Syracuse Mets News and Notes

Power Surge: Mark Vientos homered again yesterday after hitting two home runs on Wednesday for Syracuse. The 22-year-old has four home runs in his last four games. From the beginning of the season to May 1st, Vientos was hitting .164 (9-for-55) with seven RBIs, a home run, four doubles, a triple, nine walks, 22 strikeouts, and a .288 on-base percentage in 18 games. Since then, Vientos is hitting .389 (7-for-18), with seven RBIs, four home runs, four walks, seven strikeouts, and a .500 on-base percentage in five games.

Additionally, Vientos walked just four times in 14 games from the beginning of the season to April 24th, but in his last nine games, Vientos has walked ten times.

Newcomers: Gosuke Katoh was claimed by the New York Mets off waivers from the Toronto Blue Jays on May 7th and optioned to Syracuse. The 27-year-old was originally drafted by the Yankees in the second round of the 2013 draft and was in the Yankees organization through the 2019 season. Katoh signed a minor league contract with Toronto this past offseason, had his contract selected by Toronto on April 7th, and made his MLB debut with Toronto this season, going 1-for-7 from the plate with three walks and a strikeout. Tzu-Wei Lin signed a minor league deal with New York during the offseason but is just now joining Syracuse. Lin was born in Taiwan and signed with Boston as an international free agent in June 2012. Lin was with the Red Sox organization through 2020 and played parts of four seasons (2017-2020) in the Majors with Boston. Lin played for Syracuse manager Kevin Boles with Pawtucket in 2017 and 2018.

Roster Reshuffle: With the Syracuse Mets gaining two infielders with Major League experience in Gosuke Katoh and Tzu-Wei Lin, infielder Wyatt Young has been transferred to Double-A Binghamton. Young reached base in 18 of the 19 games he played with Syracuse. The Hawaii native hit .352 with seven RBIs, a home run, three doubles, 11 walks, 13 strikeouts, 14 runs scored, and a .446 on-base percentage. Young was drafted in the 15th round of last year's draft and played in only five games with High-A Brooklyn before he was promoted to Syracuse when infielder Matt Reynolds had his contract selected by New York. At the time of his transfer to Double-A, Young's .352 batting average ranked fifth in the International League, and his .446 on-base percentage ranked second.

A New Hope: From the start of the season to April 18th, Syracuse was 1-10 with a .187 batting average (20th in League), 35 runs scored (20th), .269 on-base percentage (20th), 34 walks (20th), and a pitching staff ERA of 6.73 (20th). Since April 19th, Syracuse is 11-10 with a .233 batting average (15th in League), 98 runs scored (12th), a .331 on-base percentage (14th), and 87 walks on offense (6th). The pitching staff has a 4.93 ERA (13th).

Streaking: Patrick Mazeika is on a nine-game on-base streak. During the streak, Mazeika is hitting .290 with four RBIs, a double, five walks, three strikeouts, and a .421 on-base percentage. In his first ten games, Mazeika hit .206 with 0 RBIs, three walks, six strikeouts, and a .308 on-base percentage.

In his last eight games, Mazeika is hitting .321 (9-for-28) with three RBIs, a double, three walks, three strikeouts, and a .424 on-base percentage.

Do the Palka: Daniel Palka has been a man possessed at the plate so far this season. The former Chicago White Sox leads the Mets with 22 RBIs, 13 extra-base hits, and eight home runs. Palka is tied for fourth in the International League with his eight homers, tied for 16th with 22 RBIs, is 14th with a .549 slugging percentage, 17th with a .901 on-base plus slugging percentage, and tied for 22nd with 13 extra-base hits.

Untimely Hitting: The Syracuse Mets are hitting a league-worst .198 with runners in scoring position. This series, Syracuse is 6-for-27 (.222). Last series, Syracuse went 9-for-38 (.237) with runners in scoring position, including 6-for-14 in Sunday's series finale.

- Has not pitched in Triple-A...Spent all of 2019 with Double-A Binghamton...Made his MLB debut for New York in 2020 and has spent the last three seasons (2020-22) pitching exclusively for the New York Mets
- In 2021, went on the 10-day injured list on July 2nd with an oblique strain and then went on the 60-day injured list before he came back after he suffered a Jones fracture of the fifth metatarsal of his right foot that required surgery and kept him out the rest of the season
- Entered 2020, ranked as the Mets' tenth-best prospect, according to MLB Pipeline
- In 2020, led all National League rookies and Mets pitchers with six wins, ranked third among National League rookies with 49.2 innings pitched, eighth with 40 strikeouts, and tied for the MLB rookie lead with six wins
- One of six rookies who finished a season as the Mets' team leader in wins (Tom Seaver-16 in 1967, Jerry Koosman-19 in 1968, Mark Bombardier-10 in 1980, Dwight Gooden-17 in 1984, and Dillon Gee-13 in 2011)
- In 2019, struck out a career-high 122 batters and made a career-high 24 starts while playing the entire season with Double-A Binghamton
- First round pick by the Mets (20th overall) out of Oregon in the 2017 Draft
- Finished his Oregon career ranked second in school history with 273 strikeouts and ranked sixth with 19 wins. Named consensus All-American after junior year (first Oregon player in modern era to earn that honor)
- Attended Regis Jesuit High School in Aurora, CO
- Does everything left-handed, except for golf which his father, who is right-handed, taught him to play
- 15 starts in final season at Oregon, posting an ERA of 3.05 in 100.1 IP. 140 strikeouts, 15 walks
