YESTERDAY: The Flying Squirrels beat the SeaWolves, 8-3. **John Michael Bertrand** started and threw five scoreless innings. The Flying Squirrels took a 1-0 lead in the first on an RBI single by **Victor Bericoto**. In the third, Bericoto hit into a force out to bring home a run and a second run scored on a throwing error attempting to turn a double play, giving Richmond a 3-0 lead. **Justin Wishkoski** hit a two-run homer in the fourth and Bericoto brought in a run in the fifth with a sacrifice fly to extend the lead to 6-0. In the bottom of the seventh, Justice Bigbie hit a solo homer, Danny Serretti hit an RBI triple and Max Anderson added an RBI single to close the Richmond lead to 6-3. In the top of the eighth, Wishkoski hit another two-run homer to push the lead to 8-3. **Will Bednar** retired the final six outs for the Flying Squirrels.

TODAY'S GAME: The Flying Squirrels play the fifth of a six-game series against the Erie SeaWolves, Double-A affiliate of the Detroit Tigers. This is the third and final series between the two teams this year. The Flying Squirrels went 2-4 against the SeaWolves at The Diamond from May 13-18. They also went 2-4 at UPMC Park from June 3-8. In the MiLB current schedule format, which dates back to 2021, the Flying Squirrels the Flying Squirrels have won one series and six sets at UPMC Park. The lone series win for Richmond in Erie since 2021 was a 4-2 series the close the 2023 regular season. Since the start of the 2021 season, the Flying Squirrels are 16-30 in Erie.

PACKING THE HOUSE: This season the Flying Squirrels are averaging 6,556 fans per home game, which leads Double-A and ranks seventh among all 120 MiLB clubs. Their average of 7,290 in the season's first month was the highest April attendance in franchise history. Last year, the Flying Squirrels led all 30 Double-A teams in average (6,595) and total (435,295) attendance. Among the 120 MiLB teams, the Flying Squirrels were 10th in average attendance. It was the third straight year the Flying Squirrels led all 30 Double-A clubs in average and total attendance, which had not been done prior to 2022. Last year's total attendance was the highest since 2013 (434,769) and the fourth-highest average in team history.

THE FLYING SQUIRRELS are in second place in the Southwest Division second-half standings, 1.5 games behind Altoona. Last week, they dropped four of six at Somerset. It was their second straight series loss after winning their previous three series. After going 10-2 from July 4-20, they are 6-9 in their last 15 games since July 22, but have won three of four this week. Of Richmond's 63 losses this season, 36 of them have been by two runs or less (23 by one, 13 by two). Their 23 one-run losses are tied for the most in the EL, even with Reading. Richmond's +18 run differential in the second half is second-best in the league. In the last three games, the Flying Squirrels are hitting .333 (36-for-108) and averaging seven runs per game (21 total).

THE SEAWOLVES won the Southwest Division first-half title to clinch their fourth consecutive postseason appearance. They are in fourth place in the division's second-half standings. Erie split last week's series at Akron, winning three straight from Thursday through Saturday before dropping the finale on Sunday. The Erie offense leads the Eastern League in batting average (.260), runs (545), hits (907), total bases (1452), doubles, (202), RBIs (501), OBP (.348), SLG (.417) and OPS (.765). The Erie pitching staff is second in the EL in ERA (3.32). Erie's roster features seven of Baseball America's top-30 Tigers prospects, including SS/2B Kevin McGonigle (No. 1), OF Max Clark (No. 2), C Thayron Liranzo (No. 4), C Josue Briceño (No. 5), RHP Jaden Hamm (No. 7), 2B Max Anderson (No. 13) and OF Justice Bigbie (No. 27). There are also four players on Baseball America's top-100 prospects list, including McGonigle (No. 2), Clark (No. 9), Liranzo (No. 69) and Briceño (No. 75). MLB.com's top 30 Tigers prospects list features nine Erie players, including McGonigle (No. 1), Clark (No. 2), Briceño (No. 4), Liranzo (No. 5), Anderson (No. 9), Hamm (No. 10), OF Roberto Campos (No. 20), Bigbie (No. 26) and RHP Yosber Sanchez (No. 30). MLB.com's top-100 prospects list features four Erie players, including McGonigle (No. 6), Clark (No. 10), Briceño (No. 51) and Liranzo (No. 76).

