LHP PARKER MUSHINSKI (0-0, 5.40) vs. LHP CARSON WHISENHUNT (1-1, 4.11)

TODAY'S GAME: The Isotopes and River Cats meet for the first of two series on the year and only set in Sacramento ... Parker Mushinski is slated to start for the Isotopes while Carson Whisenhunt is expected to toe the slab for the River Cats.

TURN IT AROUND: The Isotopes are 9-3 in their last 12 games and have won 11 of their last 16 after starting 1-4.

PCL STANDINGS: Albuquerque (12-9) is just 1.0 game back of first place amongst all 10 PCL teams (first place: Sugar Land, 13-8).

SERIES VICTORY: Albuquerque earned their second-straight series triumph last week after taking four of six over OKC.

-It's the first time the club has won back-to-back series since June 11-23, 2024 (4-2 over ELP and 4-2 over OKC) ... First home series victory over OKC since May 20-25, 2021 (4-2).

LAST 12: Over the club's last 12 games, the Isotopes have scored 114 runs on 148 hits, while tallying a .329/.418/.540 slash line, all tops among Triple-A teams.

-Albuquerque has scored 29 more runs than the team with the second-most tallies during the stretch (El Paso).

OFFENSE OVERALL: Among all 30 Triple-A teams, the Isotopes are 1st in average (.291) and OBP (.387).

SWIPES: Albuquerque stole four bases Sunday after having six on Saturday ... Fourth game of 2026 with four-plus swipes.

-The club has 37 stolen bases on the year, fourth-most in Triple-A. The Isotopes have stolen multiple bags in nine games.

OUTFIELD ASSISTS: The Isotopes have eight outfield assists in 2026, the most in Triple-A.

DREW: Drew Avans went 1-for-2 Saturday with three walks and two stolen bases ... Has seven walks in his last two games.

-Since starting the year 4-for-26, he is 5-for-13 with two doubles, three RBI and nine walks in his last four contests.

ADAEL: Amador went 3-for-6 Sunday with his first homer of the year, his second three-hit game in the last three nights. Is 11-for-33 with a double, triple, homer, six RBI over last seven games.

- Amador tied a career-high by scoring four runs (three times) ... Has 24 hard hit balls on the year, tied for fifth-most in PCL.

CHAD: Chad Stevens went 1-for-4 Sunday, extending his hit streak to 14, longest active streak for the 2026 season in MiLB.

-During the stretch he is slashing .415/.483/.623 with six doubles, a triple, homer, seven RBI and three stolen bases. Has multiple hits in seven of the 14 games.

-Has a 17-game on-base streak in 2026, tied for the fourth-longest active streak for the 2026 season in MiLB. Has a 27-game on-base streak dating back to September 11, 2025, with Salt Lake.

STERLIN: Sterlin Thompson went 4-for-5 with four RBI and a homer Sunday, sixth time in his pro career with at least four hits in a game for the (last: May 16, 2025 vs. Tacoma; 5-for-7).

-In his last 108 Triple-A games (since May 9, 2025), is slashing .330/.428/.560 with 25 doubles, eight triples, 17 homers, 68 RBI.

CC: Cole Carrigg went 3-for-5 with three RBI Sunday, a home run shy of a cycle. First career contest with a double and triple.

-Has a 13-game on base streak in which he is slashing .310/.375/.483 with three doubles, two triples, a home run, 13 RBI and eight stolen bases ... Has 24 hard hit balls on the year, tied for fifth-most in PCL.

GEORGIA BOY: Charlie Condon went 0-for-3 Sunday with two walks. Has a walk in eight of his last nine games (nine total).

THE MACHIN: Vimal Machin collected a single Saturday and has a hit in seven-straight games, slashing .467/.529/.800 with four doubles, two homers and 11 RBI.

UNCLE NICKY: Nicky Lopez went 1-for-3 with an RBI and a walk Saturday ... In his last 10 games, is slashing .389/.429/.667 (14x36) with five doubles, one triple, one homer, four walks and eight RBI, raising his batting average from .231 to .347.

PCL LEADERS: Charlie Condon is T-6th in homers (4), T-7th in OBP (.456), 7th in OPS (1.011) and 10th in SLG (.559) ... Cole Carrigg is 1st in SB (11), T-1st in triples (3) and T-10th in RBI (15).

