SPRINGDALE, AR – Northwest Arkansas Naturals starting pitcher **Andrew Hoffmann** turned in his best outing since joining the club last month, with six one-run innings in an 8-1 win over the Tulsa Drillers to secure a series split.

- Hoffmann allowed just one run on three hits with six strikeouts over 6.0 innings, his first quality start with the Naturals and eighth overall this year, between High-A Rome and Double-A.
- The right-hander was followed by three scoreless innings from **Nate Webb** and **Dante Biasi**, who combined for nine strikeouts. Webb struck out three straight after putting the first on in the seventh, then Biasi struck out six of the nine he faced, working around a walk, hit and error, as the final nine outs of the game for Tulsa hitters were all strikeouts.
- Northwest Arkansas was first onto the scoreboard, as **Jake Means** delivered an RBI single in the second inning that scored **CJ Alexander**, who stretched his hitting streak to six games with a single.
- After the Drillers scored a run to tie the game in the third, the Naturals countered with a seven-run fourth inning to knock Tulsa starter **John Rooney** out of the game. **Robbie Glendinning** led off the fourth with a solo home run on the first pitch, his team-leading 17th of the season. **Seuly Matias** grounded out to bring across **John Rave**, then **Tucker Bradley** snuck a single past the Drillers' drawn-in infield for two more runs. **Logan Porter** singled in one and Rave singled home two for his second hit of the inning to cap the seven-run frame.
- The Naturals only managed one hit and three walks over the final four innings, but already had more than enough runs on the scoreboard to hold on for a win.

THIS DAY IN NATURALS HISTORY

The Naturals are 7-4 all-time when playing on August 9

On August 9, 2014, the Northwest Arkansas Naturals beat the San Antonio Missions, 4-3 on a walk-off. **Andy Ferguson** threw the fifth of just seven nine-inning complete games in Naturals history, striking out six with a franchise-record 116 pitches thrown. **Juan Graterol** homered in the fifth to give the Naturals the lead, then the Missions took the lead in the sixth with their own two-run homer. **Lane Adams** homered in the bottom of the eighth to tie the score at 3-3, then the Naturals loaded the bases with three singles in the bottom of the ninth and **Micah Gibbs** singled home **Orlando Calixte** for the walk-off win, the Naturals' fifth and final walk-off win in the 2014 season.

FOLLOW THE LEADER

Manager Chris Widger enters his first season at the helm of the Naturals, after previous stops in *Advanced Rookie* Burlington (2019) and *High-A* Quad Cities (2021) managing Royals affiliates.

- 15 of the Naturals' 28 active players played for Widger with the Quad Cities River Bandits last season.
- 4 of the Naturals' 28 active players played under Widger with the Burlington Royals, then in Quad Cities and now in Northwest Arkansas: **Dante Biasi, Jonah Dipoto, Jake Means and John Rave.**

EXTREME ENDS OF THE SPECTRUM

When looking at the Naturals' numbers one game to the next, it appears rather black and white with what leads to a win or loss.

- When scoring seven runs or more, the Naturals are 33-8, while when scoring six runs or less, just 10-50.
- The Naturals are 30-13 when recording 10 hits or more, but when they get nine hits or less, are just 14-44.
- The Naturals are 40-14 when out-hitting their opponent or hits are tied, but 3-44 when out-hit by their opponent.
- When the Naturals score first, they are 28-20, whereas 15-38 when the opponent scores first.

ONE RUN GOES A LONG WAY

The Naturals are 5-17 in one-run games this season, meaning 17 of their 58 losses (29.31%) this season have been decided by just one run.

- The Naturals have had the tying run at the plate or on base in 20 losses this season (including 13 of their one-run losses).

YO, YOU WANNA SEE SOME REAL SPEED?

Through 101 games, the Naturals have stolen 133 bases in 163 attempts (average 1.32 steals/game, 81.60% success rate).

- 133 steals leads the Texas League, fifth in Double-A and 25th in the Minors ... 81.60% success rate is 20th among 120 full-season MiLB teams.
- The Naturals have stolen at least one base in 67 of 101 games this season (66.3%), including 33 games with two or more steals ... the team stole a season-high six bases on July 6 vs. Tulsa with a pair of five-steal games as well this season.
- The Naturals have pulled off a double steal 17 times, meaning 34 of 133 steals this year (25.6%) have come on a double-steal.
- Naturals players have stolen multiple bases in a game 14 times, SIX of those occasions being Garcia ... **Tucker Bradley** had the first three-steal game of the season (and of his career) on July 9 vs. Tulsa.
- Maikel Garcia's** 27 steals (in 30 attempts) still ranks fourth in the Texas League, **Nick Loftin's** 24 (in 27 attempts) ranks seventh in the league.