STRONG ARMS: Since June 18, the Flying Squirrels have posted a 3.27 ERA (127 ER/350.0 IP) in 41 games, which is fourth in the Eastern League. The Richmond bullpen has posted a 3.08 ERA (57 ER/166.1 IP) in that stretch. In their last 22 road games since June 18, the Flying Squirrels have posted a 3.02 ERA (64 ER/191.0 IP).

FOR RICHMOND: Left-hander **Joe Whitman** makes his 20th start of the season and his fourth against the SeaWolves. He last pitched on Sunday at Somerset and allowed four runs, two in the first and two in the fourth, over four innings with seven strikeouts. In the Eastern League this year, Whitman ranks third in K/9 (10.14), fourth in K% (26.2%) and seventh in strikeouts (95). On May 3, Whitman threw six perfect innings against the Patriots at The Diamond, retiring all 18 batters he faced, and set a then-career high with 10 strikeouts. He was named Eastern League Pitcher of the Week on May 5. In his first full professional season last year, Whitman split the year between Low-A San Jose and High-A Eugene, going 3-8 with a 4.63 ERA in 23 starts. He finished the year ranked ninth in the Giants organization in strikeouts (108) and tied for ninth in games started. Whitman was selected in the second round of the 2023 MLB Draft by the Giants out of Kent State, where he was the MAC Pitcher of the Year that season. Before transferring to Kent State near his hometown of Akron, Ohio, Whitman pitched at Purdue. Entering 2025, Whitman was ranked by Baseball America as the No. 8 Giants prospect and No. 7 by MLB.com. **For more on Whitman, see page two.**

FOR ERIE: Left-hander Andrew Sears makes his Double-A debut. He has spent the season to date with the High-A West Michigan Whitecaps, going 7-4 with a 2.95 ERA in 20 outings (16 starts). He last pitched last Friday against Dayton and threw five scoreless innings, allowing three hits with seven strikeouts. After going 0-1 with a 7.07 ERA in five April outings, he went 7-3 with a 2.11 ERA (16 ER/68.1 IP) in his final 15 High-A appearances from May 6-August 1. Sears was selected by the Tigers in the 10th round of the 2023 MLB Draft out of the University of Connecticut, where he pitched one season. He spent his first two collegiate seasons pitching for the Anshormen at NCAA DIII Rhode Island College of the Little East Conference.

DON'T RUN ON RICHMOND: The Flying Squirrels' catching unit of **Adrián Sugastey**, **Zach Morgan** and **Onil Perez** have combined to catch 54 stolen base attempts this season, which first among the 30 Double-A teams and leads the Eastern League. Sugastey leads all Double-A catchers with 39 runners caught stealing. Sugastey has set a franchise record for the most caught stealing in a season in Flying Squirrels history, passing **Jackson Williams'** mark of 35 set in 2015 with his 36th on July 26 against Portland. For his career with Richmond, Sugastey's 52 runners caught stealing for his career is third-most in franchise history, trailing **Eliezer Zambrano** (53, 2010-2017).

BERI BOMBS: **Victor Bericoto** hit his ninth homer of the season in the second game last Friday's doubleheader, which leads active Richmond players for the year. It was the 31st homer of his Flying Squirrels career, moving him into third place on the franchise's all-time home run list, passing **Jarrett Parker** (2013-14). He is now two homers behind **Jacob Heyward** (2019, '21-22) for second place on the list and six behind **Ricky Oropesa's** (2013-16) franchise record of 37. He also drove the 118th RBI of his Richmond career in the first game of Friday's doubleheader, moving him ahead of **Hunter Cole** (2015-17) for second place on the franchise's all-time RBI list. Bericoto now has 124 career RBIs with Richmond, trailing only Oropesa's record of 165. In eight August games, Bericoto is batting .360 (9-for-25) with a homer, two doubles and seven RBIs.

UNLUCK: **Tyler Myrick** recorded his 10th save of the season in Wednesday's 6-3 win at Erie. It was his second straight day closing out a save. For the year, he is tied for the league lead in saves. It was the 22nd save of his Flying Squirrels career, moving him into a tie for fifth place on the franchise's all-time saves list with **Josh Osich** (2013-16). His next save will tie him with **Rafael Cova** (2010) for fourth on the franchise's all-time saves list with 23. Myrick has converted six of his seven save attempts since July 1 over 11 appearances. He picked up his first win of the season on July 25 against the Sea Dogs, working the final four outs. Since June 28, Myrick has posted a 1.23 ERA (2 ER/14.0 IP) in 12 appearances.

