No. 13 to No. 10 and **Jack Choate** moved from No. 28 to No. 26. **Sabin Ceballos** fell from No. 16 to No. 21 and **Aeverson Arteaga** went dropped out of the top 30 after being ranked No. 27.

THIS DATE IN RICHMOND BASEBALL HISTORY

1955: The Richmond Virginians beat the Toronto Maple Leafs, 5-1, at Parker Field. Eddie Kasko broke a 1-1 tie with a two-out, two-run single in the bottom of the eighth inning. Rocky Ippolito added a two-run homer. Kasko started his professional career in 1949 and played three seasons before joining the Army. When returned to baseball with the Vees in 1954 and 1955. After the 1954 season he lived in Richmond and worked as a car salesman. After the 1955 season, he worked as a jewelry salesman in Richmond. Kasko went on to spend 10 seasons playing in the majors and managed the Red Sox from 1970-1973. **1974:** The Richmond Braves beat the Rochester Red Wings, 4-3, at Parker Field. Larvell Blanks won the game on a walk-off fielder's choice in the bottom of the ninth against Dave Johnson. The Red Wings tried to turn a double play to force extras, but Blanks beat the throw to first after an out at second. Joe Niekro pitched the final two innings to improve to 8-1 on the year. **1995:** The Richmond Braves beat the Pawtucket Red Sox, 6-5, at The Diamond. Eddie Perez, who did not arrive to the ballpark until the seventh inning after being delayed at the airport, hit a walk-off, three-run double to center to cap a four-run bottom of the ninth. All four runs scored with two outs. **2012:** The Flying Squirrels beat the Portland Sea Dogs, 4-3, at Hadlock Field. Trailing, 3-0, in the eighth, Richmond scored four runs to take the lead. Mark Minicozzi hit a three-run homer. Ryan Cavan added a fourth run to break the tie. Brett Bochy pitched two scoreless innings out of the bullpen and Austin Fleet closed out his third save. **2023:** The Flying Squirrels beat the Altoona Curve, 11-2, in hockey-style jerseys at The Diamond. Marco Luciano hit a grand slam in the second inning and added a two-run homer in the eighth, finishing the game with six RBIs. Wade Meckler and Simon Whitman each drove in two runs.