TUCK(ER) AND ROLL

Naturals outfielder **Tucker Bradley** has been consistent from the start of the season and established himself as one of the team's most reliable hitters.

- Bradley has reached base at least once in 72 of 87 games this season (82.76%) and reached base multiple times on 48 occasions, which ranks second on the Naturals ... he has hits in 62 of 87 games and has a team-best 28 multi-hit games, as well as 13 multi-run games and nine multi-RBI games.
- Bradley's .312 batting average leagues qualified Naturals hitters, ranks fifth in the Texas League and tied second among Kansas City's minor league hitters ... his .398 on-base percentage also ranks third in the system, while 97 hits are tied third and his .851 OPS is eighth.
- The Georgia native has hit first in the order 19 games this year, which ranks second behind Maikel Garcia (76) ... when hitting first, Bradley is a .342 hitter (26-for-76) with a .457 on-base percentage and .904 OPS ... when leading off innings, he hits .333 (27-for-81) with a .419 on-base percentage.
- Two of his six home runs this season have been grand slams, the first two of his professional career and the Naturals' second and third of the season ... April 23 @ Frisco and May 13 vs. Wichita, both came 5th inning.

TYLER, THE CREATOR (OF RUNS)

Naturals outfielder **Tyler Gentry** has been one of the best hitters in the Kansas City Royals' system this season, with an incredible impact since joining the Naturals in June.

- Among qualified full-season Minor League hitters, Gentry ranks EIGHTH in batting average (.326) when you combine his stats between Northwest Arkansas and Quad Cities (A+).
- He is the Royals' organization leader in batting average (.326) and OPS (.970), while ranking second in on-base percentage (.422) and slugging percentage (.548) ... his 59 runs batted in are tied fifth in the system (with Naturals teammate John Rave), while 15 home runs between the River Bandits and Naturals rank sixth.
- Gentry has reached base in 35 of 40 games (87.50%) and has hits in 28 of his 40 games with the Naturals.
- Since his call-up to Double-A on June 14, Gentry is batting .318 (48-for-151) over 40 games with nine doubles, 10 home runs and 36 runs batted and a .988 OPS ... he's driven in at least one run in 19 of 40 games, with nine multi-RBI games ... he already has 15 multi-hit games and 11 multi-run games as well, including a pair of four-run games.
- Over 22 games in the month of July, Gentry hit .329 (28-for-85) with nine extra-base hits and 21 runs batted in, while he has scored 19 runs as well ... his 21 RBI last month ranked tied fourth among Texas League hitters with teammate Robbie Glendinning.
- Gentry's 18-game on-base streak between June 26 and July 17 is the longest for a Naturals player this season ... in that span, he hit .382 (26-for-68) with 10 extra-base hits and 12 walks, with an on-base percentage of .459 in that span.

ROCKIN' ROBBIE

After slumping for much of June, first baseman **Robbie Glendinning** has returned to form, with a hot stretch that has carried through July.

- Glendinning's 65 runs batted in this season rank sixth in the Texas League ... his 62 runs scored are tied for the seventh-most in the Texas League, 160 total bases are tied eighth, a .489 slugging percentage ranks 10th and 37 extra-base hits are tied 10th.
- He has reached base in 76 of 86 games he's played this season (88.37%), reaching multiple times in 41 games this season ... he has hits in 58 of 86 games, including 26 multi-hit games this season.
- Among Royals minor league hitters, Glendinning ranks as one of the top hitters in nearly every category ... he places third in the system with 65 runs batted in, 62 runs scored, 160 total bases and 37 extra-base hits, while 19 doubles and 17 home runs are tied third.
- In 20 games in July, Glendinning hit .313 (26-for-83) with 11 extra-base hits and 21 runs batted in ... his 21 runs batted were are tied for the fourth-most in the Texas League in the month of July, seven home runs were tied fourth in the league and 51 total bases ranked tied fifth.

ALEXANDER THE GREAT

Infielder **CJ Alexander** has quickly heated up at the plate since joining the Naturals in a trade last month from Atlanta.

