Fort Wayne TinCaps (54-64) at Dayton Dragons (63-55)

LH Fred Schlichtholz (3-0, 3.97) vs. RH James Proctor (0-1, 4.38)

Today's Game: The Dayton Dragons (affiliate of the Cincinnati Reds) meet the Fort Wayne TinCaps (affiliate of the San Diego Padres) in the fifth game of a six-game series and the next-to-last game of the regular season.

2021 Season Series: Dayton 14, Fort Wayne 8. (At Dayton: Dragons 8, TinCaps 2). **Current Series:** Dayton 4, Fort Wayne 0.

Last Game: Friday: Dayton 8, Fort Wayne 4. Carson Spiers fired five scoreless innings and four Dayton players each had two hits. Michael Siani led the way with a single, double, two RBI, two runs scored, and a stolen base. Jacob Hurtubise, Allan Cerda, and Ivan Johnson also had two hits.

Current Series vs. Fort Wayne: The Dragons are 4-0 in the series and have outscored Fort Wayne 33-13 (scoring 8.3 runs per game) while batting .287 with a team ERA of 1.70. They have committed eight errors in the series.

Last Series at Lake County: The Dragons went 3-3 at Lake County (Sept. 7-12). They scored 26 runs (4.3 per game) while batting .202 with a team ERA of 3.74. They committed five errors in the series.

The Dragons roster includes eight players ranked among the top-20 prospects in the Reds organization. In the recently-updated *MLB.com* rankings, Matt McLain is the #4 prospect in the Reds system; Mat Nelson is #10, Michael Siani is #12, Lyon Richardson is #14, Christian Roa is #15, Bryce Bonnin is #16, Ivan Johnson is #17, and Allan Cerda is #18. In the mid-season update of Reds top-10 prospects by *Baseball America*, McLain is #4, Nelson is #11, Bonnin is #13, Roa is #14, and Johnson is #15. Siani was listed by *Baseball America* as the "Best Athlete" and "Best Defensive Outfielder" in the Reds organization entering the season.

High-A Central League Playoffs: Major League Baseball has announced that leagues at three classifications, including the High-A Central League, will conduct playoffs in September. The top two teams in each league, regardless of division, will meet in a best-of-five series.

Playoff Race: The Dragons are two games behind Cedar Rapids and one game behind Lake County in the race for the #2 seed in the 2021 post-season with two games to play. The Dragons win the tie-breaker over Cedar Rapids but lose the tie-breaker to Lake County. In the event of a tie involving more than two teams, in which one of the teams has not played regular season games against the other teams involved in the tie (ie: Cedar Rapids), Minor League Baseball has not issued a clear ruling on the tie-breaking procedure.

The Mythical First Half Division Title: The Dragons were the winners of the "Mythical First Half" East Division title. Note that the league is not utilizing a split-season format in 2021. There is no First Half or Second Half, and no First Half championship race in 2021 in the High-A Central League. The Midwest League was split into two equal halves for every season from 1988-2019, and from 1956-1981. The league did not play a split season from 1982-87.

First Round Fever: Matt McLain is the latest first round draft pick to play for the Dragons. Recent first round picks to play for the Dragons, with their draft year, have included Nick Lodolo (2019), Jonathan India (2018), Hunter Greene (2017), Nick Senzel (2016), Tyler Stephenson (2015), Nick Howard and Alex Blandino (2014), Phillip Ervin (2013), Nick Travieso (2012), and Robert Stephenson (2011). Every Reds "true" first round pick (selected within the first 30 picks of the draft) over the last 11 drafts has played for the Dragons except 2020 first rounder Austin Hendrick, who is currently at Low-A Daytona.

Salazar and a Possible ERA Title: Former Dragons starting pitcher Eduardo Salazar is likely to finish second in the High-A Central League in earned run average after leading the league for several days. Salazar, now on the injured list at Double-A Chattanooga, compiled an ERA with the Dragons of 3.49. Peoria's Wilfredo Pereira lowered his ERA on Wednesday to 3.33 to assume the league lead, and he is unlikely to pitch again this season. Only one pitcher in Dragons history has led the league in ERA: Josh Hall in 2001 at 2.65. In 2015, Tyler Mahle finished the season with an ERA of 2.43, the same as Peoria's Matt Pearce. When their ERA's were extended to a third decimal point, Mahle lost the title with a mark of 2.428 to Pearce's ERA of 2.426.

