That Was Last Night - The Saints win streak came to an end last night in Louisville by a 6-2 final score. The Saints led 2-0 going into the eighth inning, and had recorded two outs in the frame before allowing seven straight Bats to reach base, six of whom scored to take the lead. Charlie Barnes threw six shutout innings in the start, and Brent Rooker hit his sixth homer of the season in the loss.

Today's Games - As a result of the series opener on Tuesday being rained out, two games are on deck today, both scheduled for seven innings. Jhoan Duran will make his third Triple-A start in game one, Chandler Shepherd gets the ball in game two as the Saints look to start a new win streak.

Riddle is Raking - Dating back to May 23rd, JT Riddle has found his stride in the Saints offense. He's currently riding a seven-game hit streak, with a .429 average in that stretch, with an OPS of 1.234. Riddle has also had a touch for the clutch, driving in nine runs during his hitting streak after collecting just four RBIs in his prior 16 contests.

Starters Strength - Since May 21st, the St. Paul starting pitchers have put together some excellent outings. The Saints starters collectively own a 1.85 ERA in that stretch, allowing only 10 earned runs in 48.2 innings, spanning the last nine games.

Telis Timing it - Tomas Telís has been on a tear for the Saints since May 16th. He went on a five-game hit streak, the last four of which were multi-hit games. Telis is batting .315 in this stretch with 17 hits in his last 13 games. After driving in just two runs in his first 17 games of the year, Telis has driven in seven runs in the his last six games.

Keeping it in the Park - The Saints pitching staff has a collective ERA of 4.31, good for 14th in the Triple-A East, and have not been damaged by round-trippers. St. Paul's pitching staff has given up just 12 homers, which is the the fewest in all of Triple-A, with the next-fewest being the 21 homers surrendered by Lehigh Valley. The Saints have not given up a homer in eight games.

Saints Dig the Long Ball - The Saints' offense has come in bunches through 25 games this season, because nearly half of it has come from home runs. Of the 108 runs that St. Paul has scored this season, 47 (43.5%) of them have been accounted for by home runs. Brent Rooker has the team lead in homers with six.

Rooker's Good Reads - While currently riding a seven-game hit streak, OF Brent Rooker is also currently tied for fifth in walks in the Triple-A East, drawing 17 this eason. He's gotten on base in all but two games he's played in (18 of 20) with a on-base percentage of .384 this season. Rooker has two games with three walks this year.

Roster Notes - The Minnesota Twins recalled RHP Shaun Anderson on Thursday.

Twins Update - The Twins dropped their second straight to Baltimore by a 6-3 final last night. Ryan Jeffers hit a triple and a home run, driving in two runs in his first game back in the majors. Randy Dobnak got the start for Minnesota, giving up three earned runs in 5.2 innings. Gilberto Celestino also made his MLB debut, going 0-2 with a HBP.

- Spent the start of the 2021 season at the development site in Fort Myers.
- Entering the 2021 season with a 2.8:1 strikeout-walk ratio.
- Spent the 2020 season at the alternate training site.
- Traded to the Twins in 2018 from the Diamondbacks. In his first start in the
 organization, he threw seven no-hit innings for Cedar Rapids, an effort that won
 him Twins Minor League Pitcher of the Week and Midwest Pitcher of the week.
- Has started all but one appearance in his career leading into the 2021 season, with his lone relief appearance coming in 2019 with Fort Myers.

- Spent most of the 2020 season at the Alternate Training Site, had his contract selected on August 22nd and made two appearances with the Twins throwing 2.2 scoreless innings.
- Has spent parts of six of the last seven seasons on Major League rosters. He spent most of his time in the Bigs with Oakland, making 134 appearances with the A's over three seasons.
- The 2017 season called Coulombe's name 72 times with the A's. He
 was didn't allow a run in 57-of-72 games but pitched less than 1.0 IP

- Allowed runs in just five of his 14 games, he held lefties to a .192 average, while righties faired a bit better, hitting .273 against him.
- Prior to his time with Texas, he was a member of the Tampa Bay Rays organization, where Baseball America ranked him the 18th best Rays' prospect after the 2018 season.
- During the 2018 campaign, he was named an International League All-Star with the Durham Bulls.
- Has had his run-ins with injuries, missing his junior season of HS and most of his sophomore year of college due to injury.

- Prior to his stop in Pensacola, he was with Adv-A Fort Myers, where he dominated the Florida State League. while there in 2019, he went 2-0 with a 0.59 ERA over 15.1IP. He only allowed three hits and one earned run in that stretch while his opponents had a .064 average against him.
