The Chesapeake Baysox split Saturday's doubleheader against the Reading Fightin' Phils, losing game one 3-2 and winning game two 8-3. Starter **Trace Bright** threw 4.1 innings and struck out three while **Carter Young** delivered an RBI single in the first. In the second game, Chesapeake hit four homers with two off the bat of **Max Wagner**. Young and **Doug Hodo** also homered. **Ryan Long** threw his second quality start of the year with six innings of two-run ball and three strikeouts to earn the win.

HEY NOW, YOU'RE AN ALL-STAR

OF Enrique Bradfield Jr. and RHP Keagan Gillies both participated in the 2025 MLB All-Star Futures Game in Atlanta on Saturday. Both of them combined to record the final out of the game with Gillies inducing a fly out to Bradfield in right-center. The two are the 15th and 16th Baysox players and the first duo in franchise history to be selected to baseball's top prospect showcase.

CREED CRUSHES

C Creed Willems has been red hot in the month of July. The Orioles No. 11 prospect is second in the league with a .400 (12-for-36) batting average and is second in the league with a 1.067 OPS. Willems is on a seven-game hit streak and has collected a hit in eight of nine games this month.

TRIMBLE IS NIMBLE

OF Reed Trimble is on a 17-game on-base streak, which is the longest on-base streak on the team this season and is tied for the longest active streak in the Eastern League. The 25-year-old is slashing .286/.381/.486 in the month of July.

A WIN TODAY WOULD...

A win today would clinch Chesapeake's first home series win of the 2025 season. Chesapeake's last home series win was from August 6 - 11, 2024 when they won five of six against Harrisburg.

CLOSE GAMES AND FREE BASEBALL

Chesapeake has won 19 one-run games this season - which is tied for the most in the Eastern League. The Baysox have played 34 one-run games this season, which is the most in all of Double-A. Chesapeake won its 10th extra-inning game last night, which is tied for the most amongst full-season MiLB clubs with High-A Quad Cities.

BULLPEN BEASTS

Chesapeake's bullpen holds a 3.16 ERA, which is fifth-best in Double-A and eighth-best in full-season MiLB. Baysox relievers have punched out 417 hitters, which is tied for fourth-most in Double-A and tied for the most in the Eastern League.

WE'RE TALKIN' ABOUT THE FIGHTINS'

The Reading Fightin' Phils - Double-A affiliate of the Philadelphia Phillies - finished the first half with a 25-42 record, which was last in the Northeast Division. Reading has started the second half with a road series win in Richmond and a series loss against Somerset. Reading's active roster includes six of the Phillies' top 30 prospects, per MLB.com - IF Aidan Miller (No. 2), RHP Jean Cabrera (No. 12), IF Carson DeMartini (No. 15), OF Hendry Mendez (No. 25), C Caleb Ricketts (No. 29), and OF Dylan Campbell (No. 30).

TODAY'S OPPOSING STARTER

RHP Estibenzon Jimenez makes his fourth start of the season for the Fightin' Phils. The 23-year-old last pitched on July 4 and threw six innings of one-run ball and matched his season-high with seven strikeouts in a no decision against Somerset. The San Felipe, Venezuelan signed with the Phillies back in 2019. He started the year in High-A Jersey Shore.

