## FRISCO POWER SURGE LIFTS RIDERS OVER DRILLERS, 5-4:

The Frisco RoughRiders defeated the Tulsa Drillers 5-4 on Wednesday evening from Riders Field. Frisco (14-9, 58-34) jumped ahead of Tulsa (12-10, 46-45) in the top of the first inning, notching four hits against Orlando Ortiz-Mayr (4-6). **Josh Hatcher** gave the Riders the lead with an RBI single that plated **Liam Hicks** to open the scoring. Tulsa was able to tie the game against **Dane Acker** (4-4) in the top of the fourth inning when the Dodgers top prospect Dalton Rushing left the yard to leadoff the frame. **Scott Kapers** gave the Riders the lead right back in the home half of the fourth inning, delivering a two-run jack to left that plated **Geisel Cepeda** to make it a 3-1 game. Acker exited after 5.0 one-run frames, allowing just two hits and two walks while fanning five. **Cody Freeman** extended the RoughRiders lead with a solo homer to left in the bottom of fifth inning before **Abimelec Ortiz** launched a towering 410-foot homer to right to make it a 5-1 advantage for Frisco. The homers marked the second straight night that the Riders have belted back-to-back long balls. **Reid Birlingmaier** entered in the top of the sixth, allowing a run on an RBI single by Griffen Lockwood-Powell. He finished after 1.1 innings, surrendering just the one run on three hits before handing the reins to **Robby Ahlstrom**. The lefty delivered 1.2 scoreless frames with a pair of strikeouts. In the top of the ninth inning, the Drillers loaded the bases against **Tyler Owens**. Alex Freeland brought Tulsa within a run with a two-run single to center. Following an error, Owens struck out Rushing for the second out before inducing a groundout to seal the 5-4 win for Frisco. Offensively, the RoughRiders matched their season high of three homers for the second straight night. Ortiz notched the lone multi-hit performance as every hitter in the Frisco lineup collected a hit. Kapers led the charge with two RBIs.

## PUSH IT TO THE MAXIMO:

**Maximo Acosta** has been swinging a hot bat for the RoughRiders in July, hitting .293 (17-for-58)/.333/.431/.764 with three doubles, a triple, a home run, eight RBIs, 10 runs scored and six stolen bases. As one of six qualified players in the Texas League age 21 or younger, Acosta is hitting .371 (13-for-35)/.410/.571/.981 over his last nine games. He has also excelled with runners in scoring position, placing third in the Texas League with a .353 average with RISP and first with a .474 average with RISP and two outs.

## HOME COOKING:

The RoughRiders have been fantastic at home this year, going 33-13 at Riders Field this season. Their 32 wins and .717 winning percentage at home are both first in Double-A and first among non-Triple-A teams in Minor League Baseball. At home this season, Frisco has a +77 run differential, a 3.62 ERA and is averaging 5.7 runs per game with a .756 OPS. On the road, Frisco is 25-21 with a 3.41 ERA, but a +17 run differential while averaging 4.0 runs per game and owning a .633 OPS. **Cody Freeman** is slashing .338/.387/.580/.967 at home this season with eight of his 11 home runs. His .338 batting average is the second-best in the Texas League play a player at their home stadium.

## OSUNA FROM THE RIDERS:

**Alejandro Osuna** has been incredible for Frisco since joining them from High-A Hickory. In 17 games, he is hitting .299 (20-for-67)/.373/.582/.955 with six doubles, two triples, three home runs and 12 RBIs. Over his last 14 games, he is batting .315 (17-for-54)/.403/.630/1.033 with four doubles, two triples, three home runs and 12 RBIs. Two Fridays ago, he went 2-for-5 with a triple and a home run, tying his career-high with five RBIs. He set that career high in his final game in High-A this year, also hitting for the cycle in a 5-for-5 game. In the first inning, Osuna is hitting .357 (5-for-14) with three doubles and a 1.042 OPS for the Riders.

## I WANT TO BREAK FREE(MAN):

**Cody Freeman** has been one of the best hitters on the RoughRiders this season. While he slowed down slightly at the plate in June (batting .253/.298/.437/.735), he has been hot in July. Over his last 15 games, he is hitting .276 (16-for-58)/.338/.448/.786 with four doubles, two home runs, 11 RBIs and five runs scored. This season, he has a career highs in average (.273), slugging percentage (.455) and OPS (.783) while being on pace to set new career bests in RBIs (70) and home runs (17).

