THURSDAY: The Flying Squirrels lost to the Sea Dogs, 6-4. In the third, Alex Binelas hit a solo homer and Nick Yorke brought in a run with a sac fly to give Portland a 2-0 lead. Richmond tied the game, 2-2, in the fourth with RBI doubles by **Victor Bericoto** and **Logan Wyatt**. In the sixth, Bericoto hit a solo home run to give Richmond a 3-2 lead. **Will Wilson** extended the lead to 4-2 with an RBI double in the seventh. Corey Rosier closed the Sea Dogs within a run with an RBI single in the bottom of the seventh. In the eighth, the Sea Dogs tied the game on an error and took a 6-4 lead with a two-run homer by Matthew Lugo. **Ryan Murphy** started and worked his longest outing of the season, allowing two runs over five innings. **Hunter Dula** worked around runners on second and third with no outs to hold the Sea Dogs scoreless in the sixth in his Double-A debut.

TODAY'S GAME: The Richmond Flying Squirrels play the fourth of a six-game road series against the Portland Sea Dogs, Double-A affiliate of the Boston Red Sox. This series marks the second time these two teams have faced off this season. They met at The Diamond from July 25-30, with Richmond winning five-of-six.

THE FLYING SQUIRRELS have gone 33-22 in their last 55 games since June 18, the best record in the Eastern League in that span, including a 5-3 record since August 17. Over the last 60 games since June 14, Richmond starting pitchers have combined for a 3.05 ERA (77 ER/227.0 IP) with 260 strikeouts. For the year, the Flying Squirrels' 3.83 ERA is second-best in the league. Richmond starters have thrown 428.1 innings, which is the fewest in Double-A. Richmond relievers have thrown 583.1 innings this year, the most in Double-A. The Flying Squirrels bullpen has a 3.70 ERA, which is the third-lowest in Double-A and the 12th-lowest of the 120 full-season teams in the minors.

THE SEA DOGS entered their series at The Diamond on July 25 with the best record in the Eastern League and led the Northeast Division in the second-half standings. Since then, they have gone 9-18, the worst record in the league in that span. Portland's roster includes eight of Baseball America's top-30 Red Sox prospects, including SS Marcelo Mayer (No. 1, No. 15 overall), 2B Nick Yorke (No. 5), RHP Wikelman Gonzalez (No. 8), C Nathan Hickey (No. 10), SS Brainer Bonaci (No. 11), 2B Chase Meidroth (No. 14), 1B Blaze Jordan (No. 15) and RHP Hunter Dobbins (No. 30). MLB.com's top-30 Red Sox prospect list includes seven Portland players, including Mayer (No. 1, No. 11 overall), Yorke (No. 6), Gonzalez (No. 9), Bonaci (No. 11), Jordan (No. 12), Hickey (No. 15) and Meidroth (No. 20).

FOR RICHMOND: Right-hander **Carson Seymour** takes the mound for his 20th Double-A start and his second against the Sea Dogs. He last pitched on Saturday against the Senators and allowed three runs in 4.1 innings with seven strikeouts. In his four August starts, Seymour has gone 1-0 with a 1.89 ERA (4 ER/19.0 IP/28 SO/5 BB). On the season, he has the second-lowest ERA (3.63) among qualified Eastern League pitchers and holds the third-lowest WHIP (1.22). A native of Poway, Calif., Seymour was selected by the New York Mets in the sixth round of the 2021 MLB Draft out of Kansas State University. After making four appearances in 2021, he began the 2022 season with Low-A St. Lucie, where he went 4-0 with a 1.19 ERA in seven outings (four starts). He was promoted to High-A Brooklyn on May 23 for 11 outings before being traded to the Giants on August 2 as part of the deal that sent Darin Ruf to the Mets. Seymour closed the year with High-A Eugene, going 2-3 with a 3.99 ERA in six starts. Seymour is rated by Baseball America as the No. 14 Giants prospect and No. 16 by MLB.com. **For more on Seymour, see page two.**

FOR PORTLAND: Right-hander Isaac Coffey makes his 10th Double-A start and his first against Richmond. Last time out, he allowed a season-high-tying six runs (season-high five earned runs) over five innings in a loss at Binghamton last Friday. Over his previous seven starts from June 29 to August 12, Coffey went 5-2 with a 2.17 ERA (9 ER/37.1 IP/47 SO/14 BB). He began the season with High-A Greenville and went 4-2 with a 2.83 ERA in 11 starts before being promoted to Double-A Portland on June 20. Coffey was selected in the 10th round of the 2022 MLB Draft by the Red Sox out of Oral Roberts, where he a three-time First-Team All-Summit League selection and the 2021 Summit League Pitcher of the Year.

STARTING STRONG: Flying Squirrels starters have a 2.79 ERA (25 ER/80.2 IP) over the last 21 games since August 1. In that stretch, **Carson Seymour** is 1-0 with a 1.90 ERA (4 ER/19.0 IP), **Spencer Bivens** has a 1.46 ERA (2 ER/12.1 IP) and **John Michael Bertrand** has a 2.70 ERA (6 ER/20.0 IP). **Wil Jensen** also threw four scoreless innings in his start on August 10.