- Acquired by the Orioles along with cash considerations from the Tampa Bay Rays in exchange for RHP Jackson Baumeister, OF Matthew Etzel, and OF Mac Horvath on July 26; began the season with Rays; placed on the 15-day Injured List with lower back inflammation on May 20, retroactive to May 19; reinstated from the IL on June 5; placed on the 15-day IL on August 20 with right shoulder inflammation, retroactive to August 17; reinstated from the IL on September 1
- Went 5-2 with a 2.60 ERA (16 ER/55.1 IP) with 51 hits (8 HR) and 11 walks with 47 strikeouts in nine starts after
 joining the O's at the trade deadline; was 10-9 with a 3.59 ERA (66 ER/165.1 IP) combined between Baltimore
 and Tampa Bay
- Finished with a 3.5 percent walk rate, ranked in the 98th percentile, per Statcast
- Did not allow more than three runs in any of his nine starts after joining the O's
- Won his first five starts to begin his Orioles career, joining Jack Harshman (1958) as the only Orioles to win each of
 their first five appearances with the club; he's the first to win each of his first five with all of them being starts and
 the first Oriole to win each of his first five starts with the team since Ben McDonald (7/21-8/13/90)
- Pitched against Toronto in his last start with the Rays on July 24 at Rogers Centre and his first with the Orioles on July 29 (G1) at Oriole Park; became the first Oriole (since 1954) and the first MLB pitcher to make back-to-back starts against the same opponent with different franchise since Andrew Cashner (BAL & BOS against TOR) in 2019, per the Elias Sports Bureau
- Retired the first 15 batters in a row in his first start off the IL on September 1 at Colorado; tied the longest he's
 taken a perfect game in his career, along with May 1, 2018 at Miami (w/ PHI); the 5.0 perfect frames to start the
 game were tied for the longest perfect game bid by a visiting pitcher in Colorado in Rockies history, along with San
 Francisco's Livan Hernandez (5/17/08) and Tim Lincecum (9/24/10); allowed one run on four hits and a walk with
 a season-high nine strikeouts in 7.0 innings
- Walked a career-high five batters in his final start of the regular season on September 25 at New York-AL
- Started Game 2 of the ALWCS vs. KC, allowing one run on four hits, one walk, and one hit batter with three strikeouts across 4.0 innings pitched; marked his 12th career Postseason appearance

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

2023: Made a team-leading and career-high 31 starts in his first season with the Rays, setting career bests in wins (16), innings pitched (177.2) and strikeouts (186) while posting the lowest ERA (3.50) and WHIP (1.02) of his career... Was the only Rays pitcher to qualify for the ERA title... Spent time on the 15-day IL from April 11 to 23 (retro to April 8) with low back tightness...Was on the active roster for the remainder of the season...Won the club's Paul C. Smith Champion Award, as voted by the Tampa Bay Chapter of the BBWAA; the award is given to the player who best exemplifies the spirit of true professionalism on and off the field...Finished sixth in AL Cy Young voting, earning a trio of top-three votes...Collected 16 wins, tying Toronto's Chris Bassitt for the most in the AL...Became the third Rays pitcher to lead the AL (or tie) in wins, joining Blake Snell (21, 2018) and David Price (20, 2012 - T-1st)...The 16 wins tied for fifth most in Rays history...The Rays went 23-8 (.742) in his starts, tied with David Price's 2014 season (23-8) for the best team winning percentage in a qualified pitcher's starts in Rays history...His 177.2 innings were the most by a Rays pitcher since Charlie Morton in 2019 (194.2)...Joined Corey Kluber in 2022 (31 GS) as the only Rays to make 30+ starts in a season since 2020...His 1.02 WHIP ranked second in the AL behind NYY's Gerrit Cole (0.98) and signaled the third-lowest mark by a Rays pitcher behind Shane McClanahan (0.93) in 2022 and Blake Snell (0.97) in 2018...Also ranked among AL leaders in opponent on-base percentage (2nd, .259), opponent OPS (4th, .642), opponent slugging percentage (5th, .379), HR per 9.0 IP (6th, 0.96), ERA (8th), strikeouts (T-10th) and bWAR (T-10th, 3.5)...Recorded a career-low 3.4 percent walk rate, second lowest in MLB behind SEA's George Kirby (2.5) and third lowest by a Rays pitcher in franchise history behind Corey Kluber (3.0) in 2022 and David Price (3.3) in 2014...Has produced the lowest walk rate in the majors since 2020 at 4.1 percent (min. 1,500 BF)...His 7.75 SO/BB ratio ranked second in the majors and was the second-best mark by a Rays pitcher behind David Price's 2014 campaign (8.22)... Was the fifth pitcher in MLB history with 175+ strikeouts and 25 walks or fewer in a season, last done by Minnesota's

