Aviators vs. Chihuahuas: The Las Vegas Aviators professional baseball team, Triple-A affiliate of the Oakland Athletics, will host the El Paso Chihuahuas, Triple-A affiliate of the San Diego Padres, this afternoon in the finale of the six-game series in Pacific Coast League action at Las Vegas Ballpark (8,196)...Las Vegas is 2-3 on the homestand...following a PCL off day tomorrow, the Aviators will travel to Northern California for a six-game road trip beginning on Tuesday, June 6 against the Sacramento River Cats, Triple-A affiliate of the San Francisco Giants...the series will conclude on Sunday, June 11...Las Vegas will then return home to host Reno.

Las Vegas defeats El Paso 11-8 in game five of the series: The Aviators defeated the Chihuahuas 11-8 last night in game five of the six-game series before the eighth sellout of the season of 9,046 at Las Vegas Ballpark.

Las Vegas offense: The Aviators recorded 14 hits and rallied from an 8-7 deficit to score two runs each in the seventh and eighth innings. Catcher **Tyler Soderstrom** (2-for-5) hit a two-run home run in the seventh and eighth. Third baseman **Jordan Díaz** was 3-for-5, two doubles, RBI; second baseman **Zack Gelof** was 2-for-3, two walks, two stolen bases, two runs scored and right fielder **Max Schuemann** was 2-for-3, walk, double, 2 RBI, run scored.

El Paso offense: The Chihuahuas recorded 12 hits and scored three runs in the seventh inning to lead 8-7. Catcher **Brett Sullivan** was 3-for-4, walk, double, triple, solo home run, three runs scored. Second baseman **Tim Lopes** was 2-for-5, 2 RBI, stolen base, run scored.

Las Vegas starting pitching: Right-hander **Colton Eastman** pitched 4.2 innings in the no decision. He allowed 7 hits, 4 runs and walked 1 on 76 pitches (45 strikes).

El Paso Chihuahuas: In 2022, the Chihuahuas compiled a record of 85-65 (.567) and finished in first place in the PCL East Division. Reno defeated El Paso, 6-2, in the PCL Championship game on September 30 at Las Vegas Ballpark.

El Paso defeats Las Vegas 20-5 in game two of the series (Wednesday, May 31): The Chihuahuas defeated the Aviators 20-5 in game two of the six-game homestand before a crowd of 5,701 at Las Vegas Ballpark.

Las Vegas offense: The Aviators recorded 12 hits and stranded 10 runners on base. Designated hitter/pitcher **Yohel Pozo** was 3-for-5, two doubles, RBI. Second baseman **Zack Gelof** was 3-for-5, RBI, two runs scored and right fielder **Cody Thomas** was 3-for-4, double, walk, run scored.

El Paso offense: The Chihuahuas recorded 23 hits and built a 9-1 lead after 3 ½ innings. Second baseman **José Iglesias** was 5-for-7 with two doubles, three home runs, 8 RBI, five runs scored (16 total bases). El Paso defeats Las Vegas 12-2 in game three of the series (Thursday, June 1): The Chihuahuas defeated the Aviators 12-2 in game three of the six-game homestand before a crowd of 6,534 at Las Vegas Ballpark.

Las Vegas offense: The Aviators recorded 8 hits and stranded seven runners on base. Center fielder **Conner Capel** was 2-for-4, double and extended his hitting streak to 10 games. Second baseman **Zack Gelof** was 1-for-3, walk, double and right fielder **Cody Thomas** was 1-for-4, RBI and extended his hitting streak to 11 games.

El Paso offense: The Chihuahuas recorded 15 hits and built a 9-0 lead after 4 ½ innings. Right fielder **Preston Tucker** was 4-for-5, HR, 3 RBI, three runs scored. Las Vegas defeats El Paso 10-4 in game four of the series (Friday, June 2): The Aviators defeated the Chihuahuas 10-4 in game four of the six-game series before the seventh sellout of the season of 8,310 at Las Vegas Ballpark.

Las Vegas offense: The Aviators recorded 14 hits and rallied for six runs in the sixth inning to take a 9-4 lead. Center fielder **Conner Capel** was 4-for-5, stolen base, double, 2 RBI, run scored. First baseman **Dermis García** was 3-for-3, walk, SF, two-run home run in the sixth inning, 3 RBI; shortstop **Kevin Smith** was 3-for-5, double, 2 RBI, two runs scored and designated hitter **Jordan Díaz** was 2-for-4, walk, solo home run in the sixth.

