LHP JORDAN MONTGOMERY (0-1, 6.94) VS. RHP KEEGAN THOMPSON (2-4, 4.89)

TODAY'S GAME: The Isotopes hold a 2-1 series lead despite a 14-1 loss yesterday ... Albuquerque is expected to start Keegan Thompson, while Jordan Montgomery is slated to toe the rubber in a rehab start for Round Rock.

ATTENDANCE: The Isotopes have tallied a total attendance of 323,677 over 48 openings with an average of 6,743 per game—leading the PCL in both categories (second: Las Vegas, 296,070 total attendance and El Paso, 6,327 per game).

—The club has also recorded the fifth-highest total attendance in MiLB.

GEORGIA BOY: Charlie Condon went 1-for-3 Wednesday with a single and walk ... Has a hit in six-straight contests, going 8-for-24 with two RBI after a 0-for-12 stretch during a four-game hitless skid... Has not recorded an extra-base hit in 11-straight games.

—Has 103 hard hit balls in 2026—6th-most in PCL—with an average EV of 90.4 MPH, 6th-highest in PCL (min. 200 AB).

—Recorded his sixth outfield assist of the year Wednesday—tied for the eighth-most in Triple-A.

VEEN, VEEN: Zac Veen went 0-for-4 yesterday, his sixth hitless contest over 14 games in July ... During the month, is slashing .241/.279/.466 with five doubles, one triple, two homers and eight RBI after slashing .366/.385/.782 in June.

—Has drawn only five walks in his past 31 games ... Walked 23 times in a 20-game stretch from May 1-28.

—Set a career-high in homers with his 16th dinger July 5 (previous: 15 with Single-A Fresno in his debut season of 2021).

—Has 105 hard hits balls—5th-most in PCL—with an average exit velocity of 89.8 MPH, 9th-highest in PCL (min. 200 at-bats).

—Tallied his ninth outfield assist of 2026 Wednesday—the most in Triple-A.

CHAD: Chad Stevens went 3-for-4 Thursday, his fifth game with three hits this year and first time since June 23 vs. Salt Lake.

—Is 7-for-18 in his last five contests after a 3-for-25 drought that spanned seven games (July 4-17).

B DOYLE: Brenton Doyle re-started his rehab assignment Thursday, playing in his first game since July 4. Went 2-for-4 and knocked in Albuquerque's lone run with an eighth-inning single.

THE RIT MAN: Ryan Ritter went 2-for-5 Tuesday with two singles, his second-straight multi-hit contest and eighth of the season ... Is 5-for-11 in his last three games.

—Since his franchise record 31-game hit streak came to an end on June 20, is slashing .222/.341/.264 with three doubles, 10 walks and two RBI.

EL MACHIN: Vimal Machin went 2-for-4 Wednesday with a double and two RBI, his 25th multi-hit game of the year, second on the club behind Veen's 27.

—Over his last four games is 7-for-17 with two doubles and four RBI ... His double was just his sixth extra-base hit since May 30 (three doubles, two triples and one homer).

PCL LEADERS: Vimal Machin: 10th, RBI (55); 11th, hits (91); T-13th, TB (140); 13th, AVG (.298).

—**Charlie Condon** is 1st, runs (77) & OPS (.975); 3rd, HR (20), TB (180); T-3rd, 3B (6); 4th, SLG (.566) & XBH (42); 6th, OBP (.409), RBI (62) & BB (54); T-9th, hits (92).

—**Zac Veen** is 1st, 2B (27), XBH (49), SLG (.574) & TB (191); 3rd, hits (104); T-3rd, 3B (6); 4th, OPS (.961); 5th, RBI (63); T-5th, HR (16); 9th, runs (62); 10th, AVG (.312).

UP AND DOWN: The Isotopes have allowed three runs or fewer 31 times this year, while relenting double-digits runs 26 times.

—In the box, the Isotopes have scored two runs or fewer 25 times in 2026, while the club has scored in double-digits 20 times, including a franchise record 26 on May 1.

AGAINST RR: The Isotopes have won five of their last seven contests against Round Rock.

—The club has not won a series against the Express in Albuquerque since August 1-3, 2018 (0-5-4 series record from 2019-2025 in Albuquerque).

—The Isotopes suffered their most lopsided defeat to the Express at home in franchise history Thursday (previous, 18-6 loss on May 25, 2023).

HITS ALLOWED: Round Rock collected 20 hits yesterday afternoon, tied for the second-most allowed by Albuquerque in a contest this year (also: May 17 vs. OKC) ... The Isotopes relented 24 knocks on June 17 vs. Sugar Land.