Phil Hughes in 2014...Did not allow 10+ hits or 3+ walks in any of his 31 starts, per OptaStats; it marked the most such starts in a season without recording either of those statistics in the modern era (since 1900); the next closest pitcher is Cleveland's Josh Tomlin in 2016 (29)...His career-best 26.5 percent strikeout rate ranked sixth in the AL and was the ninth-best mark in franchise history... Averaged a majors-low 14.5 pitches per inning, tied for second fewest in club history behind James Shields in 2011 (14.3)...Held opponents to an average exit velocity of 87.5 mph, tied for the fourth-best mark in the AL behind Los Angeles-AL's Shohei Ohtani (86.4), Los Angeles-AL's Tyler Anderson (87.0) and Minnesota's Pablo López (87.1)...Generated a 34.0 percent chase rate, second highest in the AL behind López (34.3%)... Threw a career-high 68.9 percent of his pitches for strikes, the second-highest mark in the majors behind Miami's Sandy Alcantara (70.1%)...Signaled the third-highest percentage in Rays history, trailing David Price (70.1%) in 2014 and Corey Kluber (69.5%) in 2022...Opponents batted .182 (31-for-170) with 64 SO and a 34.9 percent whiff rate against his curveball... Went 11-4 with a 3.30 ERA (38 ER/103.2 IP) in 18 starts at Tropicana Field...The 11 home wins led the AL and set a club record...Became the first pitcher to earn a win in each of his first eight home starts of a season since St. Louis' Adam Wainwright in 2010 (10 GS)...Since 1901, only 11 pitchers have recorded longer such streaks to open a season, led by Lefty Grove (14 GS) in 1931...Made his fifth consecutive Opening Day roster, four of which came with the Phillies...Became the eighth pitcher since 1901 to earn a win in each of his first eight home starts with a new club, including the first since Chicago-NL's Rick Sutcliffe (8 GS) from June 24 to September 14, 1984...Went 10-1 with a 2.10 ERA (16 ER/68.2IP) in his first 11 home starts with the Rays, the lowest mark in such a span in club history, ahead of Matt Garza's 2.47 in 2008...In his final seven starts at Tropicana Field, went 1-3 with a 5.66 ERA (22 ER/35.0 IP)...On May 4 vs. Pittsburgh, struck out 10 over 7.0 innings of work; it marked his third career 10+ strikeout game and his first outing with 10+ strikeouts and no walks...Became the first Rays pitcher to allow three or fewer baserunners with 10+ strikeouts over 7.0+ scoreless innings since Tyler Glasnow on April 12, 2021 vs. Texas...From June 23 to July 21, did not issue a walk to 122 consecutive right-handed batters, the third longest streak in Rays history...Walked one or zero batters in a career-best 13 straight starts, June 28 to September 5... Excluding openers, it tied the second-longest streak in Rays history behind Corey Kluber (16 GS, 7/6/22-10/2/22)...On July 4 vs. PHI, started against his former club for the first time and recorded 9 strikeouts over 7.0 innings, but shouldered his first home loss of the season...On August 13 at Cleveland, allowed a season-high six runs on a season-high-tying nine hits (2x) in a 9-2 loss...It marked his first career start against the Guardians, giving him at least one appearance against all 30 major league teams...On August 25 vs. New York-AL, tallied a seasonhigh 11 strikeouts on a season-high 103 pitches, but took the loss in a 6-2 setback...It marked his fourth career 10+ strikeout game...His 17 whiffs in the outing also matched a season best, joining his July 4 start vs. Philadelphia...On September 10 vs. Seattle, earned his 11th home victory of the season, setting a new club record while helping the Rays to a four-game series victory over the Mariners...On September 15 at Baltimore, carried a no-hitter through five innings before allowing a solo homer to Heston Kjerstad to lead off the sixth frame; paired with a first inning error, he allowed only two baserunners on the evening...The win gave the Rays a share of first place in the AL East for the first time since July 21...Allowed three runs or fewer in each of his final eight starts, the longest streak of his career...Tied the third-longest season-ending streak by a Rays starter (excluding openers), trailing Blake Snell (16 GS) in 2018 and Drew Rasmussen (10 GS) in 2021...Went 2-3 with a 5.10 ERA (17 ER/30.0 IP) in his first six starts following the All-Star break and 4-1 with a 2.98 ERA (15 ER/45.1 IP) in his final eight outings...Went 4-0 with a 1.48 ERA (5 ER/30.1 IP) while holding opponents to a .162/.170/.276 (17-for-105) line in his final five road starts from August 1 to September 26...Entered that stretch having gone 1-4 with a 5.36 ERA (26 ER/43.2 IP) and .275/.313/.444 (47-for-171) opponent slash line in his first eight starts as a visitor to open the season...Started Game 2 of the Rays AL Wild Card Series vs. Texas, his first career Postseason start...Opened the game with three scoreless frames before allowing a fourth inning solo homer to Adolis García, snapping his Postseason scoreless inning streak at 10.2... Yielded a total of five earned runs over his final two innings of work.