PLAYOFF CHASE: With 21 games remaining in the regular season, the Flying Squirrels are in second place the Southwest Division Second-Half standings, a half-game behind the Erie SeaWolves, who have already clinched a spot in the postseason by winning the division's first half, and a half-game ahead of the Bowie Baysox. Harrisburg is four games back in fourth. The winner of the second half in the Southwest Division will face Erie in the first round of the playoffs, unless the SeaWolves win the second half, which would lead to the second-place team (determined by winning percentage) in the second half advancing to the postseason. The Flying Squirrels are aiming to reach the playoffs for the fourth time in team history. They reached the postseason in 2011, 2014 and 2022.

THOMAS TRENDING UP: In this week's series, **Andy Thomas** has reached base seven times in eight plate appearances. On Tuesday, he hit a two-run homer and worked a walk in his three plate appearances. On Wednesday, Thomas walked three times and had two hits, including a three-run double in the first inning. He has also hit safely in four straight games since Saturday. On the year, Thomas is tied for the team lead with 11 home runs and leads Richmond with 57 RBIs.

ALL ABOARD THE SHANE TRAIN: **Shane Matheny** has reached base 53 times in his last 26 games since July 25 (29 hits, 24 walks, 1 HBP), hitting .315 (29-for-92) with five homers, six doubles, two triples and 21 RBIs adding a .454 on-base percentage. In last week's series against the Senators, Matheny hit .412 (7-for-17) with three homers, one double, nine RBIs and three walks. Last Tuesday night against the Senators, Matheny homered twice, a three-run shot in and a solo home run, and added a double in a three-hit, four-RBI performance. It was the third two-homer game of his Richmond career, joining performances on May 1, 2022 against Bowie and May 12, 2022 at Harrisburg. On Thursday, he entered off the bench and collected a pinch-hit, RBI single in the seventh. On Saturday, he hit a three-run homer and added a sac fly, his second four-RBI game of the series. For his Flying Squirrels career, Matheny has worked 131 walks, ahead of **Ricky Oropesa** (112, 2013-16) for second-most in franchise history. He trails **Jacob Heyward** (2019, '21-22), who had 158 in his career.

BERICOTO BASHING: In his last six games since August 16, **Victor Bericoto** is batting .333 (8-for-24) with one homer, three doubles and six RBIs. He went 2-for-4 last Thursday, including a walk-off single in the bottom of the ninth inning to cap a four-run comeback in the last inning, which was tied for the largest ninth-inning comeback win in franchise history. He drove in two runs in Sunday's 6-4 win. On Thursday at Portland, he homered and drove in two runs on the night. On the year, Bericoto leads the Giants system with 20 homers (16 with Eugene and four with Richmond) and also leads the organization with 69 RBIs.

LONGBALL LOGAN: **Logan Wyatt** hit a three-run homer on Sunday afternoon, his 13th home runs this year between Richmond and Eugene, which is tied for the sixth-most in the Giants organization this year. Over his last eight games since August 15, Wyatt is batting .310 (9-for-29) with a homer, four doubles, two walks and six RBIs. He has four multi-hit games in his last nine games played.

ROBUST: Last Saturday, **Sean Roby** hit his first Double-A homer of the year. It was the 26th of his Richmond career, which is the fifth-most in franchise history. Last year, Roby set a single-season franchise record with 25 home runs in his 89 games. Roby also holds the franchise record for the most home runs at The Diamond with 22. This year, Roby missed the start of the season with an injury. He played 19 games on a rehab assignment in the Arizona Complex League before playing 22 games with the High-A Eugene Emeralds. On the year between the three levels, Roby has 13 home runs, which is tied for the sixth-most in the Giants system. In his last five games since August 19, Roby is batting .353 (6-for-17) with a homer, a double, two RBIs and three walks.

GLOW SHOW: **Jimmy Glowenke** is picked up four hits and four RBIs in his last two games, batting .500 (4-for-8) with a homer, a double and a walk. On Wednesday, he hit a two-run homer and picked up two RBI singles, matching his season high with four RBIs for the game. On the season, Glowenke is batting .291 (25-for-86) in road games, including all five of his Double-A homers. Since July 1, Glowenke is batting .283 (32-for-113) with five homers and 24 RBIs in 34 games.

PROSPECT WATCH: The Flying Squirrels have six players ranked in Baseball America's Top-30 Giants prospects, including LHP **Carson Whisenhunt** (No. 5 - on IL), OF **Vaun Brown** (No. 7), RHP **Hayden Birdsong** (No. 12), RHP **Carson Seymour** (No. 16), RHP **Landen Roupp** (No. 17 - on IL) and RHP **Ryan Murphy** (No. 28). Baseball America rates Brown as the organization's best hitter for average and best athlete, rates Roupp as having the best curveball and **Jose Cruz** as having the best changeup. MLB.com's top-30 Giants prospect list includes five Richmond players, including Whisenhunt (No. 3), Birdsong (No. 10), Brown (No. 13), Roupp (No. 15) and Seymour (No. 23).
