#### ALBUQUERQUE ISOTOPES (15-33) AT SALT LAKE BEES (21-26)

### RHP Tyler Danish (1-3, 9.14) vs. LHP Kenny Rosenberg (4-3, 3.13)

TODAY'S GAME: Salt Lake holds a 2-1 series advantage after its 9-8 walk-off win in the ninth inning last night, the Isotopes first walk-off loss of 2024 ... Tyler Danish is scheduled to start for Albuquerque while lefty Kenny Rosenberg is slated to toe the rubber for the Bees.

NOW WALK IT OFF: Albuquerque lost in walk-off fashion last night for the first time since Sept. 2, 2023, when Sacramento's Heliot Ramos launched a three-run homer off Victor Vodnik in the ninth inning.

FORMER TOPES: Last night was the fifth time a former Isotope delivered a walk-off hit against his old team, and first since Johnny Monell on April 25, 2016 at Las Vegas (solo homer). Others include: Derek Wathan (June 21, 2006 at Memphis, solo homer), Valentino Pascucci (May 23, 2008 at New Orleans, solo homer) and Chris Aguila (July 21, 2008 at New Orleans, RBI double).

THREE-BAGGERS: Sean Bouchard and Trevor Boone each collected a triple last night (sixth game with multiple triples), tallying the Isotopes MiLB-leading 25th three-bagger of the last night. Albuquerque has tallied a triple in 17 of 48 games.

**CRUNCH TIME**: Aaron Schunk's two-run double in the ninth last night marked the eighth go-ahead knock in the seventh inning or later for Albuquerque this season, and second of the series. (also: Drew Romo, solo homer, eighth inning on Tuesday.

**ONE RUN GAMES**: The Isotopes dropped to 4-9 in one-run contests in 2024, including 1-4 on the road. This is the first time Albuquerque has dropped games on back-to-back days that were both one-run affairs since Sept. 20-21, 2022 at Sugar Land (3-2 and 4-3).

**DOUBLE-DIGITS:** The Isotopes have notched double-digits in hits over six consecutive games, their longest such stretch since accomplishing the feat in seven-straight from May 23-30 last year ... Tallied double-digit hits in nine of their last 10 games with 115 knocks during the stretch, most in all of MiLB during span, since May 12. Their 78 runs over their last 10 also leads MiLB.

**FOUR RBI**: Elliot Soto became the 18th opposing player to tally at least four RBI in a game against Albuquerque this season and first since Sugar Land's Jesus Bastidas on May 17 (five RBI).

**ATTENDANCE**: Over 27 openings on the year, the Isotopes lead all of Minor League baseball in total attendance with a total of 179,324 ... Additionally, their game on Cinco de Mayo is the fourth-highest crowd in Mil.B, 12,011.

**HITTING STREAKS**: Coco Montes has a 10-game hit streak, the longest active streak in the PCL and tied in all of Triple-A.

FAN FAVORITE: Coco Montes extended his hit streak to 10 games, the fourth Isotope to reach double-digits in 2024 (also: Schunk, Romo, Jimmy Herron). It is Montes' longest stretch since a 11-gamer from Aug. 12-25, 2023. During this stretch, he is slashing .488/.551/.756 with two homers and 12 RBI.

BOOCHIE THE BRUIN: Sean Bouchard was 2-for-5 with a triple, his fifth three-bagger and 13th extra-base hit in 62 at-bats in Triple-A this season. This is his first stretch of consecutive multi-hit performances since three-straight from Sept. 28-30, 2023 vs. Los Angeles (NL) and Minnesota.

**HIS NAME IS DREW**: Drew Romo saw his nine-game hit streak come to an end, as he finished 0-for-5. He compiled a slash line of .400/.429/.725 with a two-bagger, four long balls and 10 RBI in the span that started May 9.

**ON A HEATER**: Despite his 0-for-5 last night, since April 21, Drew Romo is slashing .400/.410/.663 with eight doubles, a triple, five homers, 21 RBI.

**REAL SLIM SCHUNKY:** Aaron Schunk has hit safely in his last 13 starts, with just a lone hitless pinch-hit appearance mixed in. He is slashing .345/.397/.621 with five doubles, a triple, three homers and 10 RBI during the stretch.

**SAM I AM**: Sam Hilliard has a hit in 14 of his last 16 games (21x65): three doubles, a triple, five homers, 13 RBI, and 11 walks ... Also struck out three times in a contest for the third time in his last seven games, after previously not suffering the fate since May 1, 2023 with Atlanta.