2022: Began the season in the Phillies rotation, making 13 starts before a right knee bruise sidelined him from June 26 to September 12...Made seven relief appearances after being reinstated...Also missed time while on the COVID-19 Related IL from May 8 to 16...Limited opponents to an average exit velocity of 85.3 mph, third lowest in the NL (min. 200 batted balls) behind San Francisco's Tyler Rogers (84.2) and Los Angeles NL's Tyler Anderson (85.0)...Made his fourth consecutive Opening Day roster, all with the Phillies...Issued two walks (or fewer) in 33 straight starts from August 29, 2020 to June 3, 2022...Marked the third longest streak by a Phillie since 1901 behind Robin Roberts (36) in 1960-61 and Roy Halladay (35) in 2010-11...On May 22 vs. Los Angeles-NL, recorded a careerhigh 12 strikeouts in 7.0 IP, allowing four hits and two runs...Marked the second time in his career he reached double digits, following August 12, 2020 vs. Baltimore (10)...On October 3 at Houston, pitched a perfect ninth inning to finish a 3-0 win and recorded his first career save as the Phillies clinched a Wild Card berth...Was the third pitcher since saves became an official stat (1969) to record his first career save on the day his team clinched a Postseason berth, joining Los Angeles NL's Orel Hershiser on September 30, 1983 vs. San Francisco and Baltimore's Dave Leonhard on September 13, 1969 vs. Cleveland...Pitched in the Postseason for the first time and went 0-0 with a 3.38 ERA (4 ER/10.2 IP) in 10 relief appearances as the Phillies advanced to the World Series...Made seven straight scoreless appearances spanning 7.2 IP to end the Postseason...In Game 2 of the NL Wild Card Series at St. Louis, recorded his first career Postseason save...Pitched a scoreless ninth inning in a 2-0 win...Had four scoreless outings in the World Series against the Astros, yielding four hits in 4.1 innings pitched.

ZACH EFLIN

2021: All but one of his 18 starts came before the All-Star break...Was on the 10-day IL from July 17 to August 25 with right patella tendinitis and COVID-19 Related IL from August 27 to September 7...Reinstated on September 8 and placed on the 60-day IL to recover from right patellar tendon surgery...Led the majors with a 3.6 percent walk rate and 1.36 BB/9 IP ratio (min. 100 IP)...Ranked fourth in the majors with a 6.19 SO/BB ratio...Went 6.0+ IP and

yielded two runs or fewer in each of his first seven home starts...Tied Woodie Fryman in 1968 for the longest such

streak by a Phillie to start a season since 1901.

2020: Made 11 appearances (10 GS) in the shortened season...His only relief appearance came in the season finale when the Phillies were eliminated from Postseason contention with a 5-0 loss...Ranked 12th in the NL with a 10.68 SO/9 IP ratio (min. 50 IP)...Made three straight starts in doubleheaders from September 8 to 18, becoming the first Phillie to do so since Ed Farmer from June 21 to July 2, 1983...On September 18 vs. TOR (G1), pitched his third career shutout and recorded 9 strikeouts in the seven-inning win.

2019: His 28 starts, 163.1 IP and 129 strikeouts set then career highs...His 13 losses ranked fourth in the NL and 28 HR allowed tied for eighth in the NL...Made his first career Opening Day roster...Won three straight starts from April 28 to May 11, pitching to a 0.72 ERA (2 ER/25.0 IP) with two complete games over that stretch...On May 11 at Kansas City, his second career shutout marked the first by a Phillie since Jeremy Hellickson on September 17, 2016 vs. Miami.

