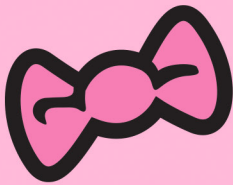

SUNDAY: The Flying Squirrels beat the Patriots, 5-1, for a series split. The game was scoreless through the first six innings. In the top of the seventh, **Mauí Ahuna** opening the scoring with a two-run double, **Trevor Cohen** hit a two-run single and **Ty Hanchey** scored on a balk for a 5-0 Richmond lead. Somerset scored a run on a Kevin Verde single in the bottom of the seventh. **Logan Martin** started for Richmond and threw two scoreless innings. **Shane Rademacher** threw three innings without allowing a run. **Marques Johnson** picked up his first Richmond win of the season with a scoreless sixth and **Ryan Vanderhei** recorded the final six outs without allowing a run.

POSTSEASON BOUND: The June 12 win clinched the Eastern League Southwest Division title for the Flying Squirrels, locking in a postseason berth. The Flying Squirrels will play the second-half division champion in the Division Series. Game 1 will be at the home of the second-half champion on Tues., Sept. 15. Game 2 and, if necessary, Game 3 will be at CarMax Park on Thurs., Sept. 17 and Sat., Sept. 18. If Richmond advances to the EL Championship Series, Game 1 will be at CarMax Park on Sun., Sept. 20. This year marks the fifth postseason appearance in franchise history and the first since 2023.

TODAY'S GAME: The Flying Squirrels face the Reading Fightin Phils, Double-A affiliate of the Philadelphia Phillies, in the opener of a six-game series. This is the first and only series between the two teams this year. It is also the second of three consecutive home series for Richmond against Northeast Division opponents and the third of three straight series against that division overall.

RECORD YEAR: The Flying Squirrels' 10-game win streak from April 4-15 was the longest in franchise history, surpassing an eight-game win streak from May 5-13, 2021, also beginning with the second game of the season. The 60-40 record the best in team history through 100 games, ahead of a 59-41 record in 2014. Richmond has won seven series, split eight and lost three so far this year. After opening the season with a 27-7 record through May 13, the Flying Squirrels are 33-33 in their last 66 games since.

RELENTLESS: In their 60 wins this year, the Flying Squirrels have come from behind in 29 of them. In 18 of the wins, Richmond has taken the lead in the eighth inning or later. The Flying Squirrels have 10 walk-off wins at CarMax Park this season, including at least one in each home series. **Diego Velasquez** has three walk-off hits this year, all in 10th innings. **Drew Cavanaugh**, **Parks Harber** and **Dayson Croes** each have two walk-off winners this year. Richmond has three wins after trailing by five-or-more runs this season. The Flying Squirrels are batting .284 in the ninth inning this year, which leads the EL and is seventh in MiLB.

THE FLYING SQUIRRELS won the Southwest Division first-half title by seven games over second-place Erie and has the Eastern League's best overall record this season. For the year, Richmond leads all 30 Double-A teams in batting average (.269), tied for first in doubles (195), second in sacrifice flies (40) and fourth in hits (895). The team has combined for 103 homers this year, surpassing 11 of the franchise's previous 15 season totals. The Flying Squirrels are on pace to set offensive single-season franchise records for batting average, runs, total bases, doubles, RBIs, stolen bases, OBP, SLG, OPS and sacrifice flies. The Richmond pitching staff has thrown nine shutouts this season, which is the most in the Eastern League and tied for second in Double-A. At 35-16, the Flying Squirrels have the third-best home record in MiLB this season, trailing only High-A Bowling Green (37-10) and Low-A Hickory (31-14). Richmond's No. 9 batters have combined to hit .335 this year, which leads the minors. The Flying Squirrels have scored 10-or-more runs 11 times this year, tied with 2023 for the most in a season in franchise history.

THE FIGHTIN PHILS are leading the Northeast Division second-half standings by one game over Portland. They went 30-39 in the first half and finished fifth in the division. Reading's roster features five players ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Phillies prospects, including 2B Aroon Escobar (No. 4), RHP Gage Wood (No. 5), SS Carson DeMartini (No. 15), RHP Jean Cabrera (No. 23) and RHP Saul Teran (No. 27). MLB.com's top-30 Phillies prospects list features XX Reading players, including Wood (No. 1), Escobar (No. 4), RHP Wen-Hui Pan (No. 12), SS Bryan Rincin (No. 14), LHP Mavin Graves (No. 24) and OF Raylin Heredia (No. 28).

