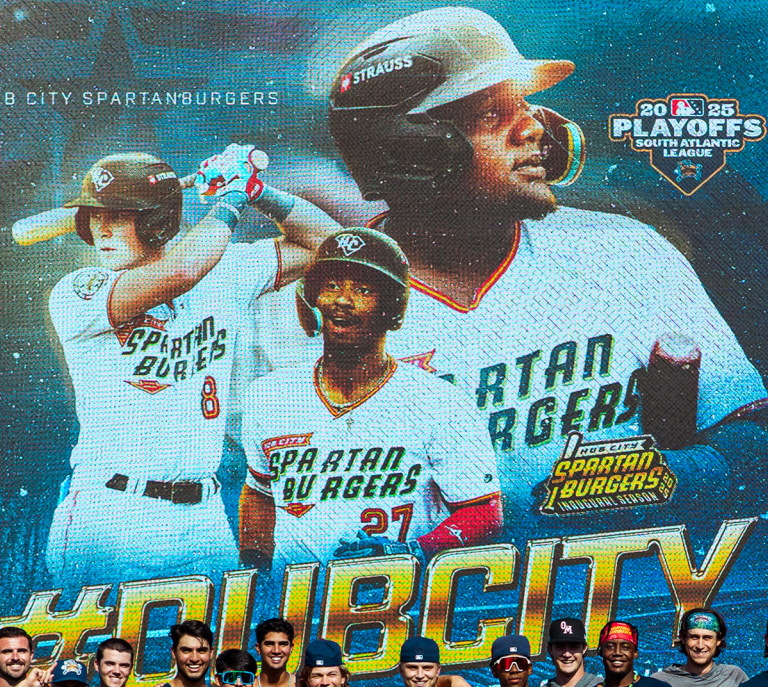

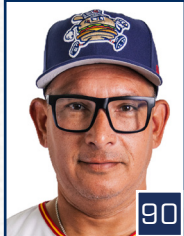

# COACHES & STAFF



## Carlos Maldonado - Manager

Maldonado begins his 11th year coaching in the Rangers organization and first with Hub City in 2026. He joins Hub City after spending three years as the Single-A manager and three years managing in the ACL and DSL. In 2023, he led Down East to a championship appearance. Maldonado was born in Maracaibo, Venezuela and signed as a free agent with the Mariners at age 17 in 1995. After time in the Mariners, Astros, White Sox and Pirates orgs, the catcher made his MLB debut with Pittsburgh in 2006. He played in 21 MLB games for the Pirates in 2006 & 2007 and 8 games for the Nationals in 2010 & 2012.

After falling out of first half contention with a late losing streak, the Spartanburgers clinched a playoff spot on the final day of the 2025 regular season. The 'Burgers finished the season 65-66, but made the postseason thanks to a 34-32 second half record, one game better than Greenville. Hub City beat Bowling Green twice for the South Division title (3-1 at home, 10-5 in extras on the road) before falling to the North Division winner Brooklyn Cyclones in consecutive games in the championship series. Manager Chad Comer (underneath the shower) and staff helped nine 'Burgers to Double-A Frisco, seven of which were members of the pitching staff.

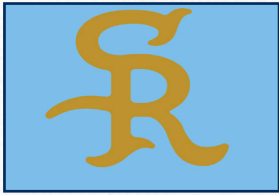

## SPARTAN REGIMENT



With America's 250th anniversary in 2026, the Regiment identity reflects the Spartanburgers and Spartanburg Community College's (SCC) commitment to celebrating the roots of the Upstate and its service members. The on-field uniform debuts on May 23, 2026. The original Spartan Regiment – founded in 1775, a time when breaking away from the British was frowned upon – was heavily involved in one of the most active battle areas of the Revolutionary War. Made up of roughly 250 soldiers, the unit played a pivotal role in some of the Patriots' greatest victories, such as the Battle of Cowpens in 1781. Four years later, Spartanburg County was formed, taking its name from the freedom fighters who stood tall against the most powerful army in the pre-Industrial world. Inspiration for the uniform design comes from the Spartan Regiment flag: the colors and text on the hats and uniforms bear resemblance to those on the flag. The 13 bars on the sleeve of the uniforms mirror the 13 bars on the flag, representing the original 13 colonies. The cap's interlocking SR represents the unity of the regiment which fought for America's freedom.

