NEWS AND NOTES

JUNE BOOM: With two more home runs in Tuesday's series opener against Jacksonville, the Sounds ended the month of June with 36 home runs. Nashville finished the month with the fourth-most homers hit in the International League, and fifth in Triple-A. The 36 home runs finishes as the 12th-most in any single month for Nashville since 2005. The Sounds hit 47 combined home runs through the first 57 games of the season. Brewers no. 12-rated prospect Luke Adams paced all Nashville hitters with eight home runs, and finished tied for fifth in Triple-A in June. His previous high for homers in a single month during his minor league career was five, which he hit in July of 2024 with High-A Wisconsin and June of last season with Double-A Biloxi.

BROCK 'N' ROLL: Brock Wilken tallied another multi-hit performance to his line in Tuesday night's game against the Jumbo Shrimp, going 3-for-4 on the night with his first 3-run blast of the season. The three hits marked his fifth multi-hit of the season and third 3-hit game. Wilken has recorded 44 RBI which ranks second-most on the team and the seven homers are tied for the fifth-most for a Nashville player this season. Milwaukee's no. 20-rated prospect ranks tied for 9th in RBI (44) among minor league hitters in the Brewers' farm system. He is hitting .185 (42-for-227) and 21 XBH for the Sounds this season. His 21 XBH account for exactly half of his season hits and he ranks fourth on

the club behind Eddys Leonard (25), Jeferson Quero (23), and Jett Williams (21). Of 47 career home runs in the minors, Tuesday night marked just his second career three-run homer.

QUERO BLAST: Jeferson Quero crushed his 10th homer of the season with a solo shot to left center field and cut into the Jumbo Shrimp lead 4-2 in the bottom of the third inning. The 10 homers ties for the team-high on the team with Eddys Leonard and Luke Adams. He has posted four homers in his last 11 games since the start of the Memphis series on June 16, adding 11 RBI along the way with a .409 AVG (18-for-44). Quero's 47 RBI leads the team, and ranks fifth among minor league hitters in the Brewers' farm system. His 10 home runs this season are tied for the sixth-most in the farm system. The Brewers no. 9-rated prospect has now reached 10+ homers in a season for the fourth time in his six-year professional career.

COMEBACK KIDS: The Nashville Sounds scored eight unanswered runs to secure the 8-4 comeback win after the Jumbo Shrimp scored four runs in the top of the first inning. Tuesday night was the fourth comeback win when down four runs this season and ties as the largest comeback win of the season (6/30 vs. JAX, 6/10 vs. DUR, 5/19 @ DUR, 4/5 vs. CLT). Nashville's largest comeback win during the 2025 season was five runs, and they did so two different times at home (May 22 vs. Scranton/Wilkes-Barre, July 23 vs. Charlotte).

LYON KING: Right-hander Lyon Richardson earned his first win with the Sounds on Tuesday night. Richardson worked 3.2 IP in relief while allowing just one hit and pitched around a pair of walks in his outing. In five appearances with Nashville this season, he has posted a 1-0 record with a 1.38 ERA in 13.0 innings of work. Tuesday night was the 150th game of his minor league career (100 GS) after being selected by the Cincinnati Reds in the 2nd round of the 2018 MLB Draft out of Jensen Beach High School in Florida. He owns a career 14-31 record with a 4.47 ERA and is now 9-10 with a 4.74 ERA in 76 career Triple-A appearances between Louisville and Nashville since 2023.

BACK LIKE HE NAVA LEFT: Andrick Nava made his return to the Nashville lineup for the first time since April 16. The 24-year-old homered in his first at-bat to get the Sounds on the scoreboard in the bottom of the second of Sunday's resumed game from Saturday, June 27. The 424-foot, three-run blast was his first career Triple-A home run and jumped to the fourth farthest homer hit for a Nashville player this season. He added a single in the bottom of the sixth to earn his first Triple-A multi-hit game to go along with a multi-RBI performance. He has reached base in all 13 games he has played in this season with High-A Wisconsin (10 G) and all three appearances with the Sounds.