FOR RICHMOND: Left-hander **Greg Farone** makes his 20th Double-A start and his first against the Fightin Phils. He last pitched in the second game of a doubleheader at Somerset last Wednesday and allowed two runs over six innings, tied for his longest start of the season and of his professional career. Farone was Richmond's Opening Day starter on April 4 at Erie in his Double-A debut and allowed one run over 4.2 innings. He had eight strikeouts, tying the franchise record for the most strikeouts on Opening Day. He pitched his first professional season in 2025 and split the year between Low-A San Jose and High-A Eugene. He made 12 starts for San Jose, going 2-1 with a 3.73 ERA. At the time of his promotion in June, he ranked third in the California League in strikeouts (73). Farone closed the year with 11 starts at High-A, going 4-2 with a 4.25 ERA. Farone began his college career at Herkimer College in New York, where he led the team to the program's first NJCAA national title in 2022, going 7-0 with a 1.65 ERA and was named the NJCAA Division III Player of the Year and MVP of the World Series. He transferred to the University of Louisville for the 2023 season and pitched at the University of Alabama in 2024 before being selected by the Giants in the seventh round of that year's MLB Draft. **For more on Farone, see page two.**

FOR READING: Right-hander Jean Cabrera makes his 11th Double-A start of the season and the third of his career against the Flying Squirrels. After back-to-back scoreless appearances on July 12 and July 21, he allowed four runs over four innings in a no-decision in his last start last Wednesday against Binghamton. He has also made seven starts for Triple-A Lehigh Valley this year, going 1-2 with a 9.32 ERA. Cabrera made two starts against the Flying Squirrels in June of 2025 at The Diamond. In the first start, he threw six innings and allowed two runs in a win. He also picked up a win in the finale of that series, allowing one run over five innings. He is 2-0 with a 2.46 ERA (3 ER/11.0 IP) for his career against Richmond. Cabrera signed with the Phillies in 2019. He is listed by Baseball America as the No. 23 Phillies prospect.

GRAND LARCENY: In the second game of last Wednesday's doubleheader at Somerset, the Flying Squirrels set a single-game franchise record with 11 stolen bases, passing the previous record of eight (5/9/14 vs. ERL 13 inn.). The 11 steals were also tied for the most in an Eastern League game since at least 2005, tied with two other games (POR @ SOM, 6/12/25 and 7/28/26, HFD vs. NH). Richmond set a single-inning franchise record with six stolen bases in the top of the third. All 11 steals were between the second and fourth innings, including 10 in the third and fourth. **Trevor Cohen** stole four bases in the game, tied for the second-most in a game in franchise history (Johneshwy Fargas, 6/8/19 @ NH), trailing only a five-steal game by Kelly Tomlinson (5/9/14 vs. ERL). The Flying Squirrels have 149 steals this season, which is second-most in franchise history behind 2014 (168). Since July 28, the Flying Squirrels lead MiLB with 26 stolen bases in 29 attempts.

HAPPY HOMECOMING: In his return to his home state last week, **Trevor Cohen** hit .486 (14-for-29) in six games with a homer, three doubles, three RBIs and eight stolen bases with seven runs scored. He has picked up multiple hits in seven straight games dating back to July 26, batting .485 (16-for-33) in that span, raising his Double-A batting average from .212 to .348. He tied his career high for hits on Friday, going 4-for-5.

KILEN IT: In his first 14 Double-A games, **Gavin Kilen** is batting .327 (17-for-52) with seven doubles, a triple and nine RBIs. For the season, he is tied for first among all MiLB hitters with 34 doubles. He is also tied for first among all Giants minor league hitters with 74 RBIs this year. After playing in the All-Star Futures Game in Philadelphia, Kilen was promoted to Double-A on July 17. He has at least one hit in 11 of his 14 games in the Eastern League. Kilen was selected by the Giants last year out of the University of Tennessee with the 13th overall pick in the MLB Draft. He is tied for the third-highest pick in the MLB Draft in Flying Squirrels franchise history with Patrick Bailey (2020) and trailing only Joey Bart (2, 2018) and Hunter Bishop (10, 2019).

