**KEEP ON GETTING ON:** Omaha **1B Nick Pratto** drew another walk yesterday to extend his on base streak to seven games, spanning parts of three series as a result of being on the IL for a week. His seven-game streak is the longest active on the team, with no other Storm Chaser having an active streak longer than three games.

**SHORT AND SWEET:** Omaha has an average game time of 2:31 over the course of the last 20 game, likely caused, at least in part, by the pitch clock imposed by MiLB. Omaha's longest game through the first 33 games is just 3:09 while on April 23, the Storm Chasers played the first game at Werner Park that was shorter than two hours, a 1:56 contest against the Memphis Redbirds. During a 20-game stretch in mid-to-late-May last season (5/8-5/30), Storm Chasers games were averaging 3:33, 24 minutes longer than Omaha's longest game of this season.

**WEEKEND WINNING:** The Storm Chasers are 10-5 in games played on Fridays, Saturdays, and Sundays this year. When playing on the weekend, Omaha has a +7 scoring margin (87-80) while averaging 5.8 runs per game. Omaha's runs-per-game average in all games this season is 4.6 with a -20 scoring margin (151-171).

**FEARLESS FOSTER:** LHP **Foster Griffin** holds Omaha's longest active scoreless streak at 8.0 innings after throwing 1.2 innings of one-hit ball with one walk and a strikeout last night. The Orlando, Fla. native needs to pitch just one more out without allowing a run to tie the Storm Chasers' longest streak of the season set by Colten Brewer in mid April. Griffin holds a 2.04 ERA in 17.2 innings pitched over 12 appearances out of the bullpen.

**CATCH THEM IF YOU CAN: OF Dairon Blanco** is now tied for the most stolen bases in the International League this season with 12, and the only member of the top five that has yet to be caught stealing. Fellow Omaha **OF Brewer Hicklen's** eight stolen bases with zero caught stealing is the only other player in the top 16 without getting caught this season.

**RESTARTING THE BATS:** Nine different players for Omaha are currently in the midst of an on base streak after seven different batters reaching safely in last night's game at Iowa. **1B Vinnie Pasquantino** leads the team this season with an on base streak that spanned 11 games (4/10-4/23) while **1B Nick Pratto** holds the longest active streak at seven consecutive games with four other players riding multi-game streaks.

**FOR OMAHA:** RHP **Jackson Kowar** toes the rubber today to make his sixth start of the season for Triple-A Omaha. Kowar is 0-3 with a 10.18 ERA for the Storm Chasers this season with 20.1 innings pitched. In Kowar's last outing, he went 4.2 innings and allowed three earned runs with four strikeouts, leaving the game in the fifth with the score tied 3-3. Kowar was the Storm Chasers' Opening Day starter in 2021, ultimately posting a 3.46 ERA in 80.2 innings across 17 outings (16 starts), striking out 115 and walking 34 to earn Triple-A East Pitcher of the Year honors. He was also named a Triple-A Postseason All-Star, the Royals' Paul Splittorff Pitcher of the Year, and Omaha Pitcher of the Year. At the time of his promotion to Kansas City on Sept. 1, 2021, Kowar led the league with 115 strikeouts. Among Triple-A East pitchers with a minimum of 80.0 innings, Kowar ranked first in strikeout percentage (34.0%) while ranking sixth in batting average against (.220) and eighth in ERA (3.46) among that subset. A former first-round pick (33rd overall) in 2018, Kowar pitched collegiately at the University of Florida, pitching on three College World Series teams and winning the College World Series with the Gators in 2017.

**FOR IOWA:** RHP **Cam Sanders** looks to make his Triple-A debut for the I-Cubs today after being moved up from Double-A Tennessee on 5/10. This season in with the Tennessee Smokies, Sanders is 1-1 in six starts with a 3.38 ERA. During the 2021 campaign, he had a 4-7 record with a 5.32 ERA in 18 appearances all with Double-A Tennessee. The LSU product was drafted in 2017 by the San Diego Padres but returned for another season at LSU. He was drafted again in 2019 in the 12th round of the 2018 MLB Amateur Draft by the Chicago Cubs organization. Sanders spent the 2018 between the Arizona Rookie League and Short A Eugene before spending the 2019 season with Full-A South Bend.
