BIG CHEESE, BIG HITS: Elijah Dunham's 11th home run of the season on Wednesday served as the game-deciding hit in Somerset 5-0 shutout of Binghamton. Of Dunham's 11 homers this season, seven have been go-ahead home runs--the most by any Patriot this season. In 39 games since returning from a four-game stint with Triple-A SWB on 6/13 @BNG, Dunham is hitting .320 with 8 HR, 29 RBI, 24 R, and a .973 OPS. Dunham has reached base in nine straight and hit safely in each of his last four games.

LET'S GO FLO: Rafael Flores slugged his ninth Double-A homer on Wednesday night, in his 34th Double-A game. Wednesday's 3-for-4 effort also marked Flores' fifth three-hit game of the season. Since the start of the second half (6/25) Flores' 9 HR lead the Eastern League, as do his 69 TB. He also ranks among the second half league leaders with 16 XBH (T-2nd), 22 R (3rd), .527 SLG (5th), 35 H (T-6th) and an .878 OPS (8th). Flores has now hit safely in seven straight games over which he is 12-for-28 (.429/.484/1.000) with 8 XBH including 4 HR, 7 RBI and 7 R. He has homered in four of his last seven games and six of his last 13 games. Overall this season, his .874 OPS and 39 XBH lead all Yankees minor leaguers.

BOMBS AWAY, EVERYDAY: The Patriots enter today having homered in each of their last nine games, their longest streak of the season. The Patriots' 115 HR this season lead all Double-A teams and their 692 HR since joining the Eastern League in 2021 is the most of any Double-A team over that span.

TY'S TIME: In six games during the month of August, Tyler Hardman has reached base in all of them, going 8-for-20 (.400 AVG) with 4 RBI, 5 R, 1 HR, 5 BB and 3 SB. Entering today, Hardman has struck out only three times in his last 30 PA's (10.0%). Hardman ended the month of July going 4-for-59 (.068) in his last 15 games.

VARGY PARTY: Alexander Vargas recorded his seventh multi-hit game of the season on Wednesday night and his second 3+ hit game. Over his last 22 games, Vargas is batting .324 with 2 HR, 15 RBI, 6 XBH, and 8 R. Vargas' five triples this season are the 2nd-most in the Yankees organization.

SUMMER OF SPENCER: Spencer Jones was named the Eastern League Player of the Week for the second time this season for his efforts on the road in Bowie. Over six games during Somerset's series with the Baysox, Jones went 9-for-22 (.409 AVG) with 2 HR, 9 RBI, 5 R, and 6 XBH. Entering today, Jones has reached base in 10 of his last 11 games. Over his last eight games, the Yankees No. 2 prospect is 12-for-33 (.363 AVG) with 2 HR, 9 RBI, 4 2B, and 6 R. Jones' hot streak comes after he hit .145 over a 14-game span from 7/4-7/27.

2024 SOMERSET PATRIOTS COACHING STAFF

RAUL DOMINGUEZ: Manager (2nd year)

Raul Dominguez enters his second consecutive season as manager for the Somerset Patriots, 10th overall as a manager and 18th coaching in the Yankees organization. He led the 2023 Patriots to a Double-A best record of 84-53 and a +211 run differential, which ranked first among all MiLB teams. Under his leadership, the Patriots finished with the Eastern League's top record in both halves of the season and clinched their second straight playoff berth. In 2023, Dominguez became the third manager in Somerset Patriots Double-A franchise history and in 2024 he will become the first to serve as manager for more than one season. Before joining Somerset, Dominguez spent the prior two seasons (2021-2022) as a defensive coach for Triple-A Scranton/Wilkes-Barre. He previously served as defensive coach for Trenton (2018-2019) and Tampa (2017). The Panama City, Panama native gained prior managerial experience with the GCL Yankees East (2016), DSL Yankees 1 (2011-15) and DSL Yankees 2 (2009-10). From 2012-2015, his teams finished at least 10 games over .500, including reaching the DSL semifinals in 2012 and 2015.

KEVIN MARTIR: Hitting Coach (1st year)

Hitting coach Kevin Martir begins his first season in Somerset and fourth in the Yankees organization, after serving in the same position for High-A Hudson Valley in 2023 and Single-A Tampa for two seasons in 2021-22. He joined the Yankees organization in 2020 and had been scheduled to serve as hitting coach for former Rookie-Advanced level Pulaski, prior to the cancellation of the minor league season. Martir began his coaching career in 2019 as a development coach for the GCL Phillies East. Martir starred at catcher during his playing career at the University of Maryland (2013-15), where he was a semi-finalist for the Johnny Bench Award in 2015. Martir was drafted by the Houston Astros in the 18th round of the 2015 MLB Draft. He played two professional seasons for the Astros with Rookie-Advanced Greeneville in 2015 and Short-Season Class-A Tri-City in 2016. A native of Brooklyn, New York, Martir graduated from the Grand Street Campus in 2012, after transferring from Xaverian High School in Brooklyn prior to his senior year.

