ABOUT LAST NIGHT... The Vancouver Canadians, led by starting pitcher CJ Van Eyk, edged the Everett AquaSox (Mariners) 4-3 Wednesday night as the C's bounced back to even the series at Ron Tonkin Field.

Van Eyk (W, 2-1) turned in his second consecutive sterling showing to earn the second win of his young career. The right-hander kept the high-powered Everett offense off balance for five innings in which he allowed a first inning run on two hits but proceeded to allow just one more hit over the next four frames. He walked two and struck out seven.

Trailing 1-0 in the bottom of the second, the C's used three consecutive two out doubles to take a 2-1 lead. Sebastian Espino started the rally with a two-bagger to left field, Ryan Gold brought him home with his team-best eleventh double and Luis De Los Santos traded places with Gold to give Vancouver an advantage they wouldn't relinquish.

The C's added single runs in the third and fourth to pad their lead. Two walks, a stolen base and a Spencer Horwitz RBI groundout helped Vancouver manufacture a run in the third before consecutive singles from Espino and Gold in the fourth set up a DJ Neal RBI single that put the Canadians up 4-1.

Everett got a run in the sixth to cut Vancouver's lead to two and seemed poised to score again in the eighth. With runners at the corners and one out, Parker Caracci (S, 5) was called upon to preserve the two-run lead. After a stolen base put the tying run in scoring position, Caracci struck out Jake Anchia before Connor Hoover grounded out to end the threat.

Things got interesting again in the ninth. In that inning, a one-out infield single brought the tying run to the plate in the form of Julio Rodriguez, the #2 Mariners prospect and one of the most highly regarded talents in Minor League Baseball. Rodriguez hit a ground ball to third that could have been a game-ending double play but instead turned into a throwing error that put runners at the corners with one out and the go-ahead run at the dish. A fielder's choice scored a run to make it 4-3 before Caracci struck out clean-up hitter Zach DeLoach to end the game and secure a 4-3 C's win.

FEELING FROGGY: Everett returns to Hillsboro this week for their second series of the season with Vancouver. The 'Sox last hopped into town May 25-30 when the C's split a six-game set. The Mariners affiliate has been ranked as one of the most prospect-laden rosters in all of baseball and have lived up to that billing; they have outscored the Canadians 46-30 this season and have plated a league-best 241 runs.

HOME AWAY FROM HOME: Due to pandemic-related border closures, Ron Tonkin Field in Hillsboro will serve as Vancouver's home ballpark this year. 78 of 120 C's game will take place in the Tualatin Valley over the course of the season (60 home games, 18 as the visitors).

ON THIS DATE IN BASEBALL HISTORY: June 17, 1960 - Ted Williams becomes the fourth major leaguer to hit 500 career home runs when he goes deep off the Tribe's Wayne Hawkins. The Splendid Splinter's 2-run blast proves to be the difference when the Red Sox beat the Indians at Cleveland's Municipal Stadium, 3-1.

COMEBACK KIDS: Last night was Vancouver's tenth comeback win of the season. Nearly half of their wins this year (45%) have been of the comeback variety.

LIGHT ON THE LONG BALL: The C's pitching staff has surrendered 24 home runs this year, tied for the second fewest in Advanced-A. Hudson Valley has given up 22 dingers, but Vancouver has pitched 32 more innings than the Renegades.

ON THE HILL: #9 Blue Jays prospect (MLB.com) Adam Kloffenstein gets the nod for Vancouver tonight. After three consecutive outings in which he struggled with his command, the right-hander returned to form in his last turn on June 11 in Spokane; that night, Kloffenstein earned the win with five innings in which he surrendered one run on three hits with three walks and six strikeouts. MLB.com says "Kloffenstein's 2020 was one of the most unique years of any prospect on this list. Not part of the club's alternate training site, the Blue Jays gave Kloffenstein permission to play in the Independent Constellation Energy League in Texas, where he posted a 4.64 ERA over 21 1/3 innings. This league was stacked up with hitters and pitchers who were older and more experienced in pro ball than Kloffenstein, making it a valuable challenge for the young starter. There, Kloffenstein's sinking fastball moved from the low-90s to sit closer to the 93-94 mph range."

MLB.com's #27 Mariners prospect Matt Brash goes for Everett in what will be his second look at Vancouver. He faced the C's on May 25 when he allowed two runs (one earned) on three hits with four walks and six strikeouts in five innings pitched. From MLB.com: "For a 6-foot-1 righty, Brash has impressive extension down the mound with his fastball, which has been one of the key attributes the Mariners have looked for while assembling Minor League pitching talent in recent years. He sat in the low 90s at Niagara, topping out at 95 mph and there's room for more velocity there as he grows into his body. His changeup is his second-best pitch and he also throws a slider and curveball."
