SOMETHING IS BREWING: OF Brewer Hicklen hit his 19th homer last night, the second half of Omaha's sixth back-to-back homers this season. Hicklen is the only Chaser to be part of the back-to-back multiple times, doing it four times this season. Hicklen is now tied with six other players for the fifth most homers in the International League. Hicklen's 63 RBIs are the 10th most in the league, while his .511 slugging percentage and 21 stolen bases are both ninth. He is looking to become the first Chaser in modern franchise history to hit 20 doubles and 20 home runs and steal 20 stolen bases, all at the Triple-A level. INF Bobby Witt Jr. hit the 20-20-20-mark last season between Double-A and Triple-A. Hicklen needs just three doubles and one homer to hit the mark.

TEAM STREAKS: The Storm Chasers are riding a couple of streaks that are among the longest active team streaks in the International League. Omaha has hit a home run in all four games this series, tied for the third longest active streak, behind Iowa who has hit a long ball in six straight and St. Paul who has five consecutive games with a homer. The Chasers have also drawn a walk in 57 games in a row, tied for the third longest in the league with Syracuse. Worcester has had a walk in all 103 games that they have played this season while Memphis has drawn a free pass in 87 consecutive games.

HECK OF A START: OF Brent Rooker played in just his second game for Triple-A Omaha yesterday, launching his second homer for the Chasers in the eighth inning. He has combined to go 4-for-6 with six RBIs and two walks since making the switch to the International League after getting traded. Rooker has as many home runs as he has times getting out, only getting retired twice. Between El Paso and Omaha he is hitting .282 with 40 extra-base hits and 61 RBIs in 63 games.

WHO IS STREAKING?: INF Clay Dungan is riding a 13-game on-base streak, the longest active streak on the team, needing to reach in just two more games to reach the 15-game on-base benchmark and become the third player to hit that mark with Omaha this season. OF Brewer Hicklen is on a 10-game on-base streak, his longest of the season and the second longest active on the team. INF Iván Castillo has scored a run in four consecutive games, needing one more to tie the second longest streak on the team this year. OF Brent Rooker has hit homers in back-to-back games and with one today would tie the season long, last set by Hicklen in July.

PROCEED WITH CAUTION: Omaha has allowed just 51 stolen bases this season, the fewest in the International League this season. Omaha's .311 caught stealing percentage is the second-best mark in the league, behind only Buffalo's .328 mark.

FOR OMAHA: LHP Drew Parrish toes the rubber to make his ninth start and 10th overall appearance for the Storm Chasers. In his last start, Parrish went just 2.0 innings and allowed three earned runs at Syracuse. He went 1-4 during the month of July, starting the month with three consecutive losses. Parrish has thrown one quality start this season for Omaha, a 6.0-inning outing in which he allowed just two runs at the end of June against St. Paul. Parrish started the season with Double-A Northwest Arkansas, getting the bump to Triple-A on June 3. He has struggled some inside of Werner Park, allowing 12 earned runs across 13.1 innings in three games. Today is Parrish's first Saturday game with Omaha, while he has a record of 0-3 on the weekends with an 8.44 ERA.

FOR ST. PAUL: RHP Ariel Jurado is set to make his fourth start and ninth overall appearance for the Saints. Jurado went 4.0 innings and allowed an earned run with seven strikeouts and no walks in his last start. Jurado has faced Omaha once this season, getting tagged with the loss on July 2, allowing five earned runs in just 1.2 innings. Jurado has lower numbers when playing on the road, with a WHIP of 0.90 and a .213 batting average against with a 2.70 ERA. His batting average against is much higher against lefties, allowing left-handed batters to hit .313 compared to .189 from right-handed batters. Jurado was signed by the Texas Rangers in 2012, making his MLB debut on May 19, 2018, before getting traded to the New York Mets in August of 2020. He signed a minor league deal with the Twins in March of this year.