GO, DIEGO, GO!: In his last 26 games since June 28, **Diego Velasquez** hit .383 (31-for-81) with a homer, five doubles, 12 walks, nine RBIs and nine stolen bases. Since joining the Flying Squirrels in July 2024, Velasquez has played 254 games. In Richmond's franchise history, Velasquez ranks second in sacrifices (19), third in walks (123), sixth in OBP (.373, min. 400 PA), fourth in stolen bases (43) and sixth in hits (250). In July, he ranked second in the EL in batting average (.389) and OBP (.463). He was promoted to Triple-A Sacramento for the first time on Tuesday.

JACK ATTACK: In his last 36 games since June 5, **Jack Payton** is batting .333 (42-for-126) with two homers, seven doubles, a triple, 16 RBIs, 12 walks and 15 runs scored. He has 11 multi-hit performances in that span, including eight two-hit games and three three-hit games. On Saturday, he hit the first grand slam of the season for the Flying Squirrels and the second of his professional career.

TOP SKIPPER: Flying Squirrels manager **Dennis Pelfrey** has led the team to 320 wins in his career, which is a franchise record all-time wins record for a manager. He passed the record with Richmond's 6-1 win at Binghamton on May 23, 2025. From 2011-2013, **Dave Machemer** won 216 games as Richmond's manager, leading the team to the Eastern League postseason for in 2011. Pelfrey, who has been with Richmond since the 2022 season, led the team to back-to-back postseason appearances for the first time in franchise history in 2022 and 2023. He also managed the 2021 Eugene Emeralds to the High-A West championship. Of Richmond managers since 1954, Pelfrey is second in wins behind Eddie Haas (1968, 1981-84), who had 351 wins.

IN THE LEAGUE LEADERS: In the Eastern League, **Diego Velasquez** is fifth in batting average (.295) and sixth in OBP (.384). **Charlie Szykowny** is tied for second in triples (4). **Bo Davidson** is tied for third in homers (19) and seventh in SLG (.521). **Parks Harber** is ninth in batting average (.284), ninth in OPS (.879) and 10th in SLG (.510). **Jonah Cox** is first in triples (5) and seventh in stolen bases (27). **Tyler Vogel** is first in saves (13) and tied for eighth in wins (7). **Trystan Vrieling** is first in shutouts (1), tied for first in complete games (1), eighth in ERA (4.22) and sixth in BAA (.238).

PROSPECT WATCH: Richmond's roster features four players ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Giants prospects, including **Dakota Jordan** (No. 8), **Gavin Kilen** (No. 9), **Trevor Cohen** (No. 11) and RHP **Yunior Marte** (No. 23). Jordan is rated as the organization's best athlete. MLB.com's top-30 Giants prospects list features five Richmond players, including Kilen (No. 4), Jordan (No. 5), Cohen (No. 11), **Jancel Villarroel** (No. 25), Marte (No. 27).

THIS DATE IN RICHMOND BASEBALL HISTORY

1977: The Richmond Braves beat the Columbus Clippers, 6-5, at Parker Field. Jim Breazeale hit a two-run single in the first, but Columbus took a 5-2 lead into the eighth until Dale Murphy hit a two-run single to pull Richmond within a run. Trailing 5-4 with one out in the ninth, Jerry Maddox, playing with a broken hand but the last non-pitcher on the bench, blooped a pinch-hit single to left in the pitchers' spot. Bob Beall hit a two-run, walk-off homer. **2010:** The Flying Squirrels beat the New Hampshire Fisher Cats, 10-0, in Manchester. Mike MacDonald threw a complete-game, nine-inning shutout, the first nine-inning shutout by a single pitcher in franchise history and one of only four in franchise history. Brandon Belt opened the scoring with an RBI single in the bottom of the first. Conor Gillaspie hit a two-run homer in the sixth. Belt added a two-run homer in the seventh. **2015:** The Flying Squirrels beat the New Hampshire Fisher Cats, 3-2, at The Diamond. Ricky Oropesa tied the score, 2-2, in the bottom of the sixth. In the bottom of the ninth, Rando Moreno hit a one-out, bases-loaded single to bring home the walk-off winning run.