## SPARTANBURG PASTIMES



Spartanburg's baseball history is longstanding, dating all the way to the 1800s, and in 2026, the Spartanburgers dawn the "Pastimes" uniform to help honor that tradition. 2026 marks the 100th anniversary of baseball at Duncan Park, the field where the Spartanburg Sluggers, Peaches, Phillies and so many more took the diamond. Legends such as Hank Aaron, Jackie Robinson and Satchel Paige took the field at Duncan Park. Renowned sports executive Pat Williams helped make the Phillies' minor league club a Spartanburg staple while Larry Bowa, Scott Rolen and the late Ryne Sandberg honed their skills climbing the ladder to the big leagues. The uniform itself is a nod to all the eras of Spartanburg's baseball past; each of the

six "Pastimes" games at Fifth Third Park in 2026 will document a different era of baseball in the 'Burg. The burgundy and tan color scheme is a nod to previous generations along with the primary logo, which features a baseball player from the early 20th century playing catch. The Pastimes uniform will also be tied to various giveaways, including a Duncan Park stadium replica, an American Legion baseball cap, a Pat Williams bobblehead and a viewfinder.

## GUSANOS DE MEZCAL DEL 'BURG



Inspired by the smoky spirit of mezcal and the legendary gusano – the agave worm that's become a symbol of strength, tradition, and flavor – the Gusanos de Mezcal Del Burg will debut as part of the team's participation in Minor League Baseball's Copa de la Diversión, a season-long series that celebrates Latino culture and community. The Gusanos logo depicts the worm as a jima-dor, a small-town agave farmer, who spends their days hard at work and their nights throwing parties for the community. Once the sun sets, the jima-dor swaps out a straw hat for their festive sombrero, joins the neighborhood band and reaps the rewards of the weekly harvest, sharing mezcal with family and friends. The spirit of the jima-dor represents the FUN at Fifth Third Park on a nightly basis, with festivities and fellowship for all. Fans can expect Gusanos de Mezcal Del

Burg nights throughout the 2026 season, complete with themed jerseys, authentic Latin American live music, dancing, and family-friendly programming that reflects the rich culture behind the concept.

## SPARTANBURG SLUGGERS



From the late 1920s to the early 1950s, the Negro League Spartanburg Sluggers were one of the teams which occupied Duncan Park. Owned by community businessman "Big Newt" Whitmire, then his son "Little Newt," who were both prominent entertainment promoters in the Upstate, the Spartanburg Sluggers mostly battled local rivals such as the Greenville Black Spinners, the Asheville Black Tourists and the Charlotte Hard Hitters. Every once in a while, the Sluggers faced off against Negro League legends such as the Homestead Grays or Kansas City Monarchs. Notable Sluggers include southpaw Bob Branson, outfielder

George Wannamaker, who went on to play in the major leagues, and Archie Means, who still lives in Spartanburg to this day. The Sluggers were an early example of sport bonding a community across racial and ethnic lines, and their example lives on today at Fifth Third Park.

Fifth Third Park is the crown jewel of downtown Spartanburg. With Fifth Third Bank serving as the naming rights sponsor, the newest ballpark in the South Atlantic League seats over 5,000 people. The Johnson Group provided oversight on the project while Overland Partners served as the architect and Robins & Morton as the general contractor. The ballpark is a part of a \$425 million development in downtown Spartanburg, S.C. Groundbreaking took place with a ceremony on November 1, 2023.