2018: Recorded a career-high 11 wins despite starting the season with Triple-A Lehigh Valley...Made his season debut on May 1 and stayed in the majors for the rest of the season...On May 1 at Miami, his perfect game bid ended on a Miguel Rojas double to start the sixth inning...On May 25 vs. Toronto, hit a solo shot off Sam Gaviglio in the third inning for his first homer...Won six straight starts from June 5 to July 3...Went 5-0 with a 1.76 ERA (6 ER/30.2 IP) in June and became the first Phillie with 5+ wins in a calendar month since Cole Hamels (5) in May 2012...Ranked among NL leaders in June in wins (T-1*), ERA (3*) and WHIP (8*), 0.98).

2017: Was on the Phillies active roster from April 18 to May 28 and August 8 to 18...Began the season on the 10-day IL while recovering from offseason surgery on both knees...Placed on the injured list (right shoulder strain) on August 22, retroactive to August 19, and missed the remainder of the season...Was on Lehigh Valley's 7-day IL from June 3 to July 8 with a right elbow strain...Including rehab assignments, went 2-4 with a 3.74 ERA (23 ER/55.1 IP) in 11 games (10 GS) between Class-A Clearwater, Lehigh Valley, and the GCL Phillies.

2016: Selected on June 14 and spent the rest of the season with the Phillies, his first career major league action... Placed on the 15-day IL (patellar tendinopathy) on August 9 and missed the rest of the season...Underwent surgery on his right knee on August 19 and left knee on September 30...On June 14 at Toronto, suffered the loss in his major league debut and yielded nine runs (8 ER) in 2.2 IP...Allowed a solo homer to Kevin Pillar in the second inning, a two-run homer to Ezequiel Carrera, and a grand slam to Josh Donaldson in the third...Marked the second time a pitcher making his major league debut allowed a grand slam to a reigning MVP, joining St. Louis' Walter Brown on May 16, 1947 at Boston (Ted Williams)...Became the first Phillies starting pitcher to make his major league debut outside of the United States since David Coggin on June 23, 2000 at Montreal...On July 5 vs. Atlanta, became the first Phillie to pitch a complete game for his first career win since Carlton Loewer on June 14, 1998 vs. Chicago-NL...His only run allowed was a solo homer by Ender Inciarte in the seventh inning.

2015: Spent the season with Double-A Reading and made the Eastern League Midseason All-Star Team...Finished ninth with a 1.21 WHIP...Opened the season with three consecutive scoreless starts totaling 15.2 IP...From July 10 to 19, pitched for Team USA at the Pan American Games in Toronto...Helped Team USA win a silver medal...Ranked by Baseball America as the No. 13 prospect in the Phillies system following the season.

ROBERTO MERCADO

Manager

CHESAPEAKE OYSTER CATCHERS



For select home games, the Chesapeake Baysox will take the field as the Chesapeake Oyster Catchers as a tribute to the Chesapeake Bay's rich heritage and thriving ecosystem.

Inspired by the American oystercatcher, the prominent patterned shorebird can be found along the Chesapeake Bay year-round. With its bold black-and-white plumage, orange beak, and knack for hunting shellfish, the oystercatcher is a symbol of strength and ingenuity—qualities that define both the Chesapeake region and its passionate baseball fans.

The Oyster Catchers name also pays homage to the Chesapeake Bay's rich maritime traditions and oyster restoration efforts, celebrating the region's deep connection to its waters.

CANGREJOS FANTASMAS DE CHESAPEAKE



The Cangrejos Fantasmas De Chesapeake (Chesapeake Ghost Crabs) are a part of MiLB's "Copa de la Diversión™" or "Fun Cup™"- a season-long event series specifically designed to embrace the culture and values that resonate most with Minor League Baseball™ teams' local U.S. Hispanic communities.

Boasting a desire to better represent the Chesapeake Bay area, Bowie's "Cangrejos Fantasmas de Chesapeake" identiy came to light after research presented the existence of the small, yet active Atlantic Ghost Crab species in the bay.

BOWIE PIT BEEF



The "Bowie Pit Beef" is an alternate identity of the Chesapeake Baysox that pays tribute to the culinary culture of Maryland.



Pit Beef consists of top round cuts of beef, thinly sliced and prepared over a charcoal fire. The meat is cooked quickly at high temperatures and has a slight smoked flavor. The sandwich got its name on Baltimore's east side in the 1970s, before being popularized by the 1980s.
