YESTERDAY: The Flying Squirrels lost to the Curve, 1-0. The only run of the game scored on an infield single with two outs by Nick Cimillo in the bottom of the third inning. Reliever Marques Johnson made his Double-A debut and worked 1.1 scoreless innings. Will Bednar threw two innings and struck out three, his third consecutive scoreless appearance. Helcris Olivárez made his first appearance for Richmond and pitched a scoreless eighth inning.

TODAY'S GAME: The Flying Squirrels play the finale of a five-game series against the Altoona Curve, Double-A affiliate of the Pittsburgh Pirates. The series marks the first meetings between these two teams this year. The Curve come to Richmond for a six-game series from August 12-17. The Flying Squirrels return to Altoona from September 2-7. The series has been shortened to five games with Thursday's scheduled game being canceled. It will not be made up.

PACKING THE HOUSE: Last year, the Flying Squirrels led all 30 Double-A teams in average (6,595) and total (435,295) attendance. Among the 120 MiLB teams, the Flying Squirrels were 10th in average attendance. It was the third straight year the Flying Squirrels led all 30 Double-A clubs in average and total attendance, which had not been done prior to 2022. Last year's total attendance is the highest since 2013 (434,769) and the fourth-highest average in team history. April 4 marked the 15th consecutive Opening Night sellout, marking every home opener in franchise history to date. This year, the Flying Squirrels are averaging 6,747 fans per home game, which ranks fourth among all 120 MiLB clubs. Their average of 7,290 in the season's first month was the highest April attendance in franchise history.

THE FLYING SQUIRRELS won back-to-back games on Friday, including the completion of Thursday's rain-suspended game, for their first consecutive wins since winning three straight games against the Patriots from May 1-3. Richmond went 1-4-1 in last week's series against Binghamton. Of Richmond's 46 losses this season, 25 of them have been by two runs or less (17 by one, eight by two). The Richmond offense is 11th in the Eastern League in runs scored (215). Richmond's pitching staff has a league-high 4.73 ERA.

THE CURVE had won four-of-five prior to dropping both games on Friday night. They split last week's six-game series against the SeaWolves. Altoona's roster features five of Baseball America's top-30 Pirates prospects, including 2B Termarr Johnson (No. 5), OF/INF Mitch Jebb (No. 12), SS Jack Brannigan (No. 14 - on IL), RHP Wilber Dotel (No. 16) and RHP Alessandro Ercolani (No. 26). MLB.com's top-30 Pirates prospects lists features three Altoona players, including Johnson (No. 4), Brannigan (No. 11 - on IL) and Jebb (No. 13).

FOR RICHMOND: Left-hander John Michael Bertrand makes his 14th start of the season and the seventh of his career against the Curve. In his last start last Sunday against the Rumble Ponies, Bertrand worked 5.1 innings and allowed two runs in a no-decision. In his last eight starts since May 4, Bertrand has gone 1-2 with a 2.82 ERA (14 ER/44.2 IP). Bertrand started on Opening Day for the Flying Squirrels on April 4 against Akron, becoming the first pitcher to start back-to-back season openers for the Flying Squirrels. Last year, he was named the Flying Squirrels' Pitcher of the Year after going 7-9 with a 4.32 ERA in 28 outings (27 starts). Bertrand also won the team's Community Service Award. He made two starts with Triple-A Sacramento to close the season. For the year, Bertrand led all Eastern League pitchers with 10 scoreless starts, all at least five innings. He also led all MiLB pitchers defensively in assists (31) and ranked second in total chances (38). He finished the season ranked first among all MiLB pitchers in double plays induced (23), five ahead of the next closest pitcher. Bertrand was named Eastern League Pitcher of the Week twice last year, first for throwing seven perfect innings against the Baysox on April 27 and then for working six hitless innings in Bowie on May 23. Entering 2025, he is rated by Baseball America as having the best control in the Giants system for the second straight year. Bertrand began his collegiate career at Furman University in South Carolina before playing his final two seasons at the University of Notre Dame. He was selected by the Giants in the 10th round of the 2022 MLB Draft. For more on Bertrand, see page two.

FOR ALTOONA: Right-hander Emmanuel Chapman makes his first start of the season and the fourth appearance of his career against the Flying Squirrels. He faced Richmond on Wednesday and threw two innings, allowing one unearned run. In his previous three career appearances against Richmond, Chapman, a native of Cuba, signed with the Pirates in 2023.

DON'T RUN ON RICHMOND: The Flying Squirrels' catching unit of **Adrián Sugastey**, **Zach Morgan** and **Onil Perez** have combined to catch 37 stolen base attempts this season, which is second among the 30 Double-A teams and leads the Eastern League. Sugastey leads all Double-A catchers with 25 runners caught stealing. Morgan, now with Triple-A Sacramento, is tied for fifth in the Eastern League with 12.

BERI'S BACK: Outfielder/first baseman **Victor Bericoto** returned to the Richmond roster on June 3. He was placed on the injured list with Triple-A Sacramento on May 9 and played six games with the ACL Giants on a rehab assignment before returning to the Flying Squirrels. Bericoto opened the season with Richmond and hits .319 with three homers, four doubles and eight RBIs in 13 games before being promoted to the River Cats on April 20. In his Richmond career dating back to 2023, Bericoto has homered 26 times, which is the eighth-most in franchise history, one behind a four-way tie for fourth place (**Devin Harris, Sean Roby, Shane Matheny** and **Will Wilson**).

