# SCHLITTIN' FIRE: CAM SCHLITTLER ESTABLISHES HIMSELF AS RENEGADES ACE WRITTEN BY JORDY FEE-PLATT

Growing up in Walpole, Massachusetts, Cam Schlittler was raised in the heart of Boston sports country. Walpole is located 4.5 miles from Gilette Stadium, home of the New England Patriots.

Schlittler witnessed the golden era of Patriots football taking place right in his backyard as a kid, as he watched thousands flock to nearby Foxborough on Sundays to watch Tom Brady. As the Patriots won six Super Bowls, the Red Sox also did their fair share of winning, winning four titles from 2004 to 2018.

"It was an easy childhood," Schlittler said. "Experiencing that so close to home was awesome. Everyone was happy and was in a good mood. It was a great opportunity to grow up there."

In 2022, the lifelong Boston sports fan joined the enemy. The right-handed pitcher was drafted in the seventh round by the Yankees out of Northeastern University. Despite his affiliations as a fan, Schlittler had no doubt the organization was the best fit.

"There's nowhere I'd rather be than the Yankees organization," Schlittler said. "The Yankees were always the frontrunner for me. I obviously grew up a Red Sox fan, but with what I want to do, the tools that the Yankees have are definitely what I want to be a part of. When I got the call from them, it was definitely the best news of my life."

Schlittler stayed close to home at Northeastern for college, making the 45-minute drive north to Boston. He experienced a lot in three seasons, grappling with the COVID-19 pandemic during his freshman season in 2020. Looking back, the 23-yearold is grateful his family was nearby during his collegiate years.



"My dad is always my biggest supporter," Schlittler said. "He'd always show up at home on Sunday games, Friday, Saturday. He was definitely a diehard fan, and it was really good to be close to my family even though I couldn't see them as much. It was really good to be around everyone that supported me."

During the height of the pandemic, Schlittler worked on getting stronger in the weight room, a factor he felt contributed to his success during his sophomore season. He also leaned on the team's veteran leadership for guidance.

"Looking up to the older guys was definitely a big thing for me," Schlittler said. "You obviously got to perform and earn their respect, but at the same time, they're there to help you. I think the older kids paved the path for me. They were a big reason why I was able to be successful."

While at Northeastern, Schlittler also had the support of his freshman-year roommate and future Renegades teammate Sebastian Keane. The two had grown up playing against one another in Massachusetts high school games and developed a strong bond in college. When Keane and Schlittler were both drafted by the Yankees in 2022, it came as a pleasant surprise.

"We obviously weren't expecting to go to the same team but I'm really happy it turned out that way," Schlittler said. "It definitely makes it easier that I knew someone going into it, especially being roommates with him here and last year in Tampa. It's always good to be with him and support each other in a healthy, competitive way."

After a large workload in the spring with Northeastern, Schlittler spent the rest of 2022 preparing for pro ball at the Yankees training facility in Tampa. Instead of going straight to an affiliate, Schlittler got the extra time to learn how to translate his pitching to the next level.

"I'm very grateful for what I learned there during that period," Schlittler said. "I was able to go home this offseason with a large understanding of what I need to do to be successful."

In 2023 Schlittler made 13 starts and 14 appearances across three levels, joining Hudson Valley for the team's postseason run to the South Atlantic League Championship Series.

After a promising debut season, the Yankees prospect has reached another level this season with the Renegades. Through 13 starts Schlittler has a 2.97 ERA, which ranks third in the South Atlantic League. Opponents are hitting just .183 against him, the second-best opposing average in the SAL, and he is striking out more than 11.5 batters per nine innings. Schlittler sees his success in 2024 as a culmination of hard work.

"A big thing for me was putting on weight," Schlittler said. "That's a big contributing factor to velocity and stamina, which I think have been big areas of improvement for me. I'm at the point now where I've already thrown more innings than last year, and I feel a lot better than I did at this point last year."

Schlittler will look to continue his success the rest of the season as the ace of the Renegades staff, with Hudson Valley looking to earn a playoff spot for the second consecutive season.

