Tonight's Game

The Clippers will send RHP **Jean Carlos Mejia** to the mound tonight, making his first start for Columbus since 5/12. St. Paul will counter with RHP **Griffin Jax**. The Clippers are 23-25 (.479) against right handers this year. Jax has never pitched against the Clippers in his career (was slated to start in Huntington Park on 6/26, but was recalled to Minnesota on 6/24).

vs. the Saints

Columbus went 4-2 against the Saints in the first ever series between the two (6/22-6/27), scoring at least seven runs three times (gave up at least six runs in four games; 22ER, fewest allowed in a home series this year). Individually, **Gabriel Arias** has batted .444 (8x18) opposing St. Paul in 5G and **Andres Gimenez** has hit .375 (9x24) with a HR and 7RBI in 6G.

Crushing It

Yu Chang's 4RBI game Friday was the second of the season (6/17 at Baltimore) and his second in his last 7G with the Clippers (8/23/19, 2HR and 4RBI vs. Toledo). The multi-hit game was his second this year with Columbus (5G, had four multi-hit games in 49G with Cleveland) and his first multi-XBH game since that 2HR effort in 2019. On the year, no Clipper has more than one game with 4+RBI.

Hammering Gimenez

Andres Gimenez homered once in seven of eight games from 6/13-6/22 (34AB; 6HR in Huntington Park), but has failed to go deep since (10G, 40AB). Gimenez still had a hit in each of the first 7G of his homerless streak (.393, 11x28), but has gone 0x12 in his last 3G (last played 7/3 at Toledo). The only other 3G hitless streak Gimenez has had with Columbus was 6/10-6/12 (right before HR streak).

Work to Do

Owen Miller is batting .265 (18x68) since returning from a three week stint in Cleveland, turning in eight hitless games in 19 chances (four hitless games in first 16). Miller was hitless in 9AB before Friday's single in the 1st (hitless in 14AB from 6/18-6/22), sinking from .342 to .317 (lowest of the season). He has only 7XBH during the cold spell, including just a double from 6/18-7/1 (.194SLG in 36AB).

Old School

Wilson Ramos has yet to strikeout this season with Columbus (10PA; has 8K in 114PA at the minor league level since the start of 2013; current stretch in Columbus is only non-rehab stint). Of tonight's lineup, only **Alex Call** (7K, 45PA) and **Connor Marabell** (8K, 36PA) join Ramos with strikeout percentages under 23% in the last two weeks (all three are only starters 26 years or older).

Take Two

The double from **Nolan Jones** on 7/3 was his IL-best 19th of the year (6G without, longest drought since 6G from 5/29-6/4). He is slugging .528 over his last 31G, collecting 14 doubles, a triple, 4HR (6XBH through first 26G) and only 30K (had 43K in first 26G). Jones is on pace for 42 doubles, a number that would tie the franchise record (**Kurt Bierek** in 1999; Bierek played in 135G).

Three Left Turns

Gabriel Arias crossed the plate Thursday, after a 2G scoring drought (has scored in 19 of 27G since an 8G drought from 5/29-6/6). Beginning with a 3-run game on 6/12 at Iowa, Arias has scored 23 runs in his last 23G, leading the IL in that time (hitting .306, 26x85, since 6/12). On the season, Arias is tied for 4th in the IL in runs (36) and is on pace to score 79 (most since **Cord Phelps'** 82 in 2012).

Big Time Slump

Alex Call was 4x9 with a pair of homers through his first 2G in Triple-A, but had just one hit in his next 23AB (bunt single on 7/3 at Toledo, hitless in 14AB until single in the 2nd on Friday). Call added another single in Friday's game, giving him his first multi-hit game since going deep twice at Toledo on 6/30 (only 2XBH with Columbus in 11G; had 19XBH in 43G with Akron). He was 0x3 Saturday.

Group Effort

The bullpen provided 5.0IP of scoreless work Friday night (3H, 1BB, 5K), marking the 10th game this season, with at least 5.0IP and 0ER (only six such games in all of 2019). After giving up at least 1ER in 12 straight at home, from 5/27-6/23 (62.1IP, 48ER), the bullpen turned in five 0ER outings over 6G at home (26.0IP, 2ER), until Thursday's blowup (5ER in 6.2IP, all charged to **Kyle Nelson**, 0.1IP).

This Date in Clipper History

7/13/2011

Zach McAllister started the Triple-A All-Star Game and picked up the win with a pair of scoreless innings (1H, 1BB, 2K) and his teammate, **Jason Kipnis**, went 1x2 with a double and a walk. The 3-0 win for the IL clinched "home" advantage in the Triple-A National Championship, a game the Clippers would win for the second straight year with an 8-3 win over Omaha in Albuquerque.

Huntington (Small) Park

In each of the first 11 years since the move downtown, Huntington Park has ranked among the top two in the IL in homers per game, totaling 2.25 per contest (1,763HR, 783 games). In 2019, HP averaged over three per game for the first time ever (seventh time averaging over a pair), as the Clippers surrendered a record 127HR and just missed out on triple digits themselves (97HR was second highest team total). Including the postseason, the Clippers have been out-homered over the life of the park (972 to 930).

Deadball Era

The franchise record for homers was destroyed in 2019 (213, +31 from '83), as was the record for homers allowed (198, +42 from '98). This season's Clippers are homering at a rate of 1.16 per game, putting them 20 off the pace of the pre-2019 record (adjusted for 140G). However, on the mound they are allowing 1.34 per game, enough to beat the pre-2019 record by 16, even with the shortened season.

