YESTERDAY: The Flying Squirrels were shut out by the SeaWolves, 8-0. The SeaWolves scored on an error and a Justice Bigbie groundout in the first inning to take a 2-0 lead. In the top of the second, Trei Cruz opened a 3-0 lead with a sacrifice fly. The SeaWolves added two runs in the fifth with the first scoring on an error and the second on a Jim Jarvis groundout. Thayron Liranzo singled in a run in the fourth to push the lead to 6-0. In the top of the seventh, Valencia added a run with a sacrifice fly and Brady Allen scored on a wild pitch in the eighth to stretch the lead to 8-0. Richmond was held to two hits in the game.

TODAY'S GAME: The Flying Squirrels play the finale of a six-game road series against the Erie SeaWolves, Double-A affiliate of the Detroit Tigers. This is the first series between the two teams. The series mark's Erie's only trip to Richmond this year. The Flying Squirrels will play a six-game series at UPMC Park from June 3-8 and again from August 5-10. Richmond has gone 1-1 in both of their previous doubleheader sets this year. The Flying Squirrels are looking for their second series split of the 2025 season.

PACKING THE HOUSE: Last year, the Flying Squirrels led all 30 Double-A teams in average (6,595) and total (435,295) attendance. Among the 120 MiLB teams, the Flying Squirrels were 10th in average attendance. It was the third straight year the Flying Squirrels led all 30 Double-A clubs in average and total attendance, which had not been done prior to 2022. Last year's total attendance is the highest since 2013 (434,769) and the fourth-highest average in team history. April 4 marked the 15th consecutive Opening Night sellout, marking every home opener in franchise history to date. This year, the Flying Squirrels are averaging 6,911 fans per home game, which ranks third among all 120 MiLB clubs. Their average of 7,290 in the season's first month was the highest April attendance in franchise history.

THE FLYING SQUIRRELS have gone 2-3 in this week's series against the SeaWolves. On Thursday, they split a doubleheader. The Flying Squirrels have homered five times this series dating back to Tuesday. The Richmond pitching staff had a 2.25 ERA (8 ER/32.0 IP) in the series prior to allowing eight runs in Saturday's loss. Their 4.94 ERA on the season is the highest in Double-A. The Flying Squirrels have been shut out four times in their last 11 games dating back to May 6.

THE SEAWOLVES are in second place in the Southwest Division, one game behind Akron. Last week, they won the first four games of the series against the Curve before dropping the last two. Erie leads the Eastern League in OBP (.335), SLG (.404) and OPS (.739). The Erie pitching staff has a 2.94 ERA this season, which is the lowest in Double-A and the second-lowest in MiLB. The Erie roster includes four players ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Tigers prospects, including C Thayron Liranza (No. 5), RHP Jayden Hamm (No. 11), RHP Troy Melton (No. 24) and OF Justice Bigbie (No. 26). MLB.com's top-30 Tigers prospect list features eight Erie players, including Liranzo (No. 5), Hamm (No. 7), Melton (No. 10), RHP Joseph Montalvo (No. 17), OF Roberto Campos (No. 20), INF Max Anderson (No. 21), Bigbie (No. 25), RHP RJ Petit (No. 28) and RHP Yosber Sanchez (No. 30).

FOR RICHMOND: Left-hander Jack Choate makes his eighth start of the season and the third of his career against the Sea-**POK KICHMUND!** Lett-hander **Jack Choate** makes his eighth start of the season and the third of his career against the Sea-Wolves. He started the series opener on Tuesday and allowed two runs over five innings in a loss, striking out seven. Choate has gone 1-1 with a 1.99 ERA (5 ER/22.2 IP) in his last five starts dating back to April 19. In his four home starts at The Diamond this season, Choate is 1-1 with a 0.98 ERA (2 ER/18.1 IP). He ranked seventh in the Eastern League in strikeouts (41). Last year, Choate spent most of the season with High-A Eugene, going 1-3 with a 2.90 ERA in 19 outings (18 starts). He was promoted to Double-A Richmond in August and made eight starts for the Flying Squirrels, posting a 1-4 record with a 5.82 ERA to close the season. Choate finished 2024 ranked first among qualified, full-season Giants minor-league pitchers in BAA (.231) and WHIP (1.21) while ranking second in ERA (3.79). Choate was selected by the Giants in the ninth round of the 2022 MLB Draft out of Assumption University. He entered 2025 ranked by Baseball America as the No. 28 Giants prospect and No. 27 by MI 8 com Assumption University. FOR ERIE: Right-hander Jaden Hamm makes his eighth Double-A start and his second against the Flying Squirrels. On Tuesday in the series opener, he threw 4.2 scoreless innings, scattering seven hits with five strikeouts. In his previous start on May 6 against the Curve, he tied his longest outing of the season, throwing five scoreless innings and allowing one hit with four strikeouts in his first Double-A win. Hamm spent the 2024 season with High-A West Michigan and went 5-4 with a 2.64 ERA in 24 games (23 starts). He is rated by Baseball America as the No. 11 Tigers prospect and No. 7 by MLB.com. Hamm was selected by the Tigers in the fifth round of the 2023 MLB Draft out of Middle Tennessee State.