## THE (BULL)PEN IS MIGHTIER THAN THE SWORD:

Frisco's bullpen has been the best in the Texas League this season, owning a 3.00 ERA, which is also the second-best in all of Minor League Baseball. Both in their series opener and series finale against Northwest Arkansas on Tuesday and Sunday, the bullpen allowed six runs. Those six runs were the most the bullpen had allowed in a game since April 23rd against Amarillo. That tied for the second-most allowed, with nine runs allowed in the second game of the season (4/6 at Wichita) marking the most. Overall, the Riders are on pace to have the second-best team ERA in franchise history (3.52), just behind 2014 (3.39). Additionally, their .228 BAA is on pace to tie the 2021 team for the lowest mark in the franchise's history.

## WE'RE GOING DANCING:

Tuesday marked the first day of the second half. The RoughRiders clinched the first-half Texas League South Division title for the first time since 2014. In the first half, they owned the best record in all of Double-A at 44-25 and they won the Texas League South by 4.0 games over the Midland RockHounds. The RoughRiders are in the playoffs for the first time since winning the Texas League title in 2022 and finished with the best record in Double-A for the first time since 2008. The Riders are on pace for 88 wins, which would break their franchise record of 85 (2007). Offensively, the Riders finished sixth in the league in batting average (.240), fifth in runs per game (4.8), seventh in home runs (45) and eighth in OPS (.680). Where they shined was on the pitching side, finishing first in ERA (3.49), third in batting average against (.231) and second in saves (19). Their relievers finished with a 2.95 ERA, which was fourth in all of Minor League Baseball.

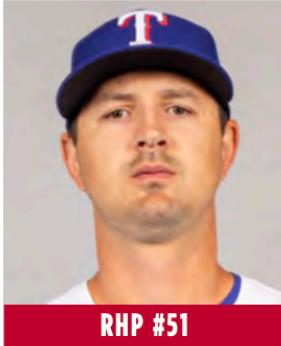

**CAREER:** Mahle (rhymes with rally) is entering the first season of a two-year Major League contract signed with the Rangers on 12/14/23...the 29-year-old is expected to miss the beginning of the 2024 campaign as he continues rehabilitation from 'Tommy John' ligament replacement surgery performed in May of 2023 (see 'Minnesota/Injuries' paragraph below)...he comes to Texas following a two-year stay with the Minnesota Twins over which he made just 9 starts while dealing with right elbow and shoulder ailments...served as Cincinnati's 2022 Opening Day starter after producing career highs in wins (13), starts (33), quality starts (12), innings pitched (180.0), and strikeouts (210) in 2021...spent the first 10 years of his professional career in the Reds organization before he was dealt to the Twins in exchange for INF's Spencer Steer and Christian Encarnacion-Strand, and LHP Steve Hajjar on 8/2/22...a veteran of seven Major League campaigns, Mahle has compiled a lifetime 33-41 record, 4.30 ERA (304 ER/635.2 IP), and 677 strikeouts (9.6 SO/9) over 123 appearances/122 starts in the big leagues with Cincinnati (2017-22) and Minnesota (2022-23)...the Newport Beach, Calif. native was originally selected by CIN in the 7th round of the 2013 MLB Draft out of Westminster (Calif.) High School.

**MINNESOTA/INJURES:** Mahle is expected to miss the first half of the 2024 regular season as he continues rehabilitation from 'Tommy John' ligament replacement surgery performed on 5/22/23...although he was with the Minnesota organization at the time of the procedure, Mahle's operation was performed by Rangers team physician Dr. Keith Meister...was limited to just 9 appearances/starts with the Twins over the last two seasons due to Injured List stints from 8/20-9/2/22 (right shoulder inflammation), 9/3/22-end of season (right shoulder inflammation), 5/3/23-end of season (right arm posterior impingement and flexor pronator strain)...just before the trade to Minnesota, he was on the Reds' 15-day Injured List from 7/3-23/22 with a strained right shoulder.

