TODAY'S GAME: The Flying Squirrels face the Erie SeaWolves, Double-A affiliate of the Detroit Tigers, in Game 2 of the Southwest Division Series at UPMC Park. This is a best-of-three series. This is the third time Richmond and Erie have squared off in the Southwest Division Series in the last five seasons since 2022. The Flying Squirrels are looking to avoid elimination and force a winner-take-all Game 3 on Friday night at CarMax Park.

HOW WE GOT HERE: A win on June 12 win clinched the Eastern League Southwest Division title for the Flying Squirrels, locking in a postseason berth. This year marks the fifth postseason appearance in franchise history and the first since 2023.

PACKING THE HOUSE: The Flying Squirrels led the Eastern League and all 30 Double-A MiLB clubs in total (468,961) and average (7,105) attendance for the fifth consecutive year. Among the 120 MiLB clubs, the Flying Squirrels rank fifth in average attendance in 2026. The Flying Squirrels surpassed the highest total attendance in franchise history, passing 463,942 in 2010. Richmond also broke the team record for the highest average attendance in franchise history, which was previously set at 6,768 in 2025. The total attendance was the highest for an Eastern League team since 2005 and the average was the league's highest since 2004.

RECORD YEAR: The Flying Squirrels' 10-game win streak from April 4-15 was the longest in franchise history, surpassing an eight-game win streak from May 5-13, 2021, also beginning with the second game of the season. The 74-61 record was the second-best in team history, trailing only a 79-63 mark in 2014. Richmond has won eight series, split 10 and lost six this year. After opening the season with a 27-7 record through May 13, the Flying Squirrels went 47-54 in their last 101 regular-season games.

RELENTLESS: In their 74 wins this year, the Flying Squirrels came from behind in 37 of them. In 26 of the wins, Richmond has taken the lead in the eighth inning or later. The Flying Squirrels had 12 walk-off wins at CarMax Park this season, including at least one in all but two home series. **Diego Velasquez** had three walk-off hits this year, all in 10th innings. **Drew Cavanaugh**, **Parks Harber** and **Dayson Croes** each had two walk-off winners this year. Richmond had five wins after trailing by five-or-more runs this season. The Flying Squirrels batted .277 in the ninth inning this year, which led the EL and was tied for fourth in MiLB. The Flying Squirrels won 32 one-run decisions this year, the most in the EL and a franchise record. They went 11-2 in extra innings.

THE FLYING SQUIRRELS won the Southwest Division first-half title by seven games over second-place Erie. For the year, Richmond was third among all 30 Double-A teams in batting average (.264), tied for second in sacrifice flies (53) and had the fewest strikeouts (1,079). The team combined for 122 homers this year, fourth-most in a season in franchise history. The Richmond offense set franchise records in batting average (.264), OBP (.345), SLG (.411), OPS (.756), runs (707), total bases (1,850), RBIs (652), stolen bases (204) and sacrifice flies (53). Richmond's No. 9 batters combined to hit .300 this year, which led the minors. The Flying Squirrels scored 10-or-more runs 13 times, passing 2023 (11) for the most in a season in franchise history. The Richmond pitching staff threw 11 shutouts this season, which was tied for first in the Eastern League and tied for sixth in MiLB.

THE SEAWOLVES won the Southwest Division's second half to clinch a postseason berth for the fifth consecutive year and posted the league's best overall record at 79-58, four games better than Richmond. Erie went 43-26 in the second half and finished four games ahead of second-place Chesapeake. This season, Erie led the Eastern League in runs (796), RBIs (728), stolen bases (284), OBP (.647) and OPS (.785) and ranked tied for first in hits (1190).

FOR RICHMOND: Right-hander **Jackson Flora** will start Game 2 in his outing at the Double-A level. He made his professional debut on Sept. 4 with Low-A San Jose at Fresno and threw a scoreless inning with two strikeouts. He also started Game 2 of San Jose's Division Series against Stockton last Thursday and struck out four over two hitless, scoreless innings as the Giants capped a sweep to advance to the California League Championship Series. Flora was selected by the San Francisco Giants with the fourth pick in this summer's MLB Draft out of UC Santa Barbara, where he was named the National Pitcher of the Year by multiple outlets, going 12-0 with a 1.06 ERA in 16 starts. Flora is ranked by Baseball America as the No. 4 Giants prospect and the No. 50 overall prospect. MLB.com ranks Flora as the No. 3 Giants prospect and No. 30 overall. **For more on Flora, see page two.**

FOR ERIE: Right-hander Kenny Serwa starts Game 2. In the regular season for the SeaWolves, he went 9-9 with a 4.41 ERA in 25 starts. In the Eastern League this year, he ranked tied for third in wins (9), tied for third in BAA (.241), tied for fourth in games started (25), fifth in ERA (4.31), eighth in WHIP (1.41) and 10th in innings pitched (117.0). Serwa has made seven starts in his career against the Flying Squirrels, combining to go 3-1 with a 2.94 ERA (10 ER/30.2 IP). He made his Double-A debut last June against Richmond in Erie, allowing four runs over six innings. Serwa began his college career with one season at NCAA DII St. Joseph's (ind.) College before spending three seasons at SIU Edwardsville. He then pitched one season at the University of Central Florida before spending his final college season at Dayton in 2022. Serwa pitched in independent baseball with the Billings Mustangs in 2022, did not pitch in 2023 and spent the 2024 season with the independent Chicago Dogs. He signed with the Tigers on January 22, 2025.