Ain't Over 'Til It's Over

From 2014-19, no team had more come from behind victories than the 210 posted by Columbus and no team produced a better winning percentage when trailing than the .353 of the Clippers (Scranton/WB was 2nd in percentage, .338, and wins, 192). This year has seen the Clippers go 11-31 (.262) in games in which they trail, ranking 9th.

Not Close

The Clippers have the 2nd most losses by at least a grand slam in the IL (18, Memphis leads with 21) and rank 13th in wins by at least that many (9, two ahead of Memphis). That poor ratio has led to a -45 run differential, a figure that places them 13th in the IL (Memphis is securely in the basement at -93).

Get What You Pay For

Columbus was the last team in the IL to play free baseball this season, playing 85 straight games, including the postseason, between extra-inning rumbles on 7/31/19 vs. Louisville (11-8 loss in 11) and 6/26/21 vs. St. Paul (6-4 loss in 10; two straight extra-inning losses following nine straight wins, 8/21/18-7/3/19). The regulation-inning streak was the longest for Columbus dating to the 1984 season (as far back as the day by day records go) and 45 straight to start the season was also a record.

Trending Downward

The current staff ERA of 5.12 is on pace to be the worst in franchise history (5.08, 1983) and anything over 4.71 will mark the fifth straight season in which the ERA has gotten worse. From 2011-16, the Clipper staff turned in a sub-4.00ERA five times in six seasons (zero such seasons from 1993-2010), including the best two ERAs of the past 32 years (3.33 in 2015 and 3.65 in 2016). The 5.66ERA at Huntington Park is the worst ever (5.29 in 2019, only time ERA has ever been over 5.00 at HP).

Free Swingers

After three straight seasons leading the IL in strikeouts, the Clipper lineup is threatening for a fourth, as they currently rank 6th (560K, 48 off the pace, Charlotte). The 2019 squad obliterated the franchise record, as they struck out 95 more times than the previous high (1,392; each of last three seasons rank among franchise's three worst, totalling 3,979K in 422G). While the record appears safe due to the truncated schedule, this year's version is averaging 9.66K per game.

Night and Day

When playing errorless baseball, the Clippers have a winning percentage that is almost 200 points higher (.556, 15-12) than when they make a mistake in the field (.387, 12-19). After an exceptional defensive run from 2015-2019, in which the fielding percentage was never below .983 and the team never committed more than 88E, the 2021 team is on pace to botch 101 plays (adjusted for 140G season, have not had triple digits in errors since six straight seasons from 2009-14) with a fielding percentage of .979.

One On, No Out Success

When the leadoff batter of an inning reached base in 2019, the Clippers plated him nearly 60% of the time (over 51% only once in the last six seasons, 55% in 2016). Getting more than one base was a specialty of Clipper hitters, as they led the IL with 136XBH to lead off the inning, including 54HR (led the IL, had 28 leadoff homers in 2018). So far in 2021, the Clippers are scoring the leadoff batter 52% of the time he reaches, with the leadoff batter scoring himself 14 times (on pace for 31HR).

Good Baseball

Oscar Mercado advanced a runner with a sac bunt on 6/26 vs. St. Paul and the runner came around to score in the loss (3-1 when advanced runner scores). During 2019, the Clippers struggled in the bunt department, but when the advanced runners scored, they were 7-1. During 2018, Columbus was 23-2 in games in which a run was scored after a good bunt attempt.

International Accolades

Bobby Bradley was named International League Player of the Month for May 2019, reaching base in 24 of 25 games during the month while hitting .302/.374/.740 with 12HR (led IL) and 28RBI. **Brandon Barnes, Eric Haase, Josh Smith** and **Asher Wojciechowski** were named to the 2019 IL All-Star Team and Bradley, Barnes and Haase were selected to the postseason squad.

Manager Profile

Andy Tracy makes his Clippers debut in 2021, following **Tony Mansolino's** championship rookie year in 2019 (sixth Clipper skipper to win Governors' Cup in first season; **Gene Michael**-'79, **Joe Altobelli**-'80, **Frank Verdi**-'81, **Bucky Dent**-'87 and **Mike Sarbaugh**-'10). This season marks Tracy's second year as a manager (first with Williamsport in the Philadelphia system), as he holds a career record of 57-77 (.425), 27-31 with Columbus (.466).

Another Debut:

Mejia's first start of the year came in the team's second game, marking the second straight night they used a starter that had never pitched above High-A (**Kirk McCarty**). Mejia then went on to make his Major League debut on 5/21 vs. Minnesota (2.1IP, 1H, 5K), becoming the 4th of nine Clippers to debut in MLB this season.

In Cleveland:

After two games above High-A, Mejia was promoted to Cleveland on 5/18, where he made his first three Big League appearances in relief (5.0IP, 1H, 0R, 0ER, 1BB, 7K). Mejia ran his scoreless innings streak to 8.0 with his first MLB start on 6/4 at Baltimore, but then was battered for 12ER in 9.2IP over 3GS from 6/9-6/18. A quality start on 6/24 at Minnesota netted a no-decision (6.0IP, 1ER) and he gave up 12ER in 6.2IP over his next 2GS, both losses, before getting optioned to Columbus on 7/8.