# VINYARD VINES

### MASON VINYARD RETURNS TO RENEGADES TO BOLSTER BULLPEN

Mason Vinyard grew up in Paducah, Kentucky, a town with a population of 26,834 located just across the Ohio River from Southern Illinois. Now in his second season in Hudson Valley, Vinyard is living in an area vastly different from the one he knows back home.

Yet Vinyard is provided with a daily reminder of his roots this season. Renegades starter Jackson Fristoe was neighbors with Vinyard as young kids in Paducah. Over a decade later, they're teammates in professional baseball.

"It's a pretty cool experience," Vinyard said. "A lot of people don't get that opportunity. It's a pretty rare one. Just to have that kind of connection from when we were little kids in the neighborhood playing whiffle ball to the bigger stage of playing professional baseball, it's pretty special."

It was a long journey to professional baseball for the Hudson Valley relief pitcher. Vinyard began his

collegiate career in 2019 at Wabash Valley College, a junior college in Illinois. After striking out 54 batters in 41.2 innings that season, the right-hander received a Division-1 opportunity with Western Kentucky, just two hours from home.

"Truth be told, that was my only D-1 offer out of junior college," Vinyard said. "I just rolled with it. It was a good situation for me to come in and have an impact right away. I really enjoyed my three years there."

After a difficult first season in 2020 that was cut short due to COVID-19, Vinyard worked tirelessly to improve during the downtime. The summer of 2020 was a turning point for Vinyard.

"A couple of buddies and I really went to work," Vinyard said. It just completely changed my career that summer to a point where I was able to become a really good Division-1 arm."

Vinyard had tremendous success with the Hilltoppers in 2021 and 2022. As a redshirt sophomore in 2021, Vinyard had a 2.32 ERA in 31 innings while striking out 39 batters. His ERA was the best on the team that season. The following year, he dramatically increased his strikeout numbers, punching out 53 batters in 31.2 innings while recording eight saves. Vinyard struck out over 15 batters per nine innings.

Following the spring season, Vinyard went undrafted before being signed by the Yankees in August of 2022 as an undrafted free agent. As a fifth-year senior, Vinyard was disappointed to go undrafted, but knew that his moment might not come in the most traditional way.

"Obviously everyone wants that opportunity and experience, but I understood if it did happen, it wouldn't necessarily be the most glamorous," Vinyard said. "I was just super thankful that they gave me that opportunity. I've wanted this since I was a little kid. My family has been there super supportive. I can't thank them enough because they helped me through those ups and downs."

Vinyard debuted in the Yankees organization in 2023 and performed at a high level throughout the season. In 38 appearances split between Single-A Tampa and Hudson Valley, Vinyard recorded a 3.12 ERA with 74 strikeouts in 60.2 innings. Opponents hit just .194 against him. After joining Hudson Valley mid-season, he allowed just 12 ER in 36.1 innings with an ERA of 2.97.

Across many levels of baseball, Vinyard has demonstrated an ability to strike out batters at a high rate. The 25-year-old credits those numbers to the simplicity of his approach.

"Your chances of getting a good outcome go up significantly if you can get to two strikes quickly," Vinyard said. "My goal is to beat you to two strikes in three pitches or less and put you away from there. Once I get you to two strikes, my mindset is punching the guy out. I don't want to give up a groundball. I want to beat you in the box. There are no accidents and no hesitancy behind any pitch I'm throwing."

After a strong season last year, the beginning of 2024 wasn't easy for Vinyard. He spent the beginning of the campaign on the injured list. After one rehab appearance with the FCL Yankees, Vinyard rejoined the Renegades in early May. He was thrilled to return.

"I was so excited to get back to Hudson Valley, and see the fans and the atmosphere," Vinyard said. "Obviously, huge credit to my fiancee and my family for helping me through that process. There were a couple of times this offseason, in December and January, where I was thinking 'Man, I really could go for some of my favorite spots in Hudson Valley."

Since returning, Vinyard has been one of the most dependable relievers for the Renegades. He has 39 punch outs in 27.2 innings, and opponents are hitting just .206 against him. While he's still in High-A, Vinyard is sure to take full advantage of the area he's grown fond of.