IN THE LEAGUE LEADERS: In the Eastern League, **Diego Velasquez** is ranked sixth in walks (53), sixth in hits (92) and 10th in OBP (.358). **Turner Hill** is tied for fifth in triples (5). **Seth Lonsway** is seventh in ERA (3.52). **John Michael Bertrand** is second in innings pitched (105.0), third in ERA (2.91), ninth in WHIP (1.27) and ninth in BAA (.242). **Jack Choate** is fourth in strikeouts (102), sixth in ERA (3.43) and tied for eighth in BAA (.232). **Joe Whitman** is seventh in strikeouts (95). **Tyler Myrick** is first in saves (10).

TOP SKIPPER: Flying Squirrels manager **Dennis Pelfrey** has led the team to 244 wins in his career, which is a new franchise record all-time wins record for a manager. He passed the record with Richmond's 6-1 win at Binghamton on May 23. From 2011-2013, **Dave Machemer** won 216 games as Richmond's manager, leading the team to the Eastern League postseason for in 2011. Pelfrey, who has been with Richmond since the 2022 season, led the team to back-to-back postseason appearances for the first time in franchise history in 2022 and 2023. He also managed the 2021 Eugene Emeralds to the High-A West championship.

PROSPECT WATCH: Richmond's roster features four players are ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Giants prospects, including **Bo Davidson** (No. 4), **Diego Velasquez** (No. 8), **Joe Whitman** (No. 9) and **Jack Choate** (No. 28). **John Michael Bertrand** is rated as having the best control in the Giants system. **Adrian Sugastey** is ranked as the top defensive catcher. **Aeverson Arteaga** is rated as the best defensive infielder and best infield arm. MLB.com's top-30 Giants prospects list features three Richmond players, including Davidson (No. 5), Whitman (No. 14) and Velasquez (No. 21).

THIS DATE IN RICHMOND BASEBALL HISTORY

1955: The Richmond Virginians beat the Columbus Jets, 3-1, at Parker Field. Jocko Thompson allowed one run on five hits. Richmond scored its first run after Dee Phillips led off with a single, one of the Vees' three hits in the game, and later scored on a double play. Russ Kearns hit a solo home run in the seventh and Butch McCord later hit an RBI single. Columbus broke Thompson's shutout bid with a force-out in the eighth. The game lasted one hour and 32 minutes. **1970:** The Richmond Braves beat the Louisville Colonels, 7-6, at Parker Field. Earl Williams hit a two-run homer in the third for a 5-0 lead. After a two-run homer by Al Yates in the fifth and another Louisville run in the top of the sixth, Williams tripled in a run for a 6-3 lead in the bottom of the sixth. Dusty Baker padded the lead to 7-3 with an RBI single in the seventh. Louisville scored three runs in the top of the eighth to pull within a run. Yates hit a fly ball to Ralph Garr in left field, who made the catch and threw out Joe Lahoud at the plate attempting to score the tying run. **1979:** The Richmond Braves beat the Rochester Red Wings, 2-1, at Silver Stadium for their eighth straight win. Bob Beall doubled in Chico Ruiz from first in the eighth to give Richmond the lead. Ed Miller stole his 63rd base of the season, tying Ralph Garr's 1969 single-season franchise record. Rochester won the second game, 4-2, to end the winning streak. Miller stole his 64th base of the season in that game to break the single-season team record. **1989:** The Richmond Braves beat the Oklahoma City 89ers, 2-1, at The Diamond. Barry Jones brought in the game's first run with a single in the fourth. Kevin Reimer tied the score with a sacrifice fly in the sixth. Chris Shaddy gave Richmond a 2-1 lead in the bottom of the sixth with a sacrifice fly. In the top of the eighth with the bases loaded and one out, Reimer hit ball that deflected off Mike Stanton's thigh, which he picked up and started a 1-2-3 double play to end the game. After a walk in the ninth, Stanton got a 4-6-3 double play to end the game for his third Triple-A save. **2012:** The Flying Squirrels beat the Harrisburg Senators, 2-1, in 13 innings at The Diamond. Daniel Mayora gave the Flying Squirrels a 1-0 lead with a single in the first. Jonny Tucker tied the score, 1-1, in the top of the seventh with a single. In the bottom of the 13th, Nick Liles hit a one out single, moved to second on a wild pitch, took third on a groundout and scored on a walk-off single by Joel Weeks. Justin Fitzgerald allowed one run on three hits in seven innings in his start. **2019:** The Flying Squirrels lost to the Baysox, 4-1, at The Diamond. Joey Bart and Heliot Ramos made their Double-A debut.