TAKING THE JAIRO: Jairo Pomares has picked up at least one hit in 12-of-his-last-16 games dating back to May 29, batting .322 (19-for-59) with two homers, three doubles, 10 RBIs and four walks, raising his season batting average from .185 to .222. That stretch includes five multi-hit games. He hit a solo homer on June 11 at Erie, his first since May 2, snapping a 25-game homerless streak. He went deep again June 8. Pomares leads the team with 25 RBIs this season.

YO ADRIAN: Adrian Sugastey has picked up nine RBIs over his last nine games dating back to June 8. In the series finale at Erie on June 8, he went 3-for-5 with a homer, two doubles and a career-best five RBIs. Last Tuesday, he drove in the Flying Squirrels' only run with a single. In last Wednesday's win, he belted his sixth homer of the year, a solo shot in the fourth, to set a new single-season career high. On Thursday, Sugastey drove in Richmond's first run in a 2-1 win at Altoona.

NIGHT AT THE ROXBY: Reliever **Braxton Roxby** closed his second save of the season in June 11, recording two outs in the eighth to strand two inherited baserunners before a 1-2-3 ninth. He followed with two scoreless relief innings in the ninth and 10th on Sunday afternoon before play was stopped and tossed a scoreless eighth in Altoona on Wednesday. Dating back to April 29, Roxby has pitched 13 consecutive games without allowing an earned run, spanning 18 innings with 23 strikeouts and four walks. The only two runs he has surrendered in that stretch were a pair of unearned runs in the 10th inning on May 27 against the Senators

SAVING THE DAY: Tyler Myrick worked 1.1 scoreless innings on Friday night to close his fourth save of the season. It was the 16th save of his Flying Squirrels career, tying him with **Patrick Ruotolo** for eighth on the franchise's all-time saves list. His next save will tie **Heath Hembree** for seventh.

IN THE LEAGUE LEADERS: In the Eastern League, Diego Velasquez is eighth in batting average (.284), tied for fifth in hits (65) and ninth in OBP (.377). Jack Choate is sixth in strikeouts (66). Joe Whitman is 10th in strikeouts (62). John Michael Bertrand is tied for fifth in innings pitched (66.0). Seth Lonsway is seventh in innings pitched (65.1).

TOP SKIPPER: Flying Squirrels manager **Dennis Pelfrey** has led the team to 223 wins in his career, which is a new franchise record all-time wins record for a manager. He passed the record with Richmond's 6-1 win at Binghamton on May 23. From 2011-2013, **Dave Machemer** won 216 games as Richmond's manager, leading the team to the Eastern League postseason for in 2011. Pelfrey, who has been with Richmond since the 2022 season, led the team to back-to-back postseason appearances for the first time in franchise history in 2022 and 2023. He also managed the 2021 Eugene Emeralds to the High-A West championship.

PROSPECT WATCH: Richmond's roster features five players are ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Giants prospects, including Joe Whitman (No. 5), Diego Velasquez (No. 10), Sabin Ceballos (No. 21) and Jack Choate (No. 26). John Michael Bertrand is rated as having the best control in the Giants system. Adrian Sugastey is ranked as the top defensive catcher. Aeverson Arteaga is rated as the best defensive infielder and best infield arm. MLB.com's top-30 Giants prospects list features five Richmond players, including Whitman (No. 7), Velasquez (No. 15), Arteaga (No. 16), Ceballos (No. 23) and Choate (No. 27).

THIS DATE IN RICHMOND BASEBALL HISTORY

1976: The Richmond Braves beat the Toledo Mud Hens, 4-3, at Parker Field. With two outs in the ninth inning, Reggie Sanders hit a walk-off RBI single to plate Chico Ruiz. Jeff Geach homered in the fourth and Pete Varney hit an RBI single to open a 3-0 lead. Toledo scored a run in the sixth and two in the eighth to tie the score. 1987: The Richmond Braves beat the Rochester Red Wings, 6-2, at The Diamond. Tom Glavine started and picked up a win after allowing two runs in 6-2 innings, scattering nine hits and a walk with two strikeouts. It snapped a string of five consecutive losing decisions for Glavine, who improved to 4-7 on the season. Six different R-Braves picked up an RBI loncencio Guerrero, John Rabba and Darryl Motley each hit solo homers. 1993: The Richmond Braves beat the Pawtucket Red Sox, 9-7, at The Diamond. Jerry Willard hit an RBI double and Bio Rodriguez brought in Javier Lopez with a groundout to open a 2-0 lead in the second. Pawtucket scored seven runs in the fourth to take a 7-2 lead. Richmond scored four runs in the bottom of the fourth to pull back within a run. Ramon Caraballo and Tony Tarasco, Ron Jones and Chipper Jones all hit RBI singles in the inning. Richmond tied the game, 7-7, with a run-scoring groundout by Caraballo in the fifth. In the eighth, Lopez hit a go-ahead single to score Tarasco and Chipper Jones. 1996: Team USA beat Japan, 8-6, at The Diamond in a pre-Olympics exhibition. Warren Morris, who had hit a ninth-inning, game-winning homer in for LSU to win the College World Series against Miami, hit a two-out, opposite-field three-run homer to give Team USA the lead. He also had four singles in the game. R. A. Dickey started for Team USA and allowed six runs over 4.2 innings. Troy Glaus drove in two runs. It was the 34th straight win for the USA Baseball team dating back to the summer of 1995. The Richmond Braves beat the Syracuse SkyChiefs, 9-0, at The Diamond. Kevin Millwood started for the R-Braves and took a no-hit bid two outs int