"We don't get a ton of time, but I love eating with guys in the area," Vinyard said. "When we're out, we love Hudson Taco, and there's a good hike in Mount Beacon. I honestly really enjoy the scenery. I like being outside in the mountains. It's a special place up here."

# J-ROD DELIVERS VERSATILITY AND A STRONG BAT HAVE PUT RODRIGUEZ ON THE PROSPECT MAP

Jesús Rodríguez signed with the Yankees when he was just 16 years old. Growing up in Venezuela, Rodríguez had watched the team with admiration, and being a part of the organization at an early age was a dream come true.

"It was an honor," Rodríguez said. "It's such a great experience. It's such a great team, and you just have to feel really happy when teams appear, and it's the Yankees that want to sign you."

Since signing in 2018, Rodríguez has performed at a high level everywhere he's played. After being named a MiLB.com Organization All-Star in 2023, the Renegades utility man is putting together another outstanding season this year. He's been one of the most consistent hitters in the South Atlantic League all season long, ranking in the top ten in nearly every statistical category.

In Venezuela, baseball is the most popular sport in the country, producing top talents like future Hall of Famer Miguel Cabrera and Braves star Ronald Acuña, Jr. The Yankees prospect grew up playing baseball with his father, honing his skills piece by piece.

"My dad and I trained in the street every day after practice with the team," Rodríguez said. "We would correct my errors from the prior practices. Those have got to be my best memories from back home."

As his baseball career continued, Rodríguez spent a lot of time on his own, playing at academies and participating in showcases to attract professional attention. In 2018, after watching Rodríguez play at a showcase in Venezuela, the Yankees were impressed, and signed him that July.

Venezuela has become a hotbed for catchers like Rodríguez over the past 20 years. Players like Robinson Chirinos played in MLB and gave back to local youth ballplayers, paving the road for former Renegades Omar Narváez, Carlos Narváez, Antonio Gómez and Rodríguez to blaze their own trails.

Rodríguez began his Yankees journey in the Dominican Summer League with the DSL Yankees in 2021. In the baseball sense, the competition was a big step up for him.

"It was hard," Rodríguez said. "The work that you put in in the offseason helps produce results, but it wasn't that easy. You got to make adjustments every day. It was a really good experience to learn about the organization, and the team you're going to see in professional baseball."

Spending time in the Dominican Republic was something Rodríguez remembers fondly.

"It was a cool experience," Rodríguez said. "I had spent time there looking to get signed, but being in Boca Chica, where the Yankees complex is located, was really cool. The beaches there are beautiful. It's really nice."

The following season, Rodríguez began playing in the United States for the first time with the FCL Yankees. This meant a new level of independence for Rodríguez, still only a teenager at the time. Being away from family for a sustained period was a difficult experience at first.

"You've got to cook for yourself," Rodríguez said. "You've got to get a place for yourself. Those are big differences from the D.R, that new experience of being here by yourself. You think about family every day. You miss them every day. But now with social media and with phones, it's much easier to communicate with them."

It is also a little easier now that players no longer have to find their own housing, with MLB clubs providing local housing to their minor league players beginning in 2022.

Rodríguez hit .348 and had a 1.010 OPS with the FCL Yankees in 2022, leading qualified Yankees minor leaguers in both categories. He was named a Florida Complex League Postseason All-Star after season's end while helping to lead the team to the FCL Championship under the guidance of 2023 Renegades manager Sergio Santos.

In 2023, splitting time with Single-A Tampa and Hudson Valley, Rodríguez didn't miss a beat. He hit .310 with a .399 on-base percentage, driving in 62 runs and scoring 66 times. Rodríguez ranked second among Yankees minor leaguers in batting average, and fourth in hits.

"You just have to have the confidence in your abilities," Rodríguez said. "If you have the confidence to say 'I can do it', even when things aren't going your way, I think that's what is going to lead you to have good results."

As the Renegades utility player continues his success this year, playing all over the diamond at catcher, third base and left field, Rodríguez is thankful to those who are helping contribute to his achievements.

"My parents are always supporting me back home," Rodríguez said. "The coaches here, they're always trying to help you with adjustments. I just feel honored to be with the Yankees. I really enjoy it.