AVIATORS INFLIGHT NEWS – Las Vegas is 2-3 on the six-game homestand against El Paso...the homestand against the Chihuahuas, Triple-A affiliate of the San Diego Padres, will conclude this afternoon...Las Vegas and El Paso will play a total of 12 times in 2023...the first-half of the 2023 season will conclude on Sunday, June 25 at Oklahoma City...the first-half winner (best record in the 10-team PCL: OKC Dodgers, 40-16, .714) will host the best-of-three series vs. the second-half-winner...following a PCL off day tomorrow, the Aviators will embark on a Northern California six-game road trip beginning on Tuesday, June 6 against the Sacramento River Cats, Triple-A affiliate of the San Francisco Giants...the series will conclude on Sunday, June 11...the Aviators will then return to Las Vegas Ballpark to host intrastate rival, the Reno Aces, Triple-A affiliate of the Arizona Diamondbacks, in a six-game series from Tuesday-Sunday, June 13-18...the 2023 season will feature six-game series from Tuesday-Sunday and off days on Mondays (one exception, July 3)...the '23 campaign will also feature 150 games (75-home; 75-away).

40th ANNIVERSARY SEASON IN THE SILVER STATE (1983-2023) – The Aviators are playing in their 40th Anniversary season in the Silver State as a proud member of the Pacific Coast League...**the Las Vegas Aviators have the proud distinction of being Nevada’s longest enduring professional sports franchise**...Las Vegas Triple-A baseball was born on April 10, 1983 before a sellout crowd of 10,622 at Cashman Field (Las Vegas defeated Salt Lake City, 11-8)...catcher **Bruce Bochy** has the distinction of hitting the first Triple-A home run in Cashman Field history for the Las Vegas Stars on April 10, 1983.

PACIFIC COAST LEAGUE: The PCL enters its 120th season (1903-2020, 2022 -) and consists of two divisions for a total of 10 teams. **West Division:** Las Vegas Aviators, Reno Aces, Sacramento River Cats, Salt Lake Bees, Tacoma Rainiers; **East Division:** Albuquerque Isotopes, El Paso Chihuahuas, Oklahoma City Dodgers, Round Rock Express, Sugar Land Space Cowboys. The 10-team league in 2021 was named Triple-A West and returned as the PCL in 2022!

INTERNATIONAL LEAGUE: The IL consists of two divisions for a total of 20 teams. **East Division:** Buffalo Bisons, Charlotte Knights, Durham Bulls, Jacksonville Jumbo Shrimp, Lehigh Valley IronPigs, Norfolk Tides, Rochester Red Wings, Scranton/Wilkes-Barre RailRiders, Syracuse Mets, Worcester Red Sox. **West Division:** Columbus Clippers, Gwinnett Stripers, Indianapolis Indians, Iowa Cubs, Louisville Bats, Memphis Redbirds, Nashville Sounds, Omaha Storm Chasers, St. Paul Saints, Toledo Mud Hens. The 20-team league in 2021 was named Triple-A East and returned as the IL in 2022!

2022 SEASON – The Aviators compiled an overall record of 71-79 (.473) and finished in third place in the PCL West Division. The Reno Aces captured the West Division with an overall record of 85-63 (.574). The Aces captured the PCL championship and defeated the El Paso Chihuahuas, Triple-A affiliate of the San Diego Padres, 6-2, on September 30 in the inaugural **Triple-A Triple Championship Weekend** at Las Vegas Ballpark. The Durham Bulls, Triple-A affiliate off the Tampa Bay Rays, captured the Triple-A National Championship and defeated Reno, 10-6, on October 2 at Las Vegas Ballpark. The Bulls defeated the Nashville Sounds, Triple-A affiliate of the Milwaukee Brewers, 13-0, to capture the IL championship on October 1 at Las Vegas Ballpark.

2021 SEASON – The Aviators compiled an overall record of 65-61 (.516) and finished in third place in Triple-A West, Western Division. The Tacoma Rainiers captured the regular season championship with the best record in the 10-team Triple-A West with a mark of 78-52 (.600). The Durham Bulls, Triple-A affiliate off the Tampa Bay Rays, captured the best overall record in Triple-A baseball with a mark of 86-44 (.662).

LAS VEGAS 80-WIN SEASONS – The Las Vegas franchise has won 80 or more games in a season six times: **85** (2002, franchise best 85-59 record (.590); **83** (1983 inaugural season, 83-60 (.580); **83** (83-57, .593 in 2019); **81** (81-63, .563 in 2013); **81** (81-63, .563 in 2014); **80** (1986 PCL champions with an 80-62 mark (.563)...Las Vegas recorded back-to-back 80-win seasons for the first time in franchise history (2013 & 2014)...the 83-57 record in 2019 marked a single-season franchise record for winning percentage at .593 (140-game season).

LAS VEGAS BALLPARK HISTORY: The Howard Hughes Corporation® (NYSE: HHC) announced on **October 10, 2017** its plans to develop and construct a baseball stadium in Downtown Summerlin® on approximately eight acres just south of City National Arena, the National Hockey League practice facility for the Vegas Golden Knights. The announcement on October 10, followed a vote by the Las Vegas Convention and Visitors Authority Board of Directors approving a marketing partnership that gives **LVCVA** naming rights to the stadium. The Las Vegas Ballpark was designed by HOK, a global architecture firm with an expertise in stadium design and constructed by **HUNT/PENTA**.

The groundbreaking ceremony took place on **Friday, February 23, 2018** before a crowd of several hundred people!