-Vimal Machin is 2nd in average (.377), 3rd in OBP (.476) and OPS (1.099) and 6th in SLG (.623) ... Chad Stevens is 3rd in average (.375), T-5th in 2B (6), T-7th in OBP (.452) and 10th in OPS (.999).

-Nicky Lopez is 9th in average (.347) ... Sterlin Thompson is T-8th in walks (13).

NUCLEI NOTES

SKIPPER: Pedro Lopez enters his 22nd year as a minor league manager and fourth guiding the Isotopes. He is the eighth manager in club history and is in his sixth year overall with the club, becoming the longest-tenured coaching staff member in franchise history. Spent 2021 as Albuquerque's hitting coach and 2022 as its bench coach ... Notched his 1,000th career managerial victory June 4, 2023 at Salt Lake, when the Isotopes defeated the Bees 7-1 ... Managed in the Texas Rangers (2001-05, 2007) and New York Mets (2011-19) organizations while claiming the 2014 Eastern League Championship with Double-A Binghamton. Lopez was drafted in the 21st round by the San Diego Padres in the 1988 MLB Draft and spent 13 years in the minor leagues, reaching Triple-A on four occasions.

CRAIG BJORNSON: Begins his first season as Isotopes pitching coach, and 27th year in the professional coaching ranks ... Was previously in the Rockies organization from 2009-11 as the pitching coach for the Casper Ghosts of the Rookie Level Pioneer League ... Most recently spent three seasons in the Braves organization as a pitching coach (Triple-A Gwinnett, 2023), roving pitching instructor (2024) and bullpen coach (Gwinnett, 2025). Was in the Major Leagues as a bullpen coach for the Houston Astros (2012, 14-17) and Boston Red Sox (2018-20) ... Won back-to-back World Series championships with the Astros in 2017 and Red Sox in 2018 ... Spent a total of 13 seasons as a Minor League pitching coach from 1999-2011 in the Montreal/Washington, Kansas City, Los Angeles (NL), and Colorado organizations. Signed as a free agent by the Astros in 1991 and pitched for parts of three seasons in their Minor League system. Attended Arizona Western Junior College where he was teammates with Pedro Lopez, and also played collegiately at Nicholls State University.

LUIS LOPEZ: Joins Albuquerque as bench coach after spending the past four seasons in the same role with the Double-A Hartford Yard Goats ... Began his coaching career as a Minor League hitting coach in the Red Sox organization from 2008-11. Was the Braves' Minor League infield coordinator from 2012-17, then managed the Gulf Coast League Tigers in 2018 and 2019. Appeared in parts of 11 MLB season from 1993-2005 with San Diego, New York (NL), Milwaukee, Baltimore and Cincinnati.

MATT SNYDER: Enters his first season in the Colorado Rockies organization as the Isotopes hitting coach ... Previously had stints in the Marlins system as hitting coach with High-A Beloit (2021-22) and Double-A Pensacola (2023) before serving as Minor League hitting coordinator in 2024. Last season, he was the hitting coach for the High-A Jersey Shore Blue Claws in the Phillies organization ... Was a 10th round pick by the Yankees in 2012 and played eight Minor League seasons with New York-AL (2012-18) and Miami (2019). Reached Triple-A with New Orleans in 2019.

HOSHI MIZUTANI: Returns to the Isotopes for his sixth season, becoming the longest tenured athletic trainer in team history. On September 19, 2025, Mizutani was awarded Minor League Trainer of the Year for the Pacific Coast League. He is in his ninth year in the Rockies organization.

SPLIT-SEASON PLAYOFF FORMAT: For the fourth-straight year, the Pacific Coast League will use a split-season format to determine playoff participants. With one 10 team division, the first half winner (concluding June 21) will host the second half winner (beginning June 23) in a three-game set. The winner will then face the International League champion for the Triple-A Championship in Las Vegas, NV, on September 26. The Isotopes have not reached the playoffs since 2012, tied with Charlotte for the second-longest drought among all 30 Triple-A teams. Only Louisville has gone longer without reaching the postseason, as they last qualified in 2010.