"They are pretty loud over there. Even there's only 1,000 people in the stadium, you are going to hear them. So that's the difference."

## IN THE AYRES TONIGHT: RENEGADES WORKHORSE HAS CARRIED BULLPEN LOAD

Cole Ayers has been one of the most dependable relievers in the South Atlantic League this season for the Rene-

gades. For much of 2024, Ayers has led the SAL in appearances. With 45 games on the mound last season, the right-hander has developed a reputation for being a workhorse. Ayers wouldn't have it any other way.

"I love it. There's nothing better," Ayers said. " If I'm feeling good, I want the ball. I want to pitch every single day if they'd let me. There's nothing better than playing, so I'd rather just get in there."

The Hudson Valley reliever comes from a very athletic family. His dad Mike had a six-year minor league career in the Pittsburgh Pirates organization, reaching Triple-A in 2000 and 2001. Ayers' uncle Nick played football professionally, earning an opportunity with the Cincinnati Bengals in 2004, and is now a high school football coach in the Cincinnati area.

Growing up in Ohio, Ayers began to develop an athletic career of his own. He began his collegiate career at Kentucky in 2019, quickly discovering the tremendous talent on display in the SEC. It was a great reminder of what MLB-caliber players look like.

"Dudes come into this ready to dominate and get to the next step, and I didn't really know what professional

baseball was about," Ayers said. "But I knew that's where I wanted to be. Seeing that up close and personal, playing with guys like [Cardinals 1st round pick] Zach Thompson, who is in the big leagues now, was fantastic."

Ayers continued to surround himself with talent that summer when he played for the Chatham Anglers in the Cape Cod League alongside future big leaguers like Spencer Torkelson.

"The Cape Cod League was one of the best summers of my life," Ayers said.

After his freshman year at Kentucky, Ayers made the decision to transfer to the State College of Florida, a junior college in Sarasota. Spending his final two seasons of college ball there, Ayers had lots of success as a starter. He struck out 117 batters in 87.2 innings in 2020 and 2021. By transferring to junior college, Ayers hoped to get more attention.

"The biggest motivation was to get drafted," Ayers said. "Being at Kentucky and being a reliever there, at that time it seemed like relievers didn't get drafted very much. I wanted to get to Florida and be in the area where there's a lot of spring training teams, a lot of scouts, and get some eyes on me."

His decision paid off, as Ayers was invited to pitch in the MLB Draft League for the Mahoning Valley Scrappers following the 2021 spring season. The Scrappers were managed that summer by 15-year big-league outfielder Coco Crisp, a World Series champion in 2007 who stole over 300 bases in his career. Advice from Crisp and his peers has really stuck with Ayers.

"Talking to guys like that and being in that clubhouse environment really set me up for the minor league lifestyle," Ayers said. "I had those dudes that were big leaguers around me as well, showing me what I could really be. Playing in front of 30 scouts every night, it was a huge eye-opener."

After a strong summer with the Scrappers, where Ayers had a 3.52 ERA and 38 punch outs in 30.2 innings, he got the draft news he was looking for. The Yankees selected Ayers in the 16th round of the 2021 MLB Draft.

The exciting news was shared in a particularly special way for Ayers, a fitting experience for the son of a professional ballplayer.

"The amateur pitching coordinator Scott Lovekamp actually was my father's pitching coach in the Pirates organization," Ayers said. "He called my dad and said, 'Your boy want to be a Yankee?' So it was an unreal experience."

After a brief pro debut in 2022, Ayers has been pitching a ton over the last two seasons. This extended workload requires a lot of preparation. Since joining the Yankees organization, Ayers has been focused on working more data into his pitching routines. Ayers now has access to a new wealth of information about the opposition and has worked to make the most out of it.

"Sometimes you can get too locked in on it," Ayers said. "But I feel like I've found a really good middle ground between data and what my eyes are telling me in the game. So I'm learning how to read hitters in person as well as reading what they're not as good at. Knowing their percentages going into the game and having that in your back pocket is important."

As the Renegades continue to turn to him the rest of the season, Ayers will look to carry his vast array of experience to the next level, with his family closely watching a process quite familiar to them.