The 8,196-fan-capacity stadium blends the distinct architectural style of the Summerlin® community with the aviation legacy of Howard Hughes. The ballpark provides a wide range of seating options including 22 suites, club seats, berm seating, party zones and decks, picnic tables, kids' zone, bars and even a pool beyond the outfield wall.

Designed to create a festival-like atmosphere in Downtown Summerlin, the site is landscaped to complement the master planned community. Parking is conveniently located on adjacent sites.

The grand opening took place on **Tuesday, April 9, 2019** before a sellout crowd of 11,036 and the Aviators defeated Sacramento, 10-2.

LAS VEGAS AVIATORS LOGO AND INFORMATION: The Howard Hughes Corporation®, owner of the city's professional Triple-A baseball team of the Pacific Coast League, and developer of the Summerlin® master planned community and the Las Vegas Ballpark® located at Downtown Summerlin®, announced on **December 8, 2018** the team's new name - the **Las Vegas Aviators®**.

The name change completed a rebrand that included the team's new two-year Player Development Contract (PDC) with the Oakland Athletics (2018) and the opening of the Las Vegas Ballpark, the state-of-the-art Triple-A baseball stadium, that now serves as the home of the Aviators.

The name change (from 51^s) pays homage to the company's namesake, **Howard R. Hughes, Jr.**, one of the twentieth century's most successful businessmen whose passion for aviation and legacy of innovation includes significant aviation-related firsts and accomplishments. In the H-1 Racer, a plane he designed and built, Hughes set the land speed record of 352 miles per hour in 1935. Hughes went on to set other records, including the fastest coast-to-coast flight in 1937 and the fastest circumnavigation of the globe in 1938, then acquiring and successfully operating major airlines and aviation companies.

AVIATORS LOGO DESIGN AND CONCEPT:

The color inspiration: the Las Vegas Sunset; the mountain range featured in the Aviators' sunglasses resemble the mountain range found in the Summerlin logo!

Team colors are navy, orange, tangerine, gold, yellow, gray.

Aviators on Radio in 2023: Russ Langer will broadcast the 150 games on **Raider Nation Radio 920 AM** (selected games on **Fox Sports 1340 AM** and **98.9 FM**) on www.aviatorslv.com. Langer is in his 23rd season broadcasting baseball to the Las Vegas Valley and 36th year overall in the business....over his career, Langer has received numerous awards, including being named 1993 Minor League Broadcaster of the Year by the National Association of Professional Baseball Leagues....in 1995 and 2016, he broadcast the Triple-A All-Star game; in 1999, he was named the New Mexico Sportscaster of the Year; and in 2002, he was named Minor League Broadcaster of the Year by Minor League News.com...Langer also is a 11-time recipient (seven consecutive years from 2007-13) of the Nevada Sportscaster of the Year award (2003, 2005, 2007, 2008, 2009, 2010, 2011, 2012, 2013, 2015, 2021), which is presented by the National Sports Media Association (NSMA)...Langer's inaugural season in Las Vegas was in 2000, the final year the franchise was known as the Stars...prior to arriving in Las Vegas, Langer called Pacific Coast League games for the Albuquerque

Dukes (1996-99) and Phoenix Firebirds (1992-95)...began his broadcasting career with Single-A Springfield Cardinals in 1987 and 1989, sandwiched around a year in Vero Beach (1988)...moved up the ranks to Double-A, calling games for the Midland Angels in 1990 and '91 before advancing to Triple-A Phoenix...he realized his longtime goal of broadcasting Major League baseball when he worked a total of 30 Montreal Expos games during the 2003 and 2004 seasons, followed by nine games for the Baltimore Orioles in 2006...has also broadcast selected spring training games for the Los Angeles Dodgers (2006-08), Toronto Blue Jays (2009-10) and Chicago White Sox (2012-20)...in 2022, Langer also completed his 11th season as the radio play-by-play voice for the UNLV football team on the UNLV Sports Properties/ Learfield Network.

RUSS LANGER 3,000TH BROADCAST IN THE SILVER STATE: The sixth game of the 2023 Aviators campaign on Thursday, April 6 against the Oklahoma City Dodgers marked **Russ Langer's 3,000th** broadcast for the Triple-A Las Vegas Stars/51^s/Aviators franchise.

Matt Neverett will also serve as the play-by-play voice for home games and selected road games...in his fourth season with the Aviators, and his third in the broadcast booth...he returned to his birthplace of Las Vegas in 2020 after spending two years with the Bradenton Marauders, Single-A Affiliate of the Pittsburgh Pirates, as the play-by-play broadcaster and media relations director...after graduating from Appalachian State University in Boone, NC in 2017, he spent one season with the Birmingham Barons, Double-A Affiliate of the Chicago White Sox, as a media relations manager and pre/post game host...his father, Tim, is a former play-by-play voice of the Las Vegas 51^s and current play-by-play voice of the Los Angeles Dodgers.

ROBERT J. BLUM BROADCAST BOOTH AT LAS VEGAS BALLPARK:

The "Aviators Home Radio Booth" was renamed the "**Robert J.