**CINCINNATI:** Prior to an August 2022 trade that sent him to Minnesota, Mahle spent the first 10 years of his professional career in the Cincinnati Reds organization (2013-22), including a 31-38 record, 4.35 ERA (287 ER/593.2 IP), and 9.7 strikeouts per 9.0 innings over 114 appearances/113 starts at the Major League level...made his 1st career Opening Day start on 4/7/22 at ATL w/ CIN, earning the win in a 6-3 victory over the Braves (W, 5.0 IP, 3 H, 1 R-0 ER, 2 BB, 7 SO, 84 pitches/51 strikes)...produced career highs in wins, starts, quality starts (12), innings pitched, and strikeouts (210) in 2021, going 13-6 with a 3.75 ERA (75 ER/180.0 IP) in 33 games/starts while ranking among N.L. leaders in starts (T1st), strikeouts per 9.0 innings (7th, 10.50), strikeouts (9th), and wins (T10th)...his 10.50 strikeouts per 9.0 innings figure from that year remains

the 5th-highest single-season mark in franchise history... Mahle compiled a 15-8 record, 3.72 ERA (94 ER/227.2 IP), and 270 strikeouts (10.67 SO/9) across 43 games/42 starts for Cincinnati from 2020-21, ranking among N.L. starters (min. 35 GS) over that span in strikeouts per 9.0 innings (8th), strikeout pct. (8th, 28.1%), strikeouts (9th), winning pct. (9th, .652), and wins (T11th).

**2023:** In his 2nd season with the Twins, went 1-2, 3.16 ERA (9 ER/25.2 IP) with 28 strikeouts/5 walks over 5 games/starts before being placed on the 15-day Injured List with a right arm posterior impingement and flexor pronator strain on 4/30... spent the remainder of the campaign on IL while recovering from season-ending 'Tommy John' ligament replacement surgery performed on 5/22...elected free agency on 11/2.

**2022:** Went 6-8, 4.40 ERA (59 ER/120.2 IP) with 126 strikeouts (9.4 SO/9) over 23 appearances/starts in an injury-shortened split campaign with Cincinnati and Minnesota...earned his 1st career Opening Day starting nod on 4/7 at ATL w/ CIN (W, 5.0 IP, 3 H, 1 R-0 ER, 2 BB, 7 SO, 84 pitches/51 strikes)... on MLB Restricted List from 5/20-22...on 15-day Injured List from 7/3-23 (strained right shoulder)...acquired by Minnesota from Cincinnati in exchange for INF's Spencer Steer and Christian Encarnacion-Strand, and LHP Steve Hajjar on 8/2... went 1-1, 4.41 ERA (8 ER/16.1 IP) in 4 starts for the Twins, but endured multiple stints on the 15-day IL due to right shoulder inflammation from 8/20-9/2 and 9/4-end of season...**2021:** Made his fourth consecutive Opening Day roster and went 13-6, 3.75 (75 ER/180.0 IP) with 210 strikeouts (10.50 SO/9) over 33 games/starts...established single-season career highs in wins, starts, quality starts (12), innings pitched, strikeouts and batters faced (759)...ranked among N.L. pitching leaders in starts (T1st), strikeouts (9th), bWAR (9th, 4.9), wins (T10th), ERA (16th)...his 10.50 SO/9 figure was 3rd-best in franchise history at the time behind only teammates Luis Castillo (10.67 in 2019) and Sonny Gray (10.52 in 2019)...became just the 13th pitcher in Reds history to record 200 strikeouts in a season...**2020:** Posted a 2-2 record, 3.59 ERA (19 ER/47.2 IP), and 60 strikeouts/21 walks over 10 appearances/9 starts during the pandemic-shortened campaign...made 1st professional relief appearance since 2015 on 8/12 vs. KC (ND, 3.1 IP, 2 H, 3 R-ER, 3 BB, 6 SO)...was included on the Reds' NLWC roster, but did not pitch...**2019:** Made his second consecutive Opening Day roster and went 3-12, 5.14 ERA (74 ER/129.2 IP) with 129 strikeouts over 25 appearances/starts across 2 stints with the Reds (O.D.-8/21, 9/1-end of season)...career-high 12 losses were T5th-most in N.L....on 10-day Injured List from 7/20-8/21 with a left hamstring strain...was on rehab assignment with Louisville (AAA) from 8/16-21 before being optioned to Triple-A the same day he was activated on 8/22.