The ballpark officially opened for baseball on April 1, 2025 when Wofford College defeated USC Upstate 5-2 in the ballpark's first game. The next night, the Spartanburgers hosted the Hickory Crawdads for a preseason exhibition. The first official Spartanburgers game was the 2025 home opener against Bowling Green on April 15, when the 'Burgers beat the Hod Rods 5-3 in front of the crowd of 3,798.

Other ballpark milestones from year one include: Cole Swindell's concert June 5, the City of Spartanburg's Red White and Boom Fireworks show on July 4. In October, the Savannah Bananas announced the park would host a series of the Banana Ball Championship League.

The Washington Senators moved to Arlington in 1971, and debuted as the Texas Rangers the following spring at Arlington Stadium, becoming the first Major League Baseball franchise in the state. After a slow start, the Rangers became a winning ballclub in the late 1970s. 10 years later, fireballing right-hander Nolan Ryan, who pitched his final five seasons in Texas, inked his contract with the club in 1989 at age 41. Ryan reached several other milestones with the Rangers, including 5,000 strikeouts and 300 wins. The team's fortunes improved in the 1990s with Johnny Oates at the helm and the emergence of slugger Juan González and Hall of Famer Iván "Pudge" Rodríguez, leading to the franchise's first playoff appearances in 1996, then again in 1998 and 1999. After a decade without a postseason series win, the Rangers broke through in 2010 and 2011, capturing back-to-back American League pennants and coming within one strike of a World Series title both years. The defining moment in franchise history came in 2023, when Texas won its first World Series championship behind the leadership of Bruce Bochy and Series MVP Corey Seager. In 2025, the Rangers finished 81-81, coming in third in the AL West. Texas' pitching staff led all of MLB with a 3.47 team ERA.

Round Rock, the Rangers' Triple-A affiliate, takes its moniker from legendary Texas flamethrower Nolan Ryan, who was dubbed "the Ryan Express" throughout his 27-year big league career. Ryan is now part of the Round Rock ownership group. The Express were originally established as the Double-A affiliate of the Astros in 2000, and won the Texas League that very season. Round Rock bumped up to Triple-A in 2005, joining the Pacific Coast League, and flipped affiliations to the Rangers in 2011. Under the guise of Texas, the Express won the PCL championship in 2015.



The Frisco RoughRiders, named after Teddy Roosevelt's regiment in the Spanish-American War, have served as the Rangers' Double-A affiliate since 2003. Frisco has made 11 Texas League playoff appearances and won two league titles, the last of which came in 2022. Their ballpark, Riders Field, holds 10,000 people and is well-known around minor league baseball for its lazy river in center field. Frisco is a main destination for the Rangers major league rehabbers, as Riders Field is roughly 45 minutes away from the big league club in Arlington.



Relocated from Gastonia, N.C. in 1993, the Hickory Crawdads got their name from the shellfish's presence in local waterways. The 'Dads won two South Atlantic League championships as a part of the Pirates organization in 2002 and 2004; Texas became the new High-A affiliate of the Crawdads in 2009. Since joining the Rangers, the 'Dads have appeared in the playoffs four times, last winning the title in 2015, and most recently playing postseason baseball under the direction of Chad Comer in 2023. In 2023, the Rangers sold the Crawdads to Diamond Baseball Holdings, which led to Hickory joining the Carolina League after the introduction of Hub City.



The Arizona Complex League Rangers are stationed at Texas' Spring Training Complex in Surprise, AZ. The ACL is the first level of the minor leagues in North America, usually reserved for players who are in their first or second year in the minor leagues. Players on rehab assignments may also appear on the ACL Rangers for short stints. The 15 Cactus league teams all have affiliates in the ACL. The Dominican Summer League is where the Rangers' international free agent prospects begin their professional careers, some as young as 16. Texas has two teams based out of its complex in the capital of Santo Domingo, Rangers Red and Rangers Blue. Most MLB teams have two DSL affiliates, although it is not a requirement. The league is split into eight divisions, with 52 total teams.