CROES CONTROL: Dayson Croes hit .343 (36-for-105) with 29 singles, six doubles, a homer, 12 RBIs and eight walks over his last 26 games since August 13, raising his season batting average at Double-A from .237 to .277. Croes picked up multiple hits seven times in his last 20 regular-season games since August 21, including three three-hit games and two four-hit games. Last Wednesday, he went 4-for-5, tying his career high for hits and RBIs (4). He also hit three doubles, tying the Flying Squirrels single-game record.

NICE GOIN', COHEN: Trevor Cohen hit .350 (21-for-60) with two doubles, a homer and six RBIs over his last 14 games since August 27. He picked up at least one hit in 12-of-14 games to close the season and had multiple hits eight times, including a three-hit game on August 30 against Portland, in that stretch. For the season, Cohen led all Giants minor leaguers in runs (106) and stolen bases (46).

TOP SKIPPER: Flying Squirrels manager **Dennis Pelfrey** has led the team to 334 wins in his career, which is a franchise record all-time wins record for a manager. He passed the record with Richmond's 6-1 win at Binghamton on May 23, 2025. From 2011-2013, Dave Machemer won 216 games as Richmond's manager, leading the team to the Eastern League postseason for in 2011. Pelfrey, who has been with Richmond since the 2022 season, led the team to back-to-back postseason appearances for the first time in franchise history in 2022 and 2023. He also managed the 2021 Eugene Emeralds to the High-A West championship. Of Richmond managers since 1954, Pelfrey is second in wins behind Eddie Haas (1968, 1981-84), who had 351 wins.

IN THE LEAGUE LEADERS: In the Eastern League, **Sabin Ceballos** was tied for fifth in walks (72). **Maui Ahuna** was ninth in stolen bases (31). **Jonah Cox** was tied for first in triples (5). **Tyler Vogel** was first in saves (16), tied for third in wins (9) and tied for sixth in games (44). **Trystan Vrieling** was first in shutouts (1) and tied for first in complete games (1). **Greg Farone** was tied for third in games starts (26).

PROSPECT WATCH: Richmond's roster features eight players ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Giants prospects, including **Jackson Flora** (No. 4), **Jacob Bresnahan** (No. 6), **LHP Henry Lalane** (No. 7), **Dakota Jordan** (No. 9), **Gavin Kilen** (No. 10), **Trevor Cohen** (No. 12), **RHP Miguel Mendez** (No. 20) and **Kaeden Kent** (No. 21). Jordan is rated as the organization's best athlete. MLB.com's top-30 Giants prospects list features 10 Richmond players, including Flora (No. 3), Kilen (No. 6), Jordan (No. 7), Bresnahan (No. 9), Lalane (No. 11), Cohen (No. 14), Mendez (No. 16), **Jancel Villarreal** (No. 18), Kent (No. 20) and **Lisbel Diaz** (No. 29).

MISC NOTES: **Tyler Vogel** was the first Eastern League reliever to reach 16 saves in a season since Portland's Luis Guerrero (18) in 2023. He now has the fifth-most saves in a season in franchise history, with Heath Hembree's 17 saves in 2011 next on the list. Vogel is also tied for fifth in franchise history in career saves with 22, even with Josh Osich (2013-2016) and Tyler Myrick (2023-2025) and one behind Rafael Cova (23, 2010). His nine wins this season are the second-most as a reliever in team history, trailing Edwin Quirarte (11, 2014). **Lisbel Diaz** hit his second Double-A homer on Aug. 30 and his 26th overall this season between Low-A San Jose, High-A Eugene and Richmond, which is second-most in the Giants organization this year. **Ryan Vanderhei** went 3-0 with a 1.47 ERA (5 ER/30.2 IP) in his last 22 outings since June 20, allowing five earned runs and seven total runs in that stretch with 33 strikeouts and a .175 BAA. **Sabin Ceballos** had 72 walks this season, the second-most in a season in franchise history and trailing only Jacob Heyward (80, 2019). In his career, Ceballos has worked 119 walks, which is fourth-most in Flying Squirrels franchise history. He is four walks behind Velasquez (123, 2024-26) for a tie for third on the all-time franchise list. **Maui Ahuna** had 31 stolen bases this season, sixth-most in a season in franchise history behind Gary Brown (33, 2012). He also has the highest (min. 25 att.) stolen base percentage (.886, 31-for-35) in a season in team history. **There have been 52 Flying Squirrels alumni who have played in the majors this year (plus Donovan Walton, who had previous MLB experience before playing in Richmond), including 30 with the Giants.**

THIS DATE IN RICHMOND BASEBALL HISTORY

1959: The Richmond Virginians beat the Havana Sugar Kings, 5-3, in Game 2 of the Governors Cup finals, evening the series, 1-1. Fritz Brickell hit a three-run homer in the first against Havana starter Mike Cuellar. The Vees added a run in the fourth and another in the fifth. After seven scoreless innings from Bill Short, Havana scored three runs in the eighth before Johnny James entered for Richmond and quieted the rally. **2023:** The Flying Squirrels beat the Erie SeaWolves, 1-0, at UPMC Park. Wil Jensen started for Richmond and threw four scoreless innings. Hunter Dula, Evan Gates and Blake Rivera finished the shutout. Erie's Jackson Jobe started and threw six scoreless innings. The game's only run scored in the top of the seventh. Carter Aldrete doubled before Brandon Martorano, Ismael Munguia and Will Wilson drew three straight walks to force home a run.