**BOONIE**: Trevor Boone has seven triples in 45 contests at the Triple-A level.

PCL LEADERBOARD: Drew Romo is 2nd in average (.356), and T-9th in hits (52) ... Aaron Schunk is T-3rd in doubles (15) ... Coco Montes is 1st in OBP (.457), average (.366) and hits (60), 2nd in and OPS (1.030), 7th in total bases (94) and 10th in slugging (.573) ... Sam Hilliard is T-1st in runs (40), T-2nd in total bases (105), 4th in slugging (.600), T-4th in XBH (24), hits (56), walks (30) and homers (11), 5th in OPS (1.015) and OBP (.415) and T-6th in triples (3) and 10th in average (.320).

**TEAM STATS**: Offensively in MiLB, the club is 1st in slugging (.496), OPS (.870), average (.290), total bases (853) and hits (498), 2nd in doubles (107) and runs (307).

#### **NUCLEI NOTES**

**SKIPPER**: Pedro Lopez enters his 20th year as a minor league manager and second guiding the Isotopes, the eighth manager in club history ... Spent 2021 as Albuquerque's hitting coach and 2022 as its bench coach ... Notched his 1,000th career managerial victory June 4, 2023 at Salt Lake, 7-1. Managed in the Texas Rangers (2001-05, 2007) and New York Mets (2011-19) organizations while claiming the 2014 Eastern League Championship with Double-A Binghamton. Lopez was drafted in the 21st round by the San Diego Padres in the 1988 MLB Draft and spent 13 years in the minor leagues, reaching Triple-A on four occasions.

**HOMETOWN KID**: Jordan Pacheco begins his third season as the Isotopes hitting coach ... An Albuquerque native and 2004 graduate of La Cueva High School, Pacheco then attended the University of New Mexico (2005-07), where he was one of the most prolific offensive players in school history (.384, 59 2B, 25 HR, 145 RBI) ... Drafted by Rockies in the 9th round in 2007 and made his MLB debut with Colorado in 2011.

CHRIS MICHALAK: Begins his second season as Isotopes pitching coach ... Pitched for the Albuquerque Dukes in 2000, followed by stints with the Isotopes in 2004 and 2008 ... Started second-to-last game in Dukes history, giving up two runs in 6.0 innings during Game 4 of a PCL First Round playoff series at Memphis Sept. 9, 2000 ... Appeared in 61 Major League games (24 starts) over five season with the Arizona Diamondbacks (1998), Toronto Blue Jays (2001) Texas Rangers (2001-02) and Cincinnati Reds (2006) ... 12th round selection by the Athletics in 1993 ... Has been in the coaching ranks since 2009, including stops as the pitching coach for the Hagerstown Suns (2010-11), Potomac Nationals (2012-13) and Harrisburg Senators (2014-17). He was also the Minor League pitching coordinator for the Miami Marlins form 2018-20 and coached in the Washington Nationals organization from 2021-22.

MICHAEL RYAN: Enters his first year with the Rockies organization as the Isotopes bench coach ... It's his second stop in Albuquerque after the former outfielder played in 33 games for the club and hit nine homers during the 2008 campaign. He and Michalak were teammates on that squad for four days in late July ... Entered the coaching ranks in 2012 as a coach for the Double-A Altoona Curve (Pirates). He then managed in the Pirates organization at three levels for seven seasons with stops at Single-A West Virginia (2013-14), High-A Bradenton (2015-16) and Double-A Altoona (2017-19), while winning the Florida State League in 2016 and Eastern League in 2017. Ryan compiled a 221-197 managerial record with Altoona—the most wins for a manager in Curve history ... He also managed in the Cubs organization (High-A South Bend, 2021 and Double-A Tennessee, 2022-June 2023) ... A 5th round draft pick by the Minnesota Twins in 1996, played in 149 MLB games over parts of five seasons with the Twins (2002-05) and Angels (2010) ... Last Angels player to wear 27 prior to Mike Trout's call-up in 2011.

SPLIT-SEASON PLAYOFF FORMAT: For the second-straight year, the Pacific Coast League will use a split-season format to determine playoff participants. With one 10 team division, the first half winner (concluding June 23) will host the second half winner (beginning June 25) in a three-game set. The winner will then face the International League champion for the Triple-A Championship in Las Vegas, NV, Sept. 28.

**BALLS AND STRIKES**: The Automated Ball-Strike System (ABS), now in its third year in the Pacific Coast League, will be used for all Monday-Thursday games while the Challenge System, second year in the PCL, will be used for all Friday-Sunday contests. Each team has three challenges per game, retaining one for each successful challenge.