GOING THE DISTANCE: In Game 1 of Saturday's doubleheader, Joe Whitman became the first Richmond pitcher to throw a complete game in nearly three years. **Matt Frisbee** was the last to pitch a complete game for the Flying Squirrels, throwing seven innings and allowing two runs in a win over Portland on June 23, 2022 at The Diamond. Prior to Frisbee, the previous two Richmond complete games were by **Caleb Kilian** in the 2021 season, both seven innings, before he was traded to the Chicago Cubs. Caleb Baragar also threw a seven-inning complete game in 2019 and Jordan Johnson threw two in 2018. The last nine-inning complete game by a Richmond pitcher was on August 21, 2017 by Tyler Herb. On Friday night, John Michael Bertrand became the second Richmond pitcher to throw seven innings in a game this season. He was the only Flying Squirrels pitcher to throw a seven-inning start in 2024, going through 21 outs twice against the Baysox.

DON'T RUN ON RICHMOND: The Flying Squirrels' catching unit of **Adrián Sugastey** and **Zach Morgan** have combined to throw out 21 stolen base attempts this season, which is second among all 30 Double-A teams and leads the Eastern League. Sugastey is tied for third in Double-A with 12 runners caught stealing, which leads the EL. Morgan is fourth in the EL with nine.

WAIT A MINUTE: Northern Virginia native Bryce Eldridge returned to the Richmond roster on April 22 after missing the start of the season with an injury. He hit a solo home run in his first plate appearance of the year. The 20-year-old first baseman played the season with an injury. He nit a solo nome run in his list plate appearance of the year. The 20-year-old hist baseman played at four levels in the Giants organization in his first full professional season last year, including nine games with Richmond in September. For the year in 116 games, Eldridge hit .291 with 23 homers and 92 RBIs. He is ranked by Baseball America as the No. 22 prospect in baseball. Eldridge is also the fifth Virginia-born player to suit up for the Flying Squirrels in franchise history. After batting .111 (1-for-9) in his first three games of the season, Eldridge is batting .318 (21-for-66) in his last 18 games since April 27. On May 10, Eldridge drove a two-out, three-run homer against the Senators to give the Flying Squirrels the lead in the eighth for a comeback win. He hit his third homer of the year on Thursday night in the second game of a doubleheader against the SeaWolves. On Friday, he went 3-for-4 with two homers, a double and four RBIs.

IN THE LEAGUE LEADERS: In the Eastern League, Diego Velasquez is tied for eighth in hits (37). Seth Lonsway is seventh in ERA (2.75), ninth in innings pitched (36.0) and 10th in WHIP (1.11). Jack Choate is seventh in strikeouts (41). John Michael Bertrand is fourth in innings pitched (39.0). Joe Whitman is tied for ninth in BAA (.217).

TOP SKIPPER: Flying Squirrels manager **Dennis Pelfrey** has led the team to 216 wins in his career, which is for the franchise's all-time wins record for a manager. From 2011-2013, **Dave Machemer** won 216 games as Richmond's manager, leading the team to the Eastern League postseason for in 2011, Pelfrey, who has been with Richmond since the 2022 season, led the team to back-to-back postseason appearances for the first time in franchise history in 2022 and 2023. He also managed the 2021 Eugene Emeralds to the High-A West championship.

PROSPECT WATCH: Richmond's roster includes seven players are ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Giants prospects, including Bryce Eldridge (No. 1), Joe Whitman (No. 10), Diego Velasquez (No. 13), Sabin Ceballos (No. 16), Trent Harris (No. 26), Aeverson Arteaga (No. 27) and Jack Choate (No. 28). There are also seven players ranked in MLB.com's top-30 Giants prospects list, including Eldridge, (No. 1), Whitman (No. 7), Harris (No. 11), Velasquez (No. 15), Arteaga (No. 16), Ceballos (No. 23) and Choate (No. 27). Eldridge is also ranked No. 22 overall by Baseball America and No. 22 by MLB.com.

THIS DATE IN RICHMOND

THIS DATE IN RICHMOND BASEBALL HISTORY

1956: The Richmond Virginians lost to the Miami Marlins, 3-1, on the road. Don Cardwell started for Miami and struck out nine batters over seven innings. Satchel Paige, who was 48 years old at the time, threw the final two innings without allowing a hit and induced two double plays. Richmond manager Ed Lopat started the game at first base in place of Tom Hamilton, who was injured, and had an infield hit in the third inning. Instead of three umpires, the crew was shortened to two after Joe Kane quit following the previous night's game. 1970: The Richmond Braves beat the Louisville Colonels, 5-3, at Parker Field. Dusty Baker hit a grand slam to cap a five-run fifth inning, which ended up being the last hit of the game for the R-Braves. Mike McQueen started for Richmond and issued eight walks but struck out nine batters over 5 2/3 innings. 1981: The Richmond Braves beat the Atlanta Braves, 1-0, in an exhibition game at Parker Field. Ken Smith drove in the game's only run with an infield RBI single in the bottom of the first. With wet grass, sevenof-nine Richmond hits did not leave the infield. The game was called after five innings for rain. The San Diego Chicken was in attendance. 1993: The Richmond Braves beat the Pawtucket Red Sox, 5-2, at The Diamond. Chipper Jones had four hits, including a triple, raising his season batting average to .336, and scored twice. Javy Lopez homered and drove in four runs. 1998: The Richmond Braves beat the Buffalo Bisons, 7-2, at The Diamond. Buffalo took a 2-0 lead in the top of the first inning with a two-run single by Richie Sexson. Damon Hollins cut the score to 2-1 with an RBI single in the bottom of the first. The R-Braves scored six runs in the fifth inning against Dwight Gooden, making a rehab start for the Bisons, to take a 7-2 lead. The tying run scored on a bases-loaded walk and Marty Malloy hit a go-ahead, two-run single. Randall Simon added a two-run double and Wes Helms drove in a run with a single. The win capped a four-game