NUCLEI NOTES

SKIPPER: Pedro Lopez enters his 22nd year as a minor league manager and fourth guiding the Isotopes. He is the eighth manager in club history and is in his sixth year overall with the club, becoming the longest-tenured coaching staff member in franchise history. Spent 2021 as Albuquerque's hitting coach and 2022 as its bench coach ... Notched his 1,000th career managerial victory June 4, 2023 at Salt Lake, when the Isotopes defeated the Bees 7-1 ... Managed in the Texas Rangers (2001-05, 2007) and New York Mets (2011-19) organizations while claiming the 2014 Eastern League Championship with Double-A Binghamton. Lopez was drafted in the 21st round by the San Diego Padres in the 1988 MLB Draft and spent 13 years in the minor leagues, reaching Triple-A on four occasions.

CRAIG BJORNSON: Begins his first season as Isotopes pitching coach, and 27th year in the professional coaching ranks ... Was previously in the Rockies organization from 2009-11 as the pitching coach for the Casper Ghosts of the Rookie Level Pioneer League ... Most recently spent three seasons in the Braves organization as a pitching coach (Triple-A Gwinnett, 2023), roving pitching instructor (2024) and bullpen coach (Gwinnett, 2025). Was in the Major Leagues as a bullpen coach for the Houston Astros (2012, 14-17) and Boston Red Sox (2018-20) ... Won back-to-back World Series championships with the Astros in 2017 and Red Sox in 2018 ... Spent a total of 13 seasons as a Minor League pitching coach from 1999-2011 in the Montreal/Washington, Kansas City, Los Angeles (NL), and Colorado organizations. Signed as a free agent by the Astros in 1991 and pitched for parts of three seasons in their Minor League system. Attended Arizona Western Junior College where he was teammates with Pedro Lopez, and also played collegiately at Nicholls State University.

LUIS LOPEZ: Joins Albuquerque as bench coach after spending the past four seasons in the same role with the Double-A Hartford Yard Goats ... Began his coaching career as a Minor League hitting coach in the Red Sox organization from 2008-11. Was the Braves' Minor League infield coordinator from 2012-17, then managed the Gulf Coast League Tigers in 2018 and 2019. Appeared in parts of 11 MLB season from 1993-2005 with San Diego, New York (NL), Milwaukee, Baltimore and Cincinnati.

MATT SNYDER: Enters his first season in the Colorado Rockies organization as the Isotopes hitting coach ... Previously had stints in the Marlins system as hitting coach with High-A Beloit (2021-22) and Double-A Pensacola (2023) before serving as Minor League hitting coordinator in 2024. Last season, he was the hitting coach for the High-A Jersey Shore Blue Claws in the Phillies organization ... Was a 10th round pick by the Yankees in 2012 and played eight Minor League seasons with New York-AL (2012-18) and Miami (2019). Reached Triple-A with New Orleans in 2019.

CHECK-SWING CHALLENGE: Starting May 5, the Check-Swing Challenge will be used in the PCL. In addition to being able to challenge ball/strike calls, players will also be able to challenge the umpire's call of swing or no-swing. A batter will be judged to have offered at a pitch when the bat head gets ahead of the knob and creates an angle greater than 45 degrees. The 45-degree threshold allows umpires to use the baselines as a visible point of reference.

SPLIT-SEASON PLAYOFF FORMAT: For the fourth-straight year, the Pacific Coast League will use a split-season format to determine playoff participants. With one 10 team division, the first half winner (concluding June 21) will host the second half winner (beginning June 23) in a three-game set. The winner will then face the International League champion for the Triple-A Championship in Las Vegas, NV, on September 26. The Isotopes have not reached the playoffs since 2012, tied with Charlotte for the second-longest drought among all 30 Triple-A teams. Only Louisville has gone longer without reaching the postseason, as they last qualified in 2010.

- Spent the entire 2025 campaign with Triple-A Iowa, posted a 4.50 ERA (64.0 IP, 32 ER) in 33 games (five starts) with 25 walks and 83 strikeouts

- Pitched in 29 games (17 starts) for Chicago in 2022 and totaled a 10-5 record, one of three pitchers that season to record 10 victories with 17 starts or fewer (also: Chris Stratton, Adam Cimber)
- Earned his first career Major League save on July 23, 2021, vs. Arizona when he pitched the final three frames of an 8-3 victory
- Made his Major League debut on May 2, 2021, at Cincinnati, tossing a scoreless inning of relief with two hits and one walk allowed
- Tossed 15.0-straight innings without allowing an earned run over nine appearances to begin his career in 2021, the third-longest streak in Cubs history behind Larry Cheney (28.0 - 1911) and Vern Olsen (15.1 - 1939)
- Selected by the Cubs in the third round of the 2017 MLB Draft from Auburn (105th overall selection) ... highest Auburn pitcher was taken since Steven Register in 2004 (80th overall)

- Made Eleventh Isotopes start (17th appearance) on July 18 vs. Sacramento and did not factor into the decision ... Tossed 4.0 innings and allowed five runs on nine hits, one homer and two walks while fanning three ... Permitted two runs in the second and three in the third ... Had 1-2-3 third inning while stranding a leadoff single in the fourth ... Induced six swings and misses

- ♦ Has faced the Express once in his career: July 3, 2026, in Round Rock ... Tossed 5.0 shutout frames and allowed three hits and three walks with five punchouts