BRETT DeGAGNE: Pitching Coach (1st year)

Pitching coach Brett DeGagne begins his first season with Somerset and fourth year in the Yankees organization. After making his organizational coaching debut as the Single-A Tampa Tarpons' pitching coach in 2021, DeGagne most recently served as the FCL Yankees pitching coach in 2022 and 2023. In 2023, his staff led the Florida Complex League in strikeouts (587) and finished fourth in ERA (4.47). DeGagne was initially tabbed to be the DSL Yankees pitching coach in 2020, before the cancellation of the minor league season. DeGagne played college ball at the University of North Dakota from 2012-2016. He moved on to grad school at St. Cloud State University, where DeGagne also began his baseball coaching career. He served as the Huskies' pitching coach during the 2017-2018 seasons. He gained additional coaching experience in 2018 as the pitching coach for the Bismarck Larks of the Northwoods League. One year prior to joining the Yankees, in 2019 DeGagne took over as pitching coach for North Iowa Area Community College.

AARON BOSSI: Defensive Coach (3rd year)

Aaron Bossi returns for his third consecutive season as the Patriots' defensive coach. Under Bossi's leadership in each of the past two seasons, infielders Jesus Bastidas (2B, 2022) and T.J. Rumfield (1B, 2023) were each awarded Rawlings Minor League Gold Gloves for their work in the field. Bossi has also overseen Somerset's baserunning program each of the last two seasons, leading the team to an Eastern League-best 205 stolen bases in 2022 and a Double-A-best 256 stolen bases in 2023. Bossi made his coaching debut as Hudson Valley's defensive coach in 2021. Prior to his coaching experience with the Yankees, he spent 2017-2019 assisting rehabbing players at the organization's minor league complex in Tampa. The St. Louis, Missouri native was signed as a non-drafted free agent by the Yankees on June 24, 2016 as a catcher/infielder. He played in 22 games for the GCL Yankees East in 2016.

2024: Broke camp with High-A Hudson Valley, where he went 6-4 with a 2.60 ERA in 17 starts, striking out 108 over 86.2 IP. Started the season by allowing 1 ER in 15 IP over his first three starts with 19 K. Pitched to a 1.77 ERA over his first eight starts, where he went 3-1 with 50 K in 40.2 IP and a 0.91 WHIP. Made a spot start for Triple-A Scranton/Wilkes-Barre on 6/23 vs. BUF, where he allowed 4 ER in 1.2 IP with 3 K, 4 BB, and 3 HBP. Upon returning to High-A, pitched six more games for the Renegades before being promoted to Double-A Somerset on 8/6. At the time of his promotion to Double-A, Schlittler led the South Atlantic League with a 2.60 ERA and .191 AVG, and ranked among league leaders with a 1.13 WHIP (2nd), 82.6 IP (6th), 108 (T-2nd).

2023: Began season in extended spring training. Finished the year by splitting time between three levels, totaling a 4.11 ERA in 13 starts (14 games) with 50 K in 46 IP. After pitching in seven games for the FCL Yankees, he had a 5.68 ERA in five starts at Single-A Tampa and then a 4.76 ERA in two starts at High-A Hudson Valley.

College: Spent three seasons at Northeastern University, where he pitched to a 14-9 record and career 2.62 ERA in 182 IP with 180 K. As a redshirt freshman in 2021, Schlittler led the Huskies on the mound with an 8-1 record in 13 starts, 1.88 ERA, and 85 K's in 76.2 innings pitched, earning CAA Co-Rookie of the Year and Rookie All-American Honors. As a redshirt sophomore in 2022, he posted a 3.53 ERA in 15 starts, placing third in the CAA in strikeouts with 85. In 2019 as a freshman, got the start vs. the Boston Red Sox in the annual Huskies vs. Red Sox exhibition game at Jet Blue Park in Ft. Myers, FL to open Spring Training where he threw a shutout inning, retiring Jarren Duran, Marco Hernandez, and Rusney Castillo.

Career Notes: Selected by the Yankees in the 7th round of the 2022 MLB Draft, signing for slightly below slot value at \$205,000. Did not pitch upon signing in 2022.

Personal Notes: Played varsity basketball at Walpole HS, where he was a 3x baseball state champ. Schlittler is one of four former Northeastern Huskies in the Yankees farm system, joining INF Max Burt, RHP Thomas Balboni, RHP Sebastian Keene. The Huskies are coach by former MLB infielder Mike Glavine, brother of Hall of Fame LHP Tom Glavine. Mike played for the Mets in 2003 on top of nine minor league seasons, including a two-year stint with the Somerset Patriots in the independent Atlantic League in 2001-02. Cam's father, John, is the Police Chief in Needham, MA and played both baseball and football at D1 Stonehill College in Easton, MA.