Serving the Hudson Valley community is an essential part of the Hudson Valley Renegades mission, and the organization would not be here celebrating 30 years without your support. Each year, the award-winning Renegades Community Program presented by Westchester Medical Center Health Network (WMCHealth), gives back multitudes to our entire community. In 2024, the Renegades are rolling out another season filled with giving back to the Hudson Valley.

#### Youth Field Betterment Program

The first is the Youth Field Betterment Program, presented by Heritage Financial Credit Union. Each year, front office and Heritage Financial Credit Union representatives come together to renovate a local Little League field. This year's recipient of a renovated field is Lee Town Recreation Park of the East Fishkill Babe Ruth League.

The field was chosen for its ability to provide access to baseball and a place to develop valuable life skills for children throughout the Hudson Valley. The focus of East Fishkill Babe Ruth is on more than just baseball as they seek coaches and volunteers who can set positive examples and act as role models throughout the season and beyond for the children playing.

East Fishkill has also opened its enrollment to children from neighboring communities with baseball programs that have seen their enrollment numbers decline to the point of limiting their ability to continue their programs so that all children have a place to play.

The Youth Field Betterment refurbishment of Lee Town Recreation Park will allow East Fishkill Babe Ruth to continue to provide an enjoyable experience to every child who wants to learn and play the game of baseball from the levels of T-Ball through 13U in both recreational teams and local travel teams.

#### HOPE Week

2024 also marks the return of HOPE Week presented by WMCHealth, a Yankees community service initiative. Each Yankees minor league affiliate carries out its own HOPE Week, which stands for Helping Others Persevere and Excel. This is the 11th season in which all Yankees affiliates have hosted HOPE Week, continuing a valued tradition. The Renegades HOPE Week will be taking place June 25-30.

On every day of that week, Renegades players, coaches and front office staff will go out in the community and donate time to making the Hudson Valley a better place. In the past few years, the Renegades have executed events at the Castle Point VA hospital, the Fishkill Food Pantry, and the Maria Fareri Children's Hospital at MidHudson Regional Hospital.

The organization that the Renegades are honoring are also brought out to that night's game at Heritage Financial Park to both bring a rewarding experience to those doing good in our community, but also to raise awareness for the causes they are fighting for.

#### Disability, Dream and Do (D3) Camp

Hudson Valley will also be offering the Disability, Dream and Do (D3) Day Camp once again. Since 2017, the Renegades have held a clinic at the ballpark to benefit children with disabilities. The D3 sports camps were created by Dave Clark and Doug Cornfield. Clark was the only pitcher in professional sports history to pitch on crutches, while Cornfield is a former NCAA medal-winning runner at Georgia, whose child was born without arms. Through donations and sponsorships, these camps are free to campers.

D3 camps bring professional players together with children with special needs, who compete in drills and competitive sports. In 2016, Dave Stevens became involved with D3. Stevens was born without legs, playing minor league baseball and college football. With his help, D3 camps expanded across the United States, allowing kids with disabilities to learn to pursue their dreams. This year's edition of the D3 camp at Heritage Financial Park will take place on Saturday, August 3.

These community programs are just a small sampling of the myriad programs that the Renegades offer on top of monetary, in-kind, and time donations made by the club and its staff. For the Gades, creating magical experiences that become life-long memories for the entire community is not something that begins and ends at Heritage Financial Park.

His Pulaski roster featured six future Major Leaguers on it, including former Renegades Oswald Peraza, Everson Pereira, Ezequiel Duran and Luis Medina.

Derogatory language is defined as offensive language concerning a person's race, ethnicity, gender, religion, disability, age, sexual orientation, or national origin. Anyone using such language is subject to automatic ejection from the ballpark.

Violations of the Fan Code of Conduct will not be tolerated and may lead to ejection from the ballpark, a ban on attending future games, or other consequences. Guests who are found to have used derogatory language will be ejected from the ballpark.

Guests are encouraged to report violations of the Fan Code of Conduct to the nearest ballpark staff member. This can be done in person, at the nearest Quest Services location, or directly with Ballpark Security.