- Over 18 games with the Naturals, the corner infielder is hitting .253 (19-for-75) with eight extra-base hits (five home runs) and 19 runs batted in, with 10 runs scored as well.
- He has hits in 11 of 18 games with the Naturals, 8 of which are two-hit performances ... he's driven in runs in 7 of 18, including already five multi-RBI games.
- Alexander began his Naturals tenure 0-for-12 over his first three games, then homered on July 16 @ Corpus Christi for his first hit and went 4-for-10 in his next two games.
- In the month of August, Alexander is hitting .364 (8-for-22) with five extra base hits (four home runs) and 11 runs batted in.
- In last week's series against Tulsa, CJ homered in four straight games, August 3 to 6 ... he is the third Natural this season and just the sixth all-time to homer in four consecutive games.

Pitchers of the Month (1)

May: LHP Drew Parrish ... started five games and went 3-1 with a 0.59 ERA (2 ER in 30.2 IP) ... only allowed 15 hits and four walks, while striking out 29 opposing hitters ... among qualified Texas League pitchers, threw the most innings and had the lowest ERA and WHIP (0.62), while holding opponents to a .144 average.

Players of the Week (3)

- April 25 to May 1: 2B Michael Massey** ... hit .417 (10-for-28) across six games with a league-best 19 total bases and nine runs batted in, while tied for the Texas League lead with 10 hits. His 1.221 OPS ranked third among players with at least 20 at-bats, while his .417 average tied for second among that same group.
- May 23 to May 29: 2B Michael Massey** ... hit a league-best .481 (13-for-27) across six games in Midland, while tied for the league lead with 19 total bases. He drove in nine runs as well, doubling three times with one home run, a go-ahead grand slam on May 24 and collected multiple hits in each of the first five games of the series.
- June 27 to July 3: OF Tyler Gentry** ... hit .435 (10-for-23) with two doubles, four home runs and 11 runs batted in, which was tied for the most in the league. Recorded 24 total bases with a 1.043 slugging percentage 1.543 OPS.

Pitchers of the Week (4)

- May 2 to May 8: LHP Drew Parrish** ... threw 7.0 scoreless innings on May 7 @ Springfield ... held the Cardinals to just two hits and one walk while striking out four. He retired the first eight he faced and the final five, with five 1-2-3 frames.
- May 9 to May 15: LHP Drew Parrish** ... threw 7.0 scoreless innings on May 13 vs. Wichita ... held the Wind Surge to just three hits and no walks while striking out nine. Between the second and sixth innings, he retired 13 straight batters, retiring the side 1-2-3 in the first inning, as well as the third through sixth.
- June 6 to June 12: LHP Anthony Veneziano** ... threw 7.0 scoreless innings in a complete-game shutout on June 9 @ Tulsa ... held the Drillers to just three hits and one walk while striking out five, on 79 pitches. Retired the final eight hitters he faced and 11 of the last 12, only needing five pitches for a 1-2-3 seventh inning to end the night.
- July 25 to July 31: LHP Dante Biasi** ... threw 5.0 scoreless innings on July 27 @ Wichita in an eventual 5-0 shutout win ... held the Wind Surge to just one hit and three walks while striking out five, on 79 pitches, his second straight scoreless start.

TOOLS TEAM

- Christian Colón returns to the organization as the Naturals Assistant Hitting Coach in 2022, following a 12-year professional career.
- He was the Royals first-round pick in the 2010 MLB Draft, scored the winning run in the 2014 AL Wild Card game and had the game-winning hit in the title-clinching Game 5 of the 2015 World Series.
- After being drafted in 2010, Colón ascended to Northwest Arkansas by 2011 and between 2011, 2012 and 2014, played 202 games for the Naturals ... in 2011, Colón led the Texas League in sacrifices (21), while leading the team in at-bats (491) and hits (126). His 21 sacrifices that season are the most a Naturals player has ever recorded in a single season, while 28 overall are tied for the club record.
- During his playing career, he made stops in Miami (2017) and Cincinnati (2019-20) ... spent 2021 with the Rich Baseball-owned Buffalo Bisons (Triple-A, Toronto) before announcing his retirement.

- Jirschele was originally selected by the Texas Rangers in the fifth round of the 1977 MLB Draft and played in 999 minor league games over 13-plus seasons in the Rangers and Royals systems.