- Jacob Hurtubise is hitting .436 (15 for 36) over his last 15 games. He is 5 for 6 (.833) in the current series.
- Juan Martinez is batting .348 with three doubles over his last six games.
- Allan Cerda is 6 for 12 (.500) in the current series with two doubles and a home run.
- Stevie Branche since joining the Dragons: 12 G, 19 IP, 5 H, 2 ER, 11 BB, 30 SO, 0.95 ERA, 2-0, 1 Sv.
- Vin Timpanelli over his last 10 relief appearances: 12 IP, 2 H, 3 ER, 4 BB, 24 SO, 3 Sv. Opponents are 2 for 40 with 24 Ks.

Team Notes

- A win tonight would match the Dragons season high for most consecutive victories (5).
- The Dragons lead the High-A Central League in team ERA in the month of September, at 2.85 (16 games). They also lead the league in lowest opponent batting average (.175) and strikeouts (175 in 136 innings).
- Dragons pitchers will break the club record in 2021 for most strikeouts per game. They have averaged 10.3 strikeouts per game this season (1217 SO in 118 G). The club record is 9.2 per game in 2011 (1,292 SO in 140 G).
- Dragons pitchers will also break the club record for most walks per game. They have averaged 4.8 walks per game (562 BB in 118 G). The club record is 4.3 per game in 2005 (600 walks in 139 games).
- Dayton has held at least a share of first place after 62 of the 118 games they have played this season.

Dragons Manager/Coaches:

Jose Moreno is in his first season as Dragons manager and his second year in the Reds organization. The 2021 season is Moreno's 22nd year as a coach, instructor, or coordinator in professional baseball. As a manager, he has won three league championships with affiliated clubs, guiding his teams to titles in 2002, 2007, and 2010. Moreno also led his teams to back-to-back championships in the Venezuelan Winter League in 2019-20 and 2020-21. Moreno was a catcher in Cleveland Indians and Baltimore Orioles farm systems.

Wapakoneta, Ohio native **Brian Garman** joins the Dragons in 2021 as pitching coach. Garman was slated to serve as the Dayton pitching coach in 2020 before the season was canceled. He served as a pitching coach in the Los Angeles Angels system for the previous two seasons, working at Rookie-level Orem (Pioneer League) in 2019 and Advanced-A Inland Empire (California League) in 2018. Garman pitched at Wapakoneta High School and the University of Cincinnati before being drafted by the Milwaukee Brewers in the 17th round in 2010. He spent four years as a pitcher in the Brewers system, reaching the Double-A level.

Hitting coach **Daryle Ward** returns to the Dragons in 2021 after serving in the same position in Dayton in 2017-18. He is in his sixth year in coaching in the Cincinnati Reds organization. He served as the hitting coach with the Goodyear Reds in the Arizona League in 2016 and with the Chattanooga Lookouts in 2019. He was slated to return to Chattanooga in 2020 before the season was canceled. Ward played professionally for 22 seasons from 1994-2015. He spent seven full seasons and parts of four others in the Major Leagues, primarily as a left fielder and first baseman. His father, Gary Ward, was a Major League All-Star selection with both the Twins and Rangers as part of a 12-year Major League playing career.

Darren Bragg returns to the Dragons in his 15th year as a coach or instructor in the Reds organization. He will serve in a newly named position within the Reds organization, carrying the title of development coach. Bragg was the Dragons hitting coach for two seasons in 2007-08, helping the club to the playoffs in both years as he worked with future Reds Todd Frazier, Zack Cozart, Chris Heisey, Drew Stubbs, Juan Francisco, and others in Dayton. Bragg served as the Reds minor league outfield coordinator from 2009-18 before returning to a coaching assignment with an individual team. He was the bench coach at Double-A Chattanooga in 2019 and was slated to fill the same role with Daytona in 2020 before the minor league season was canceled. Bragg spent 11 years as a player in Major League Baseball from 1994-2004, appearing in 916 big league games with nine teams.
